## Lost Pines State Park Complex Visitation through December 2025:

- Bastrop SP's visitation remains steady while we have seen a drop in Buescher SP's, we believe that the decline is due to the heat this summer and fall. Bastrop SP has air conditioned cabins and full hookup RV sites while Buescher does not. So we believe that the decline is due to those factors.
  - We have been treating portions of the park for wildfire and prescribed fire season, applying herbicide, mechanical thinning, hand clearing, shoring up pond dams, mulching, and shredding burn lanes.
  - We hosted public hunts this year and during the youth hunt 11 deer were taken many of which were the kiddo's first deer. Very exciting for them. Prior to the 2011 fires Bastrop SP did not have an abundance of deer, since the fires changed the landscape we have an abundance of deer and it is good that we have fewer mouths on the range. Between the 2 hunts 13 deer and 3 pigs were taken. The kids mopped the floor with the adults ☺.
  - Construction for the tribute putting green near the historic pro shop will begin late February! This will allow visitors to putt around free of charge to pay homage to the legacy of our historic golf course.
  - Construction for the reconstruction of the Lake Mina bridge began this week! This project will replace the wooden bridge with a design replicating the historically accurate rock bridge that originally served visitors in that location. The original bridge was removed sometime in the 60s or 70s for an unknown reason and replaced a wooden one.
  - We have "softly" opened our new Interpretive Center at the historic pro shop, full completion and opening is scheduled to occur in March just in time for Spring Break.
  - We currently are in the design phase for a new water and wastewater system at Buescher SP, with this project we are hopeful that we will be able to add full hookup sites to the Cozy Circle Campground which would help increase overnight use at this park. Buescher had low grade schedule 10 PVC for their waterlines and jokingly we refer to Buescher as "Buescher Springs SP" because of all the water leaks that occur regularly! This will be a huge improvement for Buescher.
  - With the winter storm precipitation we are hopeful that we received enough precipitation to potentially conduct Prescribed Fire operations, but it will all depend on weather.
  - The upcoming interpretation program flyer isn't ready at this time, but I will forward once our interpreter finishes it. She is still finalizing and confirming November programming.







To clarify - my three proposals were to show the different ways we could approach the memorial and my willingness to work with the city and committee on the designs.

I will answer your questions below in yellow.

Good afternoon Clint Howard,

I hope you're doing well. Thank you again for sharing your proposal with us. After our recent Art Committee meeting, we had a few follow-up questions we'd like to clarify before moving forward:

1. Could you provide a detailed breakdown of all project costs? All three quotes include all costs associated with the sculpting, casting, and delivery of the sculptures. Option one excluded the base as a TBD item and all options excluded concrete footings, engineering, and lighting - all of which we can add back into the project scope. I was unsure if the city wanted to handle those costs and project management items. I am confident that option 1 and 3 will come in right at or under \$500,000.00 with all possible costs - and option 2 will be under depending on the amount spent on the site.
2. Does the quoted price include installation? Yes
3. Does the price also include any required lighting or lighting design? No - but we can discuss and include once a site is determined
4. What is your estimated timeline for the project, from start to completion? 12-14 months
5. Percentage breakdown of material of sculpture: Bronze, metal, stone, wood, ceramics, glass, or synthetic material. Approximately 90% bronze 10% granite







Thank you again for your further interest in my Veterans Memorial submission.

1. Please find attached a detailed material and labor cost breakdown sheet.
2. Yes, The installation of the granite will be completed by the monumental company. They will include everything to have this installed and erected on site. I also have an Independent structural moving company that will assist on the install for the stainless steel walls to include bronze soldiers and articles.
3. I do not have lighting or landscaping included in my proposal. I would need a better idea of location to include a bid from a licensed electrician to install permanent electrical lighting. I adjusted my budget to allow unused monies granted for the project for landscaping and lighting. If you would like me to contract a landscaper and electrician to create an entire garden and watering system around the sculpture, I would be glad to assist in design and contracting.  
I can include solar lighting, which I have used at my previous sculpture location.
4. My estimated timeline is six months. This is the time that I know that I can complete the task that I need to do Independently. If I were to be granted the opportunity to build the Veterans Memorial sculpture for Bastrop, I would need to formally sit down with each business, build and implement a plan. I would Need to confirm that timeline with my foundry and stone suppliers. I believe that six months time is sufficient for them to do the required task needed. I plan for a June 30 date of completion.
5. I am a little confused about the percentage breakdown of material of sculpture. I thought maybe this question was being asked for a visual idea. I took initiative this weekend to create a model to give you a complete visual idea of what I am hoping to create for Bastrop for the fallen Vietnam soldiers of Bastrop County. I can calculate the exact masses if needed, but the stone definitely takes up 60% of the project. The metal that I am forming and creating is a sleeve on top of that 60%, approximately 15% metal, to include stainless steel, brass, steel, and aluminum. The Bronze soldiers I would estimate it 25%.

Vietnam articles on the stone sculpture to your left. Iran, Afghanistan, And desert storm on the stone sculpture to your right hand side.
2. Backside of Bronze soldiers, stone engraving to include soldiers honors, details of service and dates, honoring them. To include personal imagery of hometown Bastrop.
3. Backside of the Vietnam articles, sculpture on left, to display the names of our fallen soldiers For World War II and Korean
4. Backside of the Iraqi Afghanistan, and desert storm articles, sculpture on right, to continue and include soldier's honors details of service and dates on the Fallen soldiers.
5. A side profile to give a better idea of how the stainless steel art walls created by quarter inch stainless steel rods to create a flat wall. This stainless wall would waterfall over stone approximately 3" separate to create a beautiful contrast in colors.

# Veteran Memorial Project – Detailed Material and Labor Cost Breakdown

## Material Costs

### Stone Features – \$75,000

Includes all three stone components of the memorial: cutting, shaping, engraving, finishing, sealing, and installation.

### Stainless Steel Rod Walls – \$20,000

Includes stainless steel rods formed and structured together to create the architectural wall panels, including finishing and structural supports.

### Engraved Newspaper Articles – \$10,000

Includes metal sheet stock of stainless steel or brass, CNC or laser engraving of historical newspaper content, surface finishing, and protective clear coat.

### Soldiers Artwork by Pyrology of Bastrop – \$210,000

Includes clay work, scanning, 3D printing, casting, and sealing of five Vietnam Veteran soldiers.

### Move and Set Up – \$5,000

Includes transportation of components, heavy equipment operation, onsite crew placement, and basic logistical support.

### Labor Cost – \$75,000

Labor cost includes one employee at 40 hours per week.

**Total Material Cost: \$320,000**

**Total Labor Cost: \$75,000**

**Grand Total (Materials and Labor): \$395,000**
