2024 CDBG APPLICATION RESOLUTION

She stated the total project cost is \$1,641,318.45, with a CDBG funding request of \$1 250,000.00, and a County match of cash and in-kind services totaling \$389,318.45. She stated the County cash match will be funded through SPLOST.

Commissioner Henry Craig made a motion to approve the Resolution as presented. Commissioner Emily Davis seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

BALDWIN COUNTY FY2024 CDBG APPLICATION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Community has established a Community Development Block Grant program to assist cities and counties with improvements to public mcilities, economic development, and housing in Georgia, and

WHEREAS, there exists in Baldwin County a need to provide sewer and housing improvements to the County's FY2024 CDBG Target Area.

NOW THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED by the Chair and Board of Commissioners that Baldwin County supporß the application for FY2024 CDBG ffnds and that tie County will apply for these ftnds for sewer improvements and housing improvements in the County's FY2024 CDBG Target Area. Baldwin Coumty commits to the required cash match for the project, \$1,000 cash for the required audits and all additional cash and/or in-kind services needed to complete the project over the grant amount

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chair is authorized and directed to act as the offcial representative of Baldwin County, to act in connection with the application, to be responsible for compliance with the applicable snte and federal requirements of the program, and to provide such additional information as may be required;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Chair is authorized to enter into ayeements for engineering and grant administration services relating to the application and subsequent grant (if ftnded) and to execute the application and oåer required documents on behalf of the County including the grant award package (iffixnded);

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Baldwin CounW commits to own, operate, and maintain all proposed sewer improvements;

BE IT FURTI-ER RESOLVED that Baldwin County hereby adopts the Citizen Participation Pian of the Georgia Department of Community Affairs to ensure public involvement in the CDBG process;

BE IT F(JRTHER RESOLVED that the County hereby aclmowledges that the proposed project is subject to the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u (Section 3) and in accordance with the Georgia Department of Community Section 3 Compliance Plan will to the geatest extent feasible, comply with all Section 3 requirements;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED at the County hereby acknowledges that the proposed project is subject to the requirements of Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (Fair Housing Act), as amended, Section of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and Section 105(b)(3) of ffe National Affordable Housing Act of 1990 (NAHA). The County hereby commits to Affrmatively Furthering Fair Housing to the greatest extent feasiMe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County hereby acknowledges that the proposed project is subject to the requirements of Section 504 of die Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), and the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968. The County hereby commits to comply all Section 504 requirements to the greatest extent feasible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that tie proposed sewer improvements and housing improvements Baldwin County's Comprehensive and are inconsistent with the County's Service Delivery Smteu;
