RECOMMENDATION:

The Angleton Better Living Corporation approved funding to rehabilitate Angleton ISD tennis courts on Downing Street on June 6, 2022. The Finance Department confirmed this project would be paid for out of ABLC fund balance.

The Angleton Better Living Corporation approved design development for Freedom Park Passive Area to be completed by Burditt Consultants on October 3, 2022.

Angleton Better Living Corporation discussed addressing high priority items in the Angleton Recreation Center and ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition plan items on October 3, 2022.

Additionally, funds for a Multimodal Transportation and Trails Master Plan are available through a TxDOT Transportation Alternatives (TA) Grant in project category Active Transportation Non-Instructure. A trails master plan is one of the Parks & Recreation Strategic action items listed for this year. The grant requires a local match of 20%. Staff is estimating \$100,000 for a Multimodal Transportation and Trails Master Plan.

SUGGESTED MOTION:

I move we approve funding to rehabilitate Angleton ISD tennis courts on Downing Street to be paid out of ABLC fund balance, pursue design development for Freedom Park Passive Area to be completed by Burditt Consultants, and pursue a TxDOT Transportation Alternatives (TA) Grant in project category Active Transportation Non-Instructure for a Multimodal Transportation and Trails Master Plan.
