New Business

City Manager Department

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute a Quit Claim Deed on behalf of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, transferring approximately 0.26 acres of land to H.M. Villers, Jr. and Brody Villers by way of gift.

This City owns a small tract of land located at the intersection of 8th Street and Radio Lane, that for many years Mr. Villers, Jr. has maintained under an informal agreement, as explained by City Manger Frazer. Based on a review of its characteristics and lack of public utility, staff recommend declaring the parcel as surplus and transferring it to H.M. Villers, Jr. and Brody Villers via quit claim deed by way of gift or donation.

Motion made by Commissioner Spielman, seconded by Vice Mayor Stover to approve the item as written.

Voice Voting Aye: Mayor Beeson, Vice-Mayor Stover, Commissioner Spielman, Commissioner Tweedy III, and Commissioner Warren. Mayor Beeson declared the motion approved; given Resolution No. 2025-07-3728.

Ordinance repealing Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380, terminating the Summit Plaza Community Improvement District 2. sales tax in the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, pursuant to K.S.A. 12-6a26 ET SEQ.

City Manager Frazer explained that this action would repeal the 1-cent sales tax currently in place within the Summit Plaza Community Improvement District (CID), which includes Westlake Hardware and Dollar Tree. The termination of the CID sales tax originally established in 2015, has been recommended as the developer is close to reaching the \$750,000 cap in reimbursable project costs. Once approved and published, both the ordinance and a formal letter must be submitted to the state at least 90 days prior to the effective termination date in order for the sales tax to be officially discontinued.

Motion made by Mayor Beeson, seconded by Commissioner Tweedy III to approve the item as written.

Roll Call Voting Aye: Mayor Beeson, Vice-Mayor Stover, Commissioner Spielman, Commissioner Tweedy III, and Commissioner Warren. Mayor Beeson declared the motion approved; given Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638.

Fire/EMS Department

1. A Resolution authorizing the City of Arkansas City to accept a quote submitted by First Wireless, Inc. to purchase equipment and installation services for a new radio repeater, protective cabinets, and coax line repair, for an amount of \$28,538.70, excluding any additional shipping. (Voice Vote)

Fire Chief Cassaboom address the governing body noting that this radio equipment upgrade is essential to ensure dependable radio coverage for field units. The new protective cabinet, which will be located at the golf course tower site, will house equipment for both Fire-EMS and the Police Department. This project will restore full functionality and reliability to our communication systems, specifically Ops 5 and Ops 6 channels which are critical for daily operations and communication. Ops 5 is our primary fire operations channel, and Ops 6 serves as a backup and is also used for hospital communications. Chief Cassaboom further noted in the event Ops 5 fails, Ops 6 becomes the fallback, so maintaining at least one of them at all times is vital. This upgrade will bring the department radios up to date and significantly improve field communication reliability moving forward.

Motion made by Commissioner Warren, seconded by Commissioner Tweedy III to approve the item as written.

Voice Voting Aye: Mayor Beeson, Vice-Mayor Stover, Commissioner Spielman, Commissioner Tweedy III, and Commissioner Warren. Mayor Beeson declared the motion approved; given Resolution No. 2025-07-3729.

Public Services Department

A Resolution authorizing the City of Arkansas City to approve the bid from Buckley Roofing in the amount of \$191,790.00 and authorize the Mayor to execute a contract for the City Hall roof replacement project. (Voice Vote)

As a result of the severe wind, rain, and hailstorm that impacted much of Arkansas City on the evening of June 18, bringing hail as large as baseballs or larger, several municipal buildings, including City Hall, sustained damage. City staff have been working closely with insurance adjusters to assess the damage and obtain repair estimates. Public Services Director Tapia explained that the City Hall Roof is not insured due to its age and has not been re-roofed in the 25-years he has been with the City. Staff had already budgeted for this roof replacement prior to the storm hitting. Buckley Roofing was awarded the bid for the City Hall roof replacement project that will include high-quality 115-mil Carlisle Fleeceback TPO roofing system, tapered insulation, and a 20-year manufacturer labor and material warranty, including hail and puncture coverage.

Motion made by Vice-Mayor Stover, seconded by Commissioner Warren to approve the item as written.

Voice Voting Aye: Mayor Beeson, Vice-Mayor Stover, Commissioner Spielman, Commissioner Tweedy III, and Commissioner Warren. Mayor Beeson declared the motion approved; given Resolution No. 2025-07-3730.

City Manager Updates & Reminders

City Manager Frazer provided the following reminders and updates before the commission:

- 1. City staff across multiple departments including the City Clerk's Office, Neighborhood Services, Public Services, and Utilities, have been actively engaged in storm cleanup, damage assessments, permitting, and processing insurance claims following the June 18 hail and windstorm. Staff are commended for their hard work and dedication.
- Staff recently met with the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) in Topeka to discuss future 2. wastewater permitting requirements. Over the next two permit cycles the City will receive a new wastewater permit in 2028. During the 2028–2033 cycle, the City will likely be required to begin chemical treatment to control phosphorus. Starting in 2033, phosphorus limits will become a regulated component of the City's discharge permit. KDHE is encouraging nutrient trading strategies, which could involve working with upstream landowners to reduce runoff. Overall, the meeting helped provide clarity for long-term planning and potential cost implications.
- July 11 a budget-focused work session will be held during the regularly scheduled work session. Staff will present 3. updated figures and begin collecting Commission input on priorities for the upcoming budget.

- Consumer Price Index (CPI) trends handout provided: recent numbers indicate inflation is slowing. 6.
- 7. Hike & Bike Trail Phase II Project - Contractors began staging equipment behind the pool and marking the trail area. One initial issue occurred when the contractor mistakenly removed the pool fencing, which was quickly corrected. Progress was temporarily delayed by weather, and are now on tighter a timeline.

Steve Young of 1118 N 10th expressed support for recent street work near the golf course and 12th Street but raised concerns about long-term funding for street improvements. He suggested a sales tax might be a fairer way to fund road projects, as opposed to burdening homeowners with additional property or special taxes. Rising concerns for raises in construction costs, including roofing, and emphasizing the need for a sustainable, equitable funding plan moving forward.

Adjournment

Voice vote was unanimous in favor of the motion. Mayor Beeson declared the motion approved and meeting adjourned.

Background: The City of Arkansas City has negotiated the purchase of approximately 0.627 acres of land located at 2216 E. Chestnut Avenue from Patty K. Brown. The purpose of this acquisition is to support current and future municipal water supply needs in the area.

A Preliminary Real Estate Sales Contract was executed outlining terms of the agreement, including a purchase price of \$14,000. The City provided a 10% down payment (\$1,400) as outlined in Addendum #1, with the remaining \$12,600 due at closing. A formal survey was conducted by Professional Engineering Consultants to legally define the boundaries of the parcel.

A Quit Claim Deed has been prepared to formally transfer ownership to the city. Staff recommend approval of this transaction to secure the property for elevated water storage in the East Pressure Zone.

SECTION ONE: The City of Arkansas City is hereby authorized to accept a Statutory Quit Claim Deed from Patty K. Browm, owner of record for vacant property located 2216 E. Chestnut Avenue, Arkansas City, Cowley County, Kansas and legally described as, to-wit:

<u>Background</u>: The City of Arkansas City has provided fire protection services to Cowley County Rural Fire District No. 5 (RFD No. 5) through a series of agreements dating back to 2007. The current agreement, established through Addendum No. 3 in 2021, is set to expire on December 31, 2025.

City staff has negotiated a new five-year agreement with RFD No. 5 to continue providing fire protection and emergency response services from January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2031.

The new agreement maintains the service standards outlined in prior agreements but includes a revised funding structure. Specifically, the annual compensation to the City will increase from a 7.5 mill levy to a **7.8 mill levy** on all taxable tangible property within the fire district. This increase reflects rising costs related to equipment maintenance, personnel, insurance, general operational expenses and fire station improvements.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A NEW FIVE-YEAR AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY AND COWLEY COUNTY RURAL FIRE DISTRICT NO. 5, TO PROVIDE FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES TO THAT DISTRICT, INCLUDING AN INCREASE IN THE ANNUAL LEVY FROM 7.5 MILLS TO 7.8 MILLS.

WHEREAS, the City of Arkansas City has provided fire protection and emergency response services to Rural Fire District No. 5 (RFD No. 5), Cowley County, Kansas, through a series of agreements since 2007, commencing with Resolution No. 2007-05-2402, including addendums thereto; and

WHEREAS, the current agreement, established under Addendum No. 3, Resolution No. 2021-06-3414, is set to expire on December 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, representatives from the City and RFD No. 5 have negotiated a new five-year agreement to continue such services from January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2031; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into the new agreement which maintains the current service standards and includes an adjustment in compensation by increasing the annual mill levy from 7.5 mills to 7.8 mills on all taxable tangible property within the boundaries of RFD No. 5, to account for increased costs of service related to equipment maintenance, personnel, insurance, general operational expenses and fire station improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE AFORESTATED PREMISES, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

SECTION ONE: The Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City hereby authorizes the Mayor the City of Arkansas City to execute an Agreement with Cowley County Rural Fire District No. 5, Cowley County, Kansas, whereby the Arkansas City Fire Department will provide fire protection and response services to the area served by Rural Fire District No. 5 until December 31, 2031. Such Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION TWO: The Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, hereby authorizes the Mayor and/or City Manager of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, to take such further and other necessary actions that are required to effectuate the intent and purposes of this Legislative Enactment.

SECTION THREE: This Resolution will be in full force and effect from its date of passage by the Governing Body of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas.

AGREEMENT

FIRE SERVICES FOR COWLEY COUNTY RURAL FIRE DISTRICT NO. 5

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of July 2025, by and between the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "City" and Rural Fire District No. 5, Cowley County, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as "Fire District".

WHEREAS, the said Fire District is established and organized under the provisions of K.S.A. 19-3601 et seq. and all acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, which district is supervised by the Cowley County Board of Commissioners who constitutes the governing body of said Fire District pursuant to K.S.A. 19-3601 and all acts amendatory thereof a supplemental thereto.

WHEREAS, the said Fire District desired to receive from the City certain fire protection as hereinafter set forth, and the City is willing and able to furnish such fire protection, and both the fire District and the City desire to contract with reference thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and agreements of the parties hereto, the Fire District and City agree as follows:

SECTION ONE - TERM

This five-year agreement for Fire Protection Service shall commence on the 1st day of January 2026, and end on the 31st day of December 2031. Renegotiations for the extensions or renewal of this agreement shall commence on January 15th and be completed prior to March 15th of the year preceding the effective renewal date, so as to allow the City and the Fire District sufficient time for calculation and preparation of their respective annual budgets.

Either party to this Agreement may terminate the same by giving the other party notice on or before March 1st of the year preceding the effective renewal date. Notice shall be deemed given if delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the parties as follows:

City Manager, City of Arkansas City, 118 W. Central, Arkansas City, Kansas 67005;

County Administrator, Cowley County Courthouse, 311 E. 9th Avenue, Winfield, Kansas 67156.

SECTION TWO - FIRE PROTECTION

The City, during the effective term of this Agreement, shall make reasonable effort to furnish firefighting and related emergency services, utilizing paid on call and regular firemen employed by the City, and firefighting apparatus and equipment owned and operated by the City, all as the fire chief, or officer in charge may determine, to the District, **INCLUDING**, for structure fires, rural fire service by response with fighting apparatus, as applicable determined by the fire official in charge may determine, having a minimum pumping capacity of 50 G.P.M. (gallons per minute) and a minimum of 1,000 gallons of water. City has no obligation to attend fires where the value of the property which might be saved would be less than the cost to the City attending such fire. City shall not be obligated to respond to any fire call with equipment fighting a then existing fire, or where in the judgment of the fire official in-charge, a condition exists which would likely result in substantial damage to firefighting equipment or would deplete available fire fighting forces to an extent of unreasonably jeopardizing fire protection to the greater fire protection service area.

SECTION THREE - FEE

The Fire District shall annually make and pay to the City a 7.8 mill levy upon all of the taxable tangible property located within the fire district, specifically including the following:

- a) Motor Vehicle Tax levied pursuant to K.S.A. 79-5111;
- b) Recreational Vehicle Tax levied pursuant to K.S.A. 79-5123
- c) 16/20 Vehicle Tax levied pursuant to K.S.A. 79-5105(a).

Payments will be due within 15 working days after each and every tax distribution throughout the year by the County Treasurer of Cowley County, Kansas. Said monies shall be used by the City to assist in maintaining equipment, apparatus, salaries, insurance premiums, and any other items of expense connected with the services to be performed by the City of the Agreement.

SECTION FOUR – UNREPORTED BURNINGS

The Fire District shall advise all of its residents that any resident desiring to initiate a "controlled burning" of yards, pastures, or deteriorated buildings shall provide notice of burning in advance and upon completion thereof.

SECTION FIVE – <u>INDEMNITY</u>

To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, the parties hereto each agree to indemnify, protect, defend and hold the other harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, causes of action, suits, judgments and expenses, including attorney's fees caused by the negligence of said party.

SECTION SIX - DISTRICT'S PUBLICATION EXPENSES

The City shall pay the legal publication expenses of the Fire District which are required of the District to discharge its responsibilities under this agreement. District shall employ reasonable efforts to limit such expenses including but not limited to the use of summary ordinance/resolution when applicable.

SECTION SEVEN – FIRE REPORTS

The City agrees prior to April 1, following each calendar year included in the effective term of this agreement, to furnish the Fire District an annual report for each fire alarm responded to within said District including the nature, location, and other pertinent information concerning each such fire or alarm.

SECTION EIGHT - NON-EXCLUSIVE CONTRACT

This contract shall not be considered as exclusive, and the Fire District acknowledges that the City may enter into similar agreements with other fire districts, municipalities or governmental agencies.

SECTION NINE - INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The parties understand and agree that the services provided by City are as an independent contractor. City shall have absolute authority and discretion to determine how to perform the services provided herein. City may contract with other municipalities for the purpose of providing the same or similar services for which City has contracted herein.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed on their behalf respectively by the Mayor of the City of Arkansas City, Kansas, duly attested by the City Clerk, and by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, Cowley County, Kansas duly attested by the County Clerk, the day and year first above written.

Item: Ordinance Reinstating Summit Plaza CID Sales Tax &

Repealing Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638

Motion: An Ordinance repealing Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638 and thereby reinstating Ordinance No. 2015-02-

4380, relating to the Summit Plaza Community Improvement District Sales Tax in the City of Arkansas

City, Kansas, pursuant to K.S.A. 12-6a26 ET SEQ. (Roll Call Vote)

<u>Background</u>: The Summit Plaza Community Improvement District (CID) was created in 2015 under Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380, establishing a 1.0% CID sales tax to reimburse up to \$750,000 in eligible project costs on a pay-as-you-go basis. The CID was designed to sunset upon full reimbursement of project costs or 22 years from the start of tax collection, whichever occurred first.

City staff had confirmed that the full amount of eligible project costs had been close to being reimbursed to the developer. As such, the statutory condition for termination of the CID sales tax had been met which prompted the approval of Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638 on July 1, 2025, to and to align with the provisions of K.S.A. 12-189.

However, since then, City staff subsequently identified a clause in the original agreement requiring the reimbursement of interest to the developer at a previously established rate of seven percent (7%), in addition to the \$750,000 principal. While the principal is nearly paid off, the interest portion is still outstanding. That means the condition for ending the CID hasn't technically been met.

City staff now recommends reinstating the collection of the CID Sales Tax by repealing Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638, thus reinstating Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380, in accordance with the Act, to allow for the continued remittance of interest owed to the developer under the terms of the original agreement.

This Ordinance presented for approval will formally repeal Ordinance 2025-07-4638 and fully reinstate the 2015 CID, Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380. That this Ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after publication once in the official City newspaper. Once in effect, the City Clerk will notify the Kansas Department of Revenue State Director of Taxation of this repeal and reinstatement.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2025-07-4638 AND THEREBY REINSTATING ORDINANCE NO. 2015-02-4380, RELATING TO THE SUMMIT PLAZA COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT SALES TAX IN THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY, KANSAS, PURSUANT TO K.S.A. 12-6A26 ET SEQ.

WHEREAS, although the principal amount not to exceed \$750,000 is now close to being repaid, City staff subsequently identified a clause in the original agreement requiring the reimbursement of interest to the developer at a previously established rate of seven percent (7%); and

WHEREAS, City staff recommends reinstating the collection of the CID Sales Tax by repealing Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638, thus reinstating Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380, in accordance with the Act, to allow for the continued remittance of interest owed to the developer under the terms of the original agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body finds it to be in the best interest of the City to repeal Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638 and reinstate Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380 as originally enacted.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ARKANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. Repeal and Termination of Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638. Ordinance No. 2025-07-4638 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 2. Reinstatement of Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380. Ordinance No. 2015-02-4380 is hereby reinstated and shall be considered full force and effect as if it had not been repealed.

Section 3. Effective Date. That this Ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after publication of the Ordinance once in the official City newspaper. Upon the effective date of this Ordinance, in accordance with this section, the City Clerk shall provide notice of the repeal and reinstatement to the State Director of Taxation at the Department of Revenue.
