The procedure that the City follows to demonstrate whether to issue a Consistency letter is described under PLAN Section 6.1 (Local Procedures for Demonstrating Facility Consistency with Solid Waste Management Plan). The site meets City zoning requirements for this specific use. Site land use rezoning and special exception use was approved in May 2022.</li> </ul>
Analysis:	<ul> <li>Review of information submitted by Renovatio Solution. LLC (RSL) on June 12, 2023 (Copy attached) suggests the proposed Waste to Energy (Biofuel) production operation has the potential of improving the Augusta area environment. In addition, submitted information indicates initial diversion of limited quantity of waste from Augusta Deans Bridge Road landfill (Augusta Facility), however, information also indicates certain waste volume will be generated as byproduct waste that will be disposed of at the Augusta Facility. In summary, submitted information indicates a proposed operation minimum impact on the Augusta Facility. Hence, Augusta Engineering &amp; Environmental Services Department is not objecting to Augusta issuing requested consistency letter.</li> </ul>

#### **INTRODUCTION:**

Renovatio Solutions LLC (RSL) is a privately formed Georgia firm that is seeking to advance the USA renewable energy targets by utilizing its property at 1680 Dixon Airline Road, Augusta-Richmond County, Georgia, to develop a renewable fuel project whereby organic waste streams from MSW and biomass waste will be processed to produce renewable natural gas (RNG) or compressed natural gas (CNG) and other co-products.

It should be noted that the Georgia legislature passed Bill 274 in 2011, amending the Georgia Code (Part 1, Article 2 of Chapter 8 of Title 12) that banned yard trimmings from MSW landfills and allowing the disposal of trimmings at lined MSW landfills with operating landfill gas collection systems. The bill states that it was designed to encourage beneficial reuse and promote bioenergy and renewable energy goals.<sup>1</sup> The City of Augusta and Richmond County promote technologies that will reduce or eliminate the need to place these materials in landfills.

# How the proposed facility or facility expansion will meet the specific goals and/or needs identified in the current Solid Waste Management Plan, including a description of:

#### The impact upon the collection capability within the planning area.

There will be no significant impact upon the collection capability within the planning area. At the time of RSL's application to the Augusta Planning and Development Department for rezoning and Special Exception Use at the property, (approved in May 2022), the proposed residential MSW collector was not depositing its collected trash at the Augusta Landfill facility.

#### The impact upon disposal capacity identified in the planning area.

The operation of the proposed biorefinery by RSL will have minimal impact in the planning area. The residential MSW entity that will supply RSL's biorefinery with waste is reported to be disposing approximately 2,080 TPY of waste to Augusta Landfill.

The diversion of that amount of waste to RSL's biorefinery will be negligible for the landfill as the biorefinery is expected to deliver approximately 4,896 TPY of preprocessed non-organic & non – recyclable waste each year to Augusta Landfill.

This slight increase in deposit to the landfill will represent additional revenue for the City of Augusta.

# The impact to the waste reduction and recycling efforts within Augusta, specifically how the proposed facility or facility expansion will contribute toward waste reduction in the planning area.

The proposed residential waste collector currently delivers a small portion of its total waste to Augusta Landfill.

By implementing its biorefinery in Augusta-Richmond County, RSL facility will serve to satisfy some sections of Augusta Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP) goal # 2 – Waste Reduction.

## How the proposed facility or facility expansion and its operation will impact the community. Specifically, it will address:

# The impact to vehicle traffic and public safety around the proposed facility and throughout the planning area;

RSL petition referenced Z-22-25 was approved and an Ordinance referenced 7825. Ordinance 7825, Section II (2) states that "the developer shall provide a completed Traffic Assessment Form to the Traffic Engineer of the Augusta Engineering Department to assess traffic impact study for the development depending on the information provided in the Traffic Assessment Form."

The completed Traffic Impact Worksheet study was prepared by Infrastructure Systems Management, LLC and submitted by RSL to the Augusta Engineering Department in September 2022.

#### The impact on natural or cultural resources within the planning area.

A Phase I ESA was performed at the project site and the findings confirmed that there are no contaminants, no historical artifacts nor any endangered species on the property.

## The impact to the financial viability of the existing solid waste management system within the planning area, both public and private;

The financial viability of Augusta Landfill and other similar facilities in the planning area will not be negatively impacted. In fact, the Augusta Landfill would gain financially due to a slight net increase in waste deposit to that facility.

Other existing facilities will not be affected as RSL's residential MSW collector does not make delivery to those locations.

#### The impact to individual and business solid waste management rates.

There will be no impact to individual and business solid waste management rates as RSL proposed biorefinery tipping fees will be comparable those of the City of Augusta.

## The impact on the current solid waste management infrastructure within the planning area, both public and private.

The impact will be negligible on the current solid waste management infrastructure within the planning area because the proposed biorefinery will be sited close to an area already approved

Thus, building the proposed \$37MM new facility will have a positive impact on the City's tax revenue inflow from a new tax payer.

## Evidence that the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited in a location deemed suitable according to the criteria listed in this plan.

The proposed facility will be sited in an area that is deemed suitable according to the criteria listed in Augusta Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP).

In fact, RSL proposed project site is located close to an approved construction & demolition (C & D) landfill – Dixon Airline Recycling LLC which is reported in Section 5.2 of Augusta SWMP – page 53) to be included in the current planning area for such activities.

Further, a topographic survey was commissioned by RSL for the property located at 1680 Dixon Airline Road, Augusta-Richmond County, GA 30906. The findings confirmed that the proposed project location is not located within the 100 year flood plain.

# Evidence that the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited in an area deemed suitable location consistent with local zoning ordinances.

This project is being proposed for development at a property that was rezoned from Agricultural (A) to Heavy Industrial (HI) by the Augusta Planning and Development Department in May 2022. In addition, the property was approved for Special Exception Use to develop a biorefinery at 1680 Dixon Airline Road, Augusta-Richmond County, Georgia 30906.

An Ordinance, referenced 7825, signed May 17, 2022, confirms the amendment to the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance adopted by Augusta, Georgia Commission (effective September 16, 1997) regarding the changing of the Comprehensive Zoning Map from Zone A (Agricultural) to HI (Heavy Industrial) for property located at 1680 Dixon Airline Road, GA 30906.

# Evidence that the proper public notification was given, including notification of all adjacent property owners.

The Augusta Planning and Development Department published in the Augusta Chronicle April 14, 2022 edition as well as erected signage at 1680 Dixon Airline Road, GA 30906 to notify and invite feedback from the public regarding the rezoning of this property from Zone A to HI.

There was no negative feedback from the public regarding this proposed development.

## Chapter 6 LAND LIMITATION ELEMENT

Georgia requires that municipalities "identify those sites which are not suitable for solid waste handling facilities based on environmental and land use factors" in their SWMP. Not all geographic locations are suitable or desirable for a waste management infrastructure, which may include disposal, composting, recycling, and material recovery facilities.

SWMPs play a key role in planning and managing the potential locations of waste management facilities. The Association of County Commissioners of Georgia has stated:

Outside of zoning and land-use (ordinances), a SWMP is the only planning document that has specific legal authorization to govern the siting and operation of a solid waste handling facility within a community. The state may not issue any permits, grants, or loans for any MSW disposal facility or any solid waste handling equipment or recycling equipment that is not consistent with a local SWMP. Counties wishing to manage solid waste facilities that are not permitted by the EPD may want to use their plan and local licensing or ordinances to enforce these provisions of their SWMPs.

The Georgia DNR has multiple rules which address siting limitations and criteria for siting, design, and operating requirements for solid waste handling facilities. In addition, DNR Rule 391-3-4-.05(1)(a) requires that the siting of solid waste handling facilities "must conform to all local zoning/land use ordinances."

### 6.1 LOCAL PROCEDURES FOR DEMONSTRATING FACILITY CONSISTENCY WITH SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

No solid waste handling facility or expansion to an existing facility can be sited in Augusta without a determination that the proposed facility or expansion is consistent with the current SWMP. The procedure that Augusta and each of the local governments follow to determine whether to issue such a letter is described below.

- 1. At least 90 days prior to filing for a solid waste handling permit, or notifying EPD in the case of a solid waste handling facility that is permitted by rule, the owner/operator will submit to the County a written statement documenting the following:
  - How the proposed facility or facility expansion will meet the specific goals and/or needs identified in the current Solid Waste Management Plan, including a description of:
    - The impact upon the collection capability within the planning area.
    - The impact upon disposal capacity identified in the planning area.
    - The impact to the waste reduction and recycling efforts within Augusta, specifically how the proposed facility or facility expansion will contribute toward waste reduction in the planning area.

- How the proposed facility or facility expansion and its operation will impact the community. Specifically, it will address:
  - The impact to vehicle traffic and public safety around the proposed facility and throughout the planning area;
  - The impact on natural or cultural resources within the planning area.
  - The impact to the financial viability of the existing solid waste management system within the planning area, both public and private;
  - The impact to individual and business solid waste management rates.
  - The impact on the current solid waste management infrastructure within the planning area, both public and private.
- Evidence that the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited in a location deemed suitable according to the criteria listed in this plan.
- Evidence that the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited in an area deemed suitable location consistent with local zoning ordinances.
- Evidence that the proper public notification was given, including notification of all adjacent property owners.
- 2. Within 45 days after the written statement from the owner/operator is received, Augusta Engineering Committee will make a recommendation as to whether the proposed facility or facility expansion is consistent with the SWMP. This recommendation will be documented in a letter to the governing body of the jurisdiction in which the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited. To make a determination, the Engineering Committee will conduct a process that at a minimum includes the following:
  - Determine if the operation of the proposed facility or facility expansion would be consistent with regulations established by the County for privately operated waste handling and disposal facilities as provided for in County Ordinance
  - Determine the need for the proposed facility or facility expansion, based on projected remaining useful life of existing disposal facilities, will be the initial screen for any finding of consistency with this solid waste management plan. Need will be defined as less than 10 years of disposal capacity remaining, at the time that the request is submitted, in existing disposal facilities recognized in this solid waste management plan. Remaining disposal capacity will be calculated based on an engineering calculation of remaining capacity divided by the annual rate of disposal of in-County and contracted out-of-county waste at the time that the request is submitted given waste reduction programs and performance in place at that time;
  - Determine if the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited in an area deemed unsuitable according to development criteria;
  - Determine if the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited in a location that is consistent with all local zoning ordinances;

- Determine if the proposed facility or facility expansion may negatively impact other natural or cultural resources of the County;
- Determine if the proposed facility or facility expansion would negatively impact the County's ability to contribute to the state-wide solid waste reduction;
- Determine if proposed facility or facility expansion may negatively impact the financial viability of the County's solid waste management system
- Hold at least one public hearing on the proposed facility to gather input regarding the consistency of the facility with the SWMP. This public hearing will be advertised according to local requirements regarding public notification of public hearings;
- Determine if the proposed facility or facility expansion is properly insured so that closure and post-closure care is assured;
- Determine if the proposed facility or facility expansion has a mitigation plan above and beyond financial assurance already required;
- Evaluate the past performance of other waste handling facilities owned or operated by the applicant as a determining factor the feasibility of the new facility or facility expansion. The Committee may recommend withholding approval based on owner or operators past performance;
- Determine if the proposed facility or facility expansion is in the best interest of public health and safety;
- 3. The governing body of the jurisdiction in which the proposed facility or facility expansion is sited shall review the written documentation of consistency from the owner/operator, the recommendation of the Engineering Committee, and comments received at the public hearing to determine whether the proposed facility or facility expansion is consistent with the SWMP. Within 30 days of making their determination, the governing body shall notify the facility owner/operator whether the proposed facility or facility expansion is consistent with the Plan. If the governing body of the jurisdiction determines that the proposed facility or facility expansion is consistent with the SWMP, the governing body will issue a letter of consistency.
- 4. If the governing body of the jurisdiction determines that proposed facility or facility expansion is not consistent with the SWMP, the owner/operator may address the inconsistencies and resubmit their request for another review. This review will follow the process described above in Items 1 thorough 3.

### 6.2 INVENTORY AND NATURAL ENVIRONMENTAL LIMITATIONS

### 6.2.1 INVENTORY LAND AREAS

Augusta occupies a land area of 207,386 acres, or 324.04 square miles (sq. mi), with an additional 2,823 acres (4.41 sq. mi.) of water area.  On May 15, 2001, Augusta Commission adopted a resolution that established the Solid Waste Management District and establish assessment of the annual cost of waste collection against property owners. Established annual cost and charges rate was \$195.00 per year per unit. Service area consists of "Urban Service District" and targeted "Suburban Service District".

ii) On December 19, 2005, adopted a resolution establishing appropriate rate of charge by full and partial unit for solid waste collections services and other purposes. The resolution included provision making up solid waste collection funds deficit and repayment of 2004 solid waste bond. The resolution established annual cost and charges rate was \$276.00 per year per unit (for a full service unit) and subject to annual adjustment using the customer price index (CPI).

iii) On July 8, 2013, Augusta Commission adopted a resolution to provide an appropriate fee system and exemption(s) from services for collection of solid waste, recyclables and other purposes. The resolution also established a county wide waste collection service area effective June 1, 2013. The resolution also includes provisions covering cost of Environmental Services provided functions (including repayment of Revenue Bonds) in this fee based system; services such as repayment of solid waste 2004 & 2010 Revenue Bonds, and funding Environmental Services Operations. Other key provisions are:

a) The resolution directs and authorizes Environmental Services Director to establish policies regarding "fees and charges for functions provided through Environmental Services".

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE AN APPROPRIATE FEE SYSTEM AND EXEMPTION(S) FROM SERVICE; TO REAFFIRM THE USE OF THE APPROVED CONTRACT FOR ENGAGING CONTRACTORS FOR THE COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLABLES IN AUGUSTA; AND OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Augusta Commissioners that there is a need in Augusta to continue to develop and promote the efficient and environmentally safe management of solid waste by various means including the collection, recovery, utilization and disposition of solid waste and recycling and to promote commerce and industry by continuing the collection, processing and disposal of solid waste in an efficient and environmentally sound manner; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Augusta Commissioners that the financing of projects provided by the Regional Solid Waste Management Authorities Act (A.C.G.A Section 12-8-50, et seq.) is necessary for the public good and general welfare of Augusta and will promote the general welfare of the State of Georgia; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Augusta Commission that it is in the public interest and is vital to the public welfare of the people of Augusta and the State of Georgia to collect, transport, manage and dispose of solid waste and to recover and utilize resources contained in solid waste and thereby develop and promote for the public good and general welfare, trade, commerce, industry and employment opportunities in Augusta; and

WHEREAS, the Augusta Commission, does by this Resolution take official notice that the solid waste and recyclable collection system as implemented has resulted in a cleaner Augusta community and has thereby promoted the public health, safety, and welfare of Augusta; and

WHEREAS, any interruption in solid waste collection would present a public health emergency in Augusta which the Commission desires to avoid and does not have its own resources readily available to take over solid waste and recycling collections; and

WHEREAS, the current solid waste collections contract has been a model contract for the inclusion of local and/or small businesses as desired by the Augusta Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Augusta Commission believes that the success of the ESD programs is directly attributed, and a reflection of the day to day diligence, efforts and contributions of the employees who manage, assist, and perform functions for the citizens, the department and the contractor(s); and

WHEREAS, Augusta Georgia has established a solid waste service area, which has been extended county wide; and will enter into new contracts beginning June 1, 2013 for contractors to provide uninterrupted solid waste and recyclable collection services; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to offer its citizens a more streamlined and inclusive service, the Augusta Commission has chosen to modify services to include one-time per week garbage collection, offering various sizes of containers as well as multiple types of services and providing services to all of Augusta, either directly or through exemption, provided however that the properties within the city limits of Hephzibah and Blythe shall be granted an automatic exemption from service unless a request for service is made by the city for the entire city; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to get back to a platform of community interaction and provide a consistent service, tires have been removed from contracted collection and the Environmental Services Department (ESD) shall engage the community through local community events; and

WHEREAS, the disposal expense (associated with Fund 542 and revenues of Fund 541) were committed to repay bonds to develop additional landfill space and collect methane from said landfill, which are utilized by said solid waste collections contractors for disposal purposes, with a portion of said funds pledged to secure repayment of the Solid Waste Authority bonds, 2004 and 2010 series; and

WHEREAS, the Augusta Commission believes in educating the public, businesses and developers of its available programs and requirements through various methods of marketing, to include the placement of information regarding solid waste services in the development guidelines for acknowledgement by all developers prior to plan approval; and

WHEREAS, the Augusta Commission is committed to waste reduction and recycling efforts by offering an incentive based recycling program, single stream recycling, as well as, the establishment of satellite recyclable drop off locations at select Augusta facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Augusta Commission is committed to alternative fuels by utilizing this contract as a means of developing CNG infrastructure for Augusta, requiring collection vehicles to operate on said CNG, understanding that the contract term must be extended to a minimum length of 9 years to reasonably match the useful life of the collection vehicles thereby maximizing the benefits to Augusta; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Augusta Commissioners that there is a need to fund the ESD through a fee based system, where all property owners pay fees for services, in a similar fee based system, allowing for revenues for various ESD functions to be consolidated and collected through a single fee system; and

WHEREAS, the Commission understands that over the years there have been a variety of exemptions from solid waste and recyclable collections, and that starting a new contract with a series of program changes, yields the need to repeal all such exemptions issued prior to June 1, 2013, and all such exemptions shall be re-affirmed under the new programs rules and guidelines. Such exemptions shall be based on ESD Policies, which may be amended from time to time; and

Whereas, that the Director of Environmental Services is hereby directed and authorized to establish means to monitor, manage, regulate and enforce functions of the ESD, through contract enforcement, education programs, policies, procedures, rules, fees and ordinance enforcement, relevant to the solid waste and recycling contract and other functions of the ESD.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- The Augusta Commission requires that all Residential Unit(s) and Unoccupied Location(s) as defined by policy shall receive services provided by Augusta unless relieved of such requirement through government action or other policy to the contrary. Others, which may include small business, multi-family (above 5 units), mobile home parks (above 10 units) etc. may request, and be provided services from the ESD.
- 2. That the Director of Environmental Services is hereby directed and authorized to establish policies regarding fees and charges for functions provided through the ESD, which may be amended from time to time. Said fees shall be adjusted annually by an amount equal to the increase in the consumer price index as listed in the solid waste and recycling contract. In the event that franchise fees, taxes, in lieu of tax, regulatory fees or other governmental fees are imposed against the ESD; those costs may be amended into the ESD fees. Additionally, should the estimated amount of bad debt increase, the fees may be amended to reflect the anticipated increase in bad debt expense.
- 3. That the Augusta Commission hereby affirms and adopts the initial policies for fees and exemptions, attached hereinafter, which are incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. That the Augusta Commission hereby directs and authorizes the Director of Environmental Services to establish a billing system for the collection of fees and charges for solid waste and recycling collection services and other ESD functions, and said fees shall minimally cover the full cost of the ESD services and programs.
- 5. Augusta has set and the Contractor has agreed to a Local Small Business goal of 25%, in accordance with Augusta, GA Code 1-10-129 (d)(7).
- That the Augusta Commission authorizes the ESD Director to hold community events to collect scrap tires, neighborhood clean-up events, as well as other events to promote ESD programs and objectives.
- 7. The ESD may coordinate with other government agencies and departments to expand recycling initiatives, both to the government(s) as well as the public, through direct collection, or through drop off locations.

- 8. The Augusta landfill shall charge for disposal the actual amount of, but not less than \$3.0 million dollars annually, whichever is greater and said amount being subject to any increase in the annual adjustment using the consumer price index as set forth in the solid waste and recycling collections contracts.
- 9. That the Augusta Commission hereby directs and authorizes the Director of Environmental Services to establish policies relating to exemption(s) from specific services relating to solid waste and recycling collection and other Environmental Services functions. Said policy shall at a minimum address the cities of Hephzibah and Blythe (being granted city wide exemptions, until such time as the municipality requests such services as a whole), life safety and property safety which may be altered from time to time.
- 10. That the Director of Environmental Services may utilize the proceeds from the CNG station(s) to reinvest into alternative fuel infrastructure, alternative energy infrastructure, alternative fuel vehicles, alternative energy vehicles, hybrid vehicles or conversion technology either for vehicles or creating fuels for vehicles.
- 11. That the Augusta Commission authorizes and approves the ESD and contractors to enter private property to place, provide services, repair or retrieve Augusta owned property or other business as needed to perform or inspect serviced offered/provided by or through the ESD.
- 12. That the Augusta Commission hereby authorizes the Administrator to enter intergovernmental agreements for services offered by the ESD, when they believe it is in the best interest of Augusta.
- 13. This Resolution supplements and reaffirms any previous Solid Waste Resolutions and except where the terms of this Resolution conflict with said previous Resolution, the terms of this Resolution shall control.

# **PURPOSE:**

To provide a method to exempt locations from solid waste and recycling services based on defined criteria.

# SCOPE:

This policy applies to all "Residential Unit(s)" and "Unoccupied Location(s)" within Augusta.

# **POLICY:**

By resolution, all Residential Unit(s) and Unoccupied Location(s) within Augusta shall receive solid waste and recycling services, unless being granted an exemption by policy. It shall be the policy of the Environmental Services Department to charge for services provided unless an exemption is granted. A property owner may apply for an exemption relating to solid waste and recycling for;

- a. Long driveways in excess of 200 feet from the right of way. The driveway shall be measured from the closest portion of the dwelling to the right of way in the shortest distance commonly driven by a motor vehicle.
- b. A tract of land greater than 10 acres, used primarily for agricultural, forestry, or farming purposes under the GATE program, or equivalent, which may include a single contiguous parcel that is owned and occupied by the owner of said parcels.
- c. Areas where there is a high potential to damage property, and there are no other reasonable alternatives.
- d. Areas where there is a high potential risk to a person's safety, and there are no other reasonable alternatives.

An exemption will automatically be granted to all properties within the City limits of Hephzibah and Blythe, until such time that the respective municipal government(s) request said services from Augusta.

#### **PROCEEDURE:**

To become exempt from solid wastc and recycling services provided by the county, the following procedure shall be followed;

- a. The property owner shall request an exemption on the appropriate form, providing the requested information to prove they meet the requirements to become exempt. An exemption request must be received between January 1<sup>st</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup> of the current year, for the request to be considered timely. No prior period requests will be granted.
- b. Augusta will receive the request and schedule a customer service representative to review and validate the request.
- c. Once a determination has been made by the department regarding the exemption request, the department will notify the property owner of its findings.
- d. If an exemption is granted, charges will be removed from the later of the day the exemption request was approved or the day the cart was removed by Augusta.
- e. The Environmental Services Department retains the right to inquire and inspect any exempt properties from time to time, without prior notification to the customer, to verify the basis of continued exemption. Should a condition of exemption change, or the property owner does not retain a third party collection company, then the exemption may be revoked by Augusta.



#### "EXHIBIT A"

#### (Lot Ordinance)

Sec. 4-2-2. Unlawful dumping or storing of solid waste, or the accumulation of weeds and noxious vegetation on vacant lots, and unoccupied parcels of land.

a) Prohibition.

No owner of any vacant lot, undeveloped lot or unoccupied parcel of land within Augusta shall permit or allow the existence of excessive accumulation or untended growth of weeds, undergrowth or other plant life grow to a height exceeding twelve (12) inches; or stagnant water, rubbish, garbage, refuse, debris, trash, including but not limited to household furnishings, and all other objectionable, unsightly or unsanitary matter upon any lot, tract or parcel of land, or on the area between the lot or parcel of land and the street curb, be it uncovered or under open shelter, to the extent and in the manner that such lot, tract or parcel of land is or may reasonably become infested or inhabited by rodents, vermin or wild animals, or may furnish a breeding place for mosquitoes, or threatens or endangers the public health, safety, or welfare, or may reasonably cause disease, or adversely affects and impairs the economic welfare of adjacent property.

- b) Definitions.
  - Construction/Demolition Waste means waste building materials and rubble resulting from construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition operations on pavements, houses, commercial buildings and other structures. Such waste include, but are not limited to asbestos containing waste, wood, bricks, metal, concrete, wall board, paper, cardboard, and other non-putrescible wastes which have a low potential for groundwater contamination.
  - Lot/Parcel means any lot of record identified with a map and parcel number assigned by the Tax Assessor's Office.
  - Scrap Tire means a tire or portion thereof.
  - Tire means a continuous solid or pncumatic rubber covering designed for encircling the wheel of a motor vehicle and which is neither attached to the motor vehicle nor a part of the motor vehicle as original equipment.
  - Undeveloped Lot means a lot in its natural state, i.c.: a lot in a residential neighborhood that has not been built upon.
  - Unoccupied Parcel means a lot which has a structure/dwelling which is not occupied.
  - Vacant Lot means a previously developed Lot, once occupied with a structure/dwelling.

#### c) Duty of Property Owners Generally.

It shall be the duty of the owner of each Vacant Lot or Unoccupied Parcel of land to reasonably regulate and effectively control excessive growths and accumulations, as enumerated in Section 4-2-2 (a), on the property and on the portion of the adjoining public right-of-way between the property and the street. It shall also be the duty of the owner to drain, re-grade or fill any lot, tract, or parcel, including swimming pools thereon, which shall be unwholesome or unsanitary, have stagnant water thereon, or be in such other condition as to be susceptible to producing disease.

#### d) Notice.

Augusta shall notify in writing the owner of any Vacant Lot or Unoccupied Parcel of land within Augusta to comply with Section 4-2-2(a) to include but not be limited to cutting, destroying or removing any weeds, grass, trash, rubbish or noxious matter found growing, lying or located on such owner's property or upon the sidewalk or street rightof-way abutting the property within ten (10) days from the date of the annual notice. Notice will include a one direct mailing to the property owner's address on record, and other notices published throughout the year which may include an insert in the Property Tax Bill, a notice in other publications or billings, and publication in the newspaper, to the extent allowed by law. Upon the failure of the owner to do so, Augusta will cause such weeds, grass, rubbish or noxious matter to be cut, destroyed and/ or removed. Such *notice shall be deemed to be sufficient if it is mailed to the last owner of record on file in the office of the property appraiser.* 

#### e) Issuing of One-Time, Annual Written Notifications.

Augusta shall not be required to notify a property owner each and every time a property is in violation. A property owner will receive one written notice per parcel of land through an annual mailing. This serves as a notice for the entire year.

#### f) Removal of Weeds, etc. by Augusta.

If after ten (10) days from the date of the notice the conditions, as enumerated in Section 4-2-2 (a) and described in the notice, have not been remedied, the Director of Environmental Services or his designee shall cause the condition to be remedied by Augusta at the expense of the property owner; to include the removal of trash, filth, garbage or other refuse, and the chemical treatment, cutting down and abating from any private premises all weeds, including those growing thereon to a height exceeding twelve (12) inches whenever the owner of such premises or other person who is required by this chapter to cut down and remove the same fails or refuses to do so.

#### g) Cutting and Cleaning of Lots; Assessment of Costs: Liens.

Upon the completion of any combination of the removal, chemical treatment, cutting down, cleaning or abating by Augusta of any lot or parcel of land within Augusta by removing or abating therefrom; the excessive accumulation or untended growth of weeds, undergrowth or other plant life growing to a height exceeding twelve (12) inches; or stagnant water, rubbish, garbage, refuse, debris, trash, including but not limited to, household furnishings, scrap tires, construction/demolition waste, and all other objectionable, unsightly or unsanitary matter, the Director of Environmental Services or his designee shall certify the abatement of the offensive matter described above, specifying the lot or parcel so improved and the nature of the improvements. Thereafter, the improvements and the costs thereof, shall be assessed and appropriate action as necessary shall be taken to charge and collect monies for services provided by Augusta to abate the issue.

#### h) Enforcement.

The code enforcement division of the Environmental Services Department as well as the License and Inspection Department is hereby authorized and directed to carry out the

provisions of sections 4-2-2 hereof, as may be deemed reasonable by the Director of the department.

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i) Violation; Penalty.

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In addition to causing the condition of the property to be remedied as authorized in subsection (f), the enforcement officer may make a case against the offending party and upon trial and conviction thereof, the offending party shall be subject to the penalties provided by section 1-6-1.

  - d. The property has no dwelling.

## **FYI: Process Regarding Request for Proposals**

### Sec. 1-10-51. Request for proposals.

Request for proposals shall be handled in the same manner as the bid process as described above for solicitation and awarding of contracts for goods or services with the following exceptions:

- (a) Only the names of the vendors making offers shall be disclosed at the proposal opening.
- (b) Content of the proposals submitted by competing persons shall not be disclosed during the process of the negotiations.
- (c) Proposals shall be open for public inspection only after the award is made.
- (d) Proprietary or confidential information, marked as such in each proposal, shall not be disclosed without the written consent of the offeror.
- (e) Discussions may be conducted with responsible persons submitting a proposal determined to have a reasonable chance of being selected for the award. These discussions may be held for the purpose of clarification to assure a full understanding of the solicitation requirement and responsiveness thereto.
- (f) Revisions may be permitted after submissions and prior to award for the purpose of obtaining the best and final offers.
- (g) In conducting discussions with the persons submitting the proposals, there shall be no disclosure of any information derived from the other persons submitting proposals.

### Sec. 1-10-52. Sealed proposals.

(a) Conditions for use. In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 36-91-21(c)(1)(C), the competitive sealed proposals method may be utilized when it is determined in writing to be the most advantageous to Augusta, Georgia, taking into consideration the evaluation factors set forth in the request for proposals. The evaluation factors in the request for proposals shall be the basis on which the award decision is made when the sealed proposal method is used. Augusta, Georgia is not restricted from using alternative procurement methods for

obtaining the best value on any procurement, such as Construction Management at Risk, Design/Build, etc.

- (b) *Request for proposals*. Competitive sealed proposals shall be solicited through a request for proposals (RFP).
- (c) *Public notice*. Adequate public notice of the request for proposals shall be given in the same manner as provided in section 1-10- 50(c)(Public Notice and Bidder's List); provided the normal period of time between notice and receipt of proposals minimally shall be fifteen (15) calendar days.
- (d) Pre-proposal conference. A pre-proposal conference may be scheduled at least five (5) days prior to the date set for receipt of proposals, and notice shall be handled in a manner similar to section 1-10-50(c)-Public Notice and Bidder's List. No information provided at such pre-proposal conference shall be binding upon Augusta, Georgia unless provided in writing to all offerors.
- (e) *Receipt of proposals*. Proposals will be received at the time and place designated in the request for proposals, complete with bidder qualification and technical information. No late proposals shall be accepted. Price information shall be separated from the proposal in a sealed envelope and opened only after the proposals have been reviewed and ranked.

The names of the offerors will be identified at the proposal acceptance; however, no proposal will be handled so as to permit disclosure of the detailed contents of the response until after award of contract. A record of all responses shall be prepared and maintained for the files and audit purposes.

- (f) *Public inspection.* The responses will be open for public inspection only after contract award. Proprietary or confidential information marked as such in each proposal will not be disclosed without written consent of the offeror.
- (g) *Evaluation and selection*. The request for proposals shall state the relative importance of price and other evaluation factors that will be used in the context of proposal evaluation and contract award. (Pricing proposals will not be opened until the proposals have been reviewed and ranked). Such evaluation factors may include, but not be limited to:
  - (1) The ability, capacity, and skill of the offeror to perform the contract or

provide the services required;

- (2) The capability of the offeror to perform the contract or provide the service promptly or within the time specified, without delay or interference;
- (3) The character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience, and efficiency of the offeror;
- (4) The quality of performance on previous contracts;
- (5) The previous and existing compliance by the offeror with laws and ordinances relating to the contract or services;
- (6) The sufficiency of the financial resources of the offeror relating to his ability to perform the contract;
- (7) The quality, availability, and adaptability of the supplies or services to the particular use required; and
- (8) Price.
- (h) *Selection committee.* A selection committee, minimally consisting of representatives of the procurement office, the using agency, and the Administrator's office or his designee shall convene for the purpose of evaluating the proposals.
- (i) *Preliminary negotiations*. Discussions with the offerors and technical revisions to the proposals may occur. Discussions may be conducted with the responsible offerors who submit proposals for the purpose of clarification and to assure full understanding of, and conformance to, the solicitation requirements. Offerors shall be accorded fair and equal treatment with respect to any opportunity for discussions and revision of proposals and such revisions may be permitted after submission and prior to award for the purpose of obtaining best and final offers. In conducting discussions, there shall be no disclosure of information derived from proposals submitted by competing offerors.
- (j) From the date proposals are received by the Procurement Director through the date of contract award, no offeror shall make any substitutions, deletions,

additions or other changes in the configuration or structure of the offeror's teams or members of the offeror's team.

(k) Final negotiations and letting the contract. The Committee shall rank the technical proposals, open and consider the pricing proposals submitted by each offeror. Award shall be made or recommended for award through the Augusta, Georgia Administrator, to the most responsible and responsive offeror whose proposal is determined to be the most advantageous to Augusta, Georgia, taking into consideration price and the evaluation factors set forth in the request for proposals. No other factors or criteria shall be used in the evaluation. The contract file shall contain a written report of the basis on which the award is made/recommended. The contract shall be awarded or let in accordance with the procedures set forth in this Section and the other applicable sections of this chapter.
