NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Commission of the City of Anthony, Kansas, in regular meeting duly assembled this 20th day of December, 2022 that the City Commission requests the Director of Accounts and Reports to waive the requirements of K.S.A. 75-1120a(a) as they apply to the City of Anthony for the year ended 2023.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Commission shall cause the financial statements and financial reports of the City of Anthony to be prepared on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements as adjusted to show compliance with the cash basis and budget laws of this State.

6. Resolution No. 1107 - Annual Approval of Permit Fee Schedule

RESOLUTION NO. 1107

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ANTHONY, KANSAS ESTABLISHING THE CITY'S 2023 PERMIT FEE SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, it is beneficial for the City of Anthony to have a current and updated City Permit Fee Schedule.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Commission of the City of Anthony, Kansas, in regular meeting duly assembled this 20th day of December, 2022: As follows:

Section 1. The Anthony City Commission hereby establishes and adopts the formalized 2023 City Permit Fee Schedule which is attached hereto as Resolution Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. The 2023 City Permit Fee Schedule shall be effective beginning January 1, 2023 and remain in effect until a resolution is passed replacing this resolution. All previous resolutions and permit fee schedules are repealed and replaced by this resolution.

ADOPTED by the City Commission this 20th day of December, 2022.

7. Resolution No. 1108 - Local Participation in Rural Opportunity Zone Match **RESOLUTION NO. 1108**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF ANTHONY, KANSAS AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN RURAL OPPORTUNITY ZONE STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM CALENDAR YEAR 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF ANTHONY, KANSAS, IN THE COUNTY OF HARPER:

Section 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 74-50,223, the City Commission expresses its intent to participate in the Rural Opportunity Zone (ROZ) student loan repayment program.

Section 2. Harper County has been designated a Rural Opportunity Zone pursuant to K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 74-50,222.

Section 3. The City of Anthony Commission hereby obligate the City of Anthony to participate in the ROZ student loan repayment program as provided by K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 74-50,223 for a period of five years, which shall be irrevocable.

Section 4. The City of Anthony agrees to pay in equal shares with the State of Kansas the outstanding student loan balance of any individual domiciled within the incorporated and unincorporated areas of the City of Anthony for a period of five years, if the domiciled individual meets the terms of qualification provided by the State of Kansas in K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 74-50,223, and the appropriate rules and regulations. The number of qualified resident individuals receiving such payments will be subject to the availability of funds.

Section 5. The maximum student loan balance for each qualified resident individual to be repaid jointly The City of Anthony and the State of Kansas shall be \$15,000 over a term of five years.

Section 6. The City of Anthony shall allocate \$ 7,500.00 a calendar year for the purpose of matching payments from the State of Kansas to qualified resident individuals. The City of Anthony shall revise its ROZ budget on an annual basis submitting a new Resolution to the State of Kansas by January 30th each year. The City of Anthony shall submit their obligation in full to the Department of Commerce before the first day of September each year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be published once in the official city newspaper and shall be in effect from and after its date of publication.

Adopted this 20th day of December, 2022 by the City Commission of Anthony, in Harper County, Ks.

13. <u>Dangerous Structure Public Hearing – 432 S Anthony Gilchrist</u>

Mayor Cleveland convened the public hearing for 432 S Anthony and the Commission reviewed the evidence of the case presented by the Enforcing Officer. Owner Wesley Gilchrist being present, had no evidence to present in the case but thanked the commission for the amount time that was given to attempt correction. Based upon the findings of this hearing the Commission does determine this structure at 432 S Anthony has been found dangerous or unsafe. Therefore, the site has been ordered for removal commencing on January 11, 2023, and completing by February 10, 2023. If the structure has not been removed by said date, the city will cause the removal and the costs of such will be paid by the property owner.

14. <u>Dangerous Structure Public Hearing – Lot 1 Block 73 Anthony a.k.a. Southwest Corner of Grant and S. Massachusetts Rathgeber</u>

Mayor Cleveland convened the public hearing for Lot 1 Block 73 Anthony and the Commission reviewed the evidence of the case presented by the Enforcing Officer. There was no owner or party of interest present at the hearing. Based upon the findings of this hearing the Commission does determine this structure at the southwest corner of Grant and S. Massachusetts - Lot 1 Block 73 - has been found dangerous or unsafe. Therefore, the site has been ordered for removal commencing on January 11, 2023 and completing by February 10, 2023. If the structure has not been removed by said date, the city will cause the removal and the costs of such will be paid by the property owner.

18. <u>Dangerous Structure Resolution No. 1110 Fixing Time and Place of Hearing 301 N. Kansas Drosselmeyer</u>

RESOLUTION NO. 1110

A RESOLUTION FIXING A TIME AND PLACE AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF A HEARING BEFORE THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ANTHONY, KANSAS, AT WHICH THE OWNER, HIS OR HERAGENT, LIENHOLDERS OF RECORD, OCCUPANTS AND OTHER PARTIES IN INTEREST OF STRUCTURES LOCATED WITHIN SAID CITY AND DESCRIBED HEREIN MAY APPEAR AND SHOW CAUSE WHY SUCH STRUCTURE SHOULD NOT BE CONDEMNED AND ORDERED REPAIRED OR DEMOLISHED AS A DANGEROUS OR UNSAFE STRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, the enforcing officer of the City of Anthony, Kansas, did on the <u>20th</u> day of <u>December</u>, <u>2022</u>, file with the governing body of said city, a statement in writing that the structure, hereinafter described, is dangerous or unsafe.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ANTHONY, KANSAS:

That a hearing will be held on the <u>7th</u> day of <u>February</u>, 20<u>23</u>, before the governing body of the city at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall, 124 S Bluff, Anthony, Kansas 67003 at which the owner, his or her agent, any lienholders of record, any occupant and any other parties in interest, as that term is defined by law, of the structure located at:

All of Lots Ten (10) and Eleven (11), in Block Nine (9), in the City of Anthony, as shown by the recorded plat thereof, EXCEPT the East Fifty (50) feet thereof; together with easements reserved therein in General Warranty Deed dated August 3, 1950, and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Harper County, Kansas, in Book 76, Page 257, which said easements are hereby conveyed to second parties.

may appear and show cause why such structure should not be condemned as a dangerous or unsafe structure and ordered repaired or demolished.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk, or designated representative, shall cause this resolution to be published and shall give notice of the aforesaid hearing in the manner provided by law.
