MINUTES CITY COUNCIL MEETING

7651 E. Central Park Ave, Bel Aire, KS January 21, 2025 7:00 PM



- I. CALL TO ORDER: Council President Greg Davied called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- II. ROLL CALL

Council President Greg Davied and Councilmembers Tyler Dehn, Emily Hamburg, Tom Schmitz, and John Welch were present. Mayor Jim Benage participated in the meeting via videoconference.

Also present were City Manager Ted Henry, City Attorney Maria Schrock, Director of Community Development Paula Downs and City Clerk Melissa Krehbiel.

- **III. OPENING PRAYER:** Father Terry Hedrick provided the opening prayer.
- IV. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE AMERICAN FLAG

Council President Greg Davied led the pledge of allegiance.

- V. **DETERMINE AGENDA ADDITIONS:** There were no additions.
- VI. CONSENT AGENDA
 - A. Approval of Minutes of the January 7, 2025 City Council meeting.
 - B. Approve the Mayor's reappointment of Hildegard Yops to the Bel Aire Tree Board, term effective March 1, 2025 to March 1, 2027.
 - C. Confirm the Mayor's appointment of Brian Stuart to the Planning Commission, term effective from 2/1/2025 to 2/1/2028.
 - D. Accept and file the Bel Aire Land Bank 2024 Ending Sales and Financial Report.
 - E. Accept \$2,672,597 into the General Fund, for further transfer to special projects account, paid from the City of Bel Aire Land Bank in reimbursement to the City for special assessments and debt pay off on Land Bank property.

MOTION: Councilmember Hamburg moved to approve the Consent Agenda as listed and authorize the Mayor to sign. Councilmember Dehn seconded the motion. *Motion carried 5-0*.

VII. DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE

A. Consideration of Appropriations Ordinance No. 25-01 in the amount of \$611,503.07.

MOTION: Councilmember Dehn moved to approve Appropriations Ordinance No. 25-01. Councilmember Welch seconded the motion. *Motion carried 5-0*.

VIII. CITY REQUESTED APPEARANCES: None.

IX. CITIZEN CONCERNS: No one spoke.

X. REPORTS

A. Council Member Reports

Councilmember Hamburg reported on a meeting she had with the manager of the Chisholm Creek Utility Authority (CCUA). Councilmember Schmitz reported he recently looked at the duplexes in Chapel Landing 2nd Addition and noticed that power meters are on the same side.

Council President Greg Davied briefly reported on the latest meeting of the Sedgwick County Association of Cities (SCAC).

Councilmember Dehn reported on the latest K-254 Corridor Development meeting. He announced that he recently applied to the 2025 Champions Institute by Smart Growth America. The organization provides knowledge and training to elected officials to help provide activity-friendly routes to everyday destinations.

B. Mayor's Report

Mayor Benage reported on his trip to Washington, D.C. for the presidential inauguration. He also attended the latest meetings of the SCAC, the Utility Advisory Committee (UAC), and the Wichita Area Municipal Planning Organization (WAMPO). On January 12th he attended the Oath of Office ceremony for Sedgwick County officials. On January 13th, he attended the Oath of Office ceremony for judges of the 18th Judicial District, including former Bel Aire City Attorney Jacqueline Kelly.

C. City Attorney Report

City Attorney Maria Schrock gave a brief report on possible new ordinances regarding illegal camping, impeding the flow of traffic, and recreational vehicles/trailers.

D. City Manager Report

City Manager Ted Henry reported on a recent K-254 Corridor meeting, and the increased use of the new utility billing payment portal. He also thanked the staff safety committee for their efforts to meet requirements set by the Kansas Municipal Insurance Trust (KMIT). The City was recently awarded the Gold Standard by KMIT, which includes a 13% savings on work comp insurance for the City.

XI. ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND FINAL ACTIONS

A. Consideration Of A \$15,000 Funding Agreement With The Bel Aire Chamber Of Commerce For 2025.

MOTION: Councilmember Welch moved to approve the 2025 Funding Agreement with the Bel Aire Chamber of Commerce as presented and authorize the Mayor to sign. Councilmember Dehn seconded the motion. *Motion carried 4-1*, with Councilmember Hamburg voting against the motion.

B. Consideration Of A Funding Agreement For The Bel Aire Senior Center.

City Attorney Maria Schrock noted that Section 4.7 of the agreement was amended to include a \$50 cap for gratuities.

MOTION: Council President Davied moved to approve a Funding Agreement between Sedgwick County and the City of Bel Aire, for the Bel Aire Senior Center, with the amendment to 4.7 for the \$50 cap to gratuities, and authorize the Mayor to sign. Councilmember Welch seconded the motion. *Motion carried 5-0*.

C. ZON-24-02 Consideration of An Ordinance Approving The Recommendation Of The Bel Aire Planning Commission Recommending a zone change request in the City from C-1 Neighborhood Commercial, Office and Retail, to R-5 Garden and Patio Homes, Townhouses and Condominiums Uses (Skyview at Webb Addition,) generally located at ¼ mile South of East 53rd Street North and North Webb Road, on the West side.

Council President Greg Davied announced the agenda item. Before proceeding with the hearing, Mr. Davied asked if any Council member wished to disqualify themselves from participating in this case because they have a conflict of interest. Mr. Davied asked if any member of the City Council had received any ex-parte verbal or written communications prior to this agenda item, which they would like to share. All Councilmembers responded no to both questions. The City Clerk confirmed that no protest petitions were received regarding this case.

The Council confirmed that they had received the Unapproved Minutes of the Planning Commission for December 12, 2024, which summarizes the public hearing for this case. City Staff provided a brief report on the case and stood for questions from the Council. The applicant was not present.

Council President Davied invited anyone interested in the case to come forward to speak. No one spoke. Council President Davied then closed the public hearing. The City Clerk confirmed that no written communications had been received.

The Council then deliberated. Councilmembers cited several Golden Factors as supporting factors in their decision to support the zoning change. These factors included the character of the neighborhood, agreement with the City's master growth plan, and the zoning of nearby properties.

Council President Davied then remarked that persons aggrieved by the final decision of the City Council on this matter have rights provided at law, and he thanked everyone who had participated.

MOTION: Councilmember Welch moved to approve the findings of fact and recommendation of the Planning Commission for ZON-24-02, Adopt the Ordinance as Presented, and authorize the Mayor to sign. Councilmember Dehn seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote:

EXECUTIVE SESSION

MOTION: Councilmember Welch moved to recess into executive session to discuss confidential financial data. The discussion will be pursuant to K.S.A. 75- 4319 (b)(4) to discuss data relating to financial affairs or trade secrets of corporations, partnerships, trusts, and individual proprietorships. Invite the City Manager and City Attorney. The meeting will be for a period of 10 minutes, and the open meeting will resume in City Council Chambers at 7:52 p.m. Council President Davied seconded the motion. *Motion carried 5-0*.

The Council recessed for executive session. At 7:55 p.m., Council President Greg Davied called the meeting back to order and stated that no binding action had been taken.

D. Consideration of A Resolution Of The Governing Body Of The City Of Bel Aire, Kansas Authorizing The Redemption And Payment Of Its Taxable Industrial Revenue Bonds, Series 2024, (Bayside Development Project) And The Sale And Conveyance Of Certain Property To Bayside Development, LLC.

MOTION: Councilmember Welch moved to adopt A Resolution Of The Governing Body Of The City Of Bel Aire, Kansas Authorizing The Redemption And Payment Of Its Taxable Industrial Revenue Bonds, Series 2024, (Bayside Development Project) And The Sale And Conveyance Of Certain Property To Bayside Development, LLC and authorize the Mayor to sign. Council President Davied seconded the motion. *Motion carried 5-0.*

- XII. EXECUTIVE SESSION: This item was addressed earlier in the meeting.
- XIII. DISCUSSION AND FUTURE ISSUES: There was no further discussion.
- XIV. ADJOURNMENT

MOTION: Councilmember Hamburg moved to adjourn. Councilmember Schmitz seconded the motion. *Motion carried 5-0*.

PHASE 2 PAVING PETITION

To the Mayor and City Council Bel Aire, Kansas

Dear Council Members:

1. We, the undersigned owners of record as below designated, of Lots, Parcels, and Tracts of real property described as follows:

Skyview at Block 49 2nd Addition

Lots 1-2, Block A Lots 1 - 27, Block B Lots 1 - 9, & 11 - 26, Block C Lots 1-5, Block D

do hereby petition, pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 12-6a01 et seq., as amended, as follows:

(a) That there be constructed pavement on; **TOBEN DRIVE** from the north line of Lot 6, Block C to north line of the Addition; **TOBEN COURT** from the west line of Lot 27, Block C to and including Cul-De-Sac; **JOSHUA STREET** from the west line of the Addition to the west line of Toben Drive; **FORBES STREET** from the east line of Toben Drive to the east line of the Addition; and **FORBES CIRCLE** from the west line of Toben Street to, and including the cul-de-sac.

That said pavement on Joshua Street, Forbes Street, and Toben Drive between aforesaid limits be constructed for a width of thirty (30) feet from gutter line to gutter line, and each gutter to be two and one-half (2-1/2) feet in width; making a total roadway width of thirty-five (35) feet. Said pavement on Toben Court and Forbes Circle between aforesaid limits shall be constructed for a width of twenty-four (24) feet from gutter line to gutter line, and each gutter to be two and one-half (2-1/2) feet in width; making a total roadway width of twenty-nine (29) feet with plans and specifications to be furnished by the City Engineer of the City of Bel Aire, Kansas. Drainage to be installed where necessary. A 5' sidewalk shall be installed on one side of Toben Drive and Joshua adjacent to the new pavement.

(b) That the estimated and probable cost of the foregoing improvement being One Million One hundred Thirty-six Thousand Dollars (\$1,136,000), with 100 percent payable by the improvement district. Said estimated cost as above set forth may be increased to include temporary interest or finance costs incurred during the course of design and construction of the project, and also may be increased at the pro rata of 1 percent per month from and after January 1, 2025.

(c) That the land or area above described be constituted as an improvement district against which shall be assessed 100 percent of the total actual cost of the improvement for which the improvement district is liable.

If this improvement is abandoned, altered and/or constructed privately in part or whole that precludes building this improvement under the authority of this petition, any costs that the City of Bel Aire incurs shall be assessed to the property described above in accordance with the terms of the petition. In addition, if the improvement is abandoned at any state during the design and/or construction of the improvement or if it is necessary for the City of Bel Aire to redesign, repair or reconstruct the improvement after its initial design and/or construction because the design or construction does not meet the requirements of the City, then such costs associated with the redesign, repair or reconstruction of said improvement shall be assessed to the property described above in accordance with the terms of this petition.

(d) That the method of assessment of all costs of the improvement or which the improvement district shall be liable shall be on a fractional basis.

The fractional shares provided for herein have been determined on the basis of equal shares being assessed to lots or parcels of substantially comparable size and/or value:

Skyview at Block 49 2nd Addition

Lots 1-2, Block A Lots 1 - 27, Block B Lots 1 - 9, & 11 - 26, Block C Lots 1-5, Block D

The above listed lots shall each pay 1/59 of the total cost of the improvements.

In the event all or part of the lots or parcels in the improvement district are replatted before assessments have been levied, the assessments against the replatted area shall be recalculated on the basis of the method of assessment set forth herein. Where the ownership of a single lot is or may be divided into two or more parcels, the assessment to the lot so divided shall be assessed to each ownership or parcel on a square foot basis.

Except when driveways are requested to serve a particular tract, lot, or parcel, the cost of said driveway shall be in addition to the assessment to said tract, lot, or parcel and shall be in addition to the assessment for other improvements.

- 2. It is requested that the improvements hereby petitioned be made without notice and hearing, which but for this request, would be required by K.S.A. 12-6a04. This petition may be combined with other petitions of similar nature in order to form one public improvement project.
- 3. That names may not be withdrawn from this petition by the signers thereof after the Governing body commences consideration of the petition or later than seven (7) days after filing, whichever comes first.
- 4. That when this petition has been filed with the City Clerk and it has been certified that the signatures thereon are according to the records of the Register of Deeds of Sedgwick County, Kansas, the petition may be found sufficient if signed by either (1) a majority of the resident owners of record of property liable for assessment under the proposal, or (2) the resident owners of record of more than one-half of the area liable for assessment under the proposal, or (3) the owners of record (whether resident or not) of more than one-half of the area liable for assessment under the proposal. The Governing Body is requested to proceed in the manner provided by statute to the end that the petitioned improvements may be expeditiously completed and placed in use.

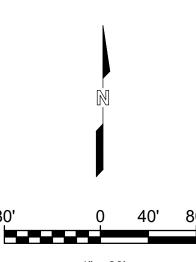

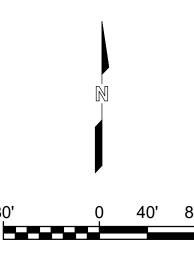

RESOLUTION NO. R-25-___

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE SALE OF CHISHOLM CREEK UTILITY AUTHORITY WATER AND WASTEWATER FACILITIES REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2025.

WHEREAS, the City of Bel Aire, Kansas (the "City") is a member of the Chisholm Creek Utility Authority ("CCUA") and utilizes water treatment and distribution and wastewater collection and treatment services provided by the CCUA; and

WHEREAS, CCUA has heretofore authorized and is undertaking certain internal improvements, described as follows (the "Improvements"): a project to enhance nutrient removal by the wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) in order to meet future permit limits and better protect the receiving stream and environment while increasing the capacity of the WWTP by approximately one-third, and any improvements related thereto; and

WHEREAS, CCUA has found it necessary and advisable that CCUA proceed with the issuance of its revenue bonds to permanently finance the costs of the Improvements; and

WHEREAS, CCUA has selected the firm of Raymond James & Associates, Inc., Leawood, Kansas (the "Municipal Advisor"), as municipal advisor for a series of water and wastewater facilities revenue bonds to be issued by CCUA and designated "Chisholm Creek Utility Authority Water and Wastewater Facilities Revenue Bonds, Series 2025" (the "Series 2025 Bonds"), in order to provide funds to permanently finance the Improvements described above; and

WHEREAS, CCUA has selected the firm of Robert W. Baird & Co., Incorporated, Clayton, Missouri (the "Purchaser"), as purchaser of the Series 2025 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to approve the selection of the Municipal Advisor and Purchaser by CCUA, and to authorize the Municipal Advisor and Purchaser to proceed with the offering for sale of the Series 2025 Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BEL AIRE, KANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The selection of the Municipal Advisor and Purchaser by CCUA are hereby authorized and approved. The Municipal Advisor and Purchaser are authorized to proceed with the offering for sale of the Series 2025 Bonds, as described in the Preliminary Official Statement referenced herein. The Series 2025 Bonds shall be sold, subject to the approving opinion of Gilmore & Bell, P.C. ("Bond Counsel"), on a negotiated basis to the Purchaser. The timing of offering for sale, the pricing, and the determination of the structuring and repayment terms of the Series 2025 Bonds shall be determined by CCUA, in consultation with the Municipal Advisor and Bond Counsel.

The confirmation of the sale of the Series 2025 Bonds shall be subject to the execution of a bond purchase agreement between the Purchaser and CCUA and the adoption of a resolution by the governing body of CCUA authorizing the issuance of the Series 2025 Bonds and the execution of various documents necessary to deliver the Series 2025 Bonds. The City hereby approves the execution of a bond purchase agreement by CCUA, subject to the following parameters: (a) the principal amount of the Series 2025 Bonds shall not exceed \$23,000,000; and (b) the true interest cost of the Bonds shall not exceed 4.75%.

Section 2. The City acknowledges that there will be portions of the Preliminary Official Statement that contain information about the City, and the City hereby authorizes its officers and employees, in conjunction with the Municipal Advisor, to assist in the preparation of the Preliminary Official Statement. The City hereby consents to the use and public distribution by the Purchaser of the Preliminary Official Statement in connection with the offering for sale of the Series 2025 Bonds.

Section 3. For the purpose of enabling the Purchaser to comply with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule"), the Mayor and City Manager or other appropriate officers of the City are hereby authorized: (a) to approve the form of said Preliminary Official Statement and to execute a "Certificate Deeming Preliminary Official Statement Final" in substantially the form attached hereto as *Exhibit A*, as approval of the City information in the Preliminary Official Statement, such official's signature thereon being conclusive evidence of such official's and the City's approval thereof; (b) covenant to provide continuous secondary market disclosure by annually transmitting certain financial information and operating data and other information necessary to comply with the Rule to certain national repositories and the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, as applicable; and (c) to take such other actions or execute such other documents as such officers in their reasonable judgment deem necessary to enable the Purchaser to comply with the requirements of such Rule.

Section 4. The Mayor, City Manager, Clerk and other officers and representatives of the City, the Municipal Advisor, the Purchaser and Bond Counsel, are hereby authorized and directed to take such other action as may be necessary to carry out the offering for sale of the Series 2025 Bonds.

The transactions described in this Resolution may be conducted, and documents related to the Series 2025 Bonds may be sent, received, executed, and stored, by electronic means or transmissions. Copies, telecopies, electronic files and other reproductions of original executed documents (or documents executed by electronic means or transmissions) shall be deemed to be authentic and valid counterparts of such documents for all purposes, including the filing of any claim, action or suit in the appropriate court of law.

Section 5. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

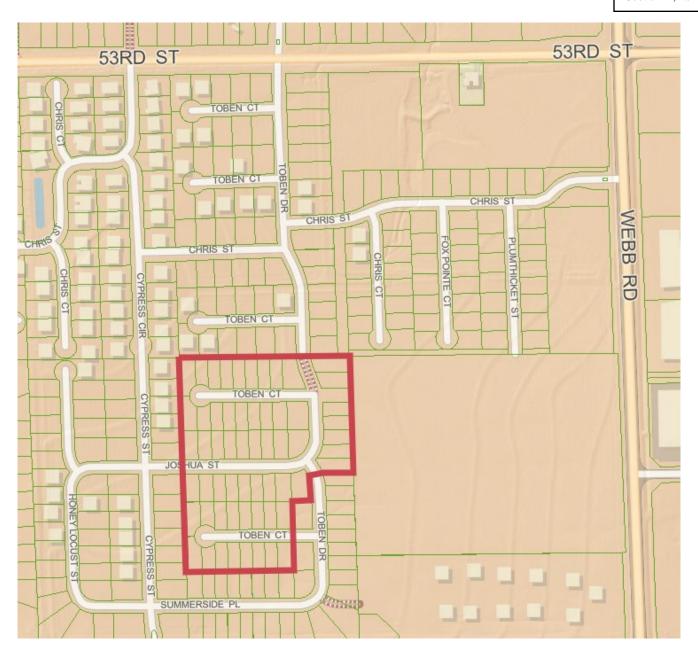

AMENDMENT TO SIXTH SUPPLEMENTAL WATER SUPPLY AND WASTEWATER SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Amendment to Sixth Supplemental Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement (the "Amendment") made and entered into as of February 11, 2025, by and between **THE CHISHOLM CREEK UTILITY AUTHORITY** (the "Seller") and the **CITY OF BEL AIRE, KANSAS** (the "Purchaser").

WHEREAS, the Seller and Purchaser have heretofore entered into a Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement, as amended and supplemented by a First Supplemental Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement, as further amended and supplemented by a Second Supplemental Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement, as further amended and supplemented by a Third Supplemental Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement, as further amended and supplemented by a Fourth Supplemental Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement, as further amended and supplemented by a Fifth Supplemental Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement, and as further amended and supplemented by a Sixth Supplemental Water Supply and Wastewater Service Agreement (the "Sixth Supplemental Agreement," and, with the foregoing agreement and supplemental agreements, collectively, the "Agreement"), pursuant to which the Purchaser purchases potable water and wastewater collection and treatment services from the Seller; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement, including the Sixth Supplemental Agreement, may be amended, modified or otherwise altered in any manner by writing signed by both the Seller and the Purchaser; and

WHEREAS, Seller and the Purchaser find that it is necessary and advisable to amend Section 1.16 of the Sixth Supplemental Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Seller and the Purchaser have authorized the execution of this Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual agreements and covenants herein and the Agreement contained, the Seller and the Purchaser hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. **Amendment.** Section 1.16 of the Sixth Supplemental Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1.16. Termination. This Sixth Supplemental Agreement shall terminate (a) on March 1, 2025, if by that date (i) the Seller's wastewater treatment plant expansion proposed as of the date of this Sixth Supplemental Agreement has not been designed in compliance with Kansas Department of Health and Environment laws, regulations and directives and (ii) a Notice of Award for a construction contract for such plant expansion pursuant to such design has not been issued by the Seller, or (b) on March 27, 2025, if by that date the construction contract for such plant expansion has not been entered into by the Seller.

Section 2. **Ratification**. Except as expressly modified in this Amendment, the Sixth Supplemental Agreement is hereby ratified and confirmed by the parties as of the date of this Amendment.

RE: Payment Card Processing Fees



BACKGROUND:

On January 1st, 2025, the City implemented a 2.5% fee for all utility payment transactions. Staff encountered some challenges with the processing software after Mayor Benage and a resident raised concerns regarding debit transactions. Initially, we sought clarification from Tyler Technologies, who told us we could implement the fee in the first place, like most of their utility billing customers across the country do.

A significant issue faced by Tyler Technologies and other cities is the inability of software to differentiate between debit and standard credit cards for fee application. After several discussions, we uncovered the root of the issue. Tyler Tech explained that 'Pin Debit' transactions are treated like cash and cannot incur fees. However, debit cards can be processed as credit cards by swiping them without entering a PIN. This also applies to online payments, where no PIN is required, making them technically credit transactions. Once this was explained, staff immediately suspended all fees connected to payments to gather more information on the topic.

This topic can become extremely confusing with many factors coming into play such as federal law, state law, and card network rules that VISA, Mastercard, and Discover require their merchants to adhere to. Another aspect of confusion is the fee type terminology and how each type is defined. The three main fee types are surcharges, service fees, and convenience fees. The following types of additional fees and their respective payment channels and payment types are outlined below.

FEE TYPES:

Surcharges: An additional amount added to the credit card transaction to pass along all processing costs to the customer. This fee type applies to the following payment channels and types:

Payment channels: Online, IVR (phone), text to pay, and POS (point of sale/in-person). Payment types: Credit cards.

Service fees (VISA): A modified form of convenience fee added to transactions by certain allowable merchants (government being one of them) to recoup processing costs. This fee type applies to the following payment channels and types:

Payment channels: Online, IVR (phone), text to pay, and POS (point of sale/in-person). Payment types: Credit cards, Debit cards, and ACH.

Convenience fees: Additional amount added to transactions for a bona fide convenience using non-standard payment channels. Convenience fees must be a reasonable and fixed amount across all non-standard payment channels. This fee type applies to the following payment channels and types:

Payment Channels: Online, IVR (phone), and text to pay.

Payment Types: Credit Cards and Debit cards

OPTIONS:

Option 1: Continue to absorb all processing fees:

The City has historically absorbed all processing fees derived from payment card transactions (credit/debit cards). The City's previous payment card processing fees averaged between 4.5% and 5.5% totaling approx. \$160,000 in processing costs for FY24. Our new Tyler Payments processing fee is 2% plus all interchange and card brand fees, which after one month of processing, is approx. 2.5676% of all payment card transactions. If the city chose to continue absorbing all fees our annual payment card processing costs could range from \$75,000 to \$90,000.

Option 2: Explore charging a convenience fee:

The City could explore charging a convenience fee for non-standard payment types as defined above to reduce the overall cost of payment card processing. Staff is confirming if this fee type would require the City to register and enroll in VISA's program for select government entities. Mastercard and Discover convenience fee programs for government entities do not require registration. The fee must be a reasonable and fixed amount.

A meeting with Tyler Technologies has been scheduled for 2/3/25 to discuss option 2.

The Developer of Skyview at Block 49 2nd, Phase 2 is ready to move forward with the construction of the Water, Storm and Paving Improvements to support the subdivision. Bids were accepted on January 23rd for the project. Four contractors submitted bids.

All bids were slightly over the original petition amount, therefore, revised petitions and resolutions are also on the agenda for this Council meeting. The cost of the improvements for these projects will be financed through a bond and spread as special assessments against the benefiting lots.
