Awards and Proclamations

 Good Neighbor Award presented to a citizen that rendered aid during a recent critical incident. Police Chief Burr presented Good Neighbor award to Samantha Koester. She was recognized for actions on Oct. 8 when her neighbor suffered an accidental gunshot wound to the leg. When Koester, a nurse for eight years, learned of the accident, she quickly called 911, used a towel to put pressure on the wound, and applied a belt as a tourniquet. Koester was awarded for being cool, calm, and collected under pressure and for rendering effective medical aid during a critical incident.

He also recognized Jaime Lovell, an employee of Four County Mental Health, and who partners with Arkansas City Police Officer Cori Tuxhorn as part of the department's Crisis Intervention Team. On Oct. 13, a citizen came to the police department to pick up her personal property after serving time in jail. Upon realizing that the citizen, who is currently homeless, didn't have shoes on, Jaime removed her shoes to give to the citizen.

2. City Clerk Shook presented for consideration first reading of an Ordinance exempting the application of K.S.A. 41-719(d) to allow the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor at a designated area of Ben Givens Center City Park during Arkalalah on October 26-29, 2022. Bottle Service, a KS State Licensed Caterer, has requested the city commission allow it to sponsor a beer garden to sell and serve alcoholic liquor at a

designated area of Ben Givens Center City Park during the Arkalalah Festival from 11 a.m. until midnight on Wednesday, October 26, 2022, through Saturday, October 29, 2022.

Motion made by Commissioner Rogers, Seconded by Commissioner Warren to approve an Ordinance exempting the application of K.S.A. 41-719(d) to allow the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor at a designated area of Ben Givens Center City Park during Arkalalah on October 26-29, 2022.

Voting Yea: Commissioner Rogers, Commissioner Spielman, Commissioner Warren, Mayor Gingher. Mayor Gingher declared the motion approve and given <u>Ordinance No. 2022-10-4567</u>.

Resolutions for Consideration

City Clerk Shook presented for consideration a Resolution authorizing the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, in conjunction with the City of Winfield, Kansas, and the Cowley County Humane Society to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the operation of the Cowley County Animal Shelter. City Manager Frazer noted this is a renewal agreement and will be in effect for 5 years. Each city will contribute \$35,000 annually, up from \$31,500 from previous contract period, and all three entities will contribute \$2,000 toward annual capital outlay projects.

Motion made by Commissioner Spielman, Seconded by Commissioner Rogers to approve the resolution authorizing the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, in conjunction with the City of Winfield, Kansas, and the Cowley County Humane Society to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the operation of the Cowley County Animal Shelter.

2. Environmental Services Superintendent Philo explained the system will be installed at 14th and Ash, is self-contained, and will run off of solar power. There also is a 1 year warranty.

CORPORATION OUIT CLAIM DEED: Detention Pond-Goff Industrial Park

WHEREAS, in 2014 the City of Arkansas City, Cowley County Kansas, a Kansas municipal corporation was awarded a financial grant to "...construct, reconstruct, repair, grade, improve and maintain..." Skyline Road generally between Summit Street (US Highway 77) on the East and Eighth (8th) Street on the West, which improvements required landowner Arkansas City Industries Inc. to confer Easements encompassing real estate along the North side of the existing Skyline Road as well as to allow the construction of a detention pond North of Skyline Road, as improved and on real property owned by landowner Arkansas City Industries Inc., to provide protection to the project from surface water drainage and because of inadvertence, formalization of the detention pond on public record was not completed and is set forth herein.



Item: Agri-Business Building Age Restriction Waiver

Purpose:

Approve a request from Shelley Robertson, One Margarita Express LLC, to waive the age restriction at the Agri-Business building during the Cowley Market event on November 19,

2022. (Voice Vote)

Background:

At the commission meeting on September 20th, the governing body approved Ms. Robertson's request to waive the age restriction at the Agri-business building during the Cowley Market event on October 8, 2022 as a trial run. Unfortunately due to a scheduling conflict, she was unable to attend the event on October 8th.

Another Cowley Market event is scheduled for November 19, 2022 and Ms. Robertson has requested the governing body waive the age restriction.

Currently, the Agri-Business building allows alcohol during events as long certain rules/regulations are followed:

- Any serving of alcoholic liquor or set-ups must be done by a vendor, group, or person holding a State temporary liquor license, or a caterer's license. The license may be obtained from the State alcoholic beverage division for a cost of \$25.00. Call 785.368.8222 (choose option 5 then 4) to obtain an application. This must be done a minimum of 14 days prior to the event in order for the license to be reviewed by the State. If serving 3.2 Cereal Malt Beverage only, the license must be obtained by the City.
- 2. Applicant must schedule use of the Agri-Business Building with the Finance Department and pay the rental fee for the Building.
- 3. Applicant must complete this alcoholic beverage permit application and pay the \$50 per each calendar day permit fee to the City Clerk's Office.
- 4. All events must be approved in advance by the City Manager.
- 5. Permits will be valid for no more than three (3) consecutive days, only for a six (6) hour period each day between the hours of 10:00 AM and 12:00 Midnight.
- 6. No person under 21 years of age shall be permitted within the interior of the agri-business building during the event.
- 7. The permit holder shall provide security approved by the police chief or his designee in the form of an off-duty, uniformed police officer or a uniformed security officer.
- 8. Permit only applies to the interior of the Building. No one may carry an open container or consume alcohol outside the building.
- 9. Events where guests are invited and requested to bring their own alcoholic beverages and set-ups are limited only to specifically invited guests. Events of this type cannot be open to the public or uninvited guests. For this, the state Temporary Liquor License is not required. Note: Setups cannot be provided to the guests.
- 10. Any group, person, or organization convicted of violating any of the permit rules and regulations will be ineligible to apply for another permit until the offense is expunged from their record in accordance with law.

The only exemption being requested is to waive the age restriction to allow persons under 21 in the building during the event. Ms. Robertson has an active Caterers' license issued through the State of Kansas has provided reasonable assurances that she will take all necessary precautions to ensure the property is used in full compliance with applicable state and local law.
