MINUTES

The minutes from the December 9, 2024 Board of Aldermen meeting were submitted for approval. A motion to approve as submitted was made by Alderman Frank Fleming and seconded by Alderman Michael Finley. A voice vote was taken with unanimous affirmative result and the motion passed.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Jacque Glaeser, 517 Golfwood Drive, spoke to the Board of Aldermen about the cold temperatures in the Pointe Indoor Pool, specifically during Water Aerobics. She noted the pool has been cold for several years during the winter months.



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Parks & Recreation Director Chris Conway noted they have reached out to see what solutions can be used to fix the problem and the Department is working on a fix.

CONSENT ITEMS

Administration – Check Signatories

Staff recommends that the Board approve the authorized signers for all City accounts as presented. A motion was made by Alderman Frank Fleming and seconded by Alderman Mike Utt to accept staff's recommendation. A voice vote was taken with unanimous affirmative result and the motion passed.

Administration – Six Month Cash Financial Statements

Staff recommends that the Board approve the semi-annual statement of revenues and expenditures. A motion was made by Alderman Frank Fleming and seconded by Alderman Mike Utt to accept staff's recommendation. A voice vote was taken with unanimous affirmative result and the motion passed.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Tim Pogue thanked City staff, Police and the Public Works Department for their hard work during the winter snow storms. He noted there have been several compliments from residents.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT_____

None.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT

City Attorney Bob Jones noted there are several changes to Missouri's State Statutes that began on January 1st. One of these changes was a Texting While Driving/Hands-Free Driving ordinance. City Attorney Jones noted that the law specifically states local municipalities cannot enact their own ordinance on those topics, so nothing further needs to be done.

He also noted there is a change to the video service/streaming ordinance that will need to be changed in City Code.

He also noted there is language change for Assault on a Law Enforcement Animal.

Alderman Mark Stallmann made a motion to draft ordinances for the code changes. Alderman Michael Finley seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with unanimous affirmative result and the motion passed.



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STAFF REPORTS

Administration – 326 Turfwood Drive Front Yard Fence

Staff recommends allowing the fence at 326 Turfwood Drive, but relocating it a minimum of five feet into the property to allow for landscaping.

Discussion:

City Planner Lynn Sprick noted there was a petition for a fence along the side street of the residence at 326 Turfwood Drive. It replaces an existing fence. Staff recommends approval with the condition that the fence is pulled back five feet into the property to allow for landscaping and sidewalk access.

The petitioner, Bob Axley, spoke to the Board and noted he only wanted to move it back three feet since he didn't want to lose part of his yard.

Mayor Tim Pogue noted he preferred five feet because the new fence will be two feet taller than the existing fence and will not be as transparent as the current chain link fence.

Alderman David Siegel said he believed three feet is more than enough in that neighborhood because the lots are smaller than other areas and that street does not have a high risk of traffic.

Alderman Mark Weaver asked if three feet would be enough for Public Works to work on the sidewalk. Public Works Director Jim Link noted he would have to take a look at the property.

Alderman David Siegel noted he would be in favor of three feet to allow the property owner to keep as much property as possible.

Alderman Frank Fleming asked if there was approval from the homeowners association. City Planner Sprick noted she had not seen any, but petitioner Axley noted he did receive approval.

Alderman Frank Fleming noted he would like to see the letter from the HOA, and would like the Police Department and Public Works to make sure three feet would be acceptable before moving forward with the petition.

Alderman Fleming then made a motion to table, followed by Alderman Mike Utt. A voice vote was taken with unanimous affirmative result and the motion passed and the petition was tabled.

Parks & Recreation – Parks Maintenance Pickup Truck Purchase

Staff recommends waiving the purchasing policy for bids and authorize the purchase of a new pickup truck for the Parks Department, not to exceed the budgeted amount of \$43,000.

Discussion:

Parks & Recreation Director Chris Conway noted he would like to waive the purchasing policy for a new work vehicle so the department can move quickly once one is available.



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A motion was made by Alderman Frank Fleming and seconded by Alderman Mike Utt to accept staff's recommendation. A voice vote was taken with unanimous affirmative result and the motion passed.

ALDERMANIC COMMENTS

Alderman David Siegel thanked the Public Works Department for their response to the snow storm, stating he had many phone calls from people complimenting the snow removal. Alderman Siegel asked about ticketing for cars on the street during a snow emergency. Chief John Bergfeld stated there is a policy to ticket and tow and the department has been ticketing.

Alderman Mike Utt also thanked the Public Works Department, and noted he forwarded a complaint from a resident to Public Works Director Jim Link and he went to fix the issue that day on a Sunday. Alderman Utt also noted there was a complaint from a resident on Lock Drive next to Arco who was upset about Arco's delivery trucks blocking the street.

Alderman Michael Finley also noted the drivers are using Lock Drive as a delivery area and the resident noted the no parking sign disappears and reappears.

Mayor Tim Pogue asked City Staff to see what could be done.

Alderman Mark Stallmann also thanked the Public Works Department for their excellent work on snow removal. He also noted January 9th was National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day and thanked the Police Department for their hard work.

Alderman Michael Finley also noted that we're 130 days away from the opening of North Pointe.

ADJOURNMENT A motion was made by Alderman Frank Fleming and seconded by Alderman Michael Finley to adjourn. The
motion was passed by unanimous affirmative voice vote and the meeting adjourned at 7:38 p.m.

INTRODUCED BY ALDERMEN UTT, FINLEY, STALLMANN, HAUG, FLEMING, WEAVER, LEHMKUHL, SIEGEL

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 17-17 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BALLWIN WITH RESPECT TO ASSAULT UPON A LAW ENFORCEMENT ANIMAL.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen has determined that the Assault of a law enforcement officer, corrections officer, emergency personnel, highway worker, utility worker, cable worker, probation and parole office, or police animal should be revised to be consistent with Missouri Revised Statues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BALLWIN, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 17, Article I, Section 17-17 is amended to read as follows (revisions in bold text):

- (a) A person commits the offense of assault of a law enforcement officer, corrections officer, emergency personnel, highway worker in a construction zone or work zone, utility worker, cable worker, or probation and parole officer in the third degree if:
 - 1. Such person recklessly causes physical injury to a law enforcement officer, corrections officer, emergency personnel, highway worker in a construction zone or work zone, utility worker, cable worker, or probation and parole officer;
 - 2. Such person purposely places a law enforcement officer, corrections officer, emergency personnel, highway worker in a construction zone or work zone, utility worker, cable worker, or probation and parole officer in apprehension of immediate physical injury; or
 - 3. Such person knowingly causes or attempts to cause physical contact with a law enforcement officer, corrections officer, emergency personnel, highway worker in a construction zone or work zone, utility worker, cable worker, or probation and parole officer without the consent of the law enforcement officer, corrections officer, emergency personnel, highway worker in a construction zone or work zone, utility worker, cable worker, or probation and parole officer.
- (b) As used in this section "emergency personnel" means any paid or volunteer firefighter, emergency room or trauma center personnel, or emergency medical technician as defined in subdivisions (15), (16), (17) and (18) of RSMo 190.100.
- (c) As used in this section, the term "corrections officer" includes any jailor or corrections officer of the state or any political subdivision of the state.

- (d) As used in this section, the term "highway worker" "construction zone" or "work zone" shall have the same meaning as such terms are defined in RSMo 304.580.
- (e) As used in this section, the term "utility worker" means any employee while in the performance of their job duties, including any person employed under contract, of a utility that provides gas, heat, electricity, water, steam, telecommunications services, or sewer services, whether privately, municipally, or cooperatively owned.
- (f) As used in this section, the term "cable worker" means any employee including any person employed under contract, of a cable operator, as such term is defined in RSMo 67.2677.
- (g) A person commits the offense of assault on a law enforcement animal if he or she knowingly kills or disables, knowingly attempts to kill or disable, or knowingly causes or attempts to cause serious physical injury, to a law enforcement animal when that animal is involved in law enforcement investigation, apprehension, tracking, or search, or the animal is in the custody or under the control of a law enforcement officer or fire or rescue personnel.
- (h) As used in this section, the term "law enforcement animal" means a dog, horse, or other animal used in law enforcement or a correctional facility, or by a municipal police department, fire department, search and rescue unit or agency, whether the animal is on duty or not on duty. The term shall include, but not be limited to, accelerant detection dogs, bomb detection dogs, narcotic dogs, search and rescue dogs, and tracking animals.
- (i) Any dog that is owned, or the service of which is employed, by a law enforcement agency and that bites or injuries another animal or human in the course of their official duties is exempt from the provisions of sections 5-38 and 5-63.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM WITHIN OR INTO THE CITY LIMITS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Alderman has determined that the Offenses Against Public Health and Safety section should be revised to be consistent with Missouri Revised Statute 571.031, also known as Blair's Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BALLWIN, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1:</u> Chapter 17, Article III, Division I, shall be amended by adding municipal ordinance Section 17.54.1, as follows:

Sec. 17.54.1 – Unlawful discharge of a firearm

- (a) A person commits the offense of unlawful discharge of a firearm if he or she recklessly discharges a firearm within or into the city limits.
- (b) This section shall not apply if the firearm is discharged:
 - 1. As allowed by a defense of justification under RSMo Chapter 563;
 - 2. On a shooting range that is:
 - a. Indoor;
 - b. Owned or operated by the state or any political subdivision;
 - c. A commercial shooting range, including any range used by paying members; and
 - d. Supervised by any person eighteen years of age or older;
 - 3. To lawfully take wildlife during an open season established by the Department of Conservation;
 - 4. For the control of nuisance wildlife as permitted by the Department of Conservation of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service;
 - 5. By special permit of the chief of police;
 - 6. As required by animal control officer in the performance of his or her duties;
 - 7. Using blanks;
 - 8. More than one-quarter mile of any occupied structure;
 - 9. In self-defense or defense of another person against an imminent or ongoing animal attack unless the self-defense or defense of another person is a gross deviation from the standard of care which a reasonable person would exercise in the situation to protect oneself or the other person from such animal attack and such person shall not have a duty to retreat;
 - 10. 10. By law enforcement officers or a member of the United States Armed Forces if acting in an official capacity.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 7.5-1 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BALLWIN WITH RESPECT TO VIDEO SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the City's Code of Ordinances establishes video service provider requirements in accordance with state law, and

WHEREAS, changes in statute (2024 SB 872 and HB 2057) require revision of the definition of video service; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen being fully informed finds that amending the City Code of Ordinances as provided herein is in the public interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BALLWIN, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The definition of Video Service in Code Section 7.5-1(a) is amended to read as follows (revisions in bold text):

Video service means the provision, by a video service provider, of video programming provided through wireline facilities, without regard to delivery technology, including Internet protocol technology, whether provided as part of a tier, on demand or on a per-channel basis, including cable service as defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 522(6), but excluding video programming provided by a commercial mobile service provider defined in 47 U.S.C. Section 332(d) or any video programming accessed via a service that enables users to access content, information, electronic mail or other services offered over the public Internet, including streaming content.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage

Staff Report

Subject: 326 Turfwood Drive

Department/Program: Administration (Planning & Zoning/Building Department)

Explanation:

This Petition was discussed at the Board of Aldermen Meeting on January 13, 2025. At that time, the Board asked for clarification and additional information.

- The Petitioner was asked to provide approval from the subdivision's homeowners' association. The property owner has since submitted signed plans from one of the trustees.
- Clarification regarding distances from property lines was also addressed. The included survey indicates that the closest point to the property line along Turfwood Drive is 20.9 feet, while the closest point along Towerwood Drive is 26 feet. Please note these measurements are to the property line, not the edge of the street. An additional 10–12 feet exists between the property line and the street edge.
- The residence was constructed in 1969, when the property was part of unincorporated St. Louis County. At that time, the required front setback was 20 feet, which the structure met. When the subdivision was annexed in 1989, this condition became legally non-conforming.
- Per Article XVI, Section 10 of the Zoning Ordinance: "No fence, structure, or planting higher than 2½ feet above street grade shall be maintained within 15 feet of any street intersection." This area, referred to as sight distance, ensures that vehicles approaching an intersection can safely assess traffic on the opposing street.
 - The Public Works Department stated that locating the fence five feet (5') from the property line would provide sufficient space for sidewalk repair/replacement.

Recommendation:

Staff's recommendation remains unchanged. Relocating the fence a minimum of five feet (5') into the property to allow for landscaping, along with the property owner's agreement to the stated requirements in the previously submitted staff report.

Good evening Lynn,

I can send you the indentures in full if you'd like. I've read it a couple of times and have found nothing regarding protocols as to which or how many trustees need to sign off. The indentures do not explicitly spell out any formal process to "OK" much of anything. They were last revised back in 2010 to my recollection. Beyond that, that this puppy is old. I won't speak for Andrew (the other trustee) but I would interpret the "building line" to be the front of the building. There are currently many houses (Golfwood & Ballwood, Ballwood & Twigwood, Twigwood & Statewood, Bitterwood's fence abutting the subdivision walkway/service road) as well as Bob's property at Turfwood and Towerwood that currently has fencing that extends to the side or their property to the sidewalk. Thankfully the houses in the subdivision are set back from the street and solid fencing does not substantially block vision from the intersection as viewed from a vehicle. As the current situation stands, to me at least, the homeowner is replacing an existing chain link fence for a new vinyl fence. It is for the benefit of the nearby neighbors to not have the dogs bark as much when people are out walking, which I think would be a good thing for our subdivision.

- D. Easements and installation and maintenance of utilities and drainage facilities are reserved as shown on the Plats and over the rear five feet of each lot. Within these easements, no structure, planting or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain which may damage or interfere with the installation and maintenance of utilities, or which may change the direction of flow of drainage channels in the easements, or which may obstruct or retard the flow of water through drainage channels in the easements. The easement area of each lot and all improvements in it shall be maintained continuously by the owner of the lot, except for those improvements for which a public authority or utility company is responsible.
- E. No oil drilling, oil development operations, oil refining, quarrying or mining operations of any kind shall be permitted upon or in any lot, nor shall oil wells, tanks, tunnels, mineral excavations or shafts be permitted upon or in any lot. No derrick or other structure designed for use in boring for oil or natural gas shall be erected, maintained or permitted upon any lot.
- (7) Fences may be constructed of any durable and reasonable material, including tight board, provided that no fence erected on any lot in the Subdivision may contain barbed wire, chicken wire, mesh or similar materials. All fences in the Subdivision must be constructed with all unfinished sides facing inward to the lot on which the fence is located and only finished sides facing outward. A fence shall neither extend in front of the building line on any lot in the Subdivision nor shall be more than six (6) feet in height.
- (8) (a) There are and will be situated in the above described tract, certain areas designated as Common Land. The Trustees shall hereafter maintain said Common Land and may develop therein park areas, playgrounds, ball fields and other kinds of recreational facilities.
- (b) Any other provision hereof to the contrary notwithstanding the obligations and rights of the Trustees hereunder to maintain the parks and streets referred to herein shall not cease nor may this Indenture be changed or amended to reduce or eliminate any of the duties, obligations and rights in such connection granted to and imposed on the Trustees under any subparagraph of Paragraph III herein, nor may this Indenture be amended to eliminate the Trusteeship set up in said Indenture or provisions for the succession of Trustees.
