| Public Forum        | Sandra Gregory reported they had a board member retire from the Friends of the Bicentennial Trail group. They are ready and waiting for the extension to start. She also mentioned that the Dottie house is for sale and part of the Trail extends into that property so the City needs to keep an eye on that and make sure we can keep that part of the trail.   |
| Partner reports     | Soccer - Renee Cannon reported that Cheatham Soccer has begun practice. They have 28 teams with 230 kids and counting. Season will begin March 16 and go through May 18 <sup>th</sup> .  Softball - Matt Waldron reported that the last day for sign ups was 2/24/24 and they will have 6 or 7 teams this season. He reported that he went to the District Meeting with Diamond Youth Baseball where is learned a lot about State Tournaments and the amount of money that it brings to the City's that are hosting these events. The State Tournament will be held in Fairview this year and it will bring 5 or 6 million dollars of revenue into the city over the 5-day event. He said that he believes once the new fields are built and we can start putting in bids to host State Tournmanents that will bring a good source of revenue into Ashland City if we are able to host.  Basketball - Anthony Clark reported that baseball has started practicing. They are still waiting to hear from West Cheatham to see if they will have enough players to have a team if not they will move down to Ashland City.                      |
| Parks Reports       | <ol> <li>Anthony Clark reported that the boat ramp extension has been completed. The crew started last Sunday and finished up on Wednesday. This extension was to the road so that 2 boaters could unload at once. There will be a tournament on May 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> hosted by Cheatham County Chamber of Commerce and TN Bass Nation as well as an event June 9<sup>th</sup> through 15<sup>th</sup> hosted by the Cheatham Chamber of Commerce and the National Bass Tournament.</li> <li>Anthony Clark reported he is working the Public Works department on getting the concrete pad for Cheatham Soccer's storage unit.</li> <li>Anthony Clark reported they are still waiting on 1 signature from RJ Corman to begin the trail extension. He reported that Mayor JT Smith, TDOT and Mayor McCarver have all attempted to reach out to RJ Corman to get signature but have not been able to get it.</li> <li>Anthony Clark stated they are currently getting bids to fix the pavement on the trails where roots have come through or parts have broken off. There are around 100 spots that need repaired.</li> </ol> |
