1. Caldwell Park

This nature center will consist of a log cabin style building at the first item built and to add on in the future years. Mrs. Crisp was present and stated she had previously entertained donating money to the City and will do it again. Mr. Smith stated he felt a rough estimate for the proposed building would be \$120,000.00. Mrs. Crisp stated she would commit to \$120,000.00 if council approves the proposal with the agreement the center would be named after her late husband. It was determined that Mr. Smith would get the proposal together on all aspects of the center and Mr. Stinson would look into possible grants.
