March 2026 output: 467 million BTUs vs. March 2025: 628 million BTUs; decrease of 119,561 (units as reported). April projected ~12,000 less than last year; YTD ~108,000 behind last year. Gas rates show a slight seasonal decrease.

B. Memorandum B - Georgia Power Streetlight - Dark Area Improvements

It is the recommendation of the Public Works Department to accept and approve the Georgia Power's proposal to upgrade and install additional outdoor streetlight located on the following roadways:

- **Old Marietta Road** - (Upgrade 4- old fixtures and install 7- LED fixtures)
- **Pine Street** - (Install 5- new LED fixtures)
- **Austell Powder Springs Road** - (Upgrade 2- old fixtures and install 8- LED fixtures)
- **Owens Drive - The Community Garden** - (Upgrade 1- old fixture and install 1- LED fixture.
- **Cureton Drive** - (Existing lighting- Upgrade 25- old fixtures to 25- LED fixtures)
- **Stovall Road** - (Install 6- new poles and 7- LED fixtures)
- **Joe Jenkins Boulevard** - (Install 1- LED light fixture to a pole)
- **Jefferson Street** - (Upgrade 7- Outdated custom fixture with 7- LED fixtures)
- **Love Street** - (Add 2 -LED Flood lights to the new parking lot)

All lights will be photocell controlled. There is no cost for fixtures nor the new poles. The monthly service fee for all new lights will be \$1,9640.00 Funding will come from the Streetlight Electricity account #100-4260-53-1250.

Request by Habitat for Humanity to a stream buffer variance to allow 202.29 square feet of encroachment within the City of Austell additional 25-foot stream buffer setback and 8.78 square feet of encroachment within the City of Austell 25-foot stream buffer for an unnamed tributary of Sweetwater Creek. No encroachment is in the state mandated 25-foot stream buffer.

While navigating through various feasible alternative design and site constraints (stream alignment and topography), applicant concluded that 202.29 square feet of encroachment within the City of Austell additional 25-foot stream buffer setback and 8.78 square feet of encroachment

within the City of Austell, 25-foot stream buffer for an unnamed tributary of Sweetwater Creek is the most effective route.

Attorney Kimbrough opened the public hearing and swore in Terri Miller with Habitat for Humanity.

While navigating through various feasible alternative design and site constraints (stream alignment and topography), applicant concluded that 1,580 square feet of encroachment within the City of Austell additional 25-foot stream buffer setback for an unnamed tributary of Sweetwater Creek is the most effective route.

## INTRODUCTION

The Public Works Departmental Monthly Report is an essential document that serves multiple important functions for the city.

## Streets Division

The Streets Division of the Public Works Department plays a critical role in the functionality, safety, and efficiency of the city's infrastructure. Below is a recap of the Streets Division performance from March 23, 2026, through April 23, 2026.
