The Arkansas City Board of City Commissioners met in regular session at **5:30 p.m. Tuesday, June 15, 2021**, in the Commission Room at City Hall, located at 118 W. Central Ave. in Arkansas City.

Mayor **Scott Rogers** called the meeting to order. Commissioners also present at roll call were Commissioner **Kanyon Gingher**, Commissioner **Jay Warren** and Commissioner **Karen Welch**. (Commissioner **Duane L. Oestmann** was absent due to a medical issue.)

City employees present at the meeting were City Manager **Randy Frazer**, City Attorney **Larry Schwartz**, Deputy City Clerk **Amanda Evinger**, Public Information Officer **Andrew Lawson**, Management Assistant **Mike Crandall**, Interim Police Chief **Eric Burr**, Interim Fire Chief **Les Parks**, Building Official **Mike Bellis** and Principal Planner **Josh White**.

Citizens in attendance were **Sue Lancaster, Thomas Langer, Shannon Martin, Diana Spielman**, **Harrison Taylor** and Cowley CourierTraveler reporter **John Shelman**.

Commissioner Warren offered the opening prayer. Mayor Rogers led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Agenda Approval

Commissioner Welch made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Gingher seconded the motion. A voice vote was **unanimous** in favor of the motion. Mayor Rogers declared the agenda **approved** as presented.

Awards and Proclamations

Mayor Rogers issued a proclamation that July 2021 is Public Health Month in Arkansas City.

Public Health Officer Thomas Langer received a copy of the proclamation, as well as another countywide proclamation document, on behalf of the **City-Cowley County Health Department**.

Consent Agenda

Commissioner Welch made a motion to approve the consent agenda, consisting of the following:

- 1. Approving the **June 1, 2021**, regular meeting minutes as amended.
- 2. Approving Resolution No. 2021-06-3413, adopting the Kansas Homeland Security Region G Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- 3. Approving **Resolution No. 2021-06-3414**, authorizing the City to approve **Addendum #3** to an existing agreement with **Rural Fire District No. 5** to extend the term of that contract to provide fire services.
- 4. Ratifying Mayor Rogers' appointments of **Jason Brewer** and **Jill Smith** to the **Outstanding Student Award Committee**.
- 5. Ratifying Mayor Rogers' reappointments of Jason O'Toole to the Arkansas City Recreation Commission and Debi Clark to the Cowley County Juvenile Corrections Advisory Board.

Commissioner Gingher seconded the motion. A voice vote was **unanimous** in favor of the motion.

Mayor Rogers declared the consent agenda **approved** as presented.

New Business

150th/Tacolalah Beer Garden Ordinance No. 2021-06-4533

Deputy City Clerk Evinger presented for discussion a first reading of an ordinance exempting the application of **K.S.A. 41-719(d)** to allow the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor at a designated area of Wilson Park during the City's **150th Celebration** from **6 to 11 p.m. Friday, July 16, 2021**, and during the **2021 Tacolalah Festival** from **4 to 10 p.m. Saturday, July 17, 2021**.

Public Information Officer Lawson said the organizers of the 150th Celebration – **Visit Ark City**, the **City**, **Burford Theatre Arts** and the **2021 Tacolalah Committee**, comprising representatives of five City boards and 4 Friends, LLC – have asked to sponsor a beer garden to sell and serve alcohol at Wilson Park during the Burford's BackRhodes concert on **July 16** and Tacolalah on **July 17**.

Tacolalah hopes to support further development of the Wilson Park Master Plan using any funds raised from this festival. Proceeds from the beer gardens will go to support the ongoing mission of Burford Theatre Arts. Lawson said the organizers have provided reasonable assurances that they will take all necessary precautions to ensure the property is used in full compliance with applicable state and local laws, as well as any applicable health orders.

Commissioner Gingher asked **Shannon Martin**, director of Burford Theatre Arts, if those younger than 21 would be allowed inside the perimeter. She asked that this be allowed and explained all of the precautions Burford Theatre Arts will take to prevent underage drinking. Interim Police Chief Burr said he did not see any issues with Martin's proposal and said officers would be there in force.

Commissioner Warren made a motion to approve the ordinance as presented. Commissioner Gingher seconded the motion. A roll call vote was **unanimous** in favor of the motion. Mayor Rogers declared the ordinance **approved** and given **Ordinance No. 2021-06-4533**.

Vacating Compass Point Drive Ordinance No. 2021-06-4534

Deputy City Clerk Evinger presented for discussion a first reading of an ordinance authorizing the vacating of all of **Compass Point Drive** within the replat of **Compass Point Addition**.

Principal Planner White said Sarah and Brandon Jellings had filed a request to vacate Compass Point Drive in the replat of Compass Point Addition. All adjacent property owners were notified.

White said the intent of the replat was to return the streets to private control, but an error was made in the platting process. The Technical Advisory Committee noted that there are a number of utilities present in the area and a utility easement would be needed for the area as the various utilities will need to continue to have access. White recommended approval of the request.

He said the Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of this vacation, subject to the reservation of the access and utility easement, at its meeting on **June 8**.

Mayor Rogers made a motion to approve the ordinance as presented. Commissioner Welch seconded the motion. A roll call vote was **unanimous** in favor of the motion. Mayor Rogers declared the ordinance **approved** and given **Ordinance No. 2021-06-4534**.

Multimodal Transportation Master Plan

Deputy City Clerk Evinger presented for discussion a resolution approving an agreement by and between the City and **TranSystems Corporation**, of Wichita, for Professional Services to design and construct a **Multimodal Transportation Master Plan** for the City, utilizing Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas Pathways to a Healthy Kansas grant funds, for an amount not to exceed **\$25,000.00**.

Public Information Officer Lawson said the City Commission on **May 5, 2020**, indicated support for a "Pathways to a Healthy Kansas" grant application, through RISE Cowley, in the amount of **\$25,000.00** for a Master Transportation Plan. On **May 19, 2020**, the Commission approved **Resolution No. 2020-05-3331**, approving the hiring of a technical consultant prior to **December 15, 2020**, to develop a Master Transportation Plan for the City, utilizing these awarded grant funds.

With the consent of Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas (BSBSKS), which has disbursed the grant funds, this deadline was extended to **June 15, 2021**, via the passage of **Resolution No. 2020-12-3377** on **December 15, 2020**. But Lawson asked for the item to be tabled and said BCBSKS signed off.

If the attached agreement is approved, Lawson said the work would kick off at the Traffic Safety Committee meeting on **July 16**. A special meeting may be convened sooner. While TranSystems gathers, collects and analyzes data, the City will be responsible for surveying citizens, convening public meetings and collecting other forms of community engagement to go into this plan.

Harrison Taylor, 525 N. Fourth St., spoke about traffic safety issues throughout Arkansas City. He advocated for not only the Multimodal Transportation Master Plan, but also urged better attendance at future Traffic Safety Committee meetings, a philosophy of traffic management in town that is based on community input and not outside engineering expertise, and changing the "custom" that east-west avenues yield to the north-south streets which have higher traffic volumes.

Mayor Rogers made a motion to table the resolution until **July 6**. Commissioner Warren seconded the motion. A voice vote was **unanimous** in favor of the motion. Mayor Rogers declared the resolution **tabled**.

Comprehensive Fee Schedule Resolution No. 2021-06-3415

Deputy City Clerk Evinger presented for discussion a resolution adopting by reference the City's **2021 Comprehensive Fee Schedule** and repealing **Resolution No. 2021-03-3390**.

City Manager Frazer said the proposed change would provide a 50-percent discount on permit fees for all contractors who build **10** to **25** dwelling units within the same development project, while the permit fees would be completely waived for projects in which **26** or more dwelling units are built.

The same discounting plan would apply to City utility fees as well, Frazer said. But in both cases, the dwelling units must be completed and move-in ready at the end of a 24-month period, and under no circumstances would Neighborhood Revitalization Program fees be waived by the City.

Commissioner Gingher made a motion to approve the resolution as presented. Commissioner Warren seconded the motion. A voice vote was **unanimous** in favor of the motion. Mayor Rogers declared the resolution **approved** and given **Resolution No. 2021-06-3415**.

City Manager's Report on Upcoming Activities

City Manager Frazer provided the commissioners with the following reminders and updates:

- The monthly **Cowley Indoor Market** will have its next event from **5 to 8 p.m. June 16** at Burford Theatre Arts, located at 118 S. Summit St. in downtown Arkansas City.
- The next **Arkansas City Area Chamber of Commerce coffee** will be at **10 a.m. June 17** in the cafeteria at South Central Kansas Medical Center, located at 6401 Patterson Pkwy., followed by a special ribbon-cutting and dedication ceremony for the SCK Health's new birthing and maternity unit at the hospital.
- The **Ark City Community Band** will continue its historic 150th consecutive season with a concert starting at **7:30 p.m. June 17** under the rotunda at Wilson Park. Concerts follow each Thursday at the same time and place through **July 15**, a special 150th anniversary concert.
- Frazer reminded commissioners about the League of Kansas Municipalities (LKM) Leadership Summit and Kansas Mayors Conference, which is June 18-19 in Lawrence.
- Robin Henderson, chairwoman of the Beautification and Tree Advisory Board, is organizing a special **Juneteenth celebration** from **10 a.m. to 6 p.m. June 19** at Lovie Watson Park. It features vendors, information booths, a pop-up StoryWalk around the trail, food and more!
- That event will be followed by the Fire-EMS and Police Departments' "Pop in the Park" from 5:30 to 7 p.m. June 19 at Wilson Park, 701 N. Summit St. Stop by for a free cold beverage!
- Presbyterian Manor will be host to its annual **Karl Faidley Summer Solstice Ball Drop** fundraising event from **6 to 8 p.m. June 21** on the front lawn of the manor, 1711 N. Fourth St.
- The Arkansas City Farm and Art Market will continue its 2021 season from 4 to 6:30 p.m. June 22, June 29 and July 6 at the Wilson Park rotunda, located at 701 N. Summit St.

- The Arkansas City Police Department will be host to its "**Coffee with a Cop**" from **2 to 4 p.m. June 24** at Lake View Estates, located at 801 W. Taylor Ave.
- The annual **Arkansas City Area Chamber of Commerce** banquet will be replaced this year by a **BBQ bash** from **5 p.m. to 10 p.m. June 25** at Chestnut Avenue Venue, located at 3120 E. Chestnut Ave. (**NOTE:** *This event later was moved to Burford Theatre Arts, 118 S. Summit St.*)
- The next **City Commission study session** was scheduled at City Hall at **noon July 2**, which is just prior to the three-day Independence Day weekend. The city commissioners indicated they wished to cancel this study session unless some pressing matter comes up.
- The City's annual **community fireworks display** will start around **9:30 p.m. July 4**. It will be followed by a special **Independence Day concert** by the Ark City Community Band starting at **7:30 p.m. July 5** under the rotunda at Wilson Park, located at 701 N. Summit St.
- City Hall and other offices will be closed all day **July 5** in observance of Independence Day.
- Frazer said the **Paris Park Pool study report** was passed out to each commissioner to review.
- He also updated them on the **Cowley First workforce gap analysis** he attended **June 14**.
- Frazer hopes to have the City's **Housing Assessment Tool** wrapped up by around **June 22**.

Adjournment

Commissioner Warren made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Welch seconded the motion. A voice vote was **unanimous** in favor of the motion.

Mayor Rogers declared the meeting adjourned at 6:25 p.m.

Background:

The **Land Bank Board of Trustees**, comprising the five city commissioners, is required by its bylaws to meet publicly at least twice annually — once in **January** for annual business and once in **July** to approve a budget for the following fiscal year. These meetings will be held on the third Tuesday in both months.

At this regular annual meeting, the Land Bank Board of Trustees will convene and conduct any business necessary, including establishing the budget for Fiscal Year 2022, as well as approving any necessary property transfers into or from the City's Land Bank. The budget of the Land Bank shall be prepared, adopted and published as provided by law for other political subdivisions of the State of Kansas. No budget shall be adopted by the Board until it has been submitted to, reviewed and approved by the Governing Body. (*If the Governing Body elects not to ratify the budget, it must reject the plan in its entirety and remand it back to this Board with specific recommendations for reconsideration*.)

Background:

AMTRAK has released the AMTRAK CONNECTS US plan to grow rail service across America. This 2035 VISION identifies expansion and enhancement of corridor routes that offers economically viable, frequent, reliable and sustainable passenger train service.

Amtrak has identified an Extension of the Heartland Flyer as an economically viable train for a connection with the Southwest Chief at Newton, Kansas, that will improve the performance of the national network. Economic analysis from Kansas University and Texas Transportation Institute have shown that an Extension of the Heartland Flyer would have a positive return on investment and a positive impact on the Kansas economy at both the state and local levels.

An Extension of the Heartland Flyer between Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and Newton, Kansas would add the cities of Edmund, Guthrie, Perry, Ponca City, Arkansas City, Wichita and Newton to the schedule. The development of a Northern Flyer train between Fort Worth, Texas and Kansas City, Missouri would qualify as a second round trip frequency for the route.

Amtrak has proposed 100% funding for the capital costs required for new corridor development.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-07

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY FOR EXPANSION OF AMTRAK PASSENGER RAIL SERVICE IN OKLAHOMA AND KANSAS.

WHEREAS, AMTRAK has released the AMTRAK CONNECTS US plan to grow rail service across America, and;

WHEREAS, this 2035 VISION identifies expansion and enhancement of corridor routes that offers economically viable, frequent, reliable and sustainable passenger train service, and;

WHEREAS, the 2035 Vision proposes adding 160 additional communities to the national rail network, and;

WHEREAS, Amtrak currently has the national capabilities and expertise in place to operate these new routes, and;

WHEREAS, Amtrak has identified an Extension of the Heartland Flyer as an economically viable train for a connection with the Southwest Chief at Newton, Kansas, that will improve the performance of the national network, and;

WHEREAS, economic analysis from Kansas University and Texas Transportation Institute have shown that an Extension of the Heartland Flyer would have a positive return on investment and a positive impact on the Kansas economy at both the state and local levels, and;

WHEREAS, an Extension of the Heartland Flyer between Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and Newton, Kansas would add the cities of Edmund, Guthrie, Perry, Ponca City, Arkansas City, Wichita and Newton to the schedule, and;

WHEREAS, the development of a Northern Flyer train between Fort Worth, Texas and Kansas City, Missouri would qualify as a second round trip frequency for the route, and;

WHEREAS, advance planning, study and development has already been accomplished, and;

WHEREAS, Amtrak has proposed 100% funding for the capital costs required for new corridor development, and;

WHEREAS, at least one independent study has been completed that determined the interest on the part of Kansas citizens for extending Amtrak passenger rail service from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma to Newton, Kansas; and;

WHEREAS, Departments of Transportation in Kansas and Oklahoma require evidence of community commitment for passenger rail service improvements, and;

WHEREAS, Amtrak has stated the urgent need in Congressional offices of demonstrated community desire of federally funded passenger rail service to be included in the Surface Transportation Reauthorization Act, and;

WHEREAS, the Departments of Transportation of Kansas and Oklahoma are currently updating State Rail Plans, and the Kansas Department of Transportation is updating a Service Development Plan for passenger rail, and, developing a Long Range Transportation Plan, and;

**Purpose:** Consent Agenda Item: Ratify SCK Health-recommended appointments of Brittany Carder and Bob Mathews to the South Central Kansas Medical Center Board of Trustees.

#### **Background:**

The City Commission on **September 15, 2020**, unanimously approved **Charter Ordinance No. 35**, which reorganizes the **South Central Kansas Medical Center Board of Trustees** to state that no more than two (2) city commissioners may serve on the Board at a time. Additionally, it specifies that each member shall serve a five-year (5) term and that one (1) such term shall expire on December 31 of each year.

To accomplish a transition to this system from the current Board that consisted of four (4) current commissioners and one (1) former commissioner, Charter Ordinance No. 35 provides that *"The initial terms of the trustees so appointed may be staggered in length from one to five years, so that only one trustee's term will expire each year. Otherwise, trustees shall normally serve terms of five years each."* 

Following two publications and the 60-day protest period prescribed by law, this Charter Ordinance became law in early **December 2020**, but the current Board composition has remained out of compliance throughout 2021.

SCK Health recently nominated Brittany Carder and Bob Mathews to be appointed to the Board of Trustees.

Mayor Rogers has no recommendations regarding these nominations and has referred the matter to the City Commission as a whole. One new member should be appointed for **four (4) years** and the other for **five (5)**.

All future appointments to the Board of Trustees would be for five-year (5) terms. Even if these appointments are tabled to **July 20** for further consideration, the new trustees could take office at the **July 22** SCKMC meeting.

If the commissioners do not wish to follow either or both of SCK Health's appointment recommendations, there are eight (8) other citizen candidates who have submitted interest forms that could be appointed in their stead.

**Purpose:** Consider second reading of a Resolution approving an agreement by and between the City of Arkansas City and TranSystems Corporation, of Wichita, for Professional Services to design and construct a Multimodal Transportation Master Plan for the City, utilizing Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas Pathways to a Healthy Kansas grant funds, for an amount not to exceed \$25,000. (Voice Vote)

# **Background:**

The City Commission on **May 5, 2020**, indicated support for a "Pathways to a Healthy Kansas" grant application, through RISE Cowley, in the amount of **\$25,000.00** for a Master Transportation Plan. On **May 19, 2020**, the Commission approved **Resolution No. 2020-05-3331**, approving the hiring of a technical consultant prior to **December 15, 2020**, to develop a Master Transportation Plan for the City, utilizing these awarded grant funds.

With the consent of Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas (BCSBSKS), which has already disbursed the grant funds, this deadline was extended to June 15, 2021, via the passage of **Resolution No. 2020-12-3377** on **December 15**, **2020**. BCBSKS Pathways Coordinator Virginia Barnes later approved an additional three-week (3) extension.

Should the overall cost of this work end up exceeding **\$25,000**, additional action from the Commission might be necessary, but community partners such as **RISE Cowley** and **USD 470** have indicated a possible willingness to assist with those costs. No work will occur outside the scope of the attached agreement without prior approval.

If the attached agreement is approved, the work will kick off at the **Traffic Safety Committee** meeting on **July 16**. While TranSystems gathers, collects and analyzes the relevant data, the City will be responsible for surveying citizens, convening public meetings and collecting other forms of community engagement to go into this plan.

Part of the outcome of this plan will be to identify areas that may need further engineering study in the future.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY, KANSAS, AND TRANSYSTEMS CORPORATION, OF WICHITA, FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES TO DESIGN AND CONSTRUCT A MULTIMODAL TRANSPORTATION MASTER PLAN FOR THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY, UTILIZING BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD OF KANSAS PATHWAYS TO A HEALTHY KANSAS GRANT FUNDS, FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$25,000.

**WHEREAS,** RISE Cowley, Cowley County's countywide health coalition, received a \$400,000 Pathways to a Healthy Kansas grant from Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas to implement locally between August 2017 and July 2020; and

**WHEREAS,** the goal of Pathways to a Healthy Kansas is to combine community-wide evidence-based solutions and promising practices for improving active living, healthy eating, and tobacco prevention in Kansas; and

**WHEREAS,** \$25,000 remains available to the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, and Cowley County from Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas (BCBSKS) in the Community Policy track of Phase 1 of the Pathways to a Healthy Kansas initiative; and

**WHEREAS,** the proposed Multimodal Transportation Master Plan would help to improve physical infrastructure for both pedestrian and bicycle travel by residents and visitors, as well as assist with better planning for future transportation grants, prioritization of projects for budgeting purposes and spurring further community engagement on this issue; and

**WHEREAS,** multi-use trails, pathways, and bicycle lanes have been proven to provide additional new business, tourism and economic development opportunities, as well as increased revenue to existing local businesses; and

**WHEREAS,** approval of the proposed Multimodal Transportation Master Plan will provide legitimacy and momentum in accessing state and federal grant funding toward achieving the construction and repair projects identified therein; and

**WHEREAS,** the professional services of a consultant are required to properly develop this Plan, assist with gathering community input, provide technical solutions to traffic safety concerns and identify new project funding sources; and

**WHEREAS,** the RISE Cowley Steering Committee, acting as the Community Policy Committee, unanimously consented during its meeting on May 12, 2020, to approve the proposed use of \$25,000 for this Master Transportation Plan; and

**WHEREAS,** the Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, on May 19, 2020, approved Resolution No. 2020-05-3331, approving the hiring of a technical consultant prior to December 15, 2020, to develop a Master Transportation Plan for the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, utilizing these grant funds which have now been received by the City; and

**WHEREAS,** a lack of responsive bids in the time frame allotted led City staff, BCBSKS and the Public Health Law Center to recommend a six-month extension to the deadline previously established in Resolution No. 2020-05-3331; and

**WHEREAS,** the Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, on December 15, 2020, approved Resolution No. 2020-12-3377, approving the hiring of a technical consultant on or prior to June 15, 2021, to develop a Multimodal Transportation Master Plan for the City of Arkansas City, utilizing grant funds which have been received by the City; and

WHEREAS, BCBSKS Pathways Coordinator Virginia Barnes later approved an additional three-week extension; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, now desires to approve an agreement by and between the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, and TranSystems Corporation, of Wichita, for Professional Services to design and construct a Multimodal Transportation Master Plan for the City, utilizing Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas Pathways to a Healthy Kansas grant funds, for an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE AFORESTATED PREMISES, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY, KANSAS: **SECTION ONE:** The Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, hereby authorizes the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, to enter into an agreement by and between the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, and TranSystems Corporation, of Wichita, for Professional Services to design and construct a Multimodal Transportation Master Plan for the City, utilizing Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas Pathways to a Healthy Kansas grant funds, for an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00.

**SECTION TWO:** The Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, hereby authorizes City staff of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, to take such further and other necessary actions that are required to effectuate the intent and purposes of this Legislative Enactment.

**SECTION THREE:** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from its date of passage by the Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas.

#### 1. Approve February Regular Meeting Minutes:

JoAnn made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 8, 2021, regular meeting as written. Rags seconded the motion, which was approved 5-0 on a voice vote. (Ethan joined the meeting in progress at 4:04 p.m. and Bob joined at 4:24 p.m.)

#### 2. Budgeting Survey Results (FlashVote):

**Roll Call:** 

Andrew presented the results of the second FlashVote survey and said staff still was not really surprised by any of the results. There were **122** respondents, or roughly 1 out of every 100 Arkansas City residents, for a margin of error of  $\pm 9$  percent.

He said staff would be meeting with TranSystems on May 14 to negotiate a scope of work for a Master Transportation Plan.

#### 3. Final Housing Assessment Tool Discussion:

Andrew introduced several special guests to the Board: Mike Crandall, Linda Misasi, Ron Niday, Landon West and James Cox, a Wichita State University student who is assisting the City with completing its Housing Assessment Tool (HAT).

Linda explained the role and purpose of the Cowley County CDDO (Community Developmental Disabilities Organization), which is one of 27 CDDOs through Kansas. As director, she oversees the CDDO's housing and resource assistance services.

She said the current average wait for services is **nine years**, **11 months**, so parents of I/DD children should begin the process as soon as possible. To facilitate this, she is working with schools and other entities to raise the education level about this.

The CDDO contracts with 17 direct providers, including **Mosaic** (which is overseen by Ron, who called in to the meeting), **Twin Rivers** (Lara McGrew), **Capper Foundation** (Mike Jones/Kathy Stempler) and **SouthWinds ResCare** (Crystal Irvin).

Mike Crandall explained what the Cowley County Council on Aging does (he is an Ark City representative). It is not involved in housing, like the South Central Kansas Area Agency on Aging, but he is heavily involved as a Meals on Wheels volunteer.

James Cox asked several questions and led a group discussion for the HAT report. In addition to the Board, Linda, Ron and Recreation Commission superintendent Landon West participated in this discussion. Ron explained how COVID has impacted Mosaic. He and Linda identified cost and accessibility as big problems for their constituents in housing. Randy said the CDBG grant that the City will be applying for soon can be used, in some instances, to make needed ADA improvements.

#### 4. Comprehensive Plan Discussion:

Andrew said the Planning Commission will be continuing its discussion of **Chapter 5**, "Parks and Recreation," and asked the Board if they had any comments or questions. Much of this discussion was tabled until the **June 10** meeting, which the Board decided to hold at the **Arkansas City Recreation Center** (with Landon's consent) so as to see the ACRC facilities firsthand.

#### 5. Tacolalah Executive Committee Report:

The next Tacolalah Executive Committee meetings will be at noon May 20 and noon June 3 at the Water Treatment Facility.

#### 6. Other Miscellaneous Items:

There was an extended discussion of ADA needs identified by this Board that still need to be addressed by showed the Board a webpage on the new City website that outlines all of the ADA accessibility features that are available.

Andrew asked if there was any further discussion about redesigning the Fair Housing flier, which he hopes to do in June.

Andrew said Capt. Eric Burr, interim chief of the Arkansas City Police Department, will visit with the Board on June 10.

Anita made a motion to adjourn the meeting. James seconded the motion, which was approved **7-0** on a voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at **5:20 p.m.** The next meeting of the Equal Opportunity and Accessibility Advisory Board will be at **4 p.m. June 10, 2021**.

- 1) <u>Call to Order: Approve the Agenda for Regular Meeting:</u> Andy Paton called the meeting to order at 7:00 a.m. Motion was made by Sandra Davis to approve the agenda as posted; seconded by Jason O'Toole motion passed.
- 2) <u>Approve the Minutes of the Previous Meeting</u>: Motion was made by Andy Paton to approve the minutes of the April meeting as submitted, seconded by Dustin Quint, motion passed.
- 3) <u>Public Comment</u>: None
- 4) <u>Financial Reports</u>: There was a line item for a new pitching mound in the financial report. All Board members were in approval of the purchase. Andy Paton made a motion to approve the Financial Report as presented. Seconded by Sandra Davis. Motion Passed.

5) <u>Consider Proposals & Bids:</u>

South Gym Roof: After locating some moisture in the bathroom of the south gym we were able to see water leaks coming from the roof. This problem is mainly in the area between the men's and women's bathrooms. ACRC reached out to two vendors for bids. Mahaney bid for seam repair, roof membrane and penetration points, and counter flashing. Bid total came to \$3,675.00. Thompson Construction was also contacted for a bid. Their bid was to seal around penetration points to prevent further leaks. Thompson's bid came to \$375.00. The board decided to acquire more bids from local roofers since the two bids that were obtained were for different repairs and vastly different amounts. Board suggested getting a bid from Bloyer & Sons Roofing and AC Roofing. Also, to look into benefits of patching vs. replacement, to look at the life of the roof compared to the life of the repairs we want to make. The board stated that as other bids come in, they can be sent and approved via e-mail.

South Gym Bathroom: The walls between the men and women's restrooms have softened due to the moisture from the roof leaks. The OSB board dividing the bathrooms has softened on the wall and on some of the ceiling of the restrooms. During inspection it was found that termites are present due to the moisture and food present. Pestmasters Aid-X has been notified and will return with another treatment once the roof leak and damage have ben repaired. ACRC had contacted two places to do the repair work. Handyman Services bid came in at \$4,800. He had stated he bid the job high due to current lumber prices. Ace Construction had not sent in their bid at the time of this meeting. The board decided that we need to postpone bathroom repairs until the roof has been fixed due to continued leaks and the possibility of additional termite damage.

PFC HVAC: It was found that one of the air conditioners units has gone out and needs replacement. During a recent service it was noted that both units are of the same age and the other compressor is also in need of repair. One furnace is 19 years old, and we requested replacement cost be included in the bids. With both units the same age we are looking to replace both. Two bids were provided to the board: Ark City Service: \$7,850.00 for compressors, \$1,00 for the furnace. Total Bid: \$9,650. Waldorf Riley \$9,580 for both compressors, add \$1,620 for the Furnace. Total Bid \$11,200. The Board suggested getting bids from all local entities before moving forward. John's Heating and Air has always been an active sponsor for youth sports and giving them a chance at the bid only seems fair. The Board also noted that this bid can be submitted via e-mail and voted on due to the urgency as well.

PFC Leg Ext and Curl Machine: The ACRC PFC has one leg extension and one leg curl machine. The manufacturer is no longer existing. Parts of these machines are costly and difficult to come by. A new machine would combine the two and create additional space in the PFC. We propose to purchase a leg extension/curl machine from Mid-States Fitness Equipment for the cost of \$3600. Sandra Davis motioned to approve this purchase, Andy Paton Seconded; Motion passed.

C Dow Complex West Sprinklers: ACRC is nearing completion of the sprinkler project at the Dow Sports Complex. After locating all the valves and lines, Boxman Lawn Service has provided as estimate to put the NW and SW fields into one system. Boxman will also do the winterizing and blow outs each year. Last year for that service they charged around \$200. The bid for the combination of field systems was \$2,304.90. If additional valves are found to be necessary, they will be \$130. Andy Paton motioned to accept this bid, Seconded by Sandra Davis. Motion passed.

Budget Planning RNR: Budget hearing with the board June 9th. Look at exacts and begin planning budget estimate. Andy Paton motioned to approve this meeting. Sandra Davis seconded. Motion passed.

6) <u>Review Superintendent report</u>: Landon's report to the board included the following:

FAC Summer programs are planned, and registration has started. One more Lifeguard training class is scheduled for June 1st and 2nd. As of now we are about 10 Lifeguards short, but all other positions have been filled. Work at PPP has started with painting and filling the pool with water. The pumps are also on and circulating. With the current economy it has been troublesome finding people to work the hours we need them to. With school ending late the pool is scheduled to open June 5th. IYQ camp is coming together, and activities are being planned for both IYQ and the PPP. IYQ training will be May 27th.

The Physical Fitness Center is looking to purchase a Precor Leg Extension/Curl machine before the year end. Both current machines need extensive work done to them and combining the two will be cost effective and provide more space in the gym. Silver Sneakers has stared up again with a small turn out, but attendance is expected to grow. The PFC was recognized as one of the Favorite Gyms in Cowley County.

Currently we have registrations going on for IYQ, Gymnastics, Swim Lessons, Golf, Tennis, Volleyball, Football and Volleyball and Basketball Camps. Baseball games kick off this week with the opening tournament Friday night and Saturday morning. We ended up with 25 baseball teams this season. Softball games will start after Memorial Day and end the week before the 4th of July. Due to registration numbers we had to make some changes to the age divisions for the older teams and so we have an 11U and a 15U division. We have a total of 18 teams in the Softball league. Our first basketball camp is June 28-30th with Kevin Washington for grades 3-12. A Corn Hole league is in the works and hoping to get it squeezed in for a quick June session on Thursdays at the American Legion.

The trench between the North and South buildings is still not what we are wanting it to look like. Landon has called CONCO and they are also not pleased with how it looks. They have said they will return to set anchors and fix the issues.

Swing for the Ring May '21 was not as big as we would have liked with only 6 total teams playing. We did a 9U and 10U age division tournament that was unfortunately cancelled Sunday due to the rain. We had more teams originally, but some backed out and with those the other age divisions did not make. However, the tournament was successful overall, and the venue was praised multiple times from all teams. The week following there had been multiple calls with interest in the June tournament. We are needing to bring back some good will that was lost in years past due to early cancelation calls and other things. We are pushing for a bigger and better June tournament!

We are opening a Full-time position for Aquatics Assistant to help relieve Deb. We are working on getting the job description finalized and posted as soon as possible.

#### 2. Adoption Update: Knebler Pond (WVDGA)

Andrew hasn't had a recent update, but thinks the course design is in progress. He will try to have more of an update in June.

#### 3. Poplar Fitness Trail & StoryWalk Signage:

Andrew introduced Lindsey, who helped to get the new Poplar Trail StoryWalk up and running through a grant as part of her Early Literacy Initiative at USD 470. As library director, Mendy helps to maintain it and Elena is assisting her as an intern.

Robin talked about her Juneteenth event on June 19 in Lovie Watson Park, which will feature a "pop-up" StoryWalk. She is using it as a demonstration project to help to raise funds for a permanent StoryWalk around the 1/16-mile trail in the park.

A previous location discussed for the next StoryWalk was always the trail at Veterans Memorial Lake, but Andrew said he thinks Lovie Watson Park might be a better fit now that the senior housing project has been built at Lake View Estates.

Lindsey showed some possible designs for a sign on Kansas Avenue to promote and guide people to Poplar Trail. Andrew said he would like the Board's input on the design, but the City can print these signs. The Board provided some feedback.

#### 4. Possible Little Free Library Locations:

As for Little Free Libraries, Lindsay is reaching out to local organizations to help sponsor these. The public library will "adopt" one of them and Elena will help with maintain the others. Possible locations include Ben Givens City Center Park, Paris Park, Pershing Park and Wilson Park. There are existing LFLs at City Hall and the Northwest Community Center.

Andrew said these last two have not been well stocked and maintained of late. He asked if the sponsoring organizations or Elena can move them around depending on usage rates. One possible location to move to may be the Senior Citizens Center.

#### 5. Review ADA Transition Plan: Pershing Park

The Boards reviewed the ADA Transition Plan recommendations for Pershing Park. Like many other parks, it was flagged for lack of curb ramps and some insufficient ADA access to and within the playgrounds. There are parking issues. While the Porta-Potty is not ADA accessible, there is a planned project in the future to build ADA-accessible restrooms at this park.

#### 6. Comprehensive Plan Discussion:

Andrew said **Chapter 5**, "Parks, Recreation, and Natural and Historical Resources," will be the main topic for the Board for the next one to two meetings. It will be split into two chapters. He gave a brief overview of Natural and Historical Resources.

He asked the Board to read through the Recreation section prior to the June 24 meeting so they will be prediscussion with ACRC director Landon West. That meeting will be at Veterans Lake and may also look at the Dow Complex.

Andrew and Josh continue to work on updating the park amenities list and design a better citizen survey. Josh said considerable attention needs to be paid by the Board to developing measurable goals and actions, with reasonable timelines. Andrew suggested that in the new Comprehensive Plan, this section's goals should be presented on a park-by-park basis.

Harrison raised concerns about usage of Lovie Watson Park between "competing" groups, including volleyball players. The Board brainstormed some possible solutions, including volleyball courts on the south side of Northwest Community Center.

Andrew said the City can look at incorporating something into its next revision of the Central Trail plans in that specific area.

#### 7. The Pollinator Project:

There was no discussion of this item.

#### 8. Tacolalah Executive Committee Report:

The next Tacolalah Executive Committee meeting will be at noon June 17 at the Water Treatment Facility.

#### 9. Other Miscellaneous Items:

Andrew said the Central Trail did not receive either grant he applied for. He is evaluating a new federal RAISE grant that could fund a project of at least \$1 million, with waived match for areas of persistent poverty and other equity considerations.

He also provided construction updates for Hike-Bike Trail Phase II and Wilson Park Master Plan Phase 1 Upgrades projects.

Candace made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Harrison seconded the motion, which was approved 3-0 on a voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at 4:49 p.m. The next regular meeting of the Beautification and Tree Advisory Board will be at 4 p.m. June 24, 2021.
