






BACKGROUND:

Approximately 18 banners are hung over SR 49 for various community and non-profit events, holidays, decorations (i.e., light strands), and other events. Attachment A summarizes the events, banners, and decorations *anticipated* for 2025. Approximately 12 light pole banners also will be installed approximately monthly. Changes to this list could occur throughout the year. Dates are approximate.

An annual encroachment permit application is required by Caltrans to hang these banners, light pole banners, and decorations. Caltrans requires a resolution from the local agency approving all banners, light pole banners, and decorations. Unless a fee waiver is obtained, applicants pay for installing and removing these banners. Gold Electric is currently under contract with the City to hang and remove banners and decorations. City staff can install the light pole banners from the sidewalks without special equipment.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Unless a fee waiver is granted by the City Council for installing/removing banners over SR 49, costs are covered by the existing City Fee of \$550.00 through July 1, 2024, when the fee will be adjusted in accordance with the California Construction Cost Index. No cost has yet been established for installing/removing light pole banners.

Project Update

Recommendation:

Acknowledge and accept updates.

Background:

Consistent with direction from the City Council, attached is an update on the above-captioned project through December 10, 2024.

Strategic Plan Alignment

A4: Economic Development: Promote a wide variety of economic opportunities consistent with the city's social, cultural, environmental, and aesthetic resources. The proposed Rural Recreation and Tourism grant park project is intended to increase tourism through park enhancements including a stage, historical (cultural) interpretation trail, and improved pavilion for outdoor events. A new children's playground, adult/teen exercise equipment, bocce courts, hardcourts, improved pavilion and stage are intended to encourage social interactions with local theatre productions, local musical performances, movies in the park and enhanced outdoor spaces for other local events.

A5: Economic Development: Maintain and enhance the city's economic vitality while conserving the city's social, cultural, environmental, and aesthetic resources. See above.

B2 Community Identity: Design new development to be compatible with the natural, scenic, and cultural resources and rural character of Angels Camp. The Community Stakeholders Design Committee will assist with park design to ensure compatibility with cultural resources and rural character.

C7: Public Facilities and Services: Maintain or increase the levels of service currently available within Angels Camp for park facilities and infrastructure. The project will increase the size of Utica Park by 3.8± acres, add or improve numerous park amenities, and upgrade and expand infrastructure increasing the level of park facilities available to all age groups and ability levels for residents and visitors.

Discussion

Landscaping

The landscaping plan was reviewed by the park committee on December 4, 2024 and approved as per the attached PowerPoint. Irrigation plans have been drafted and are undergoing a budget review. Installation of irrigation is a time sensitive item for park completion.

Lighting and Electric

A draft lighting plan is expected the week of December 9th. The Park Planning Committee has requested a meeting to review those plans.

Mark Twain Statue

Plans are underway to return Mark Twain to the park after the new stairway is installed from SR 49 (i.e., towards the end of the project).

Bocce Court

The bocce courts have been installed. The type of surfacing (oyster shells or, at additional cost, turf), is being researched.

Hardcourts

The hardcourts are poured. Fencing is pending after Christmas.

Parcourse

The general layout of the parcourse has been established. The course layout and walking/interpretive trail will be refined throughout the coming weeks.

Other

Amphitheatre footings are planned for installation in the first few weeks of December, weather permitting.

Rain


Boyer will continue park construction through the Winter as weather permits.







RELEVANT DOCUMENTS AND AGREEMENTS FOR THE UPDATE

Recommendation:

Adopt Resolution 24-98 approving the release of a request for proposals to prepare an update to the city's 2016 traffic impact mitigation fees and authorizing the city administrator to sign, authorize, and execute all relevant documents and agreements for the update.

Background:

Traffic Impact Mitigation Fees are charged to new development to offset a portion of the costs of capital improvement projects for new roads and circulation improvements associated with new development. TIMFs do not fund road maintenance. The City Council adopted the current 2016 TIMF study on a vote of 3-2 per Resolution 16-25 on June 21, 2016. The study was based on a projected 2.5% projected growth rate, which has not occurred.

TIMFs must conform to the multiple requirements of the U.S. and California Constitutions, and the California Mitigation Fee Act (California Government Code 66000 et seg).

The City Council recently update the City's development fees noting that the Traffic Impact Mitigation Fees (TIMF) had not been updated since 2016 and appeared to be out of line with those in other jurisdictions. The City's 2016 TIMFs include a 0.2% cost added to TIMFs to pay for updating the study after five years. Based on the preceding, Staff recommend an update to the TIMFs.

Strategic Plan Alignment

B5 Land Use Provide a well-organized and orderly development pattern that maintains and enhances Angels Camp's social, economic, cultural, environmental, and aesthetic resources while managing growth so that adequate facilities and services can be provided in pace with development.

An update to the City's 2016 TIMF will assist in ensuring adequate facilities and services (transportation related) will be provided in pace with development.

Discussion

Due to the extensive legal requirements surrounding the adoption of impact mitigation fees, the City anticipates hiring a consultant, as was done in 2016. The City further anticipates that contracted staff will update the costs of capital improvement projects selected to be included in the study. It is expected that the consultant will assemble a subcommittee to review the list of proposed traffic projects to be included in the study and provide guidance.

Environmental

The project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and state and city guidelines for implementation of said act pursuant to Section 15306, Class 6 of the state guidelines which states that CEQA does not apply to basic data collection or research which does not result in a serious or major disturbance to an environmental resource. These may be strictly for information gathering purposes, or as part of a study leading to an action which a public agency has not yet approved, adopted, or funded. The project includes collecting and analyzing data to prepare a report related to potential fees which have not yet been approved or adopted. Therefore, no analysis of potential impacts is required at this time.

Financial Impact

The City projects that the cost of updating the study itself will be approximately \$25,000. The study will require engineering services to update 2016 transportation capital improvement project costs at an estimated price of \$20,000-\$30,000 (to be completed by the City Engineer). Therefore, the total project cost will be approximately \$45,000-\$55,000. The entire cost will be paid for from the City's Traffic Impact Mitigation Fee fund.

Recommendation:

Adopt Resolution 24-89 authorizing the purchase of APN 062-003-041 expanding Tryon Park to Angels Creek and authorizing the City Administrator to sign, authorize, and have recorded all relevant documents and agreements.

Background:

At its May 21, 2024, meeting, the City Council, in closed session, discussed the item and directed staff to make an offer on the subject property. On June 4, 2024, the City Council approved Resolution 24-46 approving the purchase at a cost of \$4,161 that was made and accepted. Because the process of preparing a sales agreement took approximately 5 months, the landowner requested the addition of \$128.00± to the sales price reflecting the increase in the parcel's appraised value and to cover the additional cost of property taxes paid bringing the total price to \$4,289.00. This total excludes title and closing costs.

Strategic Plan Alignment

C7: Public Facilities and Services: Maintain or increase the levels of service currently available within Angels Camp for park facilities and infrastructure. The project will increase the size of Tryon Park by 0.06± acre.

Discussion

The 0.06± acre parcel adjoins Tryon Park and another parcel adjacent to Tryon Park also under consideration by the City for purchase. Purchase will realize the city's goal of expanding Tryon Park to Angels Creek. Prior to closing, an official resolution from the City Council is required. The site currently carries a general plan land use designation and zoning of Single-Family Residential.

Environmental

The project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act and state and city guidelines for implementation of said act pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3), the common-sense exemption, which states that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA. The project includes purchase of 0.06 acre of land that is primarily creek and creek-side vegetation which will ensure that inconsistent development

will not occur adjacent to Tryon Park (i.e., will be left primarily in an open space condition). Therefore, the purchase and use of the property will have no significant adverse impact on the environment.


Financial Impact
