MINUTES

WORK SESSION

Clerk Ramos let the council know that Jenny Castanon received another grant for the Union Hall Museum project. This is the second grant she has gotten which brings the total to almost \$200,000.00 in grants. He wanted to advise the council she is doing a great job.

Clerk Ramos stated a request was made by Cesar Jimenez to have a dinner for the football players and would like to close a small portion of Winifred St. He has talked to his neighbors and everyone is ok with it. It will be from 3p.m. to 7p.m. Clerk Diaz said he has helped out a lot with the Bayard Beautification Committee and the Welcome sign.

Clerk Ramos stated that they will utilize the money from the grant to hire another Police Officer. The only down fall is the grant decreases over the period of three years. It is a great idea to help have 24/7 coverage. Chief Carrillo advised as of October 7th they have had 24/7 coverage. On the police report only 23 calls were answered from the county. They are averaging 300 to 400 calls a month. They are on a 1 month rotation on graveyards. He will be down two officers when his two un-certified officers leave for the academy.

Eloy Medina brought up that there will be an increase in Hurley for trash pick-up. He wanted to verify if we are increasing rates. Marlena did advise that we do increase rates annually to follow the CPI Increases put out by the state yearly. Mr. Medina wants to advise the residents before hand. Councilor Frances Gonzales would like for the increase to start in January and we will have to eat the fees for the month of November and December. Clerk Ramos advised that it will roughly be about \$3000 per month that the city is having to take on. Councilor Diaz said we owe it to the residents to not start the fees until January. Councilor Gonzales would like to see an ad out in the paper about the increases that will start in January to give residents a fair warning. Marlena advised that speaking with the Utility clerk bills will go up about \$3 roughly.

Councilor Gonzales wanted to remind residents about a survey that needs to be completed form the health council. Also wanted to make everyone aware that on November 2nd from 6-8p.m. there will be a meeting at the Veterans Center on how we can handle homelessness issues and substance abuse issues. Councilor Diaz stated that this program is working up in Farmington. They help out with a van that is equipped with law enforcement and a social worker and they will pick up people to help them detox.

Councilor Diaz wanted to remind everyone that the Bayard Beautification Committee is having their annual trunk or treat this weekend and their candy drop.

Wednesday they will be assisting with the painting of the "C" and they will be shutting down the highway for the parade at 2 p.m. They will be assisting with the Trunk or Treat at the schools and the Bayard Beautification Committee. - The library provided a milestone spreadsheet report to Freeport 10/17/23, for the site investment grant and shared it with the city to correct their accounting records going forward.
- 3. The library received a Tx Red Bud tree for the park.
- 4. Enchanted Touch brought an excavator to smooth out the back park entrance for work to commence.
- The library hosted a Halloween Craft Day with the SW Women's Fiber Arts Collective on Friday, October 27, 2023 and we had about 15 people decorate masks, bandanas, skulls and pumpkins.
- 6. We have resumed ILL (Inter Library Loan) service with the State Library.
- 7. Sonya is working with the Volunteer Center of Grant County to go live and begin the search in earnest for volunteers who are looking to be aligned with this type of agency. We hope to finalize in early 2024. The cost will be \$100.
- 8. Anna Cantrell will be doing an unpaid internship here in January-February 2024 through Vermont College. She had a site visit 10/25/23 and is excited for the opportunity.
- 9. Sonya submitted an application for a scholarship to the Public Library Assoc. conference in April, 2024.
- 10. The Frontier Food Hub reached out and would like for the library to form a partnership that facilitates and helps aid with food insecurity in the mining district. We will begin holding meetings in November in the library conference room.

Mayor Fierro,

Thanks for your interest in this program, here are some of the details around it:

- 1) DFA will need a letter of interest for the funding from the local government requesting the funding for the box. DFA provides the \$10,000 to purchase the box.
- 2) The local government must fund the construction and installation of the box. I am hearing from local governments the costs to install have run from \$3,000 to \$11,000. The timeline and costs to completing are determined by this factor. Espanola, Carlsbad, Belen, and Hobbs have them already, so I recommend calling them to get more details around their experience with the install process and costs. (especially since the estimates vary so much)
- 3) There is also a yearly maintenance fee that comes from the infant surrender company that is used.
- 4) DFA does not cover the installation costs, only the box itself, and that money is readily provided to the local government.

If you decide to move forward, just send me a letter of interest for the funding and we will make it happen!

 - (g) Advise the development, monitoring, and compliance of Community Development Block Grant applications and awards.
 - (h) Advise Member in the preparation of applications for funding under various State and Federal grants.
 - (i) Advise and represent Member with economic development, housing. transportation., community development, and legislative initiatives and programs.
 - (k) Advise Member with Capital Outlay process.
 - (1) Provide trainings, meeting, and other events that will benefit the membership.
- 2. Member agrees to furnish the following:
 - (a) Designate a voting member to the Southwest New Mexico Council of Governments and participate in policy development and administration.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

BETWEEN CITY OF BAYARD, NEW MEXICO AND THE SOUTHWEST NEW MEXICO COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

FOR

"Capital Outlay Fiscal Agency Services"

- WHEREAS, the Southwest New Mexico Council of Governments (hereinafter "SWNMCOG") provides a range of planning and technical assistance services on behalf of Catron County and other entities in the Southwest New Mexico region; and
- WHEREAS, SWNMCOG was statutorily established to function as a multi-jurisdictional planning entity, formed by and in service to a voluntary association of units of local government in Planning District 1, pursuant to: the *Regional Planning Act*, (Section 3-56-1 through 3-56-9, NMSA 1978); the *Planning District Act*, (Sections 4-58-1 through 4-58-6, NMSA 1978); and *Executive Orders* of the New Mexico Governor dated January 2, 1969 and January 10, 1973 regarding Planning and Development Districts in the State of New Mexico; and
- WHEREAS, the SWNMCOG is moreover established by the US Department of Commerce as an "Economic Development District" pursuant to the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965; and
- WHEREAS, Catron County is an active member of SWNMCOG and holds one (1) voting seat on the Board of Directors thereof; and
- whereas, the Local Government Division (LGD) of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration encourages the use of intergovernmental services agreements as appropriate to the efficient procurement of inter-agency services, and has affirmed that the Councils of Governments are well positioned to serve as alternative fiscal agents for capital outlay projects, when local governments are constrained from doing so under the provisions of Executive Order 2013-006; and
- WHEREAS, Catron County desires to engage SWNMCOG in providing fiscal agency services for several agreed upon capital outlay projects awarded by the New Mexico Legislature and administered by several State agencies; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties do mutually agree as follows:

This Agreement is entered into by and between the County and SWNMCOG pursuant to the following purposes, conditions and terms:

A. <u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this Agreement shall be for SWNMCOG to provide fiscal agent services in connection with funding for capital outlay projects as appropriated by the State Legislature for utilization by the County of Catron, to include those projects specifically appropriated in the 2023 State Legislative Session

and also other projects as subsequently appropriated and awarded by the State Legislature and as agreed upon in writing and by amendment between the parties.

- **B. SCOPE OF WORK**: SWNMCOG's services in support of the above purpose shall be to provide overall fiscal agency services associated with the identified projects, including:
 - 1. SWNMCOG Fiscal Agency Services:
 - Ensure that grant funds are expended in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and grant agreement and the transactions are appropriately accounted for in compliance with such laws, regulations, and grant agreement;
 - Ensure safeguarding of grant funds and assets acquired with grant funds and proper accounting thereof in compliance with applicable laws, regulations, and grant agreement;
 - Act as liaison between the County and appropriate NM State Agencies;
 - Provide technical assistance regarding capital outlay projects, process, and reporting to the appropriate State agencies;
 - Review and sign-off on project invoices to the appropriate State agency in a timely manner;
 - Work with the State on getting direct project reimbursements to the County and acting as a facilitator if disagreement arises;
 - County Role and Responsibilities. The County understands it is still ultimately responsible for
 executing and complying with all applicable State laws and grant agreement requirements such
 as flow down provisions, executing procurement responsibilities and subcontractor management,
 as well as project, grant, and financial management, including CPMS, quarterly, final, and other
 reporting.
- C. <u>TIMEFRAME</u>: Work pursuant to this Agreement shall be effective no sooner than <u>December 1, 2023</u>, and be completed no later than <u>June 30, 2025</u>, except as amended and mutually agreed upon in writing.

D. COMPENSATION:

- Amount: Total compensation under this Agreement shall not exceed 2% (2 percent) of total
 reimbursable expenditures from the State Legislative appropriations identified herein and/or as
 amended and mutually agreed to in writing, such compensation to be paid from revenue sources
 other than said appropriations
- 2. <u>Method of Payment</u>: The County agrees to pay to SWNMCOG the above-agreed percentage of expenses. It is agreed that Catron County will pay the first half (\$5,306.00) at the commencement of the project and the remaining half (\$5,306.00) at the completion of the project for a total of \$5306.00 for a total fiscal agent fee of \$10, 612.00.
- 3. Records and Recovery: SWNMCOG shall maintain appropriate records of services rendered during the Agreement's term and effect and retain them for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement. The records shall be subject to inspection by the County or its designees. Payment under this Agreement shall not foreclose the right of the County to recover excessive or illegal payment.

- E. <u>ACCESS TO INFORMATION</u>: It is agreed that the County and its agencies shall provide information, if needed, for purposes and work described in this Agreement. The SWNMCOG will be included and copied on all invoices and reports, prior to submission to the appropriate State agency.
- F. OWNERSHIP OF PROJECTS: All documents, capital improvements, and project assets produced pursuant to this Agreement shall be the property of Catron County, which shall assume full administrative responsibility for the life of the project or the State grant agreement required period, whichever comes first.

G. <u>LIMITATION OF LIABILITY</u>:

- The Agreement shall not create a general liability of the constituent members of SWNMCOG.
- 2. The County shall hold the SWNMCOG harmless with respect to any damages, expenses or claims arising or in connection with any negligent acts, errors or omissions performed by the County under this Agreement. This shall not be construed as a limitation of the SWNMCOG's liability under this Agreement or as otherwise provided by law.
- 3. The SWNMCOG shall hold the County harmless with respect to any damages, expenses or claims arising or in connection with any negligent acts, errors or omissions performed by the SWNMCOG under this Agreement. This shall not be construed as a limitation of County's liability under this Agreement or as otherwise provided by law.
- H. MODIFICATION AND TERMINATION: Any modifications or amendments to this Agreement shall be in writing, and when signed by both parties shall be made part of the Agreement. The Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other.
- CERTIFICATION. The County shall comply with the requirements of all applicable laws, rules and regulations, and shall assume full responsibility for payment of federal, state and local taxes and contributions imposed or required under Social Security, Workers Compensation and income tax laws. The County is required to follow all State procurement regulations and it is the County's obligation and responsibilities to follow all State requirements in the project bond questionnaire and associated State grant agreements, including reporting and drawdown requirements. For documentation, these documents have been attached to this agreement for each project.

J. ADEQUATE APPROPRIATIONS

Performance of this agreement is contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made for the performance of this Agreement. If sufficient appropriations and authorization are not made, this Agreement shall terminate immediately upon written notice being given by the SWNMCOG to the County. The SWNMCOG's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations are available shall be accepted by the County and shall be final. If the SWNMCOG proposes an amendment to the Agreement to unilaterally reduce the number of projects it will certify, the County shall have the option to terminate the Agreement or agree to the reduced number of projects, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the proposed amendment.

K. PENALTIES

The Procurement Code, § 13-1-28 through §13-1-199, NMSA 1978, imposes civil and criminal penalties for its violation. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for illegal bribes, gratuities and kickbacks.

L. NOTICES

Any notice required to be given to either party by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person, by courier service or by U.S. mail, either first class or certified, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, as follows:
