Ms. Slagle addressed the Planning Commission about the need for a full service mental health facility in Appomattox. She plans to see patients Monday-Friday, 9am-5pm. Liberty Baptist Church has given her permission to use their parking lot as needed.

Eric and Dorothy Van Opstal, who live at 637 Lee Grant Ave, spoke out against allowing the conditional use permit as they believe it is opening the door for other business to open on Lee Grant Ave and they would like to keep it a residential area.

Mr. Ranson said that it is a much-needed service in Appomattox, and he cannot see standing in the way unless the entire neighborhood was against it.

Marvin Mitchell closed the public hearing.

On a motion by Mr. Boyce, seconded by Mr. Ranson, the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the conditional use permit to Town Council. All members present voting aye. Motion carried.
