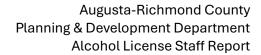

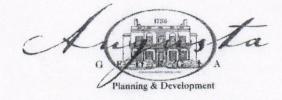

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS:

• Any person desiring to own, operate, conduct, or carry on in Augusta, Georgia, the business of offering or providing massage therapy, before doing so shall have in his/her possession the current operator's license. A licensee holding an operator's license under this chapter is not authorized or licensed to actually perform the massage therapy on the customers of the massage therapy business unless such licensee also holds a massage therapy license. Any person other than an exempt person, employed or otherwise engaged by a massage therapy business to perform massage therapy on menders of the public shall, prior to engaging in such activity, have in person's possession, a then current massage therapy license issued by the Augusta-Richmond County Commission. A licensee holding a massage therapy license is not licensed to own, operate, conduct, or carry on a massage therapy business without an operator's license. Any massage therapy business which does not maintain an office in Augusta-Richmond County, but which sends a massage therapist into Augusta-

Richmond County to provide massage therapy on an outcall basis, must possess an operator's License. Any person providing massage on an outcall basis must possess a massage therapy license.

Qualifications for Operator's License, Section 6-4-3

- Must be at least 18 years of age and have received a high school diploma or graduate equivalency diploma.
- Must be a citizen of the United States or alien lawfully admitted.
- Must show ownership in the business.
- Consent to criminal background check. No operator's license shall be issued to any person convicted of or pleading guilty or nolo contendere to any charge under any federal, state, or local law within ten (10) years prior to filing date of the application for an operator's license.
- No operator's license shall be issued to any person who has had any license under the police powers of Augusta revoked within two (2) years to filing the application for an operator's license,
- If a person in whose name an operator's license is issued is not a resident of Augusta, such person must appoint and continuously maintain in Augusta a registered agent upon whom any process, notice or demand required or permitted by law or under this chapter may be served.
- An operator's license may be denied where it appears to the Augusta-Richmond County Commission
 that the applicant does not have adequate financial strength or adequate financial participation on
 the proposed business to direct ad manage is affairs, or where it appears that the applicant is
 intended or likely to be a surrogate for a person who would not otherwise qualify for an operator's
 license.
- At the time of filing the application for an operator's license and thereafter, the applicant must have in his/her employ or under a binding contract, a person who holds a massage therapy license for the applicant if the operator's license is granted.

FINACIAL IMPACT: The applicant will pay an administrative fee of \$120.00 for the Massage Operator's License, and a fee based on estimated gross revenue reported.

presents a significant maintenance challenge and cost burden for Augusta. Recreation has partnered with Infrastructure Systems Management (ISM) to identify underutilized parks/facilities that may be candidates for divestment.

Analysis: ISM has previously presented a Divestment Matrix evaluation tool (most

recently on April 29, 2025). The final component needed to complete the matrix was the park usage data that consisted of one to two months of data

collection. Recreation and ISM will present the results of the usage

monitoring and review initial findings of the analysis.

Background: The Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department is transitioning from legacy

AFFF, which contains PFAS, to fluorine-free foam (F3) to comply with the

FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018, FAA Part 139 requirements, EPA environmental regulations, and Georgia House Bill 458. To facilitate this transition, the ARFF vehicles will undergo decontamination using industry-recognized procedures for cleaning PFAS. Once this process is completed, the ARFF vehicles must be immediately refilled with a MILSPEC-approved

foam listed on the Qualified Product List (QPL) to ensure ongoing

operational readiness and maintain FAA certification.

Analysis: To maintain FAA Part 139 compliance and ensure uninterrupted ARFF

operational readiness, Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department requires the direct procurement of Solberg 3% Synthetic Fluorine-Free Foam (SFFF). This product is unique as one of the only fluorine-free foams listed on the Department of Defense Qualified Products List (QPL) under MIL-F-24385F, confirming its proven performance against jet fuel fires and compatibility with existing ARFF proportioning systems, nozzles, and pumps without costly modifications. Ten-8 Fire and Safety LLC serves as an authorized master regional distributor for Solberg 3% SFFF and is the sole vendor capable of providing the required quantities with manufacturer-backed support, warranty compliance, and delivery aligned with the airport's decontamination schedule. Procuring through Ten-8 is both operationally necessary and cost-effective, as substitution with non-QPL products would

result in noncompliance, require extensive equipment upgrades, and jeopardize ARFF emergency response capabilities.

Executive Summary ECT2 Decontamination of ARFF Trucks

Augusta Regional Airport's Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) unit is implementing a comprehensive plan to replace its legacy aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF), which contains harmful per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), with Solberg 3% Synthetic Fluorine-Free Foam (SFFF). This transition supports compliance with FAA, EPA, state, and NFPA regulations, while aligning with environmental best practices to eliminate PFAS contamination risks.

The selected F3 foam is MIL-SPEC-approved, FAA Part 139 compliant, and fully compatible with existing ARFF equipment, allowing for a seamless switch without requiring significant hardware modifications. The transition, scheduled from August 2025 through March 2026, will follow three strategic priorities:

- 1. Procurement and Storage Secure approximately 3,200 gallons of Solberg 3% SFFF, establish a climate-controlled storage facility with secondary containment, and ensure proper labeling and documentation. Foam delivery is targeted for late 2025.
- 2. Personnel Training Conduct a comprehensive training program from October to December 2025, combining classroom instruction on foam chemistry, performance, and SOP updates with hands-on live-fire drills to ensure operational readiness before deployment.
- 3. Vehicle Conversion and Decontamination Engage contractor ECT2 in January 2026 to decontaminate three ARFF vehicles and two AFFF storage tanks using proprietary PFAS-removal technology proven to achieve up to 99% PFAS reduction. Wastewater and solid waste will be collected for compliant off-site disposal. Vehicles will be refilled, tested for proper proportioning, and sequentially returned to service to maintain continuous ARFF coverage.

The plan emphasizes regulatory compliance, environmental stewardship, and operational continuity. Upon completion, all ARFF resources will operate exclusively with F3 foam, eliminating PFAS hazards from airport firefighting operations, enhancing firefighter safety, and ensuring readiness for FAA inspections. This proactive approach positions Augusta Regional Airport as a leader in sustainable, compliant ARFF operations.

1.0 Project References

ECT2 has extensive experience working with municipal, military, and industrial customers to provide bench scale proof of concept, on-site pilot demonstration of technology, and full-scale treatment systems that have resulted in the treatment of over 10 billion gallons of water for PFAS compounds to date, ECT2 has experience with AFFF cleaning focused on ARFF vehicles. Some examples of that experience are listed below. ECT2 is actively supporting multiple contracts for this service now, so by the time your Augusta vehicles are being cleaned the number of ARFF vehicles cleaned by ECT2 will be over 30.

ECT2 Cleaning Chemistry and Method Development

The 2020 NDAA established firm timelines for the Department of Defense to phase out the procurement and use of PFAS-containing firefighting foams. In response, ECT2 began research efforts to develop effective, yet pragmatic, treatment chemistries and procedures for cleaning residual PFAS compounds out of equipment. ECT2's R&D facility worked with the EPA on developing cost effective and best-in-class cleaning techniques to remove recalcitrant AFFF film from the inside of pipe materials. After testing over 30 blends of cleaning chemistry and optimizing the procedure, ECT2 has developed a more efficient and cost-effective methodology than

ECT2 evaluated the relative effectiveness of each solution with respect to PFAS mass removal and rebound (amount of PFAS mass that would contaminate the next liquid stored in that section of pipe). Figure 1 shows mass removal and % rebound for one of the soak tests. ECT2 also evaluated other cleaning processes to determine relative effectiveness, then combined those

alternative approaches.



studies to provide a customer-focused approach that is more effective than conventional triple rinse while generating less liquid waste to manage.

Our next steps included familiarization with the firefighting vehicles, building proprietary

cleaning equipment, and setting up a full-scale demonstration. In South Carolina, ECT2 had an opportunity to clean two of the same type and size ARFF vehicle side by side. One was cleaned with a conventional triple rinse. The other with the new ECT2 methodology and proprietary chemistry. These vehicles did not need to be placed immediately back into service, which enabled rebound testing as well. The results were excellent, and lessons learned were incorporated to enable further improvements. This methodology continues to be optimized and has been implemented on ARFF vehicles in 2024 as shown below.



ECT2 Full Scale Demonstration

ECT2 cleaned two OshKosh TI-3000 vehicles with 420-gallon foam concentrate tanks in January 2024. Generating 1/3 the waste when compared to triple rinse, ECT2's cleaning method with only a single rinse was statistically equivalent in initial reduction efficiency despite having more than 18x higher starting contamination levels. Additionally, the truck cleaned with the ECT2 cleaning solution included a much larger fraction of sulfonic PFAS compounds which are more difficult to remove from surfaces.

Oshkosh TI-3000 (Truck A – conventional triple rinse)

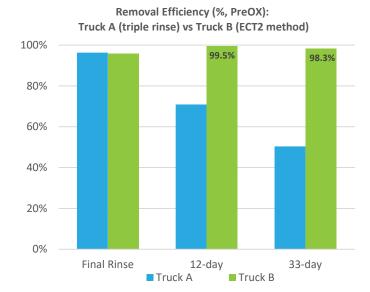


Figure 2 – Removal Efficiency and Rebound

Figure 2 shows that the 12-day rebound testing on those two foam tanks resulted in 71% removal efficiency for the triple rinse vs. <u>99.5% removal efficiency for the ECT2 method</u>.

33-day rebound testing further reduced the removal efficiency for the triple rinse to only 50% while the removal efficiency for the ECT2 solution was at 98.3%.

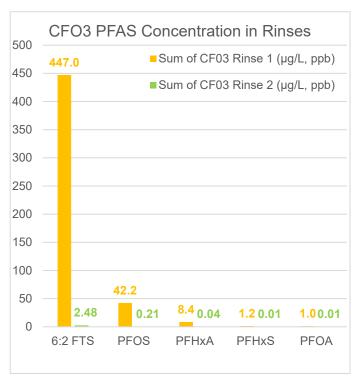

Naples FL CF03 E-One Titan 1500



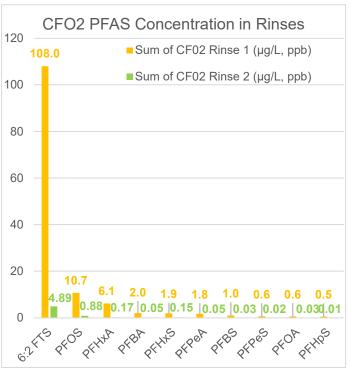

95% PFAS Removal Efficiency when comparing initial and final rinse concentrations. This vehicle had lower initial levels of contamination than we often see.





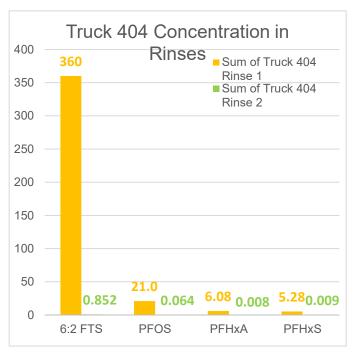

JBCC 404 Oshkosh Striker 1500 (210-gallon foam tank)



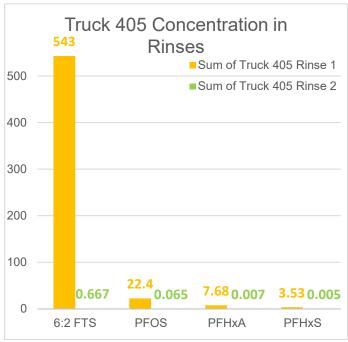

JBCC 405 Oshkosh Striker 3000 (420-gallon foam tank)



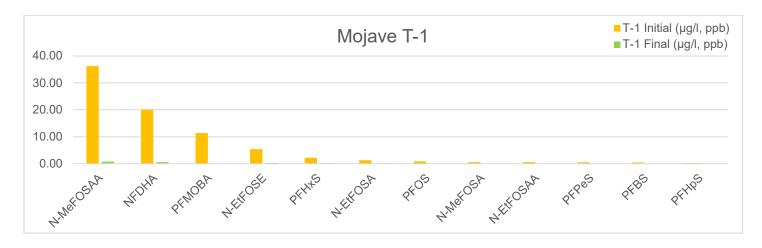

This memorandum justifies the sole-source procurement of 3,305 gallons of Solberg 3% Synthetic Fluorine-Free Foam (SFFF), a MIL-SPEC-certified product, from Ten-8 Fire and Safety, LLC. This procurement is essential for supporting the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department's transition from aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) to fluorine-free foam.

The Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department is transitioning from legacy AFFF, which contains PFAS, to fluorine-free foam (F3) in order to comply with the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018, FAA Part 139 requirements, EPA environmental regulations, and Georgia House Bill 458. To facilitate this transition, the ARFF vehicles will undergo decontamination using industryrecognized procedures for cleaning PFAS. Once this process is completed, the ARFF vehicles must be immediately refilled with a MILSPEC-approved foam listed on the Qualified Product List (QPL) to ensure ongoing operational readiness and maintain FAA certification.

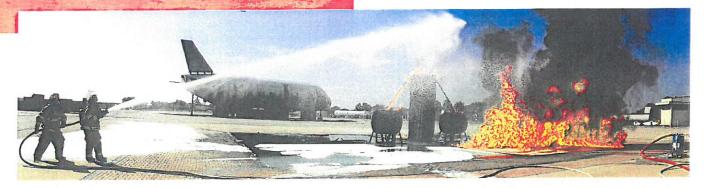

This memorandum justifies the sole-source procurement of 3,305 gallons of Solberg 3% Synthetic Fluorine-Free Foam (SFFF), a MIL-SPEC-certified product, from Ten-8 Fire and Safety, LLC. This procurement is essential for supporting the Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department's transition from aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) to fluorine-free foam.

The Augusta Regional Airport Fire Department is transitioning from legacy AFFF, which contains PFAS, to fluorine-free foam (F3) in order to comply with the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018, FAA Part 139 requirements, EPA environmental regulations, and Georgia House Bill 458. To facilitate this transition, the ARFF vehicles will undergo decontamination using industry-recognized procedures for cleaning PFAS. Once this process is completed, the ARFF vehicles must be immediately refilled with a MILSPEC-approved foam listed on the Qualified Product List (QPL) to ensure ongoing operational readiness and maintain FAA certification.

Justification

1. Product Uniqueness and Regulatory Requirements

- Solberg 3% SFFF is listed on the Department of Defense Qualified Products List (QPL)
 under MIL-F-24385F, confirming its performance against jet fuel fires.
- It was the first fluorine-free foam to be approved for ARFF operations by the DoD and is fully compliant with FAA Part 139.
- Solberg's formulation is compatible with existing ARFF proportioning systems, nozzles, and pumps, preventing the need for costly modifications.

2. Vendor Exclusivity

Ten-8 Fire and Safety is a master regional distributor authorized to sell Solberg 3% SFFF
in the needed quantities to Augusta Regional Airport.

4. Cost Effectiveness

- Procuring directly from Ten-8 prevents delays and eliminates additional costs associated with resellers or substitutions.
- Any deviation from Solberg 3% SFFF could result in noncompliance with FAA Part 139, requiring extensive upgrades to the trucks and equipment, and disrupting the ARFF operational readiness timeline.

The system proposed for Augusta Regional Airport includes redundancy and modular design, affording your personnel with the latest digital technology that is extremely flexible and functional, built around standard operating procedures. The system can grow with your facility and will continue to provide unprecedented freedom of expandability moving forward. We have based this budgetary pricing upon the scope of work provided to KOVA, Corp.

CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITIES

All transport wiring (Ethernet or fiber) between the core system and any endpoints (including PoE+ switches, UPS, etc.,) will be the responsibility of the Airport. Terminations for each end point will be CAT6 or better RJ-45 male or female, depending on the type of endpoint. It is recommended cable or any receptacles are red in color to distinguish them as dedicated outlets for the Emergency Alert System. Any Ethernet to fiber conversions in the transport path between the server and the endpoints are the responsibility of the customer. On the core side, each endpoint, modem or PoE+ switch endpoint should be terminated on an RJ-45 modular (male) connector within the rack or cabinet which will house the Emergency Alert system servers. The purpose of this memorandum is to provide justification for the sole source procurement of the KOVA Emergency Alert Notification System (KEANS) for Augusta Regional Airport. The system is designed to enhance emergency communication, improve compliance with FAA Part 139, and ensure a rapid and coordinated response across airport stakeholders.

Justification

1. Vendor Uniqueness and Capability

KOVA, Corp. is the original equipment manufacturer (OEM) and sole provider of the KEANS system. The KEANS platform is proprietary and cannot be replicated by third-party vendors. It includes critical features such as:

- Immediate, simultaneous alerts to ARFF, Airport Marshals, Operations, and other agencies.
- Redundant modular architecture tailored for airport operations.
- Seamless integration with Everbridge and other emergency management tools.
- Expandable endpoints, including phones, tablets, strobes, horn speakers, and mobile applications.

No alternative vendor can supply the proprietary KEANS software, licensing, servers, and direct manufacturer support necessary for implementation.

2. GSA Contract Compliance

The KEANS solution is offered under GSA Contract **GS-35F-011BA**, valid through March 1, 2026. This ensures federal compliance, competitive pricing, and approved government contracting standards. Procurement through GSA streamlines acquisition and provides price assurance.

3. Operational Necessity

The KEANS system replaces outdated, manual call-down notification processes with automated, multi-channel communication. This includes pre-recorded loudspeaker announcements, direct ring-down lines, email/SMS notifications, and tablet-based two-way communication. Such capabilities are essential to:

- Meet FAA Part 139 emergency notification requirements.
- Reduce response times in critical events.
- Ensure operational continuity and safety for passengers, staff, and the traveling public.

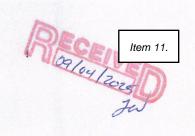

Background: Section 1-10-57 requires the Department to notify the Augusta Commission

> of emergency procurements. Emergency procurements are authorized where there is an imminent threat to public health, welfare, or safety, or to prevent interruption of essential services. Three such procurements were executed for

Recreation & Parks facilities.

1. Henry Brigham Swim Center Boiler Repairs

Vendor: Professional Boiler Services, Inc.

Scope: Disassembly, cleaning, and repair of the pool boiler; replacement of damaged components including wiring and flame safeguard control; installation of new burner tray and vent

modifications. Amount: \$22,313.60

2. Elevator Code Compliance (AAC, DLRP)

Vendor: TK Elevator Corporation

Scope: Installation of door lock monitoring systems on scoring tower elevators and aquatic center elevator to meet ASME A17.3-2015 safety requirements effective January 1, 2025. Amount: \$44,400.00

3. Augusta Aquatics Center – Desert Air Unit Repairs

Vendor: Trane Company

Scope: Replacement and repair of critical Desert Air Unit components, including belts, coils, filters, phase monitor,

transformers, compressor, and safety systems.

Amount: \$67,968.00

Each procurement was conducted under emergency authority due to the immediate need to maintain safe and continuous operation of public facilities. Alternative procurement methods were not feasible because:

• At Diamond Lakes and the Aquatic Center, compliance with new state elevator safety code was required to keep facilities operational.

Analysis:

Financial Impact: Total expenditures: \$134,681.60, with funds available in departmental

accounts as indicated in the respective purchase orders

Alternatives: No alternatives were feasible. Delay in procurement would have caused

unsafe conditions, service interruptions, or code compliance violations.

This letter provides you with Professional Boiler Services, Inc. concerns and recommendations to remedy reoccurring failure and damage of pool heater boiler at your facility.

We have been servicing your boiler for many years and have replaced it 3 times. It is in our opinion that grass clippings, dust, and other airborne debris are being pulled into the combustion chamber of the boiler by natural draft required for proper combustion. This in turn provides a condition of burnt matter sticking to the heat exchanger and building to a point where natural combustion air flow is restricted overheating the unit and ultimately the damage that has been occurring. There have been 2 different boiler manufacturers' equipment at your facility with the same condition occurring. This problem has been relayed to county personnel many times and efforts have been attempted to eliminate the condition.

I have contacted Laars, the current boiler manufacturer, and discussed the problem that is happening. We are both in agreement that a building should be erected with filtered combustion air louver system to eliminate the elements from entering the burner chamber. This building should be properly engineered for this purpose to ensure proper air flow for the combustion.

I have provided a revised quote for the boiler repairs after the building is constructed. We can also proceed to repair the boiler per the original quote with the addition of a replacement burner tray assembly, but another imminent failure would be expected. Professional Boiler Services will provide the repairs you request but highly recommend a building being part of the decision.

If Company shall be unable to carry out any material obligation under this Agreement due to an Event of Force Majeure, this Agreement shall at Company's election (i) remain in effect but Company's obligations shall be suspended until the uncontrollable event terminates or (ii) be terminated upon ten (10) days' notice to Customer, in which event Customer shall pay Company for all parts of the Services furnished to the date of termination. An "Event of Force Majeure" shall mean any cause or event beyond the control of Company. Without limiting the foregoing, "Event of Force Majeure" Includes: acts of God; acts of terrorism, war or the public enemy; flood; earthquake; lightning; tornado; storm; fire; civil disobedience; pandemic insurrections; nots; labor disputes; labor or material shortages; sabotage; restraint by court order or public authority (whether valid or invalid), and action or non-action by or inability to obtain or keep in force the necessary governmental authorizations, permits, licenses, certificates or approvals if not caused by Company and the requirements of any applicable government in any manner that diverts either the material or the finished product to the direct or indirect benefit of the government.
- 19. General. Except as provided below, to the maximum extent provided by law, this Agreement is made and shall be interpreted and enforced in accordance with the laws of the state or province in which the Services are performed without regard to choice of law principles which might otherwise call for the application of a different state's or province's law. Any dispute arising under or relating to this Agreement that is not disposed of by agreement shall be decided by litigation in a court of competent jurisdiction located in the state or province in which the Services are performed. To the extent the premises are owned and/or operated by any agency of the United States Federal Government, determination of any substantive issue of law shall be according to the United States Federal common law of Government contracts as enunclated and applied by Federal judicial bodies and boards of contract appeals of the Federal Government. This Agreement contains or Government contracts as enunciated and applies by recernifications and coules and coules and coules and phease of the receins government. This Agreements, commitments and understandings of the parties and supersedes all previous understandings, commitments or agreements, or all or written, related to the Services. No documents shall be incorporated herein by reference except to the extent Company is a signatory thereon. If any term or condition of this Agreement is invalid, illegal or incapable of being enforced by any rule of law, all other terms and conditions of this Agreement will nevertheless remain in full force and effect as long as the economic or legal substance of the transaction contemplated hereby is not affected in a manner adverse to any party hereto. Customer may not assign, transfer, or convey this Agreement, or any part hereof, without the written consent of Company. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their permitted successors and assigns. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which when executed shall be deemed to be an original, but all together shall constitute but one and the same Agreement. A fully executed facsimile copy hereof or the several counterparts shall suffice as an original. No modifications, additions or changes may be made to this Agreement except in a writing signed by Company. No failure or delay by the Company in enforcing any right or exercising any remedy under this Agreement shall be deemed to be a walver by the Company of any right or remedy.
- 20. Federal Requirements. The Partles shall comply with all United States federal labor law obligations under 29 CFR part 471, appendix A to subpart A. THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS ARE INCORPORATED HEREIN BY REFERENCE: Executive Order 11701 and 41 CFR §§ 60-250.5(a), 60-300.5; Executive Order

11758 and 41 CFR § 60-741.5(a); U.S. immigration laws, including the L-1 Visa Reform Act of 2004 and the H-18 Visa Reform Act of 2004; and Executive Order 13496. The Parties shall abide by the requirements of 41 CFR 60-300.5(a) and 60-741.5(a). These regulations prohibit discrimination against qualified individuals based on their status as protected veterans or individuals with disabilities. Moreover, these regulations require that covered prime contractors and subcontractors take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment individuals without regard to protected veteran status or disability. If the Services are in connection with a U.S. government contract, Customer agrees and hereby certifies that it has provided and will provide current, accurate, and complete information, representations and certifications to all government officials, including but not limited to the contracting officer and officials of the Small Business Administration, on all matters related to the prime contract, including but not limited to all aspects of its ownership, eligibility, and performance. Anything herein notwithstanding, Company will have no obligations to Customer unless and until Customer provides Company with a true, correct and complete executed copy of the prime contract. Upon request, Customer will provide copies to Company of all requested written communications with any government official related to the prime contract prior to or concurrent with the execution thereof, including but not limited to any approval from Company prior to providing any government official any information about Company's performance of the Services that are the subject of this offer or agreement, other than the Proposal or this Agreement.

22. Limited Walver of Sovereign Immunity. If Customer is an Indian tribe (in the U.S.) or a First Nation or Band Council (in Canada), Customer, whether acting in its capacity as a government, governmental entity, a duly organized corporate entity or otherwise, for itself and for its agents, successors, and assigns: (1) hereby provides this limited waiver of its sovereign immunity as to any damages, claims, lawsuit, or cause of action (herein "Action") brought against Customer by Company and arising or alleged to arise out of the furnishing by Company of any product or service under this Agreement, whether such Action is based in contract, tort, strict liability, civil liability or any other legal theory; (2) agrees that jurisdiction and venue for any such Action shall be proper and valid (a) if Customer is in the U.S., in any state or United States court located in the state in which Company is performing this Agreement or (b) if Customer is in Canada, in the superior court of the province or territory in which the work was performed; (3) expressly consents to such Action, and waives any objection to jurisdiction or venue; (4) waives any requirement of exhaustion of tribal court or administrative remedies for any Action arising out of or related to this Agreement; and (5) expressly acknowledges and agrees that Company is not subject to the jurisdiction of Customer's tribal court or any similar tribal forum, that Customer will not bring any action against Company in tribal court, and that Customer will not avail itself of any ruling or direction of the tribal court permitting or directing it to suspend its payment or other obligations under this Agreement. The individual signing on behalf of Customer warrants and represents that such individual is duly authorized to provide this waiver and enter into this Agreement and that this Agreement constitutes the valid and legally binding obligation of Customer, enforceable in accordance with its terms.

SECURITY ADDENDUM

This Addendum shall be applicable to the sale, installation and use of Trane equipment and the sale and provision of Trane services. "Trane" shall mean Trane U.S. Inc. for sales and services in the United States, or Trane Canada ULC for sales and services in Canada.

 Definitions. All terms used in this Addendum shall have the meaning specified in the Agreement unless otherwise defined herein. For the purposes of this Addendum, the following terms are defined as follows:

"Customer Data" means Customer account information as related to the Services only and does not include HVAC Machine Data or personal data. Trane does not require, nor shall Customer provide personal data to Trane under the Agreement. Such data is not required for Trane to provide its Equipment and/or Services to the Customer.

"Equipment" shall have the meaning set forth in the Agreement.

"HVAC Machine Data" means data generated and collected from the product or furnished service without manual entry. HVAC Machine Data is data relating to the physical measurements and operating conditions of a HVAC system, such as but not limited to, temperatures, humidity, pressure, HVAC equipment status. HVAC Machine Data does not include Personal Data and, for the purposes of this agreement, the names of users of Trane's controls products or hosted applications shall not be Personal Data, if any such user chooses to use his/her name(s) in the created accounts within the controls product (e.g., firstname.lastname@address.com). HVAC Machine Data may be used by Trane: (a) to provide better support services and/or products to users of its products and services; (b) to assess compliance with Trane terms and conditions; (c) for statistical or other analysis of the collective characteristics and behaviors of product and services users; (d) to backup user and other data or information and/or provide remote support and/or restoration; (e) to provide or undertake: engineering analysis; failure analysis; warranty analysis; energy analysis; predictive analysis; service analysis; product usage analysis; and/or other desirable analysis, including, but not limited to, histories or trends of any of the foregoing; and (f) to otherwise understand and respond to the needs of users of the product or furnished service, "Personal Data" means data and/or information that is owned or controlled by Customer, and that names or identifies, or is about a natural person, such as: (i) data that is explicitly defined as a regulated category of data under any data privacy laws applicable to Customer; (ii) non-public personal information ("NPI") or personal information ("PI"), such as national identification number, passport number, social security number, social insurance number, or driver's license number; (iii) health or medical information, such as insurance information, medical prognosis, diagnosis information, or genetic information; (iv) financial information, such as a policy number, credit card number, and/or bank account number; (v) personally identifying technical information (whether transmitted or stored in cookies, devices, or otherwise), such as IP address, MAC address, device identifier, International Mobile Equipment Identifier ("IMEI"), or advertising identifier; (vi) biometric information; and/or (vii) sensitive personal data, such as, race, religion, marital status, disability, gender, sexual orientation, geolocation, or mother's maiden name.

"Security Incident" shall refer to (i) a compromise of any network, system, application or data in which Customer Data has been accessed or acquired by an unauthorized third party; (ii) any situation where Trane reasonably suspects that such compromise may have occurred; or (iii) any actual or reasonably suspected unauthorized or illegal Processing, loss, use, disclosure or acquisition of or access to any Customer Data.

"Services" shall have the meaning set forth in the Agreement.

- HVAC Machine Data: Access to Customer Extranet and Third Party Systems. If Customer grants Trane access to HVAC
 Machine Data via web portals or other non-public websites or extranet services on Customer's or a third party's website
 or system (each, an "Extranet"), Trane will comply with the following:
 - a. Accounts. Trane will ensure that Trane's personnel use only the Extranet account(s) designated by Customer and will require Trane personnel to keep their access credentials confidential.
 - b. <u>Systems</u>. Trane will access the Extranet only through computing or processing systems or applications running operating systems managed by Trane that include: (i) system network firewalls; (ii) centralized patch management; (iii) operating system appropriate anti-malware software; and (iv) for portable devices, full disk encryption.
 - c. <u>Restrictions</u>. Unless otherwise approved by Customer in writing, Trane will not download, mirror or permanently store any HVAC Machine Data from any Extranet on any medium, including any machines, devices or servers.
 - d. Account Termination. Trane will terminate the account of each of Trane's personnel in accordance with Trane's standard practices after any specific Trane personnel who has been authorized to access any Extranet (1) no longer needs access to HVAC Machine Data or (2) no longer qualifies as Trane personnel (e.g., the individual leaves Trane's employment).
 - e. <u>Third Party Systems</u>. Trane will provide Customer prior notice before it uses any third party system that stores or may otherwise have access to HVAC Machine Data, unless (1) the data is encrypted and (2) the third party system will not have access to the decryption key or unencrypted "plain text" versions of the HVAC Machine Data.



- 3. Customer Data: Confidentiality. Trane shall keep confidential, and shall not access or use any Customer Data and information that is marked confidential or by its nature is considered confidential ("Customer Confidential Information") other than for the purpose of providing the Equipment and Services, and will disclose Customer Confidential Information only: (i) to Trane's employees and agents who have a need to know to perform the Services, (ii) as expressly permitted or instructed by Customer, or (iii) to the minimum extent required to comply with applicable law, provided that Trane (1) provides Customer with prompt written notice prior to any such disclosure, and (2) reasonably cooperate with Customer to limit or prevent such disclosure.
- Customer Data: Compliance with Laws. Trane agrees to comply with laws, regulations governmental requirements and industry standards and practices relating to Trane's processing of Customer Confidential Information (collectively, "Laws").
- 5. Customer Data: Information Security Management. Trane agrees to establish and maintain an information security and privacy program, consistent with applicable HVAC equipment industry practices that complies with this Addendum and applicable Laws ("Information Security Program"). The Information Security Program shall include appropriate physical, technical and administrative safeguards, including any safeguards and controls agreed by the Parties in writing, sufficient to protect Customer systems, and Customer's Confidential Information from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification or disclosure. The Information Security Program shall include appropriate, ongoing training and awareness programs designed to ensure that Trane's employees and agents, and others acting on Trane's, behalf are aware of and comply with the Information Security Program's policies, procedures, and protocols.
- 6. Monitoring. Trane shall monitor and, at regular intervals consistent with HVAC equipment industry practices, test and evaluate the effectiveness of its Information Security Program. Trane shall evaluate and promptly adjust its Information Security Program in light of the results of the testing and monitoring, any material changes to its operations or business arrangements, or any other facts or circumstances that Trane knows or reasonably should know may have a material impact on the security of Customer Confidential Information, Customer systems and Customer property.
- Audits. Customer acknowledges and agrees that the Trane SOC2 audit report will be used to satisfy any and all
 audit/inspection requests/requirements by or on behalf of Customer. Trane will make its SOC2 audit report available to
 Customer upon request and with a signed nondisclosure agreement.
- 8. Information Security Contact. Trane's information security contact is Local Sales Office.
- Security Incident Management. Trane shall notify Customer after the confirmation of a Security Incident that affects
 Customer Confidential Information, Customer systems and Customer property. The written notice shall summarize the
 nature and scope of the Security Incident and the corrective action already taken or planned.
- 10. Threat and Vulnerability Management. Trane regularly performs vulnerability scans and addresses detected vulnerabilities on a risk basis. Periodically, Trane engages third-parties to perform network vulnerability assessments and penetration testing. Vulnerabilities will be reported in accordance with Trane's cybersecurity vulnerability reported process. Trane periodically provides security updates and software upgrades.
- 11. Security Training and Awareness. New employees are required to complete security training as part of the new hire process and receive annual and targeted training (as needed and appropriate to their role) thereafter to help maintain compliance with Security Policies, as well as other corporate policies, such as the Trane Code of Conduct. This includes requiring Trane employees to annually re-acknowledge the Code of Conduct and other Trane policies as appropriate. Trane conducts periodic security awareness campaigns to educate personnel about their responsibilities and provide guidance to create and maintain a secure workplace.
- Secure Disposal Policies. Trane will maintain policies, processes, and procedures regarding the disposal of tangible and intangible property containing Customer Confidential Information so that wherever possible, Customer Confidential Information cannot be practicably read or reconstructed.
- 13. Logical Access Controls. Trane employs internal monitoring and logging technology to help detect and prevent unauthorized access attempts to Trane's corporate networks and production systems. Trane's monitoring includes a review of changes affecting systems' handling authentication, authorization, and auditing, and privileged access to Trane production systems. Trane uses the principle of "least privilege" (meaning access denied unless specifically granted) for access to customer data.
- 14. <u>Contingency Planning/Disaster Recovery</u>. Trane will implement policies and procedures required to respond to an emergency or other occurrence (i.e. fire, vandalism, system failure, natural disaster) that could damage Customer Data or any system that contains Customer Data. Procedures include the following

- 16. <u>Background Checks</u> Trane shall take reasonable steps to ensure the reliability of its employees or other personnel having access to the Customer Data, including the conducting of appropriate background and/or verification checks in accordance with Trane policies.
- 17. DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES. EXCEPT FOR ANY APPLICABLE WARRANTIES IN THE AGREEMENT, THE SERVICES ARE PROVIDED "AS IS", WITH ALL FAULTS, AND THE ENTIRE RISK AS TO SATISFACTORY QUALITY, PERFORMANCE, ACCURACY AND EFFORT AS TO SUCH SERVICES SHALL BE WITH CUSTOMER. TRANE DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL OTHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES WITH RESPECT TO THE SERVICES AND THE SERVICES PROVIDED HEREUNDER, INCLUDING ANY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, OR THAT THE SERVICES WILL OPERATE ERROR-FREE OR UNINTERRUPTED OR RETURN/RESPONSE TO INQUIRIES WITHIN ANY SPECIFIC PERIOD OF TIME.
