SPLOST 9 Project List

Department: Administrator's Office

Presenter: Tameka Allen, Administrator

Caption: Discuss path forward for developing SPLOST 9 final project list.

Background: Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) Phase 8 is currently

projected to complete collections in September 2026. The Augusta Commission has discussed presenting SPLOST Phase 9 to voters for

consideration at the May 19, 2026 election.

Analysis: To allow sufficient time for required notice before the May election, the

final SPLOST 9 project list would need to be approved by the Augusta Commission in January 2026. (See attached SPLOST 9 Timeline.)

The attached project list includes the Administrator's updated

recommendations since the August 12, 2025 SPLOST 9 work session. The

changes include:

• Increase of \$14 million for Boathouse Reconstruction project and \$2.5 million for associated bond interest (as discussed at the August 12 work session).

- Increase of \$5 million to the Juvenile Court New Facility project, reflecting updated cost estimates received since August 12.
- Increase of \$4 million to Program Administration for construction management services for major building projects.
- Increases of \$160,000 for Blythe and \$730,300 for Hephzibah to maintain their percentage shares after the other changes.

The updated total SPLOST 9 package is \$434,074,300. Other projects discussed without consensus are listed in the "Other Requests since 7/23/25"

column on each category page.

Financial Impact: Projects would be funded from SPLOST 9 proceeds, if approved by voters.
