B. Leaves, Limbs and Bulk Waste Collection Services Discount Program

Several cities and counties in Georgia offer discount or special services for waste removal, particularly for senior citizens. It is up to each city to determine the type of discount program that best matches up with their city's sanitation program.

The Public Works Department is committed to providing accessible and affordable services to all its residents. To support our senior citizens, the department is proposing a discount program of 50% or a fee reduction of \$7.50 for senior citizens ages 65 or older for the removal of leaves, limbs, yard waste and bulk waste removal. This program would go into effect May 1, 2025.
