This still need to be reported as a finding but has been corrected, third finding was lack of internal control is journal entries to be reviewed and approved, as soon as new management started this was corrected and last finding was payment with out services rendered the city paid \$23,490.00 before work was done and skipped the biding process and placed the city at legal and financial risk. This was done by the previous management and was identify by the new management and was brought to the auditor attention.

May 21, 2025, Bayard Public Library Board Report

I received word that we did not get the 30Something Grant, however, I was told the outdoor kitchen was popular among the voting members. The good news is that Frontier Food Hub got one of the 4 grants to start building out the community garden next door to the Bayard Police Department.

I found a grant that we don't need a fiscal sponsor for that could potential support the our community gardening efforts called LOR: Field Work grant. Here is some information about the grant:

Our 2025 Field Work effort seeks to uncover innovative ideas that improve mental health in rural communities. Projects may be innovative in many ways: from how they engage residents to where they take place or even who is leading them. Our hope is that ultimately, these ideas can be shared and replicated in other rural places.

Beginning May 12, when applications open, LOR invites people with creative ideas about how to improve mental health and social well-being in rural places to apply for between \$1,000 and \$25,000 in funding.

Since this grant came across my email, I do not plan to apply for the Con Alma grant that we needed a fiscal sponsor for.

I do plan on applying for Outdoor Equity Grant up to \$40K, opens June 1 -Municipalities are eligible to apply on their own. This grant would help us continue the effort to start an outdoor gear lending library.

OUR MISSION

We are dedicated to stopping the killing of adoptable healthy cats and dogs in SW New Mexico shelters and beyond.

We are committed to improving the quality of life for cats and dogs who are in need of food, appropriate shelter and veterinary care through our community outreach, Good Neighbor Program, which serves our low-income and homeless population.

Our seven Board of Directors and three Advisory Board Members have extensive years of experience in animal rescue, advocacy and training. We currently have 14 volunteers who are helping to accomplish our mission of 95% no kill in Southwest NM Shelters.

HISTORY

For the past 12 years a small group of volunteers have assisted with the care and rehoming of over 200 dogs and cats from the Mining District of Grant County in rural SW New Mexico.

In August of 2024 some of these committed volunteers came together to form NMBARC (New Mexico Borderland Animal Rescue Coalition), a 100% volunteer based 501c (3) non-profit animal welfare and advocacy organization.



WHAT WE DO

Rescue and transport animals to no kill shelters and sanctuaries where they have a better chance of finding forever homes.

Find foster homes for animals who are awaiting forever homes.

Volunteer at the three Mining District shelters in Grant County by feeding, cleaning, walking and socializing dogs for faster adoptions. We fill in for ACO's on week-ends, holidays, days off and vacancies.

Through our Good Neighbor Program, we improve the living environment of outside dogs by providing dog houses and straw where needed. We put up tarps on kennels and help reinforce kennels and fences.

Sponsor low or no cost spay/neuter and vaccinations services.

Provide education and consultation to the public and to government entities regarding animal welfare.
