1. Call to Order and Confirmation of Quorum

Mayor Carson called the Council Meeting to order at 6:30 p.m., and the City Clerk, Yolanda Quiceno, confirmed the presence of a quorum. City Manager (CM) Rudometkin, Chief Grimm, Attorney Shaffer, Public Works Director Phil Price, and City Clerk Yolanda Quiceno were also present.

2. Invocation and Pledge to Flag - Comm Jim Partin, District 7, led the invocation and Pledge to the Flag.

3. Public Comments & Announcements

Mayor Carson opened the floor for public comments and announcements.

- Rick Miller, residing at 2001 Nela Avenue, Belle Isle, FL, commented on two items. Regarding the stormwater study, he noted that, upon reviewing the report, additional information on planned capital projects would be helpful. Mr. Miller suggested that a more detailed discussion of those projects could provide a better understanding of what future stormwater fee increases would fund. He suggested evaluating whether debt financing should be considered to accelerate the completion of needed capital improvements. Regarding storm debris management, he raised questions about the vendor selection process and the criteria used during evaluation, and that the highest-scoring vendor was not the recommended vendor, and asked what additional factors were considered in making the recommendation. Mr. Miller stated that no additional criteria were identified in response to a public records request. He added that if factors such as proximity, response time, or the speed of debris pickup were considered, they should have been included in the published scoring criteria. As a recommendation, he said he would like the City Commission to have input on the development of future RFP evaluation criteria to ensure they reflect the community's needs and priorities. He noted that to make sure that there is a balance, if evaluation factors other than the published criteria were used, the solicitation should be reissued with revised criteria so that all vendors compete under the same standards.

There being no further comments, Mayor Carson closed the public comment section.

4. Presentations

FDOT D5 on School Speed Zone Study - Todd Davis, Protean Design Group, Inc.

Chief Grimm provided background on the proposed school zone improvements along Hansel Avenue. He noted that the Police Department has been seeking additional safety measures in the area for some time, including discussions about school zones and other traffic-control improvements. Chief Grimm stated that the City received multiple complaints this year regarding pedestrian safety and children crossing near the roadway, particularly as school enrollment has increased. In response, staff worked with FDOT to evaluate the area. With assistance from Public Works Director Phil Price, the City coordinated with FDOT and consultant Todd Davis, who observed traffic conditions and student dismissal activity firsthand. Chief Grimm explained that the purpose of the study was to assess existing conditions and identify appropriate safety improvements.

Todd Davis, Consultant from ProTea Design Group, accompanied by FDOT District Five representative Tammy King, presented the findings of the Hansel Avenue School Zone Study. Mr. Davis explained that the study was conducted in response to concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety near the school. The evaluation included traffic counts, pedestrian activity observations, and speed studies conducted at various times throughout the day.

The study focused on the northbound section of Hansel Avenue adjacent to the school and considered existing traffic patterns, student pick-up and drop-off operations, pedestrian movements, and roadway conditions. Mr. Davis noted that while speeding concerns were observed outside of school hours, traffic speeds generally decreased during school arrival and dismissal periods. Based on the findings, FDOT recommended establishing a northbound school zone on Hansel Avenue, including school zone signage, flashing beacons, pavement markings, and pedestrian warning signs. Additional recommendations included installing a "Do Not Block Intersection" marking at Wallace Street to improve vehicle and pedestrian safety. Existing signage would also be adjusted to reduce driver confusion and improve visibility of school-related traffic controls. Mr. Davis advised that pavement markings, signage, and school zone markings could be installed through FDOT maintenance programs, while flashing beacons would require a separate project and additional time for implementation. He also noted that speed feedback signs were recommended, but would be the City's responsibility to fund and install. The recommendations are intended to improve pedestrian safety and traffic operations near the school while avoiding the need for additional traffic signals in the corridor.

Mayor Carson asked for clarification on the use of the 85th-percentile speed metric. Mr. Davis explained that the analysis does not rely on the highest recorded speeds but instead uses the 85th percentile speed. He noted that the metric is commonly used to determine whether the posted speed limit is appropriate for a roadway. Under FDOT guidelines, the posted speed limit may be evaluated within a range of plus or minus eight miles per hour of the 85th percentile speed. The analysis helps determine whether the current posted speed limit is appropriate for the corridor.

Comm Lance asked whether the existing traffic signal at Fairlane Avenue remains necessary now that Fairlane operates as a one-way westbound roadway. Comm Lance noted that the signal previously served two-way traffic and questioned whether relocating the signal to Wallace Street would provide greater benefit by addressing traffic concerns in that area and serving the community beyond school-zone operations.

Mr. Davis explained that traffic signals must meet specific warrant requirements, including sufficient traffic volumes over an extended period. Based on the available data, Wallace Street does not appear to generate enough traffic to justify a signal. He also noted that the existing signal at Fairlane provides important pedestrian protection at the school's primary entrance and crossing location. Relocating the signal to Wallace Street would move that protection away from the area where most students cross and could require changes to current pedestrian routes and crossing guard operations. Mr. Davis added that it is not just one thing; traffic safety relies on a combination of engineering measures and enforcement efforts. You can't do one without the other.

Comm Lowell asked whether they knew the approximate cost of the speed signs. Tanya King with FDOT District Five said she can research and forward the information.

Comm Bobrowski said she agrees with Comm Lance on moving the traffic signal light down to Wallace. She noted that only a small percentage of Belle Isle residents have children attending Cornerstone Charter Academy, while school-related traffic significantly impacts motorists in the area. She noted that one of the most common complaints she receives involves difficulty crossing Hansel Avenue from Orange Avenue to Wallace Street. She questioned whether modern traffic technology could coordinate signals at both Fairlane Avenue and Wallace Street, with the Fairlane signal operating primarily during school hours to accommodate student crossings. Comm Bobrowski suggested that relocating or adding signalization at Wallace Street could provide greater benefit to the broader community while still maintaining pedestrian safety for crossing students. Mr. Davis spoke briefly on traffic scenarios from Orange Avenue to Wallace. Mr. Davis noted that it comes down to balancing, and we must consider how it will affect the lights at Hoffner and Fairlane. Considering how close these intersections are, it would not provide as much benefit from a safety perspective. Discussion ensued.

Comm Lowell asked if he would have to involve the school in the decision. Davis stated that this is a state facility and does not have to deal with outside parameters. The change is to provide safety.

Stormwater Management Study – Tara Hollis, Engineering Consultant from Wildan Financial Services

CM Rudometkin gave a brief overview and noted that one of the main reasons for the study is related to pervious and impervious ratios and ensuring that everyone is being billed properly.

Tara Hollis presented the findings and noted that the purpose of the study is to review customer classification and ERU assignments, evaluate current assessment revenues, final projections, and propose a fee adjustment. After the presentation, the recommendations from the Study include implementing a Fee Plan with annual monitoring costs, refining ERU assignments, and finalizing research on impervious area data. In addition, the study showed that, to maintain current funding methods, the City should develop a credit policy and conduct periodic reviews.

Comm Lance asked whether the referenced cities were using the ERU system. Ms. Hollis said yes, I believe they are to provide a credit program for businesses and non-residential properties, with a suggestion that a similar program for residential properties be considered in the future for fairness.

Comm Oller asked about the maintenance for the 522 per year. What was used to get to that number with virtually no growth? Why does it continue to grow all the way through until the end? And does it include reserves? Ms. Hollis said the projections are based on the current budget and include personnel costs, engineering services, maintenance activities, and required fees, including those associated with the Chain of Lakes. The increase in projected costs is driven by inflationary factors such as rising labor, engineering, supply, repair, and maintenance expenses. It was noted that Exhibit 1 of the report provides a detailed breakdown of these budget line items and the annual adjustments applied to them.

Comm Lowell asked if there was a secondary recommendation, like if we said we maybe wanted to do 12.5 and 12.5 next year, versus the full 25, or the opposite end of that, or go 35% the next year and then lower each year after that. Are there any adjustments that you know of? Ms. Hollis said this is a range plan, but yes, you could look at different scenarios. Ms. Hollis noted that they recommend the first year be used for catch-up. Just remember, the more you delay, the more you're actually going to have to do more later, just because of the compounding effects. Discussion ensued on historical increases and on nutrient overload in Lake Conway.

After discussion, Comm Partin moved to approve and accept the stormwater rate study as presented. Implementation of any rate increases will be brought back to the council for approval in the annual budget process. Comm Lance seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

5. Consent Items.

- a. Approval of City Council Meeting Minutes - May 19, 2026
Comm Lowell moved to approve the consent items as presented.
Comm Partin seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

6. Unfinished Business

- a. Possible Contract Award of RFP 2026-01 Emergency Debris Hauling and Disposal Services
 CM Rudometkin said the item was brought back before the Council after being tabled at the previous meeting to allow additional time for review of the proposals. The current debris cleanup contract remains in effect through September 30, and a new vendor is needed beginning October 1. No changes have been made to the recommendation since the last meeting. Staff requested Council approval of a vendor selected through the RFP process for future debris cleanup services. A rating sheet summarizing the scores of the top four recommended vendors was provided for the Council's review.

Comm Bobrowski asked for clarification on Page 80 of the RFP regarding white goods debris removal, eligible dead animal removal, and other debris removal. Are we not talking just organic? Are we also talking about construction removal, roof damage removal? Is that all of the contract? CM Rudometkin said Yes, it has to be all put into the RFP process, because there's a potential that you could have something like this to be removed, but historically here in Belle Isle, it's been just vegetative debris. CM Rudometkin spoke briefly about previous FEMA events and stated that the RFP is not the final contract but rather a guideline for selecting a vendor. Once the vendor is selected, the contract process starts.

Comm Lance noted that, after further research, he found that other companies outside the City may experience delays due to other contracts they are also serving during weather events. Comm Lance said he keeps circling back to the safety factor of 24 hours being here, being a local resident, their whole family of residents here, they contribute to the

community, they give back, they, they're not just residents, they're vested in this community, and they have been for many, many years, and I physically have seen them do a lot of community work in the past, and also I also believe that they don't have any contracts anywhere else besides Belle Isle, maybe Edgewood, if Edgewood calls them, but Belle Isle is their community that they live in, and they're going to take care of our community just like you or anybody else would.

Comm Lowell requested consideration of language that provides cost parameters while maintaining flexibility as cleanup progresses. Reference was made to concerns previously raised regarding having dollar amounts associated with the work. It was also asked whether costs could be structured by storm phases or categories, while recognizing that storm categories do not always correspond to the amount of damage caused. Second, she inquired about subcontractors, safety, and insurance. She also agreed with Comm Lance on the 24-hour response time and not choosing someone who is overzealous.

Attorney Shaffer stated that cost thresholds could potentially be included in the contract negotiations, but noted there are limitations on withholding payment for work that has already been completed. It was suggested that the contract could require an initial cost estimate and Council pre-approval, with additional approval required if costs exceed certain thresholds. Attorney Shaffer noted that such a process could slow response times but would provide greater oversight. It was further suggested that final costs could be reconciled after the work is completed, while including provisions requiring Council approval when specified cost limits are exceeded. CM Rudometkin noted that the total fees are based on quantities and the severity of the storm.

Attorney Shaffer noted that subcontractor language is very common in service contracts and is also an integration with the city's processes. Chief Grimm noted that Orange County shuts down if the winds are 55mph or greater; once it slows down, the county is then reopened for emergency operations at first check.

Comm Partin noted that the evaluation criteria were outlined in the proposal documents and referenced the recommendation memorandum, which stated that selecting a contractor solely on price could expose the City to compliance issues, legal risks, and potential fines. The memorandum further indicated that proposals were evaluated based on what best serves the interests of the City and its residents while ensuring operational readiness. Comm Partin emphasized the importance of considering factors such as a contractor's ability to stage resources, respond quickly, and past performance. Reference was made to a previous event in which a contractor was unable to respond because resources were committed elsewhere. It was also noted that the City has historically been cleaned up more quickly than other areas in Orange County. He observed that pricing appeared to lower Madison's evaluation scores and suggested that, if price were not a significant factor, the rankings may have been closer. The Commissioner stated support for Commissioner Lance's recommendation.

Comm Shuck confirmed that the new contracts will be signed before the end of the fiscal year, when the current contracts expire. Attorney Shaffer said the execution date of the contract and the term of the contract are necessarily coterminous, so it's the fact that you have a signed contract that begins October 1 that means all the material terms of that contract kick in once that start date is reached.

Comm Bobrowski asked whether the city will be in a liability situation due to the wording of the RFP not selecting the highest-tabulated vendor. Attorney Schaffer stated that if vendor selection were based solely on bid tabulation, City Council approval would not be necessary. The RFP process provides recommendations rather than automatic awards, allowing the Council discretion in evaluating the proposals and making a final decision. The Attorney noted that if the Council selects a vendor other than the top-ranked recommendation, it may need to justify its reasoning, particularly in the event of a bid protest. However, the Council retains the authority to exercise its judgment and evaluate the criteria when making the final award decision.

There being no further discussion, Comm Lance moved to award the RFP 2026-01 for Emergency Debris Handling and Disposable Services to Pete Madison Management Incorporated, an authorized city manager, and the city attorney to negotiate and prepare a three-year agreement for services, with the final contract to be brought back before the city council for review and approval. Second from Commissioner Oller, which passed 6:1 with Comm Lowell, nay.

7. New Business

- a. Approval of Budget Hearings and Change of City Council Meeting Dates
CM Rudometkin presented the FY 2026/27 Budget Calendar and meeting schedule for consideration.

Comm Bobrowski moved to reschedule the City Council meeting from August 18, 2026, to August 20, 2026, due to the General Elections. Seconded by Comm Lance, unanimously approved 7:0.

Comm Lance moved to reschedule the City Council meeting from September 1, 2026, to September 9, 2026. Seconded by Comm Lance, unanimously approved 7:0.

Comm Partin moved to reschedule the City Council meeting from September 15, 2026, to September 23, 2026. Seconded by Comm Bobrowski, unanimously approved 7:0.

Comm Partin moved to approve the Budget Calendar schedule for Fiscal year 2026/2027 as presented. Seconded by Comm Oller, unanimously approved 7:0.

8. Attorney's Report

Attorney Schaffer stated that a mediated settlement agreement has been negotiated and provided for review. The details were not discussed publicly. The Attorney requested that Council reconvene in a closed executive session on Thursday or Friday to discuss the agreement, followed immediately by an open public meeting for approval or denial. He noted that timely direction is needed because certain deadlines begin the following week, which could result in additional costs and activity for the City if the agreement is not addressed. CM Rudometkin said the special-called session can be scheduled during the day or evening.

After discussion, Comm Partin moved to hold the Executive Session on Thursday, June 4, at 6 pm. Comm Lowell seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

9. City Manager's Report

- a. City Manager's Report & Work Plan
 - CM spoke briefly on the Property Tax Reform, which passed in the Senate. He addressed briefly the calculations and timing of the November ballot.
 - The City received an appropriate grant for Marine Safety equipment and is currently under review at the Governor's office. Chief Grimm provided the necessary report to the Lobbyists for the Governor's consideration.
 - Vulnerability Assessment Online Study 2nd outreach meeting will be held on June 11 at 6 pm.
- b. Chief's Report
Chief Grimm reported on the following,
 - Memorial Day – no big issues.
 - Presented the newly formatted Dashboard, Monitoring Reports, and a link to the City's website.
- c. Public Works Report
Phil Proce reported on the following.
 - Pipelining for St Regis is on the way to completion and will help the water flow to the lake.
 - Completed the sidewalk project in the Landings. The remaining area is around City Hall.
 - Reminded all of Hurricane Season and the importance of yard, tree, and debris clean up.

10. Mayor's Report

Brief discussion on the clean out of the baskets with the NAV Board. It was noted that OC is currently looking for a new vendor. Mr. Price noted that he will follow up with the NAV Board. Mayor Carson thanked all staff and the council for their support.

11. Commissioners' Report

- Comm Gold notes that there is some interest in having the Public Works Department create a monthly dashboard as well.
- Comm Lance noted that cleaning out the baskets is very important and valuable to our lakes.
- Comm Lowell reminded all of the submittal of Form 1.

12. Adjournment

There being no further business, Mayor Carson called for a motion to adjourn, which was unanimously approved at 8:50 pm.

Arrests and Notable Incidents

May 1, 2026 – Child Abuse Investigation Determined Unfounded

On May 1, 2026, officers responded to Cornerstone Charter School regarding allegations of child abuse involving a juvenile student. The investigation was conducted in coordination with the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) after the juvenile reported being struck by a parent during a family dispute.

Officers and DCF investigators interviewed the involved juvenile, family members, and a sibling who was present during the incident. During the investigation, conflicting accounts were provided regarding the circumstances leading to a minor injury inside the juvenile's mouth. Investigators also reviewed the child's injury and the family dynamics surrounding the incident.

Based on witness statements, physical observations, and the totality of the investigation, the injury appeared consistent with an accidental brace-related abrasion rather than intentional abuse. No evidence was developed to support criminal charges, and investigators concluded that no crime had occurred. The case was documented and referred to DCF for review. The report was closed as informational.

May 1, 2026 – Hit and Run Arrest Following Rental Car Crash Investigation

On May 1, 2026, officers responded to a rental car business on McCoy Road regarding a hit-and-run crash that occurred in the parking lot. Surveillance footage showed a vehicle backing into a parked rental vehicle, causing visible damage, before leaving the scene without notifying the property owner or reporting the crash.

Through the investigation, officers obtained surveillance footage, witness statements, vehicle information, and identified the driver. After coordinating with another law enforcement agency and conducting follow-up interviews, the driver admitted to being present at the location and operating the vehicle involved in the crash.

Based on the totality of the investigation, officers determined there was probable cause to charge the driver with leaving the scene of a crash involving property damage. The driver was arrested and transported to the Orange County Jail without incident. Evidence, including surveillance footage and photographs, was collected and preserved as part of the investigation.

May 1, 2026 – Child Abuse Arrest Following Runaway Juvenile Investigation

On May 1, 2026, officers responded to an apartment complex on McCoy Road after receiving information that a juvenile who had recently been reported missing was afraid to return home due to physical abuse by her father. During the investigation, officers interviewed the juvenile, family members, and witnesses while working alongside the Orange County Sheriff's Office and the Florida Department of Children and Families.

The juvenile reported being struck during disciplinary incidents and showed visible injuries, including welts and bruising to her arms and legs. Photographs documented injuries consistent with repeated strikes from a belt or similar object. During interviews, the father admitted to striking the child and acknowledged becoming overwhelmed while disciplining her. Family members also expressed concerns that the level of force used was unreasonable under the circumstances.

Based on the evidence gathered, officers determined there was probable cause that excessive physical discipline had been used, resulting in physical injury to the child. The father was arrested and transported to the Orange County Jail on child abuse charges. The juvenile was released into the care of a family member, and the Florida Department of Children and Families initiated a separate investigation.

May 3, 2026 – Traffic Stop Results in Arrest for No Driver’s License

On May 3, 2026, officers conducting traffic enforcement on Hoffner Avenue initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle after discovering the registered owner did not possess a valid driver's license. During the investigation, officers confirmed the driver had never been issued a driver's license and had been operating the vehicle unlawfully.

The driver admitted he did not possess a driver's license and was identified as the registered owner of the vehicle. Based on the investigation, the driver was arrested and charged with operating a motor vehicle without ever having been issued a driver's license. The driver was transported to the Orange County Jail without incident. The vehicle was removed from the scene by a licensed driver.

May 4, 2026 – DUI Arrest Following Early Morning Traffic Stop

At approximately 2:15 a.m. on May 4, 2026, an officer conducting traffic enforcement on McCoy Road observed a vehicle driving erratically, including swerving within its lane, crossing roadway markings, accelerating and braking without cause, and nearly entering a marked safety zone occupied by a patrol vehicle. Based on the driving pattern, the officer initiated a traffic stop to investigate whether the driver was impaired or experiencing a medical issue.

Upon contact, the driver displayed multiple indicators of impairment, including slurred speech, glossy eyes, poor balance, and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage. The driver declined to participate in field sobriety exercises and was placed under arrest for suspicion of Driving Under the Influence.

The driver was transported to the Orange County DUI Center, where breath testing revealed alcohol concentrations of .194 and .177, both more than twice the legal limit of .08. The driver was charged with Driving Under the Influence and transported for processing. The vehicle was impounded from the scene.

May 4, 2026 – Traffic Stop Leads to Drug Arrest and Seizure of More Than 30 Grams of Cannabis

At approximately 9:45 p.m. on May 4, 2026, an officer conducting traffic enforcement on Daetwyler Drive stopped a vehicle towing an unregistered trailer after observing a speeding violation and equipment-related violations. Upon contact with the driver, the officer immediately detected a strong odor of cannabis coming from the vehicle.

During the investigation, the driver admitted to recently smoking cannabis and voluntarily produced a small amount of cannabis and related packaging. Based on the odor and the driver's statements, a probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. Officers located a large quantity of cannabis, a cannabis cigarette, drug paraphernalia, and additional containers containing cannabis residue.

The cannabis was field tested and later weighed at the police department, totaling approximately 30.5 grams. The driver was arrested and charged with possession of cannabis over 20 grams, possession of drug paraphernalia, and operating an unregistered vehicle. The vehicle was towed from the scene and the evidence was submitted for processing.

May 5, 2026 – Drug Arrest Following Proactive Patrol at Local Business

On May 5, 2026, at approximately 8:26 p.m., an officer conducting proactive patrols in the parking lot of a local business on Hoffner Avenue observed a vehicle filled with smoke and detected a strong odor of cannabis emanating from the area. As the officer approached, the sole occupant quickly exited the vehicle, attempted to discard a cannabis cigarette, and walked away from the vehicle.

During the investigation, officers observed additional cannabis in plain view inside the vehicle and conducted a probable cause search. The search resulted in the discovery of a large quantity of cannabis, loose cannabis residue, and drug-related paraphernalia. The cannabis was field tested and later weighed at the police department, totaling approximately 22.5 grams.

The suspect admitted the cannabis belonged to him and stated he had been smoking prior to entering the nearby gym. Due to the quantity recovered exceeding the legal threshold, the individual was arrested and charged with possession of cannabis over 20 grams. He was transported to the Orange County Jail without incident.

May 6, 2026 – Felon Arrested with Illegal THC Product and Concealed Knife

At approximately 2:15 a.m. on May 6, 2026, an officer conducting proactive patrols at a hotel on McCoy Road observed an unregistered pickup truck parked without a license plate. The sole occupant appeared to be unconscious behind the wheel. As the officer made contact, the driver

awoke in a dazed condition and attempted to place the keys into the ignition before being stopped.

During the investigation, officers detected the odor of cannabis coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming a THC gummy prior to driving and stated he had pulled into the parking lot after becoming drowsy from its effects. Officers also learned the driver was a convicted felon with a prior burglary conviction.

A search of the driver and vehicle resulted in the discovery of an illegal THC edible and a concealed spring-loaded knife carried on the driver's person. Further investigation confirmed the driver was prohibited from possessing concealed weapons due to his felony conviction. The driver was arrested and charged with possession of tetrahydrocannabinols and possession of a concealed weapon by a convicted felon. He was transported to the Orange County Jail without incident.

May 7, 2026 – Resident Loses More Than \$3,600 in Sophisticated Bank Impersonation Scam

On May 7, 2026, officers met with a Belle Isle resident who reported being the victim of a fraud scheme involving individuals impersonating employees of her financial institution. The victim received text messages and phone calls from suspects who convinced her that her bank account and Social Security number had been compromised.

Believing she was working with legitimate bank representatives, the victim was instructed to withdraw approximately \$3,620 from her account and provide the money to an individual who claimed to be working on behalf of a federal agency to secure her funds. The victim complied and turned the cash over to a driver who met her at the bank.

After the money was transferred, all communication with the suspects ceased. The victim later realized she had been defrauded and contacted law enforcement. Investigators obtained suspect phone numbers, a vehicle description, a license plate number, and a sworn statement from the victim. The case remains under investigation.

This incident serves as an important reminder that financial institutions, government agencies, and law enforcement agencies will never send couriers to collect cash from residents or request that money be withdrawn and transferred to "secure" accounts.

May 7, 2026 – Domestic Violence Arrest Following Family Disturbance

On May 7, 2026, officers responded to a residence on Pleasure Island Road regarding a domestic disturbance involving a couple and their 10-month-old child. Upon arrival, officers separated the involved parties and conducted interviews regarding the incident.

During the investigation, the female involved admitted to striking the male during a verbal argument concerning childcare responsibilities. The male later confirmed that he had been struck

and stated that he physically separated himself from the situation before leaving the residence. Investigators also learned that a knife was displayed during the incident; however, based on the statements provided and the available evidence, the elements necessary for additional charges could not be established.

Based on the totality of the investigation, officers established probable cause that a domestic violence battery had occurred. The female was arrested and transported to the Orange County Jail without incident. The child was released into the care of a family member, and the Florida Department of Children and Families was notified and accepted the case for further review.

May 7, 2026 – Domestic Violence Investigation Results in Arrest Warrant

During the early morning hours of May 7, 2026, officers responded to a hotel on McCoy Road after receiving information that a female victim had been transported to the hospital following a domestic violence incident. Upon arrival, officers observed evidence of a violent altercation inside the hotel room, including blood throughout the room and signs of a struggle.

Officers later interviewed the victim at the hospital, where she was being treated for multiple injuries, including significant facial swelling, bruising, and contusions to her face, arms, and chest. The victim reported that her former boyfriend became enraged during an argument, physically assaulted her, and repeatedly struck her in the face before fleeing the scene. The victim provided a sworn statement and agreed to assist with the prosecution.

Based on the evidence collected, witness statements, and the victim's injuries, investigators established probable cause that a domestic violence battery had occurred. An arrest warrant was submitted and later approved by a judge. The victim was provided with domestic violence resources and victim assistance information. Following medical treatment, she was transferred to a behavioral health facility for additional care and support.

May 8, 2026 – Woman Arrested for Battery on Elderly Victim

On May 8, 2026, officers responded to a residence on Swann Avenue regarding a disturbance involving a woman who was refusing to leave the property. During the investigation, officers learned that the involved parties had a prior domestic violence history and that the female had previously been trespassed from the residence.

Witnesses reported that the female repeatedly honked her vehicle horn and demanded that an 88-year-old resident come outside. When the victim entered the vehicle and later attempted to leave, witnesses observed the female grab him by his shirt and prevent him from exiting. The victim confirmed that he was grabbed during the incident, and the female later admitted to pulling his shirt in an effort to stop him from leaving the vehicle.

Based on witness statements, the victim's account, and the suspect's admission, officers established probable cause that an unlawful touching had occurred. The female was arrested and charged with Battery on a Person 65 Years of Age or Older. She was transported to the Orange

County Jail without incident. The victim was provided with information about victim services and declined medical treatment.

May 9, 2026 – Retail Theft Suspect Arrested Minutes After Theft

On May 9, 2026, officers responded to a retail theft at a convenience store on Hoffner Avenue after an employee reported observing a man conceal three alcoholic beverages and leave the store without paying. The stolen merchandise was valued at approximately \$12.75.

Using the suspect's description and direction of travel, officers quickly located the individual approximately 0.3 miles from the business. As officers approached, the suspect was observed discarding one of the stolen items into a nearby trash can. A witness was transported to the scene and positively identified the suspect as the individual who committed the theft.

Based on witness statements, the recovery of stolen property, and the suspect's actions after leaving the store, officers established probable cause that a retail theft had occurred. The suspect was arrested and charged with Retail Theft before being transported for processing.

May 10, 2026 – Major Narcotics Investigation Leads to Trafficking Arrests and Crash with Ambulance

At approximately 6:41 p.m. on May 10, 2026, an officer conducting proactive patrols at a business on Hoffner Avenue observed suspicious activity involving multiple occupants of a parked pickup truck. During the investigation, officers discovered one occupant unconscious behind the wheel of the running vehicle and another individual in possession of suspected illegal narcotics. Orange County Fire Rescue was requested to respond to evaluate the unresponsive driver.

As paramedics arrived on scene, the driver unexpectedly regained consciousness, placed the vehicle in motion, struck a parked ambulance, and attempted to leave the scene. Officers immediately intervened and stopped the vehicle. The driver displayed signs consistent with impairment and was taken into custody. During the subsequent investigation, officers discovered trafficking quantities of amphetamine-based pills, fentanyl, methamphetamine, alprazolam, cannabis, drug paraphernalia, scales, packaging materials, and additional controlled substances inside the vehicle.

The investigation resulted in the arrest of two individuals. One suspect was charged with Trafficking in Amphetamines, multiple felony drug possession offenses, possession of drug paraphernalia, leaving the scene of a crash, and driving while license suspended. The second suspect was charged with possession of fentanyl, possession of alprazolam, and possession of drug paraphernalia. The vehicle was impounded and the narcotics were seized as evidence.

This case represents one of the most significant narcotics investigations of the month, resulting in the seizure of trafficking-weight controlled substances, multiple felony arrests, and the

apprehension of a driver who attempted to flee after striking an emergency vehicle responding to provide medical assistance.

This case represents one of the most significant narcotics arrests of the month, resulting in the seizure of trafficking-weight controlled substances and multiple felony charges.

May 14, 2026 – Suspicious Communication Report

On May 14, 2026, officers responded to a residence on Seminole Drive regarding a suspicious communication. The resident reported receiving a phone call and text message from an unknown individual on May 10, 2026. The resident blocked the number and reported that no further contact had occurred. A sworn statement was obtained, and the incident was documented for informational purposes.

May 15, 2026 – Fraud Investigation Results in Arrest Warrant

On May 15, 2026, officers responded to a financial institution on McCoy Road after employees reported a customer claimed he was being forced by an armed individual to withdraw money from his account. The customer advised bank staff that a suspect waiting in his vehicle was threatening harm to his family if he did not obtain cash. Before officers arrived, the individual left the bank without receiving any money.

During the investigation, bank employees provided surveillance footage and information regarding similar incidents involving the same individual at multiple financial institutions. In each case, the subject claimed he was being threatened and forced to withdraw money; however, previous investigations found no evidence supporting the allegations. Surveillance footage from the current incident showed no other occupants inside the vehicle, contradicting the claims made to bank employees.

Based on witness statements, video evidence, and the pattern of similar incidents, investigators determined the claims were fabricated and part of an ongoing effort to obtain money through deception. Probable cause was established for Scheme to Defraud, and an arrest warrant was submitted.

On May 26, 2026, the warrant was reviewed and signed by a judge. The case remains active pending the apprehension of the suspect.

May 15, 2026 – FLOCK Alert Leads to Arrest for Driving While License Suspended

On May 15, 2026, officers received a FLOCK license plate reader alert indicating that the registered owner of a vehicle traveling through the city had an invalid driver's license. Officers located the vehicle on Hoffner Avenue and conducted a traffic stop after confirming the registered owner's driving status through state records.

During the traffic stop, the driver identified herself as the registered owner and acknowledged that her driver's license had been suspended. A review of her driving history confirmed multiple license suspensions, including an active suspension that had been in effect since 2024.

Based on the investigation, the driver was arrested for Driving While License Suspended with Knowledge and transported to the Orange County Jail without incident. The vehicle was later released to a licensed driver.

May 15, 2026 – Officers Investigate Domestic Disturbance Following 911 Call

On May 15, 2026, officers responded to a residence on Hoffner Avenue after Orange County Dispatch received a 911 call involving a distressed female. Dispatch reported hearing a woman crying in the background and stating that she wanted to leave the residence while claiming her boyfriend would not allow her to do so.

Upon arrival, officers made contact with both individuals involved and conducted separate interviews. Both parties acknowledged they had been involved in a verbal argument after returning home from a day of boating on Lake Conway. The female stated she wanted to leave the residence to avoid further arguing, while the male wanted her to stay and talk through the disagreement. Both individuals denied any physical altercation, and officers observed no signs of injury or evidence indicating that violence had occurred.

Based on witness statements, physical observations, and the totality of the circumstances, officers determined the incident was a verbal domestic disturbance. No criminal violations were identified, and no arrests were made. The female voluntarily left the residence and arranged transportation to stay with a friend for the evening.

May 17, 2026 – FLOCK Cameras Assist in Identifying Hit-and-Run Driver Who Destroyed Traffic Safety Devices

On May 17, 2026, officers discovered extensive damage to newly installed traffic safety devices and signage near the intersection of Hoffner Avenue and Conway Road. The investigation revealed that a vehicle had struck multiple roadway dividers and a traffic control sign before leaving the scene without reporting the crash. Debris from the vehicle, including pieces of a bumper and wheel well, was located throughout the area.

Using the city's FLOCK camera system, officers were able to narrow the timeframe of the crash and identify the suspect vehicle. A damaged BMW matching the debris found at the scene was later located abandoned nearby. Additional investigation and FLOCK camera data led officers to the registered owner, who was subsequently contacted and interviewed.

During a post-Miranda interview, the driver admitted to operating the vehicle during the crash and acknowledged leaving the scene without notifying law enforcement. The driver also admitted that friends assisted in removing vehicle debris and relocating the damaged vehicle

after the crash. While speaking with officers several hours later, the driver still exhibited the odor of alcoholic beverages and later stated he briefly dozed off before the collision.

Based on the investigation, the driver was arrested and charged with Leaving the Scene of a Crash Involving Property Damage. The damaged vehicle was impounded, and the investigation documented significant damage to recently installed traffic control devices designed to improve safety along the Hoffner Avenue corridor.

May 20, 2026 – Theft Investigation Identifies Suspects After Gym Employee Targeted

On May 20, 2026, officers responded to a theft at a business on Hoffner Avenue after an employee reported that his personal bag had been stolen from an employee breakroom. The victim discovered the theft after receiving fraud alerts from his financial institution indicating that someone was attempting to use his credit cards at a nearby retail store. The stolen property included wallets, identification cards, vehicle keys, and multiple credit cards.

During the investigation, officers reviewed surveillance footage from the business, which showed an unidentified suspect entering a restricted employee area and stealing property belonging to multiple employees. The suspect was also observed taking cash from another employee's belongings before concealing the stolen items and leaving the business with two associates.

Officers conducted follow-up investigations with a nearby retailer where the victim's credit cards were later used. Surveillance footage confirmed the suspects attempted to make purchases using the stolen cards, although the transactions were unsuccessful. Investigators obtained photographs and evidence from both locations and continue working to positively identify the suspects.

The case remains under active investigation.

May 20, 2026 – Traffic Stop Leads to Arrest After Driver Provides False Identity

On May 20, 2026, an officer conducting proactive patrols observed a vehicle displaying a license plate assigned to an expired trailer rather than the vehicle it was attached to. A traffic stop was conducted, and the driver immediately admitted that the license plate did not belong on the vehicle.

During the investigation, the driver claimed he did not possess a driver's license and provided a false name and date of birth to the officer. Through additional investigative efforts, officers were able to positively identify the individual and determine that he did not possess a valid driver's license. Further investigation revealed multiple suspensions, a cancellation of his driving privileges, and an active warrant related to a probation violation.

The driver later admitted he intentionally provided false information because he knew he did not have a valid driver's license and was aware of pending legal issues. He was arrested and charged with No Valid Driver's License, Providing False Information to a Law Enforcement Officer, and

Attaching a License Plate Not Assigned to the Vehicle. He was additionally booked on the outstanding Orange County warrant. The improperly displayed license plate was seized as evidence.

May 22, 2026 – Criminal Mischief Investigation After Basketball Hoop Damaged

On May 22, 2026, officers responded to a residence on Wind Harbor Drive regarding a report of criminal mischief. The homeowner reported that a basketball hoop valued at approximately \$500 had been damaged the previous evening.

According to the victim, witnesses observed a group of four teenagers in the area prior to the damage occurring. One witness reported seeing an individual hanging from the basketball rim before the equipment was damaged. Although the residence was equipped with surveillance cameras, the incident was not captured on video.

A sworn statement was obtained from the victim, and the case was documented as a criminal mischief investigation. The suspects remain unidentified, and the investigation is ongoing.

May 25, 2026 – Officers Conduct Welfare Check Following Concerned Neighbor Report

On May 25, 2026, officers responded to a residence on Wind Willow Road after a concerned neighbor requested a welfare check due to a strong odor coming from the property and concerns for the resident's well-being.

Upon arrival, officers made contact with the resident, who appeared to be in good health and advised she was not experiencing any medical emergency. During the contact, officers detected a strong odor coming from the garage area. The resident explained the odor was related to a previous rodent infestation and stated she had not yet been able to address the issue.

Officers observed no immediate signs indicating the resident was in danger or required emergency assistance. The incident was documented, and the appropriate agency was notified regarding the circumstances. No criminal activity was identified, and no further action was required at the time of the investigation.

May 26, 2026 – Traffic Stop Leads to Arrest for Driving While License Suspended

On May 26, 2026, an officer conducting traffic enforcement on Hoffner Avenue identified a vehicle whose registered owner had a suspended driver's license. A traffic stop was conducted after confirming the driver's status through state records.

The driver was identified as the registered owner of the vehicle and acknowledged being aware of previous traffic citations. During the investigation, officers confirmed the driver's license had been suspended as a result of failing to appear in court on multiple traffic summonses.

Based on the investigation, the driver was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and transported for processing without incident.

May 27, 2026 – Elderly Woman Dies Following Suspected Intentional Overdose

On May 27, 2026, officers responded to a residence on Quando Drive after receiving a report of an 85-year-old woman who had reportedly ingested a large quantity of medication. Upon arrival, officers located the woman unconscious and unresponsive inside a bedroom. Emergency medical care was immediately provided, including the administration of Narcan and life-saving measures until Orange County Fire Rescue personnel arrived and assumed treatment.

Family members advised that the woman had been struggling with depression, anxiety, and recent life changes, including moving into the residence approximately two months earlier. During the investigation, officers located multiple empty prescription medication bottles, a cup containing a white residue, and other items believed to be associated with the ingestion. Family members expressed concerns that the overdose was intentional and provided sworn statements regarding the events leading up to the incident.

The woman was transported to Orlando Regional Medical Center for treatment. Later that evening, officers were notified that she had succumbed to her injuries. Due to the circumstances surrounding the incident, the Medical Examiner's Office accepted the case for investigation. Evidence collected from the scene was submitted for further analysis, and the investigation remains active pending the Medical Examiner's findings.

May 28, 2026 – Vehicle Burglary Results in Theft of Firearm and Property Valued Over \$12,000

On May 28, 2026, officers responded to a condominium complex on Conway Road regarding a vehicle burglary involving a rental vehicle parked overnight. The victim reported discovering multiple items missing from the vehicle, including a handgun, automotive diagnostic equipment, ammunition, and jewelry.

The stolen property included a .45 caliber handgun, two automotive diagnostic scanners, a gold necklace, and ammunition, with a combined estimated value exceeding \$12,000. The victim advised that the vehicle had been parked in the complex parking lot the previous evening and that the theft was discovered the following morning.

During the investigation, officers processed the vehicle for evidence and recovered latent fingerprints from multiple locations. No signs of forced entry were observed. The stolen firearm was entered into state and national law enforcement databases as stolen property, and evidence collected from the scene was submitted for further examination.

The case remains under active investigation.

May 28, 2026 – Juvenile on Probation Arrested on Drug Charges and Violation of Probation

At approximately 1:38 a.m. on May 28, 2026, an officer conducting proactive patrols at an apartment complex on McCoy Road observed a vehicle occupied by three individuals. One of the occupants was a juvenile known to officers through prior contacts and who was currently on supervised release for serious felony offenses, including robbery with a firearm.

During the encounter, officers detected the odor of cannabis coming from the vehicle. In plain view, officers observed a THC vape device and a cannabis cigarette within reach of the juvenile. The juvenile was observed attempting to move the vape device away from his seating area as officers approached. A subsequent search of the vehicle confirmed the presence of the THC vape device and cannabis, and witnesses on scene identified the vape device as belonging to the juvenile.

Testing confirmed the vape device contained THC in an illegal concentration. After consulting with juvenile probation authorities, officers confirmed the juvenile's possession of illegal drugs constituted a violation of the conditions of his supervised release.

The juvenile was arrested and charged with Possession of Tetrahydrocannabinols, Possession of Cannabis Under 20 Grams, and Felony Violation of Probation. He was transported to the Juvenile Assessment Center and later medically evaluated before being returned for processing. The narcotics evidence was seized and submitted into evidence.

May 30, 2026 – Resident Loses \$7,700 in Prize Scam Investigation

On May 30, 2026, officers responded to a hotel on McCoy Road regarding a fraud complaint involving a prize-winning scam. The victim reported being contacted by an individual who claimed he had won a \$200,000 prize and was required to establish an investment or portfolio account before receiving the funds. The suspect provided what appeared to be official documentation and convinced the victim that the offer was legitimate.

Believing the prize was genuine, the victim conducted multiple financial transactions over an eleven-day period, sending funds through various electronic payment platforms and bank accounts. After becoming suspicious and realizing he had not received any prize money, the victim contacted law enforcement.

The investigation revealed that approximately \$7,700 had been transferred to multiple recipients as part of the scheme. Officers obtained transaction information, contact information used by the suspect, and supporting documentation related to the fraud. A sworn statement was obtained from the victim, and the case remains under investigation.

This case serves as a reminder that legitimate sweepstakes, lotteries, and prize promotions do not require winners to pay fees, transfer money, or establish accounts in order to claim winnings.

May 30, 2026 – Early Morning Traffic Stop Leads to Arrest for No Driver's License

At approximately 1:29 a.m. on May 30, 2026, an officer conducting traffic enforcement on Hansel Avenue observed a vehicle operating without functioning taillights and conducted a traffic stop.

During the investigation, the driver was unable to provide a driver's license and admitted he had never been issued one. Officers confirmed the driver did not possess a valid driver's license and learned he also had an outstanding warrant from another state for a traffic-related offense, although the warrant was not extraditable to Florida.

Based on the investigation, the driver was arrested and charged with No Driver's License, Never Had One Issued. The vehicle was towed from the scene, and the driver was transported to the Orange County Jail without incident.

Traffic Crash Reports

During May 2026, the Belle Isle Police Department investigated 11 traffic crashes ranging from minor parking lot collisions to crashes involving injuries, traffic control devices, construction zones, and significant property damage. While the majority of crashes resulted in only minor damage, several required extensive follow-up investigations.

In some cases, a traffic crash may also be associated with a separate criminal investigation or arrest. When that occurs, the crash itself is summarized in this section, while any related criminal charges or arrests are detailed separately in the Arrest and Criminal Investigations section of this report.

Below is a brief summary of each crash investigated during the month of May.

May 1, 2026 – Hit-and-Run Crash Investigated at Rental Car Facility

On May 1, 2026, officers responded to a rental car facility on McCoy Road after a vehicle struck a parked rental vehicle in the parking lot and left the scene. Surveillance footage showed a sport utility vehicle backing into an unoccupied rental vehicle, causing damage before departing.

Investigators reviewed surveillance footage, identified the vehicle involved, and conducted follow-up interviews to determine the circumstances surrounding the crash. The collision resulted in property damage to the parked rental vehicle, and the crash was documented for investigative and reporting purposes.

May 8, 2026 – Parking Lot Crash Causes Minor Vehicle Damage

On May 8, 2026, officers investigated a crash in a parking lot on McCoy Road involving a vehicle attempting to park next to an occupied parking space. During the maneuver, the driver struck a parked vehicle, causing damage along the passenger side of the parked vehicle.

After the collision, the driver left the immediate area to complete a food delivery but was later contacted and returned to the scene. No injuries were reported by any involved parties, and both vehicles were removed from the scene by their respective drivers.

The at-fault driver was issued a traffic citation for Improper Backing.

May 8, 2026 – Intersection Crash Causes Minor Vehicle Damage

On May 8, 2026, officers investigated a two-vehicle crash at the intersection of Seminole Drive and Daetwyler Drive. According to the drivers involved, both vehicles stopped at the intersection before attempting to proceed at approximately the same time, resulting in a collision.

The crash caused minor damage to both vehicles. No injuries were reported, and both vehicles were driven from the scene by their owners. Following the investigation, no traffic citations were issued.

May 10, 2026 – Driver Strikes Ambulance in Wawa Parking Lot

On May 10, 2026, officers investigated a crash in the parking lot of a business on Hoffner Avenue involving a pickup truck and an Orange County Fire Rescue ambulance. The incident began when a driver was found unresponsive behind the wheel of a running vehicle, prompting emergency medical personnel to respond and assess the driver's condition.

After regaining consciousness, the driver attempted to leave the area and backed into the parked ambulance, causing minor damage. No injuries were reported as a result of the collision, and emergency personnel evaluated the driver at the scene.

The driver was determined to be at fault for the crash and was issued a citation for Improper Backing Resulting in a Crash.

May 13, 2026 – Rear-End Crash at Hansel Avenue and Wallace Street Intersection

On May 13, 2026, officers investigated a two-vehicle crash at the intersection of Hansel Avenue and Wallace Street. According to the investigation, traffic ahead began slowing as vehicles approached the intersection. One driver was unable to stop in time and collided with the rear of the vehicle in front, causing minor damage to both vehicles.

No injuries were reported by either driver, and both vehicles were removed from the scene by their owners. As a result of the investigation, the at-fault driver was issued traffic citations related to careless driving, learner's license restrictions, and failure to provide proof of insurance.

May 17, 2026 – Overnight Crash Destroys Newly Installed Traffic Safety Devices on Hoffner Avenue

On May 17, 2026, officers discovered extensive damage to recently installed traffic safety devices along Hoffner Avenue near Darden Avenue. Multiple roadway dividers had been destroyed or displaced, a traffic control sign was damaged, and vehicle debris was scattered

throughout the area. An abandoned vehicle with significant front-end damage was later located nearby.

The investigation determined the vehicle had traveled through the area during the early morning hours and struck the traffic safety infrastructure, causing substantial damage. The collision destroyed several roadway delineators and damaged signage that had recently been installed as part of ongoing traffic safety improvements.

No injuries were reported as a result of the crash. The damaged vehicle was removed from the scene, and the crash resulted in significant damage to public traffic control devices and related roadway safety equipment.

May 20, 2026 – Driver Leaves Roadway and Strikes Parked Vehicle

On May 20, 2026, officers investigated a single-vehicle crash on Country Lakes Drive after a vehicle failed to negotiate a curve and left the roadway. The vehicle traveled off the road and struck a parked vehicle that was located in a residential driveway.

The crash caused significant damage to both vehicles, with the striking vehicle sustaining approximately \$10,000 in damage and the parked vehicle sustaining approximately \$3,000 in damage. No injuries were reported by the driver or passenger involved in the crash.

Both vehicles were removed by their owners. Following the investigation, the driver was issued a citation for Careless Driving Resulting in a Crash.

May 22, 2026 – Electric Bicycle Rider Collides with Parked Police Vehicle

On May 22, 2026, officers investigated a crash involving an electric bicycle and a marked Belle Isle Police Department patrol vehicle near the intersection of Randolph Avenue and Fairlane Avenue. The patrol vehicle was stopped with its emergency lights activated when the bicyclist traveled around a road closure barricade and collided with the rear of the vehicle.

The bicyclist advised he did not see the patrol vehicle and was not paying attention immediately prior to the collision. No injuries were reported, and only minor damage was sustained to the bicycle and the patrol vehicle.

Following the investigation, no traffic citations were issued.

May 22, 2026 – Parking Lot Collision Results in Minor Damage

On May 22, 2026, officers investigated a two-vehicle crash in the parking lot of an apartment complex on McCoy Road. The collision occurred as one vehicle was backing from a parking space while another vehicle was also backing in the parking lot, resulting in contact between the two vehicles.

The crash caused minor damage to both vehicles. No injuries were reported, and both vehicles were removed from the scene by their drivers.

Following the investigation, one driver was issued a citation for Improper Backing Resulting in a Crash.

May 24, 2026 – Rear-End Crash Causes Minor Injury on Hoffner Avenue

On May 24, 2026, officers investigated a rear-end crash on Hoffner Avenue near Duban Avenue. The crash occurred when a vehicle stopped in traffic and was struck from behind by another vehicle whose driver later stated they were not paying attention at the time of the collision.

The impact caused minor damage to the vehicles involved. One driver complained of lower back pain following the crash but declined medical treatment at the scene. No other injuries were reported.

Following the investigation, the at-fault driver was issued a citation for Careless Driving.

May 27, 2026 – Rear-End Crash in Active Construction Zone

On May 27, 2026, officers investigated a two-vehicle crash on Hoffner Avenue near Saint Denis Court. The collision occurred within an active construction zone that was marked with traffic control devices and construction signage.

According to the investigation, one vehicle slowed for construction workers entering the roadway while a second vehicle failed to reduce speed and struck the rear of the slowing vehicle. The impact caused minor damage to both vehicles.

No injuries were reported, and both vehicles were driven from the scene by their owners. Following the investigation, the at-fault driver was issued a citation for Careless Driving Resulting in a Crash.

 **Code Enforcement**

Code Enforcement Activity – May 2026

During May, Code Enforcement staff addressed a variety of property maintenance, permitting, and land use issues throughout the city. A total of six new cases were opened and six cases were brought into compliance and closed. Activity included landscaping violations, permit-related issues, RV and trailer concerns, and tree permit and tree violation cases. Staff continue to work with residents and property owners to achieve voluntary compliance while helping preserve the safety, appearance, and quality of life within the City of Belle Isle.

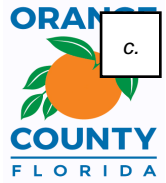

Re: Engagement Letter with GrayRobinson, P.A.

Dear Rick:

Thank you very much for your continued interest in GrayRobinson, P.A. (“GrayRobinson” or “the Firm”). We appreciate the opportunity to provide governmental consulting services to City of Belle Isle (“City”). The Firm is committed to providing the highest level of service in furtherance of your goals. This letter will describe the terms under which that representation will occur, disclose the Firm’s reporting responsibilities under the law, and summarize the nature of government consulting services as compared to legal services.

Firm Contacts for Your Representation

You have asked that we represent the City before the State of Florida on issues related to the executive and legislative branches of government. The entire team of GrayRobinson’s lobbyists will be available to advance your interests. However, in order to ensure that your needs are efficiently and fully addressed, I will be the primary contact for this representation. If I should ever be unavailable, I would encourage you to contact Kylee Anzueto, who will serve as an additional contact for this representation.

Fees, Costs and Terms

The term of this agreement is for one year commencing on June 1, 2026 and ending on May 31, 2027. The City shall have the right to extend the term of this agreement in one-year increments for up to three additional one-year renewal terms with the last renewal term ending May 31, 2030. However, the City reserves the right to terminate this agreement, without cost or penalty, at any time upon giving GrayRobinson written notice of termination. In exchange for these services, the City has agreed to pay the Firm \$4,000 per month until this agreement expires or is terminated, beginning with an initial payment of \$4,000 on June 1, 2026, and on the first day of each month thereafter. Any additional out-of-pocket expenses incurred or advanced on behalf of the City will be itemized on our invoice and, in the aggregate, not exceed \$500 per month without preapproval from the City. All payments should be remitted to 301 East Pine Street #1400, Orlando, FL 32801 or via ACH transfer or other electronic transfer upon receipt of invoice. Both the City and the Firm have the right to terminate this contract with or without cause with thirty (30) days’ notice given.

The obligation of the City to make payments under this agreement shall be subject to annual appropriation by the City Council. In the event sufficient funds are not appropriated for any fiscal year, this agreement shall terminate at the end of the then-current fiscal year without penalty or further obligation to the City.

Lobbyist Registration

Florida law requires that GrayRobinson's lobbyists must register with the state prior to engaging in lobbying activity. Lobbyist registrations are effective when they are received by the state, and lobbying may not occur prior to proper registration. The registration and fee cycle is a calendar year beginning January 1 and ending December 31. Therefore, the City consents for the Firm's lobbyists to register to represent the City, and the City agrees to reimburse the Firm for the cost of lobbyist registrations.

Lobbyist registration fees are:

- **Legislature:** \$20 for each person from the point of registration until December 31; then renewed in January each calendar year thereafter.
- **Executive:** \$25 for each person from the point of registration until December 31; then renewed in January each calendar year thereafter.

Lobbyist registration forms will be sent following the execution of this agreement. By signing below, you agree to complete and return the registration authorization, which are necessary to our representation of the City during the term of this contract or after its termination should reporting periods overlap. The Firm cannot commence representation until the registration authorizations are properly filed with the state.

Similarly, local governments, before which we may need to appear on your behalf, may also have their own lobbying registration and/or reporting requirements. GrayRobinson will comply with any such jurisdictional ordinances or policies, and will not commence any representation in those jurisdictions until all necessary disclosures or authorizations are filed. You agree to facilitate any required registrations with appropriate paperwork, documentation, and payment of costs associated with such compliance.

Compensation Reporting

Florida law requires that the fees and costs invoiced by GrayRobinson for lobbying services are reportable to the state on a quarterly basis to both the Florida Legislature and the Florida Commission on Ethics. Therefore, the City consents to the quarterly disclosure of compensation paid or owed to GrayRobinson for lobbying activity as required by Chapter 2005-359, Laws of Florida. Such consent is granted so that GrayRobinson may file the specified quarterly reports, disclosing only the information required by Chapter 2005-359, Laws of Florida, and shall remain in effect as long as any GrayRobinson lawyer or non-lawyer lobbyist serves as the client's registered representative before the Legislature and any executive branch agency.

Unless you direct otherwise, the Firm will attribute and report 50% of our fees and reimbursements as legislative branch lobbying fees, and 50% of our fees and reimbursements as executive branch lobbying fees, subject to periodic adjustment by us to reflect our best professional judgment regarding allocation of our efforts associated with this representation.

Confidentiality

In order to ensure the candor and trust in our relationship that forms the basis of effective representation, it is the policy of the Firm to keep strictly confidential all information about your interests and strategies. Because information is our stock in trade and because advancing your interests may depend on it, we ask that you also keep confidential any information we may share with you regarding political strategy, insight, information, or analysis.

General Provisions

This agreement was procured pursuant to City of Belle Isle RFP# 2026-03 ("RFP") and GrayRobinson shall comply with all requirements of the RFP. All services rendered hereunder shall be provided in accordance with the RFP and all ordinances, resolutions, statutes, rules, and regulations of any Federal, State or local governmental agency having jurisdiction in effect at the time service is rendered. To the extent applicable, GrayRobinson will comply

with the Florida Public Records Act concerning services performed for the City and will cooperate with the City's custodian of records to fulfil public records request directed at records in GrayRobinson's custody, possession or control. This agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Exclusive venue for disputes between the parties arising from this agreement is Orange County, Florida. This agreement supersedes and replaces all previous agreements between the parties concerning the services governed by this agreement.

Insurance

GrayRobinson shall procure and maintain during the term of this agreement all insurance policies required by the RFP. The Firm shall procure and maintain, at its sole cost and expense, in a form and content satisfactory to City, during the entire term of this agreement, including any extension thereof, the following policies of insurance:

- A. **Comprehensive General Liability Insurance.** A policy of comprehensive general liability insurance written on a per occurrence basis in an amount not less than a combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) aggregate.
- B. **Workers compensation insurance** for its employees and other applicable insurance as may be required by the State of Florida.
- C. **Errors and Omissions Insurance.** A policy of professional liability issuance written on a claims made basis in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

GrayRobinson shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City and its elected officials, officers, employees, and agents from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, liabilities, and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of services under any resulting contract, except to the extent caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the City. Nothing in this agreement shall constitute a waiver of the City's sovereign immunity or any other privilege or immunity afforded by law to the City and its elected officials, officers, employees, and agents.

Generative Artificial Intelligence

As part of our commitment to providing efficient and high-quality services, the Firm may use advanced technologies, including generative artificial intelligence (AI), to assist in research, drafting, and other related tasks. The use of such technologies is supervised by our lobbyists and is intended to enhance, not replace, the judgment and expertise that we bring to this representation.

Please be advised of the following:

- **Human Oversight:** All work products generated by the Firm using AI tools are carefully reviewed and validated by responsible individuals in our Firm. We do not rely on content we generate using AI without human oversight.
- **Confidentiality:** We take your privacy and confidentiality seriously. Any information shared with or processed by AI tools is subject to the same rigorous confidentiality and data protection standards as all other information handled by our Firm.
- **Limitations of AI:** While AI tools can assist in streamlining certain processes, they are not infallible. The final responsibility for the accuracy, relevance, and appropriateness of any advice, document, or strategy we develop rests with us.
- **Client Consent:** By engaging our services, you acknowledge and consent to the use of generative AI tools as part of our services. If you have any concerns about the use of AI in your representation, please inform us, and we will discuss alternative approaches to meet your needs.

Distinguishing Between Lobbying and Legal Services; Conflicts

GrayRobinson offers not only legal services but also lobbying services. The Florida Bar treats legal services differently than non-legal services, which includes lobbying and consulting. It is important to understand the distinction between those services relative to conflicts, and the scope of this representation. *This lobbyist engagement does not create an attorney/client relationship between you and our Firm.* If legal services are required by the City, we will enter into a separate engagement.

Both lobbyists and lawyers must avoid conflict of interest. Lawyers may not accept a legal client adverse to another legal client in a legal matter, and our lobbyists will decline to accept a lobbying client involved in legal action against an existing legal or lobbying client of the Firm. However, legal services and lobbying are separate and distinct services for the purposes of evaluating conflicts, and, because lobbying frequently involves advocating for potential changes to existing law within the legislative branch or application of the law by the executive branch, the positions advanced on behalf of lobbying clients may or may not differ from legal positions taken on behalf of clients in judicial proceedings. In some instances, lobbying clients may not have a legal conflict, but they may be marketplace competitors or they may take inconsistent positions on one or more lobbying issues. We will bring any such situations to your attention immediately upon discovery and we likewise ask you to contact us immediately if you have similar concerns at any time. Whenever conditions merit, we will implement and maintain an "ethics wall" to maintain complete separation of information, strategy, and personnel associated with the affected lobbying clients.

Under the scope of representation outlined above we know of no lobbying conflicts with our current lobbying clients, and we have discussed our plan for protecting your interest from marketplace competitors via an ethics wall. If you ever have a concern about a perceived or potential conflict, or any other issue we ask that you alert us immediately so we can address it in a mutually acceptable fashion. We will do the same.

I believe the above reflects our understanding. If it does, please sign this agreement and return it to me. If not already completed, electronic lobbyist registration forms will be sent separately from the respective entities for 2027. I appreciate your attention to this matter and look forward to working with you. Please never hesitate to contact me if we can assist you in any way.

Subject: Water Supply Plan Update 2026-2035 WSWFP

Background: On March 18, 2025, the Council approved Ordinance 25-01 to transmit the updated Comp Plan to the State.

As part of the state review process, the St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD) noted that the City last adopted the state-required Water Supply Facilities Work Plan (WSFWP) in 2008 and 2025. Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes (F.S.), requires local governments to prepare and adopt their local WSFWP into their comprehensive plans within 18 months after the Water Management District approves a regional water supply plan or its update. The Central Florida Water Initiative Regional Water Supply Plan was approved by the District’s Governing Board in November 2025; therefore, the City needs to amend its Comprehensive Plan to reflect the updated WSFWP.

In coordination with SJRWMD Staff, the attached 2026-2035 WSWFP will address state requirements and bring the City into compliance.

The purpose of the City of Belle Isle’s WSWFP is to identify and plan for the water supply sources and facilities needed to serve existing and new developments within the local government’s jurisdiction. In accordance with state guidelines, the Work Plan, as further effectuated through the Comprehensive Plan Update, addresses the development of traditional and alternative water supplies, service delivery, and conservation and reuse programs necessary to serve existing and new development for at least a 10-year planning period. This update also eliminates superfluous information in the previous WSWFP to facilitate future updates.

The WSWFP is relatively straightforward in terms of its contents. The City does not provide potable water to its residents and relies upon Orange County Utilities and Orlando Utilities Commission to provide this service.

Staff Recommendation:

Summary of What Triggers a Water Supply Facility's Work Plan Update

- SJRWMD is divided into three water supply planning regions: 1. Central Florida Water Initiative (CFWI), 2. Central Springs/East Coast, 3. North Florida Regional Water Supply Partnership. Separate regional water supply plans (RWSPs) are developed for each region.
- RWSPs are updated every five years. Once an RWSP is updated, in accordance with Section 163.3177(6)(c)(4), F.S., all local governments within that respective water supply planning region have 18 months to adopt a new or updated WSFWP-related comprehensive plan amendment. In effect, local governments are required to update their WSFWP every 5 years.
- Belle Isle is located in the CFWI water supply planning region. In November 2025, SJRWMD approved the 2025 CFWI RWSP. This was an update of the 2020 CFWI RWSP. Subsequently, the City is required to amend its comprehensive plan to adopt an updated WSFWP within 18 months of governing board approval of the 2025 CFWI RWSP.

Staff requests a recommendation by the Council to TRANSMIT Ordinance 26-02 as amended of the 2026-2035 Water Supply Plan.

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**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, ADOPTING THE
2026-2035 WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES WORK PLAN AND AMENDING THE

SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, CONFLICTS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the City of Belle Isle has considered an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan relating to the City's Water Supply Facilities Work Plan; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the City of Belle Isle Water Supply Facilities Work Plan ("Work Plan") is to identify and plan for the water supply sources and facilities needed to serve existing and new developments within the local government's jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes (F.S.), requires local governments to prepare and adopt Work Plans into their comprehensive plans within 18 months after the St. Johns River Water Management District (District) approves a regional water supply plan or its update; and

WHEREAS, the Central Florida Water Initiative Regional Water Supply Plan was approved by the District's Governing Board in November 2025; and

WHEREAS, the proposed 2026-2035 Water Supply Facilities Work Plan, attached hereto as Exhibit "A," will promote and protect public health safety and welfare and will help accomplish the goals, objectives, and policies of the City's Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to adopt the 2026-2035 Water Supply Facilities Work Plan and amend the text of the Comprehensive Plan to reference the same.

1 **IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE AS FOLLOWS:**

2 **SECTION 1. RECITALS.** The above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein as
3 legislative findings of the City Council.

4 **SECTION 2. WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES WORK PLAN ADOPTION.** The City of Belle Isle hereby
5 amends the City of Belle Isle Comprehensive Plan to adopt the 2026-2035 Water Supply Facilities Work Plan as
6 set forth in **Exhibit “A”** attached hereto (“Water Supply Facilities Work Plan”). The Water Supply Facilities Work
7 Plan will be codified into the Comprehensive Plan in accordance with general law.

8 **SECTION 3. TEXT AMENDMENT ADOPTION.** Policy 5.1.1 of the Infrastructure Element of City of Belle
9 Isle Comprehensive Plan is hereby replaced and amended to read as follows:

10 **POLICY 5.1.1:** The City of Belle Isle Water Supply Facilities Work Plan 2026-2035 is herein adopted
11 and affixed as Exhibit A to the Infrastructure Element of the Comprehensive Plan.

13 **SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.** The effective date of the Comprehensive Plan Amendment adopted
14 by this Ordinance, if the amendment is not timely challenged, shall be in accordance with general law, which is
15 31 days after the State Land Planning Agency notifies the City that the Comprehensive Plan Amendment package
16 is complete. If timely challenged, in accordance with general law, the amendment adopted by this Ordinance does

19 **SECTION 5. CONFLICTS.** In the event of a conflict or conflicts between this Ordinance and any other

21 **SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY.** If any part of this Ordinance is found to be invalid, preempted, or
22 otherwise superseded, the remainder shall nevertheless be given full force and effect to the extent permitted by
23 the severance of such invalid, preempted, or superseded part.

24 **SECTION 7. CODIFICATION.** Sections 2 and 3 of this Ordinance shall be incorporated into the City

1 and/or any heading may be changed or modified as necessary to effectuate the foregoing. Grammatical,

ORDINANCE 26-02

1.0 Introduction

The City of Belle Isle (City) is a small, predominately residential community in Central Florida. It is located approximately five (5) miles south of the City of Orlando, in Orange County, Florida around the Lake Conway Chain of Lakes.

This Water Supply Facilities Work Plan is the City’s plan to service current water demands and the anticipated growth in demand within its jurisdiction. This workplan is based on information provided by the City’s Planning Department, the City’s Comprehensive Plan, Orlando Utilities Commission and Orange County Utilities.

The City does not own, operate or maintain any of the water supply facilities or transmission mains serving the City. The City’s potable water and wastewater service is provided by two (2) water suppliers:

1. Orlando Utilities Commission (OUC).
2. Orange County Utilities (OCU).

Figure 1 presents the current City boundaries and identifies areas serviced by OUC and OCU. The two water service providers serve approximately half of the City each. A small portion of the City, in the southeast, is serviced by OUC who provides the water supply, but the transmissions lines and related facilities are owned and maintained by OCU.

Both water suppliers included in the City’s projected demand in their water supply plans and is included in their consumptive use permits.

Infrastructure Element Policy 4.1.1 and Capital Improvement Element Policy 1.3.4 establish the City’s level of service standards for the potable water as follows:

- Residential: 350 gallons/unit/day
- Non-Residential: 2,000 gallons/unit/day

The City is largely built-out but anticipates some annexation of property which is already connected to potable water. Therefore, the annexations would not impact the water supply or increase demand as the areas of proposed annexation have existing water service provided by OUC and OCU.

Since the City is in a built-out condition and with plans for only a small amount of annexation, the water consumption for the City will not significantly change over the next ten (10) years. In addition, the majority of the property which is proposed for annexation already has existing water service; therefore, the overall impact will not increase. Thus, the assumption that sufficient water service will be available to the City via OUC and OCU has been made.

2.0 Provision of Potable Water Supplies and Facilities

Belle Isle is within both OCU and OUC's service areas. Both entities included the City of Belle Isle within their population and flow projections, which are used to calculate the flows in their consumptive use permits. The City's 2024 comprehensive plan update RVI Assessment Report/Plan Framework report (dated November 15th, 2023) shows that the city is expected to grow from the current 2020 estimate of 7,032 to 7,747 by 2040, an increase of +/- 10%.

Orange County Utilities (OCU)

The population of Orange County is anticipated to increase by about 51 percent between 2015 and 2040. OCU has historically have used potable groundwater from the Floridan aquifer as the primary source for public supply. Fresh groundwater is considered a traditional water source. However, the initial phase of the CFWI technical process concluded with a determination that the amount of traditional groundwater currently permitted in the five-county CFWI area, which includes Orange County, exceeded sustainable supply quantities. The CFWI process then provided guidance for a combination of water sources and water supply project options that could meet the needs of this region.

Orange County has identified that its most effective course of action with the planning horizon is to:

- Optimize the use of groundwater from the Floridan aquifer.
- Maximize the use of reclaimed water.
 - Continue aquifer recharge projects in areas of greatest benefit.
 - Expand reuse distribution facilities for irrigation and other beneficial use.
- Continue to implement effective water conservation measures.
- Develop additional AWS sources such as brackish groundwater, indirect and direct potable reuse, and surface water for potable supply and non-potable system augmentation.
- Investigate additional options such as aquifer storage and recovery (ASR), reservoir storage, and stormwater reuse for future implementation as feasible.

OCU's operations within the planning horizon will be based on this water supply strategy.

Orlando Utilities Commission (OUC)

The City of Orlando's growth projections indicate that by 2045, the City of Orlando will have approximately 400,854 residents, an increase of 30% from 2020, which is consistent with the historic pattern of the City in recent years.

As the population continues to increase, the demand for water is expected to increase as well. From 2020 to 2025, an increase of 12% in the cumulative demand is expected. For 2045, the demand for potable water will reach 84.1 MGD for all land uses combined.

The City of Orlando and OUC have identified three (3) major strategies for meeting water demand with sufficient water supply, as follows:

1. Reclaim Water: Expand treatment and reclaimed wastewater for use as irrigation.
2. Conservation: Encourage conservation measures to decrease potable demand.
3. Alternative Water Sources: Identified alternative water sources other than traditional groundwater from the Florida aquifer. "

2.1 Regional Water Supply Plan Project Options

The City of Belle Isle does not have any supplemental regional water supply projects planned as it does not own the water utilities servicing the City. However, the City of Belle Isle is supportive of projects planned by the two water utilities servicing the area outlined above.

Since the City’s water service is provided by OUC and OCU, the City will rely on OUC and OCU to partner with other utilities to implement alternative water supply projects for potable supply, improve potable water supply, or establish agreements with other water suppliers.

2.2 Agreements with OCU and OUC

The City does not currently have formal interlocal agreements regarding the provision of water service with OCU or OUC. Instead, the City relies on its location with each entities respective territorial service area for the provisions of services.

Please note that the City’s existing policies 1.4 and 1.4.1 within its Future Land Use Element that require coordination with and approval by the applicable service providers for new development. Please see referenced Future Land Use policies in the Comprehensive Plan.

3.0 Provision of Reuse or Other Non-Potable Water Supplies and Facilities

The City does not currently have a reuse pipe distribution system network and does not plan to retrofit residents in the next ten (10) years. The City’s potable water providers do not have reuse water available nearby, and there are no plans by OUC and OCU to bring reuse water service to the City.

3.1 Agreement with Other Non-Potable Water Suppliers and Users

The City does not currently have formal interlocal agreements regarding the provision of wastewater service with OCU or OUC. Instead, the City relies on its location with each entity’s respective territorial service area for the provision of services.

4.0 Water Conservation Practices

The City does not currently have a conservation plan of its own. Instead, the residents of the City are bound by the conservation corresponding to the water supplier's service area in which they reside. However, the City does provide public education and outreach programs by printing and distributing information on water conservation to its citizens. In addition, the City has language in its Land Development Code that encourages drought tolerant plants to be used in landscaping as well procedures that promote water conservation through the more efficient use of landscape irrigation, specifically, Chapter 32, Article II, Sec. 32-31 restricts addresses within the City to certain days and times for landscape irrigation, which is consistent with the SJRWMD's lawn and landscape irrigation rule that limits irrigation to two days per week between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. when Daylight Savings Time is in effect and one day per week between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. when Eastern Standard Time is in effect, with some exceptions. The City's code is (enforced by the Belle Isle Police Department who issues warnings and upon second infraction issues a code violation citation. The following sections describe the City's conservation practices.

4.1 Water Conservation Policies

The City implements and maintains numerous water conservation practices through its LDC and Comprehensive Plan. Below is a listing of the Comprehensive Plan policies that provide enabling language for various water conservation practices. The agreement provides for the assignment of two School Resource Officers to serve the Cornerstone Charter Academy K-8 and High School campuses. The agreement is substantially the same as the prior year agreement, with updates limited to the contract year and annual cost figures.

WHEREAS, the City has established a School Resource Officer Program (from now on referred to as the "SRO Program") under applicable Florida law; and

WHEREAS, the Academy desires that the City provide a law enforcement officer to serve as its School Resource Officer (referred to as "SROs") at the Academy, and the City is willing to assign a law enforcement officer to serve as an SRO under the terms and conditions set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Academy agree that the SRO Program is an excellent benefit to the school administration, the student body, and the community as a whole, and desire to enter into this School Resource Officer Agreement (referred to as "Agreement") to accomplish the purposes expressed herein; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Academy understand and agree that the SRO Program is established for the purposes set forth under applicable Florida law, including assistance in preventing juvenile delinquency by providing programs specifically developed to respond to those factors and conditions that give rise to delinquency.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - RECITALS

1.01 **Recitals.** The parties agree that the preceding recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

ARTICLE 2 - SPECIAL CONDITIONS

2.01 **Term of Agreement.** This Agreement shall take effect upon the signature of both parties. It shall remain in effect until terminated by either party by Section 3.04 of this Agreement (from now on referred to as the "Term").

2.02 **Assignment of School Resource Officer.** The City, or its designee, shall assign two law enforcement officers to serve as an SRO at the Academy at the following school locations: Cornerstone Charter Academy K-8 and Cornerstone Charter Academy High School, located at 906 Waltham Avenue, Belle Isle, FL 32809. The Chief of Police shall be considered a designee of the City for all purposes described herein. If the Academy has concerns with an SRO's work performance, it may request a meeting with the Chief of Police to resolve the concerns within five business days. If unresolved, the Academy may request a replacement officer. In cases of misconduct, improper or unlawful behavior, or neglect of duties, the Chief of Police will assign a new SRO. The City may change SRO assignments at its discretion during the Term of this Agreement. The City has sole discretion to hire, discharge, and discipline SROs. Unless precluded by law enforcement requirements or emergency circumstances, the City will ensure that SROs are on duty during regular school hours and attend required training programs. If any assigned SROs are absent, the City will ensure that two officers are always cover the school to maintain safety and security.

2.03 **Employment of School Resource Officer.** The law enforcement officers assigned as an SRO under this Agreement shall be an employee of the City and shall be subject to the administration, supervision, and control of the City. The City shall always be responsible for all aspects of the employment, control, and direction of the SROs. Nothing herein is intended to create an employment or agency relationship between the Academy and any law enforcement officers assigned by the City to participate in the SRO Program. All compensation, salaries, wages, benefits, and other emoluments of employment payable to the SRO shall be the City's sole responsibility. The Academy will compensate the SROs for working after school or off-duty events at the current rate established by the City. The Parties agree that the City, or its designee, and the Academy, or its designee, will jointly participate in an annual pre-planning meeting before the commencement of the academic year to address operational needs, issues, and concerns.

2.04 **Qualifications of the SRO.** All SROs shall meet or exceed the following qualifications:

- A. Minimum of two years of experience as a State of Florida certified law enforcement officer.
- B. SROs will receive formal training (to include SRO Basic Certification Training) within 12 months of being assigned to the SRO program.
- C. These requirements may be modified by mutual agreement between the City and Academy.

2.05 **Applicable Policies and Standards.** The City shall ensure that the exercise of law enforcement powers by the SROs shall comply with the authority granted by applicable law. The law enforcement officers assigned to the SRO Program shall perform their duties as an SRO by the Florida Association of School Resource Officer Training Standards and with applicable Florida law.

2.06 **Duties of School Resource Officer.** The SRO shall not function as a school disciplinarian or security officer, shall not intervene in the everyday disciplinary actions of the Academy which do not involve criminal acts, and shall not be used as a witness to any disciplinary procedures or actions at the Academy, excepting however, that SRO may be involved in disciplinary procedures or actions arising from those matters and incidents within the scope of SRO's duties. The SRO shall always act within

the scope of authority granted to the SRO by applicable law. The SRO work year will follow the schedule established by the Academy for its teachers and its academic calendar (approximately ten months). In the event the SRO is absent from work, the SRO shall notify their supervisor in the Police Department and shall also notify the Academy. The SRO shall perform duties including, without limitation, the following:

- a) the performance of law enforcement functions within the school setting;
- b) to serve as a liaison between the Academy (including Administration, Staff, parents, and students) and the City;
- c) to be visible on the Academy's campus, serve as a role model and mentor for students, participate in campus activities, student organizations, and athletic events when possible;
- d) to routinely monitor the Academy's campus and facilities to ensure a safe environment;
- e) to report and investigate crimes originating on the Academy's campus. When indicated, the SRO will investigate criminal incidents involving Academy (including Administration, Staff, parents, and students) which occurred off-campus and in the SROs jurisdiction;
- f) identifying and preventing juvenile delinquency (including substance abuse) through counseling and referral services. The SRO shall be a resource for staff, parents, and students dealing with individual problems or questions. The SRO shall be familiar with community resources and agencies, including but not limited to mental health, counseling, drug treatment, crisis management, etc., and shall make referrals as necessary;
- g) the enhancement of student knowledge of the law enforcement function and the fundamental concept and structure of law;
- h) the development of positive student concepts of the law enforcement community and promotion of positive interaction and enhanced relations between students and law enforcement officers;
- i) the provision of assistance and support for crime victims (including victims of abuse) identified within the school setting;
- j) the presentation of various topics, including, but not limited to, educational programs concerning crime prevention and the rights, obligations, and responsibilities of students as citizens to students, teacher conferences, parent groups, and other groups, as requested. The SRO will formulate educational crime prevention programs to reduce opportunities for crime against persons or property in the Academy. The SRO will seek permission, guidance, and advice from the Academy before enacting any new programs within the Academy.
- k) to perform traffic control duties before and after school;
- l) to share appropriate information with Academy administrators which presents a danger to the Academy (school, students, and staff). The SRO shall review the Academy Emergency Plan annually, provide feedback to Academy administrators regarding any potential deficiencies or improvements, and advise Academy on Police Department emergency planning. SRO and Academy administrators will collaborate to develop plans and strategies to prevent and minimize potential dangers; and
- m) SRO shall notify Academy administrators and attempt to notify a parent before interviewing a student regarding a criminal investigation or allegation.

2.07 **Student Instruction.** The City shall always maintain control over the content of any educational programs and instructional materials provided at the Academy by the SRO through the SRO Program. The SRO will provide instructional activities to the students at the Academy in areas of instruction within the SRO's experience, education, and training. The SRO will formulate educational crime prevention programs to reduce the opportunity for crimes against persons and property in the school. The SRO will seek permission, guidance, and advice before enacting any new programs within the school.

2.08 **Academy Contact Person(s).** The Principal at the Academy shall be the on-site contact person

for the SRO assigned to the Academy. In addition, this Section confirms that the City has designated the Chief of Police to serve as the City's contact person for the SRO Program.

2.09 **Payment for SRO Program Services.** The Academy agrees to compensate the City for services rendered by two SROs as outlined in Exhibit A. The annual payment will be invoiced in two equal installments in December and May. The City shall invoice the two (2) equal installments in December and May for **SRO** services rendered under this Agreement. Upon certification by the Academy's Principal that the services rendered were satisfactory, payment for SRO services shall be made by the Academy within 30 days of receipt of the invoice for such services.

CCA Summer School SRO Services. The City agrees to provide one School Resource Officer (SRO) during summer school as part of this contract.

2.10 **Indemnification.** Each party agrees to be fully responsible for its acts or omissions and its agents, contractors, servants, employees, licensees, or invitees, and any acts of negligence, or its agents' acts of negligence when acting within the scope of their employment, and agrees to be liable for any damages resulting from said negligence. Each Party shall indemnify and save the other Party harmless from and against and shall reimburse the indemnified Party for all liabilities, obligations, damages, fines, penalties, claims, demands, costs, charges, judgments, and expenses, whether founded in tort, contract, or otherwise, including attorney's fees and costs for any act or neglect of the indemnifying Party in connection with the respective Party's obligation under this Agreement. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a waiver by the City or Academy of its immunities provided by law, including those outlined in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

ARTICLE 3 - GENERAL CONDITIONS

3.01 **No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity.** Nothing in this Agreement is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity by the City or Academy.

3.02 **No Third-Party Beneficiaries.** The parties expressly acknowledge that they do not intend to create or confer any rights or obligations in or upon any third party, person or entity under this Agreement. Neither party intends to benefit a third party directly or substantially by this Agreement. The parties agree that there are no third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement and that no third party shall be entitled to assert a claim against any of the parties based upon this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by an agency or political subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising from this or any contract.

3.03 **Non-Discrimination.** The parties shall not discriminate against any employee or participant in performing the duties, responsibilities, and obligations under this Agreement because of race, age, religion, color, gender, national origin, marital status, disability, or sexual orientation.

3.04 **Termination.** This Agreement may be canceled with or without cause by either party during the Term hereof upon 30 days' written notice to the other party of its desire to terminate this Agreement. In accordance with paragraph 2.09, payment shall be prorated and made in full, up to and including the day of termination.

3.05 **Records.** The Academy acknowledges that the public shall have access, at all reasonable times, to certain documents and information about City contracts, under the provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. Academy agrees to maintain public records in Academy's possession or control in connection with Academy's performance under this Agreement and to provide the public with access to public records by the record maintenance, production, and cost requirements outlined in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise required by law. Academy shall ensure that public records exempt or confidential from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law.

Unless otherwise provided by law, any reports, surveys, and other data and documents provided or created in connection with this Agreement shall remain City's property. In the event of termination of this Agreement by either party, any reports, photographs, surveys, and other data and documents and public records prepared by, or in the possession or control of, Academy, whether finished or unfinished, shall become the property of City and shall be delivered by Academy to the City Manager, at no cost to the City, within seven (7) days of termination of this Agreement. All such records stored electronically by the Academy shall be delivered to the City in a format compatible with the City's information technology systems. Upon termination of this Agreement, Academy shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure. Any compensation due to the Academy shall be withheld until all documents are received as provided herein. The Academy's failure or refusal to comply with the provisions of this section shall result in the immediate termination of this Agreement by the City.

3.06 **Entire Agreement.** This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements, and understandings applicable to the matters contained herein, and the parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements, or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement that are not contained in this document. Accordingly, the parties agree that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written.

3.07 **Preparation of Agreement.** The parties acknowledge that they have sought and obtained whatever competent advice and counsel was necessary to form a complete understanding of all rights and obligations herein and that the preparation of this Agreement has been their joint effort. The language contained herein expresses their mutual intent, and the resulting document shall not, solely as a matter of judicial construction, be construed more severely against one of the parties than the other.

3.08 **Waiver.** The parties agree that each requirement, duty, and obligation set forth herein is substantial and essential to the formation of this Agreement and, therefore, is a material term of this Agreement. Any party's failure to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such provision or a modification of this Agreement. A waiver of any breach of a provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach and shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of this Agreement.

3.09 **Compliance With Laws.** and local laws, codes, rules, and obligations under this Agreement. Each party shall comply with all applicable federal and state regulations in performing its duties, responsibilities, and

3.10 **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed by and governed by the laws of the State of Florida, and venue and jurisdiction shall lie in the courts of Orange County, Florida.

3.11 **Binding Effect.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns.

3.12 **Assignment.** Neither this Agreement nor any interest herein may be assigned, transferred, or encumbered by any party without the prior written consent of the other party. There shall be no partial assignments of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the partial assignment of any right to receive payments from the Academy.

3.13 **Force Majeure.** Neither party shall be obligated to perform any duty, requirement, or obligation under this Agreement if such performance is prevented by a hurricane, earthquake, explosion, war, sabotage, accident, flood, acts of God, strikes, or other, labor disputes, riot or civil commotions, or because of any other matter or condition beyond the control of either party and which cannot be overcome by reasonable diligence and without unusual expense ("Force Majeure"). In no event shall a lack of funds on the part of either party be deemed Force Majeure.

3.14 **Place of Performance.** All obligations of the City under this Agreement's terms are reasonably susceptible to being performed in Orange County, Florida, and shall be payable and performable in Orange County, Florida.

3.15 **Severability.** In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable, or void in any respect, the invalidity, illegality, unenforceability or unlawful or void nature of that provision shall not affect any other provision. This Agreement shall be considered if such invalid, illegal, unlawful, unenforceable, or void provision has never been included.

Subject: Approval of Flock Safety Integrated Public Safety Camera Expansion Program

Background:

The City currently operates seventeen (17) Flock license plate reader cameras and has successfully utilized the Flock platform for investigative and crime prevention purposes.

The Belle Isle Police Department currently uses Flock Safety technology in its public safety, crime prevention, and investigative operations. The Department has worked with Flock Safety to develop a proposed expansion of the City's existing camera network by deploying thirteen (13) Condor Pan-Tilt-Zoom (PTZ) cameras strategically located throughout the City.

The proposed deployment consists of twelve (12) solar-powered PTZ cameras and one (1) AC-powered PTZ camera. These cameras will provide live and recorded video coverage of public spaces, parks, boat ramps, major intersections, commercial corridors, and other strategic locations throughout Belle Isle.

Unlike traditional stand-alone camera systems, the proposed cameras operate within the same FlockOS platform currently utilized by the Department. This integration allows officers, supervisors, and investigators to access license plate reader data, live camera feeds, recorded video, alerts, and investigative tools through a single cloud-based interface.

The proposed system will enhance officer safety, improve situational awareness during critical incidents, increase investigative capabilities, and further the City's long-term goal of building a scalable real-time crime and intelligence network.

This proposal allows the City to evaluate the system's effectiveness while minimizing financial risk and maintaining flexibility in final camera placement.

This expansion represents another step toward developing a scalable, real-time crime and intelligence network for the City of Belle Isle, without the significant personnel costs of increasing staffing levels.

Negotiated Benefits:

During discussions with Flock Safety, staff secured several significant concessions and benefits for the City, including:

- Waiver of all installation and implementation fees.
- Discounted pricing resulting in approximately \$32,750 in savings over standard pricing.
- Designation of Belle Isle as a demonstration and reference agency for other municipalities evaluating similar technology.
- A 90-day "Project Prove It" pilot period that allows the City to terminate the agreement without penalty if the technology does not meet expectations.
- Flexibility to evaluate camera locations during the first 90 days and remove or relocate cameras that do not provide operational value.

The pilot period significantly reduces risk to the City and allows staff to validate camera placement based upon actual field performance.

Sole Source Procurement:

Staff has obtained a Sole Source Certification from Flock Safety, which documents that the proposed technology platform, software, hardware, cloud infrastructure, analytics capabilities, and integrated public safety network are proprietary products available exclusively through Flock Safety.

The sole source documentation further establishes that Flock Safety is the only provider offering this specific combination of integrated live video, license plate reader technology, vehicle fingerprint analytics, cloud-based evidence management, CJIS-compliant data storage, and nationwide law enforcement camera-sharing network capabilities.

Because the proposed system is proprietary and integrates directly with the City's existing Flock Safety infrastructure, staff recommends using the City's sole-source procurement provisions.

Staff Recommendation and Council Discussion Points:

Staff believes the proposed deployment represents a cost-effective opportunity to significantly enhance public safety capabilities throughout the City.

The proposed camera locations focus on key parks, boat ramps, commercial corridors, major intersections, and strategic ingress/egress points. The integration of these cameras into the existing Flock platform will provide officers with immediate access to live video and intelligence information during both emergency and investigative situations.

The negotiated price concessions, waived installation fees, sole-source compatibility with the City's existing system, and the 90-day risk-free evaluation period make this proposal a favorable investment in public safety technology.

Approval of all thirteen (13) cameras provides the City with the greatest operational benefit while preserving flexibility to remove or relocate cameras during the evaluation period should staff determine adjustments are necessary.

Staff believes this proposal represents a prudent investment in technology that will enhance public safety while maximizing existing personnel resources.

For these reasons, the staff recommends approval.

Discussion Points:

The proposed camera system provides several operational advantages to the City and Police Department, including:

- Live and recorded video monitoring from Department computers and authorized mobile devices.
- Remote pan-tilt-zoom capabilities allow officers to assess incidents before arrival.
- Integration with the City's existing Flock Safety platform and License Plate Reader network.
- Access to the nationwide Flock network and participating agency camera systems.
- Cloud-based storage and management with no additional City server or IT infrastructure requirements.
- Enhanced officer safety through real-time situational awareness.
- Improved investigative capabilities and case clearance rates.
- Increased coverage of parks, public spaces, boat ramps, and key transportation corridors.

The proposed cameras will be integrated into the same system currently used by Belle Isle officers and investigators, allowing personnel to quickly access both vehicle intelligence and live video from a single platform rather than multiple software systems.

Suggested Motion:

"I move to approve the Flock Safety Agreement for thirteen (13) Condor PTZ cameras at an annual cost of \$52,000, approve the sole source procurement as presented, and authorize the City Manager to execute all necessary agreements."

Alternatives:

Alternative 1: Approve as presented.

Alternative 2: Approve a reduced number of cameras and direct staff to revise the deployment plan.

Alternative 3: Deny the request.

Subject: Recommendation for Award – RFP 2026-04 Information Technology Services

Background:

The City has completed receipt of seven (7) submittals in response to the Request for Proposals (RFP 2026-04) for Technology Services. The current contract with EOLA Tech has expired; however, services have continued to maintain operational continuity. Initiating and completing the RFP process is considered best practice to ensure transparency, competitiveness, and confirmation that the City is receiving both quality services and fair market pricing. All seven submittals demonstrated generally strong qualifications. However, the evaluation process also highlighted key differences in experience and in law enforcement-related technology requirements.

A critical component of the RFP is compliance with CJIS (Criminal Justice Information Services) requirements. CJIS compliance and experience working with law enforcement agencies are essential to the City’s operational needs. During the evaluation process, it was noted that EOLA Tech has developed a strong working relationship with Orange County and the City over the duration of the existing contract, including familiarity with operational workflows and CJIS-related requirements. However, several submittals did not demonstrate substantial experience with law enforcement agencies, CJIS compliance, or comparable public safety technology environments.

During the procurement process, a pre-proposal meeting was held and attended by multiple vendors, providing an opportunity to clarify the City’s needs, including CJIS expectations, public safety integration, and operational requirements. Following review of all submissions, staff have completed an initial evaluation based on qualifications, experience, technical capability, and alignment with City needs.

Recommendation

After careful review, staff recommends that EOLA Tech remain the primary provider of services, given its demonstrated performance, institutional knowledge, CJIS familiarity, and continuity of operations. Staff will continue to monitor market competitiveness and future procurement opportunities. It was acknowledged that there were initial challenges during the early stages of the previous contract with EOLA Tech. However, with updated contract language from the City Attorney and strengthened oversight and accountability measures implemented by staff, service delivery has improved and will continue to improve moving forward.

The City is also currently in the process of issuing a separate RFP for streaming services and updating equipment used for City Council meeting broadcasts. Staff intends to ensure that EOLA Tech is included in this process to leverage their existing knowledge and experience while also ensuring the City receives the best possible product, pricing, and technological solution.

Staff recommends continuing services with EOLA Tech while proceeding with the separate streaming services RFP and ongoing vendor performance oversight.

The RFP Submittals are attached for review. Staff requests that the City Council approve one of the top-ranked firms and move forward with the agreement. The three firms are listed in order of % total:

- 1. EOLA Technology
- 2. Scarlett Group
- 3. Iventure Solutions

Suggested Motion: I move to award RFP 2026-04 to _____ and authorize City Manager and City Attorney to negotiate and prepare a three-year agreement with two possible one-year renewals for services.

Alternatives: I move to reject the proposal RFP 2026-04 and direct staff to re-advertise and repost the solicitation in an effort to obtain additional competitive proposals.

From there, the engagement shifts toward standardization, hardening, reporting cadence, and delivery of a practical roadmap for Belle Isle's next 12 to 36 months.

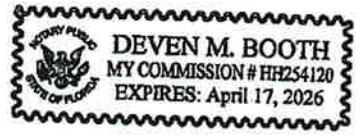
