# MINUTES CITY COUNCIL MEETING

- I. CALL TO ORDER: Council President Justin Smith called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- II. ROLL CALL

Present were Greg Davied, Emily Hamburg, Justin Smith, and John Welch. Mayor Jim Benage joined the meeting by video conference. Tyler Dehn was absent.

Also present were City Manager Ty Lasher, City Attorney Jacqueline Kelly, City Engineer Anne Stephens, City Clerk Melissa Krehbiel, and Bond Counsel Kevin Cowan of Gilmore & Bell.

- **III. OPENING PRAYER:** A moment of silent prayer was held.
- IV. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE AMERICAN FLAG

Council President Smith led the pledge of allegiance.

- V. PROCLAMATION
  - A. Veteran's Day, November 11, 2022: Council President Smith read the Proclamation.
- VI. **DETERMINE AGENDA ADDITIONS:** There were no additions.
- VII. CONSENT AGENDA
  - A. Minutes of the October 18, 2022 City Council meeting.
  - B. Accept a Petition for Water Main Improvements to serve Homestead Senior Landing.
  - C. Approval of A Resolution Determining The Advisability Of The Making Of Certain Internal Improvements In The City Of Bel Aire, Kansas; Making Certain Findings With Respect Thereto; And Authorizing And Providing For The Making Of The Improvements In Accordance With Such Findings (Water Main Improvements/Homestead Senior Landing).

#### VIII. DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE

### A. Consideration of Appropriations Ordinance 22-20 in the amount of \$763,955.65.

**MOTION:** Councilmember Hamburg moved to accept Appropriations Ordinance 22-20. Councilmember Davied seconded the motion. *Motion carried 4-0.* 

### IX. CITY REQUESTED APPEARANCES

### A. Rosemarie Wood, NonprofitGO

Ms. Wood introduced Vickie Kline, CEO of NonprofitGO. Ms. Kline gave a brief presentation about the history of, and services provided by NonprofitGO.

### X. CITIZEN CONCERNS:

Carolyn Gunzelman, 5029 E 39<sup>th</sup> Street North, spoke regarding a letter she received from the Mayor regarding a task force for the gravel roads in her neighborhood. She pointed out that the neighbors knew that 51% of the petitions must be returned for the proposed paving project to go forward. That threshold was not met, so clearly there was a consensus against the project. She feels that a task force and hiring a consulting firm is not warranted yet.

Melanie Penner, 4100 N Battin Street, stated she and her husband have lived at their current residence for 31 years. They are in favor of paved streets but not the petition. They were very disappointed that the City Council voted to deny moving forward with the paving. She asked several questions of the proposed task force: how much time and money will be spent to draw up task force documents and pay Garver; who pays for the improvements; who does maintenance; what equipment will be necessary for the maintenance; and who pays qualified personnel to provide the maintenance? Before any road materials are addressed, some streets need to be widened, crowns and bumps removed.

### XI. REPORTS

### A. Council Member Reports

Councilmember Hamburg reported that she attended Coffee with the Mayor on October 22<sup>nd</sup>. She encouraged residents to attend the Taste of Italy fundraiser on November 12<sup>th</sup>.

Councilmember Welch reminded citizens to vote.

Councilmember Davied reminded citizens to vote and thanked poll workers.

Councilmember Smith provided a brief report on the October 27<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Chisholm Creek Utility Authority (CCUA).

### B. Mayor's Report

Mayor Benage briefly reported on the latest meetings of the CCUA and Utility Advisory Committee, as well as Coffee with the Mayor on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, the League of Kansas Municipalities (LKM) Legislative Dinner held in Newton on October 27<sup>th</sup>, and a meeting with Boy Scout Pack #585 on October 20<sup>th</sup>. Mayor Benage reminded residents about Veteran's Day and thanked veterans for their service. He reminded citizens about early voting details, and about a Red Cross blood drive that will be held on November 5<sup>th</sup> at Resurrection Catholic Church. Mayor Benage encouraged citizens to continue to support Los Cunados & Dollar General during the Woodlawn Avenue construction project.

### C. City Attorney Report

City Attorney Kelly briefly reported on the proposed social media policy on the agenda tonight, and regulations regarding political signs.

## **D.** City Manager Report

City Manager Lasher reported on City efforts to follow environmentally friendly practices and the proposed paving projects that Council has considered recently for neighborhoods with gravel roads.

### XII. ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND FINAL ACTIONS

A. Consideration of confirming the Mayor's appointment of Emily Ryder to the Bel Aire Tree Board. The term will be for 4 years, ending in November 2026.

**MOTION:** Councilmember Davied moved to confirm the Mayor's appointment of Emily Ryder to the Bel Aire Tree Board. Councilmember Welch seconded the motion. *Motion carried 4-0.* 

B. Consideration of A Resolution Establishing An Aurora Park Gravel Roads Task Force For The City Of Bel Aire, Kansas.

**MOTION:** Councilmember Davied moved to accept A Resolution Establishing An Aurora Park Gravel Roads Task Force For The City Of Bel Aire, Kansas and authorize the Mayor to sign. Councilmember Welch seconded the motion. *Motion carried 3-1* with Councilmember Smith voting against the motion.

C. Consideration of an engineering consultant agreement with Garver for Gravel Roads Task Force.

**MOTION:** Councilmember Davied moved to table an engineering consultant agreement with Garver for Gravel Roads Task Force until the Task Force submits a preliminary recommendation to City Council but no later than October 30, 2023. Councilmember Welch seconded the motion. *Motion carried 4-0.* 

# D. Consideration of Terminating the Consulting Services Agreement with the Loyd Group, LLC.

**MOTION:** Councilmember Welch moved to approve the Termination of a Consulting Service Agreement with the Loyd Group, LLC and authorize the Council President to sign. Councilmember Hamburg seconded the motion. *Motion carried 4-0*.

# E. Consideration of a Proposal from Burns & McDonnell for CCUA Cost Sharing Evaluation.

Dave Newman, Burns & McDonnell, stood for questions from Council.

**MOTION:** Councilmember Hamburg moved to accept the proposal from Burns & McDonnell for CCUA Cost Sharing Evaluation and authorize the Council President to sign. Councilmember Davied seconded the motion. *Motion carried 4-0*.

F. Consideration of an Agreement for Professional Services with Baughman for Engineering Design and Construction Observation services for the 12" Water Main Extension to serve Homestead Senior Landing in the amount of \$30,000.00.

### **PHASE 2 SANITARY SEWER PETITION**

To the Mayor and City Council Bel Aire, Kansas

Dear Council Members:

1. We, the undersigned owners of record as below designated, of Lots, Parcels, and Tracts of real property described as follows:

### **Bristol Hollow**

Lots1-21, Block B

do hereby petition pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 12-6a01 et seq., as amended, as follows:

- (a) That there be constructed a lateral sanitary sewer to serve the area described above, according to plans and specifications to be furnished by the City Engineer of the City of Bel Aire, Kansas.
- (b) That the estimated and probable cost of the foregoing improvements being Two Hundred Fifty-Six Thousand Dollars (\$256,000), with 100 percent payable by the improvement district. Said estimated cost as above set forth may be increased to include temporary interest or finance costs incurred during the course of design and construction of the project, and also may be increased at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after November 1, 2022.
- (c) That the land or area above described be constituted as an improvement district against which shall be assessed 100 percent of the total actual cost of the improvement for which the improvement district is liable.

If this improvement is abandoned, altered and/or constructed privately in part or whole that precludes building this improvement under the authority of this petition, any costs that the City of Bel Aire incurs shall be assessed to the property described above in accordance with the terms of the petition. In addition, if the improvement is abandoned at any state during the design and/or construction of the improvement or if it is necessary for the City of Bel Aire to redesign, repair or reconstruct the improvement after its initial design and/or construction because the design or construction does not meet the requirements of the City, then such costs associated with the redesign, repair or reconstruction of said improvement shall be assessed to the property described above in accordance with the terms of this petition.

(d) That the method of assessment of all costs of the improvement or which the improvement district shall be liable shall be on a fractional basis.

The fractional shares provided for herein have been determined on the basis of equal shares being assessed to lots or parcels of substantially comparable size and/or value:

### **Bristol Hollow**

Lots1-21, Block B

The above lots shall each pay 1/21 of the total cost of the improvements.

In the event all or part of the lots or parcels in the improvement district are replated before assessments have been levied, the assessments against the replated area shall be recalculated on the basis of the method of assessment set forth herein. Where the ownership of a single lot is or may be divided into two or more parcels, the assessment to the lot so divided shall be assessed to each ownership or parcel on a square foot basis, or per the terms of a re-spread agreement submitted to the City of Bel Aire.

- 2. (a) It is requested that the improvement hereby petitioned be made without notice and hearing, which, but for this request, would be required by K.S.A. 12-6a04.
  - (b) Signatures on this petition are made with full knowledge and understanding that said signatures constitute a waiver of the limitations contained in K.S.A. 13-1013, which appear to limit the assessment for a lateral sewer to not more than one lateral sewer.
- 3. That names may not be withdrawn from this petition by the signers thereof after the Governing Body commences consideration of the petition or later than seven (7) days after filing, whichever occurs first.
- 4. That when this petition has been filed with the City Clerk and it has been certified that the signatures thereon are according to the records of the Register of Deeds of Sedgwick County, Kansas, the petition may be found sufficient if signed by either (1) a majority of the resident owners of record of property liable for assessment under the proposal, or (2) the resident owners of record of more than one-half of the area liable for assessment under the proposal, or (3) the owners of record (whether resident or not) of more than one-half of the area liable for assessment under the proposal. The Governing Body is requested to proceed in the manner provided by statute to the end that the petitioned improvements may be expeditiously completed and placed in use if and when such improvements are necessary to serve any building which may be constructed on the real property after the date on this petition.



### **RESOLUTION NO. R-22-**

A RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE ADVISABILITY OF THE MAKING OF CERTAIN INTERNAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CITY OF BEL AIRE, KANSAS; MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS WITH RESPECT THERETO; AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE MAKING OF THE IMPROVEMENTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUCH FINDINGS (SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENTS/BRISTOL HOLLOWS ADDITION - PHASE 2); AND AMENDING, RESTATING AND REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. R-22-10.

**WHEREAS**, a new Petition was filed with the City Clerk of the City of Bel Aire, Kansas (the "City") proposing certain internal improvements; and said Petition sets forth: (a) the general nature of the proposed improvements; (b) the estimated or probable cost of the proposed improvements; (c) the extent of the proposed improvement district to be assessed for the cost of the proposed improvements; (d) the proposed method of assessment; (e) the proposed apportionment of the cost between the improvement district and the City at large; and (f) a request that such improvements be made without notice and hearing as required by K.S.A. 12-6a04(1) (the "Act"); and

**WHEREAS**, the governing body of the City hereby finds and determines that said Petition was signed by the owners of record of more than one-half of the area liable for assessment for the proposed improvements, and is therefore sufficient in accordance with the provisions of the Act; and

**WHEREAS**, the Petition will replace a petition previously submitted with respect to the Improvements, and it is therefore necessary to amend, restate and repeal Resolution No. R-22-10 of the City.

# THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BEL AIRE, KANSAS:

Section 1. Findings of Advisability. The governing body hereby finds and determines that:

(a) It is advisable to make the following improvements (the "Improvements"):

That there be constructed a lateral sanitary sewer to serve the area described below, according to plans and specifications to be furnished by the City Engineer of the City of Bel Aire, Kansas.

- (b) The estimated or probable cost of the Improvements is: \$256,000, exclusive of interest on financing and administrative and financing costs; said estimated costs to be increased at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after November 1, 2022.
- (c) The extent of the improvement district (the "Improvement District") to be assessed for the cost of the Improvements is:

Lots 1 through 21, Block B, Bristol Hollows Addition, to the City of Bel Aire, Sedgwick County, Kansas.

(d) The method of assessment of all costs of the Improvement or which the Improvement District shall be liable shall be on a fractional basis: Lots 1 through 21, Block B, Bristol Hollows Addition, to the City of Bel Aire, Sedgwick County, Kansas, shall each pay 1/21 of the total cost of the Improvements. The fractional shares provided for herein have been determined on the basis of equal shares being assessed to lots or parcels of substantially comparable size and/or value.

In the event all or part of the lots or parcels in the Improvement District are replatted before assessments have been levied, the assessments against the replatted area shall be calculated on the basis of the method of assessment set forth herein. Where the ownership of a single lot is or may be divided into two or more parcels, the assessment to the lot so divided shall be assessed to each ownership or parcel on a square foot basis, or per the terms of a re-spread agreement submitted to the City of Bel Aire.

(e) The apportionment of the cost of the Improvements between the Improvement District and the City-at-large is: 100% to be assessed against the Improvement District and 0% to be paid by the City-at-large.

If these Improvements are abandoned, altered and/or constructed privately in part or whole that precludes building these Improvements under the authority of this resolution, any costs that the City incurs shall be assessed to the property described above in accordance with the terms of this resolution. In addition, if the Improvements are abandoned at any state during the design and/or construction of the Improvements or if it is necessary for the City to redesign, repair or reconstruct the Improvements after initial design and/or construction because the design or construction does not meet the requirements of the City, then such costs associated with the redesign, repair or reconstruction of said Improvements shall be assessed to the property described above in accordance with the terms of this resolution.

- **Section 2**. **Authorization of Improvements**. The abovesaid Improvements are hereby authorized and ordered to be made in accordance with the findings of the governing body of the City as set forth in *Section 1* of this Resolution.
- **Section 3**. **Bond Authority; Reimbursement**. The Act provides for the Improvements to be paid by the issuance of general obligation bonds or special obligation bonds of the City (the "Bonds"). The Bonds may be issued to reimburse expenditures made on or after the date which is 60 days before the date of Resolution No. R-22-10, pursuant to Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.
- **Section 4. Repealer.** The provisions of Resolution No. R-22-10 is hereby amended, restated and repealed.

RE: 2022 Budget Amendment



#### BACKGROUND:

Municipalities are authorized by K.S.A 79-2929a to amend budgets to spend money not in the original budget. Additional expenditures are to be made from existing revenue and cannot require additional tax levies.

### Water and Sewer Fund Budget

The 2022 water and sewer budgets were adopted by the Bel Aire City Council on September 7, 2021. Since the adoption of the 2022 budget, staff has recommended, and the City Council approved the water main replacements in Aurora Park and 41<sup>st</sup> Steet. Since the adoption of the 2022 budget, staff has recommended, and the City Council has also approved Cured-In-Place-Pipe (CIPP) in Lawn Terrace and Aurora Park. All other adjustments were made during the 2023 Budget process and accommodate increase spending for new meters, meter setting materials, and an expert review of our treatment system.

### General Fund Budget

The proposed General Fund amendment is to provide information on changes made to each budgeted category. Since the adoption of the 2022 General Fund budget, the city sold more land and experienced beneficial 2021 budget performance. This created more reserves than anticipated at the end of fiscal year 2021. In January of 2022, staff recommended, and the City Council approved using surplus reserves to increase the annual transfer to our Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for street improvements. Also, in early of 2022, staff recommended, and the City Council approved the addition of the Director of Planning and Development. All other revenue and expense adjustments were made during the 2023 Budget process. Finally, the proposed General Fund amendment creates more transparency on the mid-year adjustments of a growing community.

### DISCUSSION and FINACIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

<u>All budget adjustments before you tonight were accounted for in the 2023 Budget.</u> This action only provides final budget authority for previously approved actions decided by City Council.

#### **RECOMENDATION:**

Step 1: Approve the 2022 Budget Amendments and set a public hearing for the December 6, 2022 City Council Meeting.

Step 2: Adopt the 2022 Budget Amendment at the December 6, 2022 City Council Meeting.



RE: New Truck bids for Building Inspector



<u>DISCUSSION:</u> The current vehicle that is utilized for building inspections is a 2007 Chevrolet Silverado. The vehicle experiences more than usual wear as it requires significant amounts of idle time and is turned off and on more than a usual vehicle. As building in Bel Aire increases, the amount of added wear will increase and could cause maintenance to increase significantly. A request for a bid was sent to multiple dealerships in the area. All GM produced vehicles were cut off from Fleet Orders this year according to Don Hatton Chevrolet. Because of this, any order would be done at the dealership without discounts. After this, a request was made to Rusty Eck Ford, TCS, and Mel Hambleton Ford for a quote on a 3.3L V6 4X4 Ford F-150 Crew Cab. A crew cab is necessary for the documentation and equipment that the Building Inspector must carry to perform his duties. The price of the 3 quotes are as follows:

<u>FINANCIAL</u>: Funding for the new Planning and Zoning truck was planned and is available in the Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund.

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> While the F150 quoted by Rusty Eck Ford is the cheapest option, the PD's use of TCS and the upfitting by TCS that will need to take place on the vehicle makes TCS the best option. The Building Inspector will begin to use a laptop in the field and will need TCS to fit a stand on the vehicle once it is purchased. Due to the constraints of finding vehicles and the longer wait times once a vehicle is ordered, paying extra for a known delivery date is both an economical and logical choice. The existing vehicle will be kept by the city and utilized where needed.

#### BACKGROUND:

The Social Media and Website policy was established and adopted on March 20, 2018. According to my research, the Cable Channel 7 policy was first established July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2007 and then revised on May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2011. With the continuous evolution of technology and these media platforms, both policies needed to be updated to reflect our current practices and procedures.

#### DISCUSSION:

Working with the City Attorney, the included Media Policy reflects current practices and procedures as well as combining the two policies into the one policy that encompasses the communication platforms utilized.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: None

<u>RECOMENDATION:</u> Based on my daily experience following these policies and working with these medias, my recommendation would be to approve the updated policy.





#### Media Policy

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines, protocols, and procedures to ensure that the City's communication with the public is efficient, effective, consistent, timely, and transparent. In addition, this policy addresses the responsibilities of individual employees and city officials with regard to media use. Lastly, this policy outlines terms of use and comment policy in order to help facilitate and enhance the transfer of information to the public through the City's Social Media.

#### **Communication Objectives**

- 1. Ensure the City is visible and responsive to the residents it serves.
- 2. Inform residents about the City's policies, programs, services, projects, and initiatives through communication that is effective, timely, accurate, and consistent.
- 3. Inform stakeholders about priorities, policies, programs, and services where reasonable and practical.
- 4. Engage in a proactive communications program the uses a variety of platforms to accommodate diverse needs existing in our community.

#### **Ownership**

All website and social media systems and resources owned or controlled by the City and all messages, text, graphics, images, and electronic files and other information transmitted by, received through or stored in these systems are the property of the City.

#### **Platforms**

- 1. City of Bel Aire Website The City's website is a platform for residents to get information as well as make payment for City services.
  - A. The Communications department is responsible for maintaining the City website.
  - B. The Communications department will work with department heads and the City Manager to determine what information will be posted to the City's website.
  - C. Access to edit department pages can be granted by getting approval from the Communications Director.
  - D. Linking to an outside news source as a way to promote City of Bel Aire-related information is prohibited unless specifically approved by the City Manager. An example of a possible exception would be in the case of a co-sponsored event.
- 2. Cable Channel Cable Channel 7 is a public service and information resource for Bel Aire citizens provided through Cox Communications.
  - A. The Communications department is responsible for scheduling appropriate programming following FCC guidelines.
  - B. As of 2022 Council meetings will no longer be rebroadcast on the cable channel as

requirements for airing meetings are cost prohibitive.

- 3. Social Media The City of Bel Aire has an interest in informing and engaging its audience using traditional as well as new media. Social media has become one of the main channels of communication for many and is an excellent communication tool for the City. By leveraging social media as a primary communication tool, Bel Aire is engaging customers in a timely cost-effective way and supporting City goals.
  - A. The Communications department will set up the accounts and be named the administrator or will obtain all usernames and passwords to these accounts.
  - B. City meetings are open to the public at the designated meeting location, however when practical the City will make reasonable effort to rebroadcast recorded meetings on social media platforms.
  - C. All social media accounts that represent the City will be approved by the City Manager. If specific departments are interested in creating a social media presence, they will need to first get approval from the City Manager and then contact the Communications department.
  - D. The City of Bel Aire reserves the right to temporarily or permanently suspend access to any page or social media platform at any time.

#### **E.** Community Standards

- i. Communication on City media platforms must be made with respect and courtesy to others.
- ii. Any comment posted by a member of the public on an official City Social Media Page or Department Social Media Page is the opinion of the commentator only, and its publication on such Page shall not imply endorsement or agreement from the City.
- iii. All Social Media established by the City, including the City's Social Media Page and those Pages utilized by individual City departments, are for informing the public and not intended to create a public forum. As such, each Page shall have, in a place visible to the public or accessible by link, a notice that comments containing any of the following forms of content are prohibited and will be removed:
  - 1) Comments not related to the topic of discussion;
  - 2) Profane, obscene, uncivil, harassing, or inappropriate language or content;
  - Sexual content;
  - 4) Solicitations of commerce;
  - 5) Promotion or encouragement of illegal activity;
  - 6) Information that may tend to compromise the safety or security of the public, public systems, the City, its employees, or public officials;
  - 7) Promotes political candidates, issues or viewpoints except as provided by City sanctioned debates or forums;
  - 8) Defamatory remarks, personal attacks, or threats against any individual person or group of people.

- 9) Content that violates a legal ownership interest of any party;
- 10) Any content in violation of or inconsistent with federal, state, or local laws and ordinances;
- 11) Links to any outside websites that are inconsistent with this policy;
- 12) Content that is repetitive or duplicative;
- 13) Any content not listed herein but that is otherwise inconsistent with the spirit of civility intended by these Terms of Use & Comment Policy.
- iv. The following notice shall be posted on all City interactive platforms: *The City of Bel Aire utilizes platforms for informational purposes only and is not intended to create a public forum, please reference the City Media Policy for more information*.

#### **Employee Use**

Social media guidelines for employees are established in the *Personnel Policy Manual* and should be reviewed and followed by City Staff.

Personal social media accounts established by employees should not be presented as official voices of the City.

#### **Updates to this Policy**

The City of Bel Aire recognizes that these guidelines will continually evolve as new technologies and social networking tools emerge. The City of Bel Aire reserves the right to change the communication policy at any time to reflect the current communication priorities of the City.



The Homestead Senior Housing project has footing, plumbing groundwork and concrete slabs starting. The framing is now expected to start around November 23<sup>rd</sup>.


The Sky View 3<sup>rd</sup> at Block 49 storage units have started with the manager living quarters and site improvements.







#### Recreation

• Pickleball participation was up with 267 compared to 225 participants last month.

### **Consent Agenda (Item VI)**

The consent agenda contains the Minutes of the November 1, 2022 City Council meeting. Also included is an amended Petition for Phase 2 Sanitary Sewer Improvements to serve Bristol Hollow and an Amended Resolution for the same improvement. Petitions for water and sewer for this phase were approved earlier this year. However, sewer bids came in higher than the original petition amount, creating the need for the amended petition and amended resolution. These costs have been accepted by the Developer and will eventually be bonded and spread as special assessments against the benefiting lots.

### **Appropriations Ordinance (Item VII)**

This reporting period includes one payroll period. Utility Maintenance Contractors was paid for the 41st Water Main Replacement project, lift station cleaning and 10 new water service installs. The new 2022 Chevy 3500 for public works was paid out of Equipment Reserve fund. Bond and interest payments totaled \$2.8 million during this period.

### Agreement to Dedicate Lots for City Park (Item A)

Last year the City approved a plat for Skyview at Block 49 that obligated the developer, Andrew Reese, to dedicate a single lot for a park that the City would build, own, and maintain. As the development has taken shape, the developer has decided that it would be more appropriate and beneficial to the surrounding lots to have a larger park. He is proposing to dedicate more land to the City for a larger park than initially proposed. Council will consider entering an agreement to accept those lots and maintain them as a City park. If the agreement is approved, Andrew will deed over the lots to the City via a separate deed instrument. The Developer will be at the meeting to present his concept and answer questions Council may have.



### **2022 Budget Amendment (Item B)**

Once a budget has been adopted, expenses cannot increase above the published amounts. If expenses exceed that adopted amount, a budget amendment must be approved. This process requires a public hearing and governing body approval. Due to the items outlined in Ted's report, expenses in the water, sewer and general funds will exceed the published amount. All of these expenses were discussed and approved by the Council. Each fund has received revenues in excess of budgeted amounts and have substantial reserves. There are no financial concerns but simply needed to meet state requirements.

### 2023 Pay Scale (Item C)

In 2021, the city hired WSU to complete a salary and benefits study. They found that our benefits were above average however many positions were under average in pay. Police had the greatest disparity with all positions needing increased. The study also identified a number of supervisors and other staff that were below the market. Council felt the police department was an immediate need and had an impact on the budget, so they concentrated on putting those positions at the top for the market. The result was all police positions were filled and we have had no issues in retaining or hiring since that time.

Over the last year, the job market has changed dramatically, and we are now finding that the positions which were not addressed in the last salary schedule have fallen farther behind. Cities in our region are giving anywhere from 10% - 15% salary adjustments and revising their pay schedules to reflect that. We have several positions open with few applicants. I have heard some staff are looking at other cities due to the higher wages. We know there is a cost to hiring and training good employees, making retainment key. Ted and I have spent the last few months reviewing the WSU study, pacing the market, and trying to speculate the future. As a result, we have drafted a revised salary schedule that we feel matches the market and will allow us to retain our good employees as well attract new staff to our open positions.

Council discussed the proposed changes and subsequent impacts to both employees as well as the budget at the November workshop. Consensus was the revisions were needed and ready for adoption.



### **Quote For New Truck For Building Inspections (Item D)**

The Community Development Department currently has two vehicles that are used for Code Enforcement and Building Inspections. The current inspections vehicle is a 2007 Chevrolet Silverado. This vehicle experiences more than usual wear as it idles a significant amount of time as well as being turned off and on more than a typical vehicle. A request for quotes was sent to multiple dealerships, and 3 returned quotes. All three quotes are for a 3.3L V6 4X4 Ford F-150 Crew Cab. The crew cab is needed for building inspection equipment. Funding for the replacement truck was planned with funds available in the Equipment Reserve Fund.

While the F150 quoted by Rusty Eck Ford is the cheapest option, the PD's use of TCS and the upfitting by TCS that will need to take place on the vehicle makes TCS the best option. The Building Inspector will begin to use a laptop in the field and will need TCS to fit a stand on the vehicle once it is purchased. Due to the constraints of finding vehicles and the longer wait times once a vehicle is ordered, paying extra for a known delivery date is both an economical and logical choice. Therefore, staff is recommending council accept the quote from TSC.

### Bids for Utilities, Bristol Hollow Phase 2 (Item E)

The Developer of Bristol Hollows is ready to begin Phase 2 construction of water and sewer. The cost of the improvements for these projects will be financed through a bond and spread as special assessments against the benefiting lots. Five contractors submitted bids, with Nowak being the lowest bidder. Staff recommends that Council accept the bid from Nowak for \$335,288.20.

### **Ordinance Amending Fireworks Regulations (Item F)**

Two ordinances are included in the packet for your consideration.

### Option A:

- Does not have any requirements for a fireworks applicant to own a business in Bel Aire or affiliate with a Bel Aire nonprofit.
- Amends the application deadline from June 16th to May 5th to allow more time for review and processing.
- Amends the detonation dates to correspond with the sale date June 27<sup>th</sup> to July 4<sup>th</sup>.

### Option B:

- Requires that fireworks applicants affiliate with a Bel Aire nonprofit.
- Amends the application deadline from June 16<sup>th</sup> to May 5<sup>th</sup> to allow more time for review and processing.
- Amends the detonation dates to correspond with the sale dates- June 27<sup>th</sup> to July 4<sup>th</sup>

### Media Policy 2022 (Item G)

The original media policy adopted in 2007 addressed only the cable channel but has been revised several times to include new communication tools being utilized by the City. Over the last four years, the City has added YouTube and other social media tools, so staff felt it was important to update the current policy. This item was considered at the last Council meeting and was tabled for formatting revisions. The requested changes have been made and the final draft now comes before Council for approval.

### **Executive Session (Item XII)**

Staff has no need for an executive session.

### **Discussion And Future Issues (Item XIII)**

December is typically busy with the holidays, parties, and family events. The week before Christmas often contains travel plans or vacations. I have heard from a number of governing body members that canceling the regular meeting on the 20<sup>th</sup> would be preferred. In order to conduct any needed business, I am recommending moving the second meeting to December 13<sup>th</sup> and then holding the workshop right after. If everyone agrees, we can have the official action on the December 6<sup>th</sup> agenda.
