CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Henry Craig called the June 7, 2022 Regular Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

INVOCATION

The Invocation was delivered by Vice Chairman John Westmoreland.

Commissioner Sammy Hall led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Vice Chairman John Westmoreland made a motion to approve the minutes of the May 9, 2022 Executive Session, May 17, 2022 Regular Meeting, May 17, 2022 Executive Session, May 25, 2022 Called Meeting and May 25, 2022 Executive Session. Commissioner Sammy Hall seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Henry Craig presented a Proclamation to members of the Alpha Alpha Phi Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority in observance of their First Anniversary with the local chapter being chartered in Milledgeville on June 19, 2021.

ADMINISTRATIVE/FISCAL MATTERS

Community Home Investment Program (CHIP) Award

Assistant County Manager Dawn Hudson presented the Community Home Investment Program (CHIP) Award Agreement for the Board's consideration. She reported the Agreement between the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (GDCA) and Baldwin County outlines requirements of both parties and specifies conditions that have must be met. Ms. Hudson stated the award is in the amount of \$400,000 for homeowner rehab assistance. Commissioner Hall asked if there are matching requirements. Assistant County Manager Hudson responded there is no cash match. Commissioner Butts asked for clarification with DCA as to whether manufactured

housing is eligible. Ms. Hudson responded she would have Mr. Tobar confirm whether it is eligible.

Commissioner Kendrick Butts made a motion to accept the Agreement and to get clarification on manufacturing housing eligibility. Commissioner Sammy Hall seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Local Option Sales Tax (LOST)

Chairman Henry Craig stated the County must initiate the renegotiation of the Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) and notify the Georgia Department of Revenue of the commencement date prior to July 1, 2022. He stated a letter to the City has been prepared notifying them of the Commencement of LOST Renegotiation effective Monday, June 13, 2022.

Commissioner Sammy Hall stated the Local Option Sales Tax must be used to roll back taxes. He made a motion to proceed with notification to the City of Milledgeville of the commencement date of June 13, 2022 for renegotiation of LOST. Vice Chairman John Westmoreland seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

Commissioner Emily Davis stated she is opposed to any consideration to rename the Collins P. Lee Center.

Vice Chairman John Westmoreland stated problems with trash pickup and convenience centers continue. He said Waste Management must do something to prevent trash along roads, especially Ivey Weaver where the transfer station is located. He suggested Waste Management have somebody on that road to pick up trash. He also reported the centers are not being kept clean.

Commissioner Kendrick Butts reported he and County Manager Tobar met with Waste Management and told them about all the problems and concerns that community is having. Waste Management responded it is going to be getting back with County.

Chairman Henry Craig stated he has shared her Research Plan with Commissioners, Sheriff and staff members. He said the County will participate in the efforts to address the violence in our community.

Mr. James Finney addressed the Board requesting to change the name of the Collins P. Lee Center to the Lucille Harris Center because of her contributions regarding the center which was formerly a school.

Rev. Rosemary Thomas stated she had worked with Mr. Lee and wants to do what is right for community. She said the community should come to an agreement on this matter.

Ms. Ida Wells Manson stated she was born, raised and lived in Harrisburg all life. She stated she feels the center should be names for Lucille Harris and XXXXX Harris because they built the school.

Dr. Collinda Lee addressed the Board in opposition to a change in the name of the Collins P. Lee Center.

Mr. James Andrews addressed the Board in opposition to a proposed bicycle / pedestrian path in the Airport neighborhood.

RESOLUTION

BALDWIN COUNTY ADOPTION OF CHIP GRANT HOMEOWNERS ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR COMMUNITY HOME INVESTMENT PROGRAM (CHIP) GRANT

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Chairman and Commission Members and it is hereby resolved by authority of same.

WHEREAS, the Chairman and Commission Members have found it necessary to adopt homeowner's eligibility requirements for the Community HOME Investment Program (CHIP) Grant Number 2022-101 and,

WHEREAS, the Chairman and Commission Members have established eligibility requirements as follows:

- First consideration to:
 - o Citizens over 60 years of age.
 - o Citizens who are disabled.
- Must be properly owned as per 24 CFR 92.254.
- Gross household income must be less than 50% of the average median income for the county as established by HUD.
- Must be a homeowner in the Census Tract 9706 Block Group 1 or 4, or Census Tract 9707.01 Block Group 2 or 3.
 - Must have and maintain fire insurance.
 - Must have property taxes paid up to date.
- After rehabilitation property value limit not to exceed 95% of the median property values for the area as per 24 CFR 92.254.

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman and Commission Members will provide assistance through the CHIP grant according to the property value limits for homeownership activities as outline in the HOME Final Rule published on July 24, 2013. No home receiving assistance will have an after-rehabilitation value that exceeds 95 percent of the area median purchase price for existing single-family units, as issued by Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The after rehabilitation will be established prior to any rehabilitation work being performed, and;

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ADOPTED, by the Chairman and Commission Members the eligibility requirements that will be used to administer the CHIP program set forth by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs for financial assistance pursuant to this housing rehabilitation grant project.

Hi Ms. Hudson,

Attached is the budget for the Public Defender's Office for FY 2023 which runs from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023. The cost to Baldwin County will remain the same as the previous year with a total of \$209,523.06, for the year on monthly payments of \$17,460.25. This includes \$170,223.06 for representation of indigent defendants in Baldwin Superior Court and Baldwin Juvenile Court and \$39,300 for representation of indigent defendants in Baldwin State Court. Additionally, our office provides representation of defendants in the Ocmulgee Circuit Adult Treatment Court (ATCC) including both the Drug and Mental Health Courts.

Also enclosed is the contract for indigent defense services for FY 2023.
