AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO AMEND CREDIT CARD PROCESSING AND CONVENIENCE FEES FOR UTILITY BILLING

WHEREAS, The City of Bellbrook has maintained a policy for allowing credit card payments for utilities through a third party, InvoiceCloud; and

WHEREAS, the City has absorbed the cost of the associated convenience and processing fees; and

WHEREAS, it is more appropriate to have the fees covered in the cost of the transaction.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF BELLBROOK HEREBY RESOLVES:

- Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to take all actions necessary to amend the credit card payment process to include the cost of any convenience and processing fees in the payment made by the payer..
- Section 2. AUTHORIZING TRANSFERS WITHIN VARIOUS FUNDS OF THE CITY OF BELLBROOK

WHEREAS, the City of Bellbrook has adopted Ordinance 2023-O-6 establishing appropriations for the 2024 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the 2024 budget has adequate funds appropriated at the fund level to cover the cost of city operations; and

WHEREAS, fund transfers are necessary to appropriately classify and account for received funds..

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF BELLBROOK HEREBY RESOLVES:

- Section 1. That fund and cash transfers necessary for the operations of the City of certain monies up to amounts not exceeding those shown for the purposes cited in Exhibit A are hereby authorized, and such authorization applies to any and all such transfers necessary and effected after January 1, 2024.
- Section 2.
