Councilor Diaz had a question on the wastewater report he asked Jason Jaeger if there was a generator down at the treatment plant.

Jason Jaeger stated yes there is emergency generators down at the wastewater treatment plant.

Councilor Gonzales asked about her detailed report she made for the animal control officer/code enforcer. She has not seen this report submitted and would like to know why?

Police Chief Carrillo stated he has not seen the report but he will look in to it.

Councilor Villanueva would also like this report to be more detailed. To be able to know who exactly got the citation and what it was written for.

Councilor Diaz stated if he does get a phone call after hours, he can look at the report and know if there has been a citation written. He also would like this report to be back dated three or four month.

Police Chief Carrillo stated back in August the Sheriff's office answer 22 call and Bayard answer 204 calls. The Police Department is very busy answering a lot more calls now.

New Business

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated Juan Rogers came in to request water service on 920 North Street. This property was provenly Ray's Trailer Park and has had 3 different owners. So now that property has lost allowance for a mobile home park. Juan Rogers did mention he wanted to park his friends RV at the property. Under the planning and zoning RV are not allowed only if there is approved permit for construction on a site build home for up to either six months or a year. Mr. Rogers was not happy with Kristy and stated he was being discriminated. Kristy did tell him no the problem is that he did mention he wanted to do some development to the property. Mr. Rogers changed his mind and wanted the water to water the trees on the property. Mr. Rogers is in the process of changing ownership of the property.

Councilor Diaz stated based off the information you have been wanting to work with the individual and trying to get specifics of where he wants to place to trailer but he has not brought any paper work or anything? and what tress? There are no trees at this property.

Councilor Diaz stated he wants to be very careful, if the council starts allowing one mobile home/RV, he dose not want it to get out of control and have 4 or 5 placed there.

Councilor Medina stated first step is he need documentation to see who's the property owner. We can not allow to have a water tap on someone else's property. This issue needs to be resolved before any thing else.

Councilor Diaz stated he just wants to deny it and when he has all his paper work he can come back and ask for permission.

Police Chief Carrillo stated Mounted Patrol has been around for awhile, they are there own entity. These gentlemen are retired certified police officers. They carry there own weapons, they have there own procedures, the only this that is required is they are with a certified agency to enforce the laws. They are a back up for the police officer they are with. Chief Carrillo is requesting this because of the call volume that is high. Chief Carrillo is requesting there assistance for only major events that are going on in Bayard. There assistance is no cost to the city.

Councilor Villanueva asked if there were to be a incident would there entity be responsibly or would that be Bayard?

Police Chief Carrillo stated it would be there entity. They have there own insurance and there own policy.

Clerk-Treasurer Kristy stated Rudy Martinez requested we contact Nicholas Krocket. He provides lobbying services at the federal level. This contract will be a total of \$20,000 per year. Mr. Krocket did stated his success rate is high.

Councilor Diaz stated if he could bring money for the wastewater treatment plan. It's something to look at.

Councilor Villanueva would like to research this further before making a decision.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated this is for discussion only. This rate is high for Bayard but if Mr. Krocket can secure millions of dollars for Bayard then it will be worth it. Also this funding can be matched with other federal dollars.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated this Resolution 23-2022 Credit card Processing and Electronic Transfers policy is required by DFA. This resolution is required to be approved by council to get this approved by DFA.

Councilor Diaz asked if Bayard is coved by FDIC? and is this a double security?

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated this is just a policy for internal this does not have anything to do with the bank.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated Resolution 25-2022 is for the quit claim deed for McKee Street property.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated Resolution 26-2022 is for PERA in regards to allow any employee to pay in to deferred compensation.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy announced that she will be retiring from the City of Bayard. Her last day will be October 21, 2022. She will still be working with the local communities at the federal level.

Councilor Villanueva thanked Kristy for everything she has contributed to this community and this is well deserved, he hates to see her go but he knows this is best for her and her family. He knows she will continue to help Bayard.

Councilor Diaz would like to know what amounts do each employee get after introductory status.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated it is what the budget is for each employee.

Larry Ojiana asked what the update on the sidewalks?

Clerk-Treasure stated the engineers are still working with the utilities to get the relocations for some of the poles. It is still under design.

Larry Ojiana asked about the burnt house on Central Ave?

Councilor Diaz stated he spoke with the lady who own the property. She is an elderly lady and she dose have until October 22 to get it done. She may ask for an extension. Diaz did inform her to go before the council for this request. There has been some progress.

Larry Ojiana stated he has not seen any progress on the property. Maybe the weeds that were cut around it.

Councilor Medina thinks the Department Director needs to be address soon. The department needs direction.

Police Chief Carrillo stated they will be participating in Domestic Valiance Month and will be attending training. The office that was hired was disqualified and he is now looking for a police officer.

Councilor Villanueva thanked the police department for everything. Villanueva has spoken with the police officers and they say there are busy. The community sees it and he sees it. Villanueva stated he appreciates what they are doing and to keep it up. Villanueva did speak with Mayor Fierro and they both agree to advertise for the Maintenance Director. Also any other position we need to move forward and get everything we can done while Kristy is here. Villanueva stated he hates to see Kristy go but she has to do what she has to do for herself. Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated this position has always gone back and forth. Sometime there is not enough work and sometimes there is. With the budget this is why the position has been combined.

Councilor Diaz stated there is a lot work for one person to do both positions and he thinks if the city want to succeed and move forward we need to look in to this. We might have to invest in this.

Police Chief Carrillo stated the last 6 months he has been here the animal control and codes call have sky rocked. He did suggest maybe hiring a part time person to help with this.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated she agrees the work load is a lot doing both jobs. Getting a call for animal control having to pick up a dog, go to the office do the report, take the dog down to the kennels or to the vet that is about 2 or 3 hours for just one call.

Councilor Villanueva stated if Kristy can look in to a part time person to help the animal control/code enforcer.

Clerk-Treasure Kristy stated someone will need to be certify in flood plan. This will effect the residents insurance rates if no one is certified.

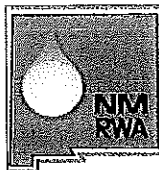

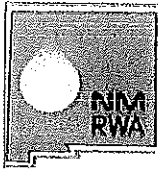
