Mr. Schommer distributed ballots for each council member to cast a vote, then collected and read the ballots. Upon tally of the submitted ballots from each council member, the results as announced and viewed are 5 votes for Mr. Havens, 2 votes for Mr. Greenwood.

#### 13. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Schommer provided updates on the following item:

- Finalizing the personnel manual for employees through Lexipol for an online and searchable system that also includes legal updates.
- Signed services agreement received with Outdoor Enterprise for the Franklin and Main project and will begin planning for a projected start date of May 1
- Independent Financial Audit started for 2023 with Julian & Grube
- Engage Bellbrook will be used as a central source of information on our website to inform the community on our financial planning and the upcoming revenue shortfalls faced to maintain current public safety service levels.

- Charter Review Committee has completed the initial review and Council will be provided time to review segments of the Charter for review and modification.

- Two potential candidates in the process for part time employees at the fire department
- A grant for a new ladder truck was not awarded last year, but re-submission has been done for 2024.
- Three new patrol vehicles being upfitted for the police department
- New radios have been ordered for the police department
- Sight Surveys on Flock Camera installation is ongoing
- Interviews on new officer candidates are being conducted
- Sugar Maple Festival Committee was met with for planning of this year's festival
- Active Shooter threat training is scheduled

#### B. Service Committee

Mr. Greenwood provided updates on new water meters and the ability to be remotely read by one person in a single day as opposed to a few people over several days, noting an improvement in efficiency.
