Old Business

Discussion from Larry Ojinaga regarding an update on wording for Abandoned Building Ordinance, Mayor Fierro stated the City's attorney has this ordinance and is reviewing it. He knows he's been really busy and as soon as he returns this to the city it will be placed on the agenda for the council meeting.

Larry asked why is this taking so long? He stated September he brought this up to the council also, in January the city got a copy from Santa Clara and it was going to be revived. On January 27th this was discussed again and now the attorney has it but this has been 4 months.

Councilor Medina stated there is a process. The Council received this ordinance, had a idea to have a sub-committee, then that got pulled back because Police Chief Carrillo had some concerns. So the council made a motion to send it to our attorney and that's where this stands now. The city has issues we are working on and Mr. Ojinaga's the abandoned building on East Street you want to see come down will take time. Medina understands he wants this to be done fast but the council has to be sure and review it thoroughly because this ordinance will impact a lot of citations. There is potentially over 100 citations that will be affected with this ordinance being passed. Medina stated there are fees that will impact residents that live in Bayard that are on a fixed income and he will not vote on a document to speed up the process up that could effect residents on a fixed income without making sure this document is correct and make sure this does not impact people's lives that live in Bayard just to speed the process up.

Mayor Fierro stated he has been in contact with the owns of the property on East street and they know there is an issue there. There are multiple owners and the lady he spoke with will talk to the rest of the owners and come up with a resolution.

They are getting a lot of people from Bayard that feel that they can not afford to be berried in the Bayard Cemetery. She has asked the Bayard Beautification Committee if they can attend and maybe have a booth with some kind of game. She is expecting a lot of kids and would really like more eyes and ears at the event. The library will absorb the cost with what Sonya has budgeted for performances for the Summer Reading Program. This foam is biodegradable and all that would need to be done after is hose it down really good. Then the summer reading program will began the following Monday at the library. This year the program will be limited to 25 kids per day.


