REGULAR AGENDA

1. Approve the minutes of the Senior Citizen Commission meeting of June 7, 2021.

Upon a motion by Member Collins and seconded by Member McDaniel, the Commission approved the minutes from the June 7, 2021 meeting. The motion pass with a vote of 4-0. Member Aschenbeck was absent.

2. Discussion on developments in Angleton for senior housing.

Geris Gonzales, Recreation Superintendent, introduced discussion on developments in Angleton for senior housing. Geri introduced staff-members from the development service division to present and provide updates relating to housing development in the city. Development services staff presented on the status of multiple housing developments that are in progress or in planning and engaged in discussion with the Senior Citizen Commission member about their comments and concerns as it relates to housing availability to seniors, property types, and lot sizes available.

3. Discussion on Recreation Assistant - Senior Activities position.

Geri Gonzales, Recreation Superintendent, introduced Vicki Chelette as the new Recreation Assistant for Senior Programs. Vicki introduced herself to the group and provided an update on the status of senior programs offered by Angleton Parks and Recreation as well as plans for future program offerings. Senior Citizen Commission members engaged in discussion on programming items and expressed their desires to see more trips return to the schedule and to ensure opportunities for meals are provided for longer trips. The staff provided an overview of the upcoming schedule including crafts, lunches, game play, coffee chat, walking classes, and Lunch Bunch. Staff emphasized that beginning in October, the plan is to open the calendar up to more in-person opportunities.

4. Discussion on Strategic Plan updates.

Geri Gonzales, Recreation Superintendent, provided an update on the Senior Commission strategic and opened for discussion with the Senior Citizen Commission members. Updates were provided related to housing development, transportation opportunities, upcoming health care opportunities, and details on upcoming recreation opportunities and events.

5. Discussion on senior citizen recreational, leisure events, and programs.

Geri Gonzales, Recreation Superintendent, provided updates on citizen recreational opportunities, leisure events, and programs. Staff noted that the Angleton Recreation Center was back to normal operations and included details about summer camp and pool operations. Staff provided updates on senior trips planned for August and September. It was noted that 60 guest participated in a welcome back party/lunch in July which gave an opportunity for seniors to provide programming interest and desires to staff to assist in future programming decisions.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

At the Welcome Back Party held in July 2021, staff provided senior participants a survey to gather information on suggestions for future senior programming.

Results included a high number of responses for general trips such as Lunch Bunch, wineries, and overnight trips. Three recommendations were received for casinos, shopping, and plays. Two recommendations were received for movies, plantations, and Christmas light tours. One suggestion was received for beaches, flea markets, and craft shows.

Additionally, a high number of responses were received for specific trips including San Antonio, Galveston, and Louisiana followed by YO Ranch, Amazon Fulfillment Center, San Saba and Lampasas.

Utilizing the given data, staff is working to create a destination plan for future trips.

Prior to the survey, staff planned a casino and play trip. Both trips reached maximum participation. For the months of October, November and December, staff considered survey results and will bring back Lunch Bunch, along with movies and a museum trip. An overnight trip will be planned for January 2022.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

On Monday, September 13, staff prepared the Angleton Recreation Center for potential impacts from Tropical Storm Nicholas. This included storing outdoor items inside, assessing the facility's existing conditions inside and out, and closing early at 5PM to keep staff and guests off the roads due to heavy rain.

The storm was upgraded to Hurricane Nicholas and hit the Angleton area that evening and into the early hours of September 14. Tuesday morning, parks and recreation staff assessed all parks as well as the Angleton Recreation Center.

Parks staff had to close Dickey & Bates Parks for the week to remove downed trees. They also helped Public Works clear debris and limbs from city streets.

The Angleton Recreation Center had no power and suffered from water damage in various areas including hallways, women's locker room, gymnasium and both multipurpose rooms. Staff worked to clean all areas and sought the services of Blackmon Mooring to eliminate moisture and prevent future issues.

Additionally, once power was restored, the cooling center opened on Wednesday, September 15 through Sunday, September 19 from 9AM – 6PM. The facility served as a cooling comfort center that offered air conditioning, showers, charging stations, snacks, and water. The Angleton Recreation Center had about 65 citizens who utilized these resources. Staff also delivered water and snack boxes to 10 senior citizens at Magnolia Acres who sought help due to no power.

The Recreation Center returned to normal operations on Monday, September 20. Staff are working with the Human Resources Director on insurance claims.
