1. Approve the minutes from Regular Called meeting on August 23, 2021.

Upon a motion by Member Dellinger and seconded by Member Cooper, the Commission approved the minutes form the meeting on August 23, 2021. The motion passed on a 5-0 vote. Vice Chair Scarborough and Member Goolsby were absent.

2. Presentation of Fiscal Year 2021 fourth quarter Code Enforcement statistics and update on enforcement actions.

Lindsay Koskiniemi, Assistant Director of Development Services, provided 4th quarter updates for the Code Enforcement Division. Staff provided a presentation to the KAB commission which included code enforcement patrolling and mitigation activity, the staff's participation in Hurricane Nicholas damage assessments and recovery, and Code Enforcement's observations, actions, and enforcement efforts within Angleton.

2. Discussion on Keep Angleton Beautiful Program and Service Updates

Kyle Livesay, Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation, provided updates for KAB programs and services. This included updates for KAB Memberships, the Green Seminar Series, TXDOT Traffic Control Box Wraps, the TXDOT Green Ribbon Project, and the HGAC Solid Waste grant application.

3. Discussion on the 2021 Fall Sweep

Kyle Livesay, Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation, provided program updates for the 2021 Fall Sweep event. Updates included general planning updates, adding a tree giveaway with trees provided from Trees for Houston to the event, event communication plans information, and event sponsorship updates.

5. Discussion and possible action on a identifying a Plan for the Keep Angleton Beautiful Strategic Plan Item "Who and What is KAB".

Upon a motion by member Brewer and seconded by Member Demopulos-Coats, the Commission approved moving forward with a plan to create a group video and individual member testimonies to promote "Who and What is KAB" via social media and the KAB Monthly Newsletter. The motion passed with a 5-0 vote. Vice Chair Scarborough and Member Goolsby were absent.

6. Discussion and possible action on a recommendation for relandscaping one median on Loop 274.

Upon a motion by Member Demopulos-Coats and seconded by Member Cooper, the Commission recommended the median at Loop 274 nearest to Cannon be relandscaped during FY22. The motion passed with a 5-0 vote. Vice Chair Scarborough and Member Goolsby were absent.

Upon a motion by Member Demopulos-Coats and seconded by Member Brewer, the Commission recommended that remaining funds not used in re-landscaping the median at Loop 274 nearest Cannon be used toward Permanent Signage for the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Citywide Spring Cleanup: Staff are prepping communication materials and beginning to market the upcoming Citywide Spring Cleanup. The event will take place on Saturday, April 2nd from 8-12 pm at Angleton Junior High School. All vendors have been confirmed for heavy trach & debris disposal, electronic recycling, tire recycling, paper shredding, and community tree giveaway. Staff are working to secure sponsors for the event as well as ways to get additional community volunteers involved with the citywide cleanup. Additionally, staff are working with the Bay Area Council on Drugs & Alcohol to coordinate a corresponding cleanup of tobacco paraphernalia at a local park to support the Citywide Spring Cleanup and to collect data needed to support the potential development of a tobacco and drug free parks ordinance.

Arbor Day Tree and Butterfly Seedball Giveaway: Staff are coordinating with Trees for Houston to make trees available for giveaway on Friday, April 29, 2022. Area residents will be able to pick up trees and butterfly seed balls from the Angleton Recreation Center.

Green Ribbon Project/Loop 274 Median Landscaping: Staff are working with staff from TxDOT's Green Ribbon Project to stay up to date on proposals for the City of Angleton to benefit from the project. Staff are also working with these staff to identify specific requirements that may need to be satisfied so an RFP can be developed and posted to seek landscaping services that would take place in advance of the Green Ribbon Project for the single median on Loop 274 that was identified during the 10/25/2021 KAB meeting.

Green Gardening Series: Staff have been working on the continuation of the Green Gardening series that is offered on the second Tuesday of each month (February through November). The previous lead of the program from the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension in Brazoria Count, Stephen Brueggerhoff, has recently changed job locations. With the change, staff began working with representatives from the Brazoria County Master Gardeners for the continuation of the program.

BCMG representatives have been working to schedule topics and secure speakers for the continuation of the monthly on-line seminars.

GCAA Application: On Thursday, February 17th, staff completed the application for the Governor's Community Achievement Award offered through KTB for the work completed during 2021. Staff highlighted KAB programs & events as well as other community wide efforts within the City of Angleton for consideration of the award.

KTB Annual Report: Staff is currently working to complete the required annual report for Keep Texas Beautiful. The application is due on March 25, 2022. Completion of this application is required for affiliates to maintain good standing, silver star, or gold star designations through Keep Texas Beautiful.

Volunteer Partnerships: Staff have been in communication with representatives from Dow and Life Foursquare Church. Both groups have shown interest in participating as volunteers for various projects or events provided through Keep Angleton Beautiful. Staff are working to pair opportunities to the needs and capabilities of the volunteer groups so that volunteers are best engaged in the support they are providing and that their capabilities are best being used. Volunteers from Dow will primarily consist of employees that possess a variety of general and specialized job skills that could be matched with specific projects. Volunteers from Life Foursquare Church consist of middle school students that are looking for opportunities to provide service to the immediate community.

KAB Commission Member Spotlights: Staff will begin working on collecting testimony and background information of KAB commission members to support commission member highlights in KAB publications. Staff will send out a questionnaire to collect each commission member's general history of involvement with Keep Angleton Beautiful and work to arrange times and capture commission member photos and/or videos.



Q4 What is your annual household income?



Q5 Do you live or work within Angleton?










Q11 What types of educational programs would you or a family member benefit from? (Choose up to 3)



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

On December 15, staff advertised a Request for Proposal (RFP) for traffic signal controller cabinet wrap art for three new locations within Angleton including: Loop 274 and Plum Street, Business 288 and Magnolia Street, and Highway 35 and Chenango Street.

This is an opportunity to support the aesthetic improvement of the state highway system within Angleton city limits and, also, fulfills goal four, revitalize downtown, objective three, attract arts, entertainment, and specialty retail downtown, of the Strategic Plan adopted by City Council on June 26, 2018. KAB provided staff direction regarding a theme which included Texas Wildflowers, historical Texas heroes, coastal birds, and Texas butterflies, for the RFP. The RFP was advertised on December 15, 2021, and closed on January 18, 2022.

Staff received several submissions from four artists which were evaluated and ranked by KAB members and the Executive Director. Results were compiled and KAB recommended the top three submissions for wrap installation: Blue Jays and Fall Maples by Wendy Delgado, Finding Beauty in the Moment by Joy Chandley, and Cardinal on a Branch by Lauren Luna.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In October of 2021, staff applied to be considered for grant funding available through the Houston-Galveston Area Council Solid Waste Grant. Staff requested \$27,000 in funding to offset the cost of the annual Spring Cleanup and Fall Sweep events that fall within the calendar year of 2022 and 2023. The purpose of the request was to make existing budget dollars available to a third citywide cleanup event. As of March 1st, 2022, staff was awarded and notified of final approval of grant funds to support the City of Angleton and Keep Angleton Beautiful. Staff are seeking guidance on the development and scheduling of a third citywide cleanup event to be added in the calendar year of 2022 and 2023.
