A new method of communication with senior participants has been implemented through TextMyGov. This process allows seniors to opt-in to the Silver Hearts distribution group to receive program updates and reminders. There are currently 29 on the opt-in list. The Silver Hearts Newsletter is still occuring on a monthly basis with 33 individuals on the mailout list, and 43 on the email list.
