#### PUBLIC INPUT

Ralph Jimenez the president of the Copper Little League thanked the council for everything. He stated the internet is installed and the security cameras will be up and running. Everything at the Little League is going smoothly. The Senior League will be starting soon. The Little League will not be hosting the State Tournament and the season will end June 4, 2022.

Adrian Ortiz a coach for the Copper Little League came before the council and stated there will be t-ball and coach pitch games played this weekend May 14-15 at the little league filed.

Councilor Diaz asked who is liable if someone gets hurt, will there be security present, and who will be cleaning up the fields?

Ralph Jimenez will have all kids insured by the league's insurance, Chief Carrillo will cover if no one is scheduled and Adrian Ortiz will be sure to have the fields clean.

Steve Gabaree has concerns with M&M Auto. The owners are moving in more cars and more junk. He now is parking the cars on the street and has cars on blocks. To him it seems things are going backwards.

Highway 356 project is underway and should be done by December 2022. The owners on Central Avenue with the burned house have been given a letter and the owners have 6 months to take care of the issue, the repairs on the railroad crossing are underway. They are getting all the contracts together, cost estimates and getting the project awarded to whoever will be doing the work. The project will be completed by the end of the federal fiscal year.

Rudy Martinez stated he has been reading in the newspaper the problems that are going on at the wastewater treatment plant. The main concern he has is with the eroding of the pipe line and he knows it's a matter of funding. He does realize there are other issues but we need to take them one step at a time. Mr. Martinez has been doing some research on the internet and came across a rural development grant program that continues, there is no deadline and is specific for water and wastewater. He will share that information with the city.

9. Approval of the Fire Proclamation.

#### Proclamation

WHEREAS, the City of Bayard Code of Ordinances Section 18-32 provides the authority for the Governing Body to declare extreme fire danger due to severe drought conditions within the boundaries of the town; and

WHEREAS, in recent weeks, the fire danger has increased throughout the State due to warmer temperatures, lower humidity, high winds, and an abundance of dry, fine fuels; and

WHEREAS, according to the United States Drought Monitor, approximately 93% of New Mexico is experiencing severe drought conditions, while more than 70 % of the state is experiencing extreme to exceptional drought conditions; and

WHEREAS, significant fire danger and prevailing drought conditions create the possibility for numerous natural disasters, including sever wildfires, flooding due to severe wildfires, and crop production loss; and

WHEREAS, Grant County is experiencing, or recently experienced, wildfires, including the East Fire; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Mexico have recently enacted Executive Order 2022-022 declaring severe that drought and fire conditions currently exist throughout New Mexico and urge counties, municipalities, and local governments to implement appropriate fire prevention measures legally in their power and firework bans pursuant to the Fireworks Safety and Licensing Act, NMSA 1978, 60-2C-1 to -11.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Raul Villanueva, Mayor Pro-tem of the City of Bayard declare severe drought and fire conditions exist in Bayard, Grant County and hereby implement the following fire restrictions within the city boundaries:

- A. No building or maintaining of campfires.
- B. No open burning to include the burning of yard waste, tree limbs, and weeds.
  - C. UL approved propane grills with appropriate covers/lids are approved.
- D. Any other outdoor wood or charcoal burning device shall have appropriate covers such as screen, metal siding and/or dirt. Fires used to prepare hot coals must have a protective screen and a five foot clearance around the entire fire pit. Fire pits must have prior approval from the Bayard Fire Department who will issue a special burn permit.

Restrictions are effective immediately; May 9, 2022; and shall remain in effect until conditions improve and will only be lifted by the Fire Chief.

Any individual caught in violation of this order is subject to the following penalties: A fine of not more than \$300.00 or imprisonment or not more than 90 days, or both.
