Call to Order	Michael Smith called the meeting to order at 6:00pm
Roll Call	Michael Smith, Renee Cannon, Brandy King, Matt Waldron, Valerie VanOstenbridge
Approval of agenda	Valerie VanOstenbridge made a motion to approve, Matt Waldron seconded by, approved by all.
Approval of minutes	Brandy King made a motion to approve, Valerie VanOstenbridge seconded by, approved by all.
Public Forum	None
Partner reports	Soccer – Renee Cannon reported that soccer started last weekend, they had a good turn out for their opening ceremonies and games. Soccer will skip this weekend, pictures will be April 5 th ther they will play till May 17 th , skipping April 19 th . She reported that they have 261 kids signed up. Softball – Matt Waldron reported that they have 3 teams this season, with 37 kids. Their season will start 4/4/25 ending 6/2/25. They will be hosting the 12u district tournament, June 12-15. He would like the parks department to drag the fields if possible, early in the morning when they are wet. Baseball – AC Clark reported baseball starts April 5 th .
Parks report	AC Clark reported that the new trail hasn't had any movement. Their zoom meeting has been canceled due to nothing new to report from TDOT. There was bridge that fell on the trail, insurance came out and looked at the bridge and turned in
	the paperwork. The parks can't do anything with the bridge until insurance gets with their expert to figure out why the bridge fell. Cheatham Dam campground opens 4/1/25.
	Old Business
Daddy/Daughter Mother/Son Dance	Renee Cannon reported there were around 100 people signed up for each event. The daddy daughter dance had a great turn out, the mother son one did not have as much of a turn out. She reported that we may need to look at doing 1 event next year and combine both dances at a bigger venue.
2025 Park Activities	AC Clark Nashville Symphony will be coming out April 17 th for a site visit to confirm if they will be able to set up at Riverbluff. AC will get with the Pig Out in the Park vendors to see if they would rather move this to fall instead of the summer.
	 AC Clark reported he would like to add the following: Sips & Strokes – hot chocolate and paint (for kids) November Firetruck water day – as long as insurance approves it the fire department is ok. He reported that the fire department would do little obstacle courses for the kids to do. Adult Kickball League CoEd – 10 weeks on Wednesday or Sunday
	Renee Cannon reported that Food Truck Mondays start 4/7/25, we have 12 vendors signed up. With a good variety and the majority said they will be there each Monday. AC Clark asked that she check with them to see if they wanted to be in the parking lot or by the pavilion. Renee Cannon also reported she will get the permit guys to make sure they are all set.
Committees	Michael Smith reported he wants to keep this open to be able to jump into using committees if needed for events. He would like to create a town beautification committee to help clean up the town and add some new items to the town. He would like to invite the town business owners to getheir input and see what they would like to see.
	Valerie VanOstenbridge would said the approach to the business is very important and she doesn't want to stress them out more. She said we need to look at ways to get them motivated to get on board and let me see this is going to be good for the town.
