The Belle Isle City Council met in a Regular Session on February 18, 2020, at 6:30 p.m. at the City Hall Chambers located at 1600 Nela Avenue, Belle Isle, FL 32809.

Present was: Mayor Nicholas Fouraker Commissioner Ed Gold Commissioner Anthony Carugno Commissioner Karl Shuck Commissioner Harv Readey Commissioner Jim Partin Commissioner Sue Nielsen Absent was: Commissioner Mike Sims

Also present were Attorney Langley, City Manager Francis, Chief Houston, and City Clerk Yolanda Quiceno.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Fouraker called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Comm Partin led the invocation and pledge to the flag.

Mayor Fouraker reported that a long time resident has been hospitalized and suffering from a grave condition. He gave a few words and prayer on behalf of the City.

Mayor Fouraker opened the meeting with a presentation of the Citizen of Year Proclamation presented to Holly Bobrowski for her outstanding community service and volunteerism in the City of Belle Isle.

Mayor Fouraker called for a motion to excuse Commissioner Sims absence for tonight's meeting.

Comm Readey motioned to excuse Comm Sims for tonight's meeting Comm Partin seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

APPEAL OF NOTICE OF PUBLIC NUISANCE – 2820 Nela Avenue

City Manager Francis provided copies of the expired permit and pictures. He said the City issued a Notice of Violation to the homeowner for a boathouse that has an expired permit to rebuild the collapsed structure. The City staff made several attempts to contact the homeowner with no success and issued the violation in accordance with the Municipal Code Section 10-31(b). Under this section, she is allowed the opportunity to appeal to the Council. City Manager Francis clarified that the violation does not have to do with the dock itself, but the boathouse, which should come down or bring to conformance of the Code.

Ms. Rosselot said she has been trying to confirm with City staff what types of plans she is required to submit and provided pictures of the boat dock and house for the record. She said the response she received was nebulous and discouraged her from moving forward. The applicant is willing to work with the City and obtain new plans to be in conformance with the Code and obtain a permit to start the renovation. Ms. Rosselot provided current pictures of her boat dock and said she believes her boat dock is usable and safer than when this process started. The boat dock currently does not cause any obstruction and has not produced the surrounding property values to decrease in value. She would like to be able to replace the walls of the boathouse to enclose the structure.

To facilitate the process, Mayor Fouraker submitted a public request and asked the City Clerk to provide the applicant the last three contractors who pulled boat dock permits in the City. He stated that the information is not an endorsement but will be for informational purposes only.

Comm Readey spoke of his experience with correcting this type of repair and the concerns why the City does not allow encle boathouses. He asked Ms. Rosselot why does she want an enclosed boat house when it is not permitted by Code. Ms. Rosselot said it is because that was what was there before, and she enjoyed the screen in room to relax by the water.

Comm Partin asked if the Council would like to go with the staff recommendation to deny the appeal or provide the applicant additional time. City Manager Francis said at this time she is appealing a code violation, and the structure has to come down. The applicant has an expired permit, and the boat dock has not been inspected by an Engineer to confirm the stability.

Council discussed allowing the applicant time to hire an Engineer to establish the stability of the structure. The staff has completed their due diligence, and a decision has to be made to move forward with the violation or allow additional time to correct the problem. Ms. Rosselot asked that the time to obtain an approved permit be included in the extra time allotted.

Attorney Langley said the applicant is contesting the designation of the current structure as a public nuisance based on the Code which was the authority why the City Manager has ordered the removal of the non-permitted structure. Based on the discussion, Council consensus is to,

- 1. Uphold the City Manager decision and declare the uncompleted boat dock a public nuisance; or
- 2. Remove the boathouse structure within 30-days; or
- 3. Within a shorter period of time allow the applicant to apply and obtain a building permit with a supporting engineers inspection report, at the owners expense, stating what part of the structure can be salvaged and converted to meet today's building and land development code regulations; and, timely complete the permit within a defined period of time.
- 4. If the issue is not remedied within the allotted time by the applicant, the City staff can proceed with the remedy to remove the structure and bring it into compliance.

Attorney Langley stated that Universal Engineering is the City's consultant and request that the applicant finds an alternative inspection company to review the structure and provide a report to the City for compliance standards. Ms. Rosselot said she understands.

After discussion, Comm Partin motioned the following,

- 1. the City Council deny the appeal of the applicant Angela Rosselot; and
- 2. Accept the City Managers recommendation for corrective action as set forth in the packet to be achieved within 30-days; and
- 3. With one additional corrective measure, within 30 days from today, the property owner apply for and obtain a building permit with submittal of an Engineer's report, at her expense, that will provide completion of the structure upon the boat dock in conformance with today's building and land development code attempting to salvage what she can from the current structure; and
- 4. Upon obtaining the permit, the construction be completed in no more than 90-days from the time of the building permit being used;
- 5. Failing wither one of the corrective measures the City Manager is permitted to continue forth with the remedies specified in the Code to correct the action and to charge the property owner with the cost of the said remedy and Council is finding the structure a public nuisance.

Comm Gold seconded the motion which passed 5:1 with Comm Shuck, nay.

CONSENT ITEMS

Mayor Fouraker called for a motion to approve Consent items,

 Comm Partin motioned to approve consent items as presented.
 Comm Carugno seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 6:0.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Mayor Fouraker opened for citizen comments.

- Don Anacker residing at 5224 Chiswick Circle shared his concerns with the removal of existing pavers on driveways, aprons, and sidewalks. He spoke in favor of keeping his pavers and for a code change
- Ken Dukes residing at 5212 Chiswich Circle spoke in favor of allowing pavers on driveways, aprons, and sidewalks. They provided pictures for the record showing the positive differences between pavers and concrete. Mr. Dukes provided pictures of different types of sidewalk/paver designs for the file.
- Steve Brennon residing at 5230 Chiswick Circle shared his concerns with the removal of his existing pavers because he was provided a permit by the City. He spoke in favor of allowing pavers on driveways, aprons, and sidewalks and grandfather-in of those existing homes.

There being no further comment, he closed citizen comments.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The proposed date for a follow-up workshop for CCA meeting

City Manager Francis said on February 4^{th,} the Council held a workshop on the refinancing of the CCA Debt Refinancing bond issue. At that meeting, Council shared some concerns and asked for a follow-up workshop to discuss each topic and provide further direction. Also, Mr. Francis said he has not received the list of items for discussion from every Commissioner and asked that it be forwarded before the scheduled meeting date.

Comm Nielsen motioned to schedule February 26th at 6L:30 pm to discuss further the issues involved in the CCA Bond Refinancing.

Comm Readey seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 6:0.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>ORD 20-01 - FIRST READING AND CONSIDERATION</u>: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE BELLE ISLE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, CHAPTER 48, ARTICLE III, SECTION 48-63 – TREE PROTECTION; PROVIDING CLARIFICATION OF TREE PRESERVATION PROCESSES, PROVIDING FOR AN APPEAL PROCESS AND PROCEDURES; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Comm Readey motioned to read Ordinance 20-01 for the second time and adopt Ordinance 20-01 at the March 4, 2020, City Council meeting.

Comm Gold seconded the motion for discussion, which passed unanimously 6:0.

Discussion regarding the use of pavers in sidewalks

City Manager Francis said, according to Section 5-36 of the Municipal Code, it reads, "All subdivisions shall have four-foot concrete sidewalks on both sides of all streets except streets projected to carry more than an ADT equal to 3,500 vehicles per day (vpd) which shall have five-foot concrete sidewalks. All sidewalks shall be located within the street right-of-way. Sidewalks shall be a minimum of four inches in thickness, except at driveways where the required thickness is six inches. Sidewalks shall be designed to include handicapped ramps at all intersections. On a case-by-case basis, upon approval from the city engineer and city manager or the city manager's designee, a developer may make a voluntary contribution to a sidewalk fund to pay for the construction of sidewalks instead of the actual construction of sidewalks. The amount of the contribution shall be on a per-foot basis, as may be approved from time to time by the city engineer and the city manager or the city manager's designee."

He said he could not speak to what happened before he became City Manager; however, for the record, City Manager Francis said a representative at Windsor Place HOA told to him that when a paver permit is submitted the resident is told that they cannot pave over the sidewalk by the HOA. At some point, the HOA must have been given the right information if not everyone would have a paved driveway.

He has received applications and requests from residents asking for pavers on their sidewalk and was not allowed to proceed. There are approximately 15 properties that have this condition. Based on other complaints, the City sent letters requesting that the pavers be removed and concrete installed according to the Code. There are two cases approved that allowed pavers across the sidewalks, which were an error on the part of the City and the zoning officer at that time. Mr. Francis said there are no other materials allowed for sidewalks in the Code. If the Council wants to allow for and material other than concrete, then an Ordinance should be passed to allow other material and grandfather-in the existing paved sidewalks. The City Manager asked that if the Council approves the grandfather-in of those permits that it is agreed with the condition that they will sign an agreement to be responsible for the replacement of the pavers if they have to be removed for whatever reason. Council consensus was to

- allow the existing pavers;
- ask for a signed agreement for owner replacement of pavers;
- allow for other materials for driveways other than concrete.

Mayor Fouraker asked if a mistake is made by staff in approving a permit, does the Code prevail even if an error was made. Attorney Langley said it is based on the totality of the circumstances; there is no one size fits all. If a permit is issued by mistake or the outcome of some mitigation, the arguments may go to the type of errors, statements, and appearance of the authority of staff, or the property owner was aware that it was not consistent with the Code. A property owner may argue estoppels principle. However, there are cases in point that speak to mistakes made during the permitting process, and the City can say that the applicant may not rely on a permit that was issued in violation of the Code. With that being said, whenever a sidewalk is in the right-of-way, the City has the right to remove/replace/alter the area of the right-of-way or sidewalk easement with concrete and improves its property whether or not a resident has a permit.

Mayor Fouraker asked if the City would be harmed in any way and if there can be a liability created if there is no delineation where a sidewalk begins and ends. Attorney Langley said the City has a right-of-way, apron, and a sidewalk. If the City wants to allow pavers, he agrees with the City Manager and the City can enter into an agreement with the property owner stating that they must safely maintain the pavers and flush with the pavement but that they also consent that the public may traverse on parts of their property because they did not define the boundaries of the right-of-way or sidewalk path and release the City from any argument on private property rights.

The Council shared their consensus and agreed with the City Manager with the use of a User Agreement. Comm Carugno further shared his concern with the liability to the City by allowing homeowners to pave over the City sidewalk, causing a safety issue. The City Attorney said typically, if a sidewalk or right-of-way, whether it is paved or concrete, the City has an obligation to maintain. If the City is aware of a safety issue, then the City could have liability. The City may have sovereign immunity if they were not aware, and an agreement is signed by the resident. The City will then have a claim for indemnification to the homeowner on failure to meet their obligation. The Use Agreement is not complete protection for the City, but it does mitigate the liability because the homeowner is accepting all responsibility. The Council discussed HOA involvement and how it applies to a City Ordinance. If the HOA is a gated community with private sidewalks, then the HOA governance does control in that circumstance.

Mayor Fouraker asked if the City can have a consistent sidewalk surface ordinance across the City. Mr. Francis said it is difficult to answer because it all depends on how well the pavers/sidewalks are maintained.

After discussion, Council consensus was to have the staff develop a plan to include,

- update the Ordinance with the newly discussed requirements and allow pavers;
- ask for a signed agreement that indemnifies the City from any responsibility and tied to the Deed;
- allow for other material for driveways other than concrete;
- grandfather paved driveways/sidewalks for the existing 15 homeowners;
- require a delineation of the sidewalk and the property owners driveway

Comm Partin moved to direct the City Manager to develop a paver program and include

- grandfather paved driveways/sidewalks for the existing 15 homeowners;
- ask for a signed agreement that indemnifies the City from any responsibility and tied to the Deed;

Comm Gold seconded the motion which passed unanimously 5:1 with Comm Shuck, nay.

Comm Gold moved to re-appoint Holly Bobrowksi, Richard Weinsier, and Chris Stalder to 3-year terms on the Tree Board.

Comm Nielsen seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 6:0.

Chief Houston reported on the following,

Special Events Committee Report

- Holly Bobrowski gave a brief overview of the 2019 Holiday Budget. She reported that the total cost for the Holiday events was under budget with a savings of \$4,500.
- Ms. Bobrowski announced preparations for the Easter Egg Hunt on April 11th and Spring Fling/Arbor Day event on April 25th at the Wallace field.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Fouraker reported on the following,

- Mayor Fouraker thanked the City Manager for some endeavors that go above and beyond his scope of duties such as St Johns Water Management district lobbying for Gene Polk Park Grants, Matchett, and Storm Water improvements.
- Mayor Fouraker presented Holly Bobrowski with a Proclamation for the Citizen of the Month.
- Mayor Fouraker announced the Pioneers Day event. He is not able to attend the event on Saturday and confirmed that Comm Nielsen has volunteered to present to Proclamation.

Comm Partin

- Comm Partin said he has seen a sign of the Lancaster House stating "Save the House" and would like to add on the next agenda for discussion. He clarified that the City had given the Historical Society a year to prepare.
- He has received calls from the upcoming Debate. He said that the Debate has been scheduled to be at the Woman's Club and awaiting confirmation from both candidates
- Orange County District 3 Debate planned for Feb 19th at 6 pm at 1650 Sand Lake Road Suite 390, Orlando, Fl.

Comm Nielsen

- Comm Nielsen spoke on a few resident concerns on traveling Hoffner Avenue. The residents asked if the PD can create a plan/idea to have the travelers on Hoffner flash twice or some other approach to promote safety.
- She spoke on oversized trucks on Nela and asked if the City can place truck sign limits before they get to the Nela Bridge. Comm Readey agreed.
- She would like to address, at a future meeting, changing the word "Beach" or "Park" on some of the open areas and enforcing non-alcoholic beverages in City parks.

Comm Shuck

• Comm Shuck spoke on safety concerns for bike riders around the City- He encourages all citizens to drive especially careful.

Comm Carugno

- Comm Carugno asked if the City can monitor the pedestrian walks around the City because the vehicles are not stopping. Chief Houston said the crosswalks have been observed by the PD, specifically the one on Hoffner, and have reported that there so few pedestrians. Chief Houston said, understands the concern, and has asked the officers to be aware of the area.
- Comm Carugno reported on the ANAC meeting and strongly advised residents to call the hotline if they have a complaint on the airport noise.

Re:	Lancaster House

At the January 21 Council meeting, the City Council wanted some clarification on a statement that I made regarding the historic significance of the Lancaster House staying on the current site at 5903 Randolph (the intersection of Randolph and Waltham). Last year, I reported to the Council that the Lancaster House would lose its historic significance if it was moved from the current location. This was based on a statement by a State Historic Preservation Architect and PCHS that this was the original location of the house and therefore it was considered a homestead. Based on this assumption, the City Council passed a motion allowing the house to remain at its current location. As it turns out, based on additional research, this may not be the case.

To verify that my information was correct, I again contacted the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) to ask them about this issue. I spoke to Andrew Waber, Historic Preservationist in the Survey and Registration Division. His email on the process is attached, as well as an information packet on the Historic Places Program Description. Mr. Waber pointed out that a building can still be listed on the National Registry depending on other criteria that SHPO uses to evaluate an application. There is no application currently at the SHPO office for the Lancaster House.

Under Criteria Considerations (page 5), structures that have been moved from their original locations shall not be considered eligible for the National Register. However, such properties will qualify if they are integral parts of districts that do meet the criteria or if they fall within the certain categories. One of those categories is "a building or structure removed from its original location but which is significant primarily for architectural value, or which is the surviving structure most importantly associated with a historic person or event."

According to Mr. Waber, other variables will be considered, such as distance to be moved, character of the place it is moving. I asked Mr. Waber if it is moved within the Pine Castle Urban Preservation District, would it be considered eligible. I explained that the Pine Castle Urban Preservation District is a preservation district that has existing historical and residential communities which form a cohesive whole. He said it's possible, but was clear stating that until an application is submitted to SHPO for evaluation, a decision cannot be made on whether the house should remain or it can be moved.

PCHS came to the City Council a year ago asking that the house be turned over the PCHS so they could save it. The City Council agreed to donate the house to PCHS and gave the PCHS a year to provide the City Council with a plan to move the house. The deadline was March 2020. Since that time, it was discovered that there was a problem with donating the house as it was part of the 2012 Bond issue. The City and CCA had to go through the legal channels of getting this house off the "books" because it was part of the 2012 bond issue. That issue has been cleared up. The house could be now turned over to PCHS.

The initial information from SHPO now seems to be in error regarding whether or not the house could be moved and retain its historic significance. Additionally, PCHS stated that CCA would want to use the house once renovated which is not the case. However, CCA has offered to assist in moving the house.

Therefore the City Council might want to consider having PCHS develop a plan for moving the house. PCHS moved the Crawford House, so they should be able to apply this plan to the Lancaster House as the initial location, route and final destination are all similar to the Crawford House move.

The City should request PCHS to:

- 1. Submit the SHPO application for the Lancaster House by April 30, 2020. They should make note on the application that the house needs to be moved to a new location, but within the Pine Castle Urban Preservation District. As the City is still the owner of the house, the City will have to sign the application.
- Develop a plan for moving the Lancaster House (PCHS could use the plan that was developed for the Crawford House.) The plan will include cost, sources of funds, project leader, and moving date. If the City assisted in the Crawford House move, it should provide those same services for the Lancaster House move.
- 3. Provide a copy of the SHPO application and the moving plan to the City by May 12, 2020.
- 4. Provide a funding plan for the rehabilitation of the Lancaster House by June 1, 2020. The plan will include:
 - a. List of rehabilitation items
 - b. Cost of rehabilitation list
 - c. Sources of funding
 - d. Project Leader
 - e. Contractor
 - f. Expected completion date

5. Stipulate that PCHS cannot transfer, sell, or deed the Lancaster House to any other entity without City Council approval.

Thank you for reaching out to us regarding the National Register process. In order to start the nomination process, we will need for you to first complete a Preliminary Site Information Questionnaire (PSIQ), which you can find at http://dos.myflorida.com/media/30809/psiqrevised2013.pdf. We will need a signature from the official owner of record of the property; current photographs of the exterior and interior of the building; any historical photographs, even recent historical photographs for the sake of comparison (if they can be found); a location map (a simple Google map printout should suffice); and proof of ownership (a simple property appraiser printout should suffice). If the building is owned by a for-profit or non-profit organization, we would also like to have proof that the individual signing on behalf of the organization is authorized to do so. If there is more about this building you would like to tell us than would fit onto this single piece of paper, please do not hesitate to include continuation sheets. Keep in mind, when we evaluate a building for NR eligibility, we are not only assessing significance, but also integrity. So any changes that have taken place to the building over time should be noted.

Once we receive the proposal, it will undergo staff review and we will notify you if the proposal is either preliminarily approved, rejected, or we need more information. If approved, you will be receiving a Florida Nomination Proposal (FNP) packet, and we will assist you further in preparing the proposal for presentation before the state National Register Review Board. If rejected, we will state the reason why. Please let me know if you have any further questions.

Also attached is an information packet on the National Register program.

- 2. by imposing limited protection from activities involving funding, licensing, or assistance by Federal agencies that could result in damage or loss of its historic values, and
- 3. by making the property eligible for Federal financial incentives for historic preservation

Redevelopment of a listed property which involves Federal funding, licensing, or assistance will be subject to review by the State Historic Preservation officer and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation to assure that adequate and appropriate consideration is given to the preservation of the historic qualities for which it was originally listed. This review requirement will also apply to any Federally funded, licensed, or assisted activities undertaken by others that could have an adverse effect on the property.

Federal financial incentives for historic preservation include eligibility for direct matching grants and investment tax credits for the rehabilitation of income producing properties.

The National Register of Historic Places is an official listing of properties throughout the country that reflect the prehistoric occupation and historic development of our nation, states, and local communities. The Register is maintained by the National Park Service under the Secretary of the Interior. It is used primarily as a planning tool in making decisions concerning the development of our communities to ensure, as much as possible, the preservation of buildings, sites, structures, and objects that are significant aspects of our cultural and historic heritage. Sometimes there are misunderstandings as to what listing in the National Register will mean for a property owner. The following is an outline of what it will do and what it will not do.

WILL DO

- The National Register **provides recognition** that the property is deemed by the federal and state governments to be significant in our history at the national, state, and/or local levels. Most properties are significant because of their local significance.
- The National Register **identifies** the properties that local, state, and federal planners should carefully consider when developing projects. Projects involving federal funding, permitting, licensing, or assistance and that may result in damage or loss of the historic values of a property that is listed in the National Register or is eligible for listing are reviewed by the State Historic Preservation Office and the federal Advisory Council on Historic Preservation. A similar review takes place under state law for state or state-assisted undertakings. A typical example of projects that are given such review is road construction or improvement. For more information, call the Compliance Review Section of the Florida Bureau of Historic Preservation at (850) 245-6333.
- Listing may make a property eligible for a **Federal Income Tax Credit**. If a registered property that is income producing undergoes a substantial rehabilitation carried out according to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation, the owner may apply for a 20% income tax credit. The credit amounts to 20% of the cost of the rehabilitation. For more information, contact the Architectural Preservation Services Section of the Florida Bureau of Historic Preservation at (850) 245-6333.

- In 1992, the Florida Legislature passed legislation that allows counties or cities to grant **ad valorem tax relief** for owners of properties that are listed or eligible for listing in the National Register or in a local district. When a property is improved its value is increased and the assessment is raised accordingly. The ad valorem tax legislation provides that the increase in assessed value of the improved property will be exempted for up to 10 years from taxation for those portions of the tax bill affected by local option county or municipal exemption ordinances. This provision is available for both income and non-income producing properties. Contact your local property appraiser to see if this provision is available.
- Listing may make a property exempt from certain Federal Emergency Management Act (FEMA) requirements and eligible for some American Disabilities Act (ADA) and building safety code adjustments. For more information, call the Architectural Preservation Services Section of the Bureau of Historic Preservation at (850) 245-6333.
- Listing or being determined eligible for listing is not required for receiving state preservation grants. The competition for the grants is intense, however, and this official recognition adds weight to the argument that a property is significant and should be awarded a grant. For more information, call the Grants and Education Section of the Bureau of Historic Preservation at (850) 245-6333.

WILL NOT DO

- Listing in the National Register or being determined eligible for listing does not automatically preserve a building, and does not keep a property from being modified or even destroyed.
- Unless an undertaking is state or federally funded, or regulated by local ordinance, private property owners may deal with their property in any way they see fit. Architects in the Bureau of Historic Preservation are available to provide advice concerning the best ways to approach rehabilitation needs while maintaining the historic character of a property. For more information, call the Architectural Preservation Services Section at (850) 245-6333.
- Private owners are not required to open their listed property to the public for visitation.
- The federal and state governments will not attach restrictive covenants to a property or seek to acquire it because of its listing in the National Register.

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF STATE - LAUREL M. LEE - SECRETARY OF STATE

The National Register of Historic Places is an official listing of sites and properties throughout the country that reflect the prehistoric occupation and historical development of our nation, states, and local communities. It is maintained by the Keeper of the National Register, National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior.

The nomination of historic resources in Florida for listing in the National Register is a function of the State Historic Preservation Officer, Florida Division of Historical Resources. Anyone interested in having a particular property listed may submit a nomination proposal to the State Historic Preservation Office. The nomination proposal must meet National Register standards. It is the responsibility of the person submitting the proposal to provide the necessary information and materials. The staff of the Division is available for consultation on preparation of proposals.

Upon receipt of a nomination proposal, the following procedures will be carried out.

- 1. The nomination proposal and all accompanying documentation will be evaluated by the professional staff of the Bureau of Historic Preservation. If possible, a staff member will visit the site as a part of the evaluation process.
- 2. The owner(s) of the property and the chief local elected officials will be notified in writing that the property is being proposed for nomination and given the opportunity to comment on the property.
- 3. The proposal will be submitted for consideration and recommendation by the Florida National Register Review Board which is charged with reviewing all nomination proposals to the National Register of Historic Places from the State of Florida.
- 4. Upon the favorable recommendation of the Review Board, a formal nomination will be prepared for the submission by the State Historic Preservation Officer to the Keeper of the National Register in Washington, D.C. Special procedures also exist for processing proposals when the Board and the State Historic Preservation Officer do not agree on the eligibility of the property for listing.
- 5. The Keeper of the National Register and his staff undertake the final review and make the final decision whether or not to list the property. If the owner of a private property objects to the nomination, the property will not be listed, but the site may be submitted to the Keeper of the National Register for a formal determination of eligibility for listing.

6. The owner is then notified in writing as to the final decision.

The *National Register of Historic Places* is an official listing of sites and properties throughout the United States that reflect the prehistoric occupation and historical development of our nation, states, and local communities. It is maintained by the Keeper of the National Register, National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior.

The following criteria are used by the State Historic Preservation Officer and the Keeper of the National Register in evaluating properties for eligibility for listing in the *National Register*.

Criteria for Evaluation:

1) Districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects may be considered to have significance in American history, architecture, archaeology, engineering, and/or culture if they possess integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association, and:

- a) are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history; and/or
- b) are associated with the lives of persons significant in our past; and/or
- c) embody the distinctive characteristics of type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; and/or
- d) have yielded, or may be likely to yield, information important in prehistory or history.

Criteria Considerations:

- 2) Ordinarily cemeteries, birthplaces, or graves of historical figures; properties owned by religious institutions or used for religious purposes; structures that have been moved from their original locations; reconstructed historic buildings; properties primarily commemorative in nature; and properties that have achieved significance within the past 50 years shall not be considered eligible for the *National Register*. However, such properties will qualify if they are integral parts of districts that do meet the criteria or if they fall within the following categories:
 - a religious property deriving its primary significance from architectural or artistic distinction or historical importance; or
 - b) a building or structure removed from its original location but which is significant primarily for architectural value, or which is the surviving structure most importantly associated with a historic person or event; or
 - c) a birthplace or grave of an historical figure of outstanding importance if there is no appropriate site or building directly associated with his productive life; or
 - d) a cemetery which derives its primary significance from graves of persons of transcendent importance, from age, distinctive design features, or association with historic events; or
 - e) a reconstructed building, when it is accurately executed in a suitable environment and

presented in a dignified manner as part of a restoration master plan, and no other building or structure with the same association has survived; or

- f) a property primarily commemorative in intent, if design, age, tradition, or symbolic value has invested it with its own exceptional significance; or
- g) a property achieving significance within the past 50 years, if it is of exceptional importance.

The City received three bids for the installation and maintenance of automated cameras/monitoring devices and systems. The City is looking at total of 4 systems.

- NovoaGlobal \$3,500/month per system
- Sensys Gatso Group \$3,250/month per system
- Verra Mobility \$3,500/month per system

The City staff reviewed the proposals and they are all good companies. The advantages of NovoaGlobal is that they are headquartered in Orlando and stated in their proposal that they do not have any current litigation pending.





Subject: Use of Pavers for sidewalks

Background: The Belle Isle Municipal Code, Section 50-36 states "All subdivisions shall have four-foot concrete sidewalks on both sides of all streets except streets projected to carry in excess of an ADT equal to 3,500 vehicle per day (vpd) which shall have five-foot concrete sidewalks. All sidewalks shall be located within the street right-of-way. Sidewalks shall be a minimum of four inches in thickness, except at driveways where the required thickness is six inches. Sidewalks shall be designed to include handicapped ramps at all intersections. On a case-by-case basis, upon approval from the city engineer and city manager or the city manager's designee, a developer may make a voluntary contribution to a sidewalk fund to pay for construction of sidewalks in lieu of actual construction of sidewalks. The amount of the contribution shall be on a per foot basis, as may be approved from time to time by the city engineer and the city manager or the city manager's designee." No other materials allowed for sidewalks in the code.

At the February 18th meeting, the City Council heard testimony from several residents about the advantages of pavers and requested the Council review the current code provisions and make exceptions to the code to allow pavers to be used for sidewalks, or driveway extensions across sidewalks. The Council directed staff to work on a change that would allow the use of pavers as an acceptable material for sidewalks.

The staff drafted an ordinance for Council review that:

- a. Sets specifications for concrete sidewalks
- b. Allows the use of pavers on a case-by-case basis
- c. Makes property owners who install pavers responsible for maintenance
- d. Sets specifications for pavers and installation of pavers
- e. Grandfathers existing pavers but when replaced or removed, must comply with these code changes.

Staff Recommendation: Approve the changes to the Land Development Code.

Suggested Motion: I move we approve the staff recommendations and read the proposed ordinance for the first time at the April 21, 2020 Council Meeting.

Alternatives: Do not approve the changes and provide further direction to the staff.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA PROVIDING THAT THE BELLE ISLE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE BE AMENDED BY REVISING **CHAPTER 50, ARTICLE II, SECTION 50-36 RELATING CONCERNING** TO **IMPROVEMENTS** THE SPECIFICATIONS TO BE USED FOR **CONCRETE** SURFACES; AMENDING CHAPTER 50, ARTICLE III **TO CREATE A NEW SECTION 50-77 PROVIDING FOR** THE PRIVATE **INSTALLATION** OF PAVER SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAYS IN RESIDENTIAL CERTAIN **CONDITIONS;** AREAS UNDER **ESTABLISHING CRITERIA FOR CONSTRUCTION AND** MAINTENANCE OF PAVER **SIDEWALKS** AND **PROVIDING FOR DRIVEWAYS**; SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Belle Isle ("City") has authority pursuant to Chapters 163 and 166, Florida Statutes, to make and enforce its land development code and enact land use and planning regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City's Land Development Code, Section 50-36, generally relates to improvements and specifically describes the development standards for driveways and sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, the City's Land Development Code currently does not allow for paver sidewalks or driveways; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the non-allowance of pavers for sidewalks or driveways, City residents have installed pavers within the public rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that paver sidewalks and driveways can be a beneficial aesthetic feature in a neighborhood, may increase property values, and are otherwise desirable by property owners; and

WHEREAS, the property owners are responsible for residential minimum maintenance according to Chapter 10, Article V, of the Belle Isle Municipal Code, which includes maintenance of sidewalks and driveways; and

WHEREAS, the failure to properly construct or maintain paver sidewalks across and/or through driveways within the right-of-way increases liability for which homeowners should be responsible; and

WHEREAS, maintenance obligations and a private right of action is hereby created against property owners who install or previously installed paver driveways, which includes but

is not limited to sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the Land Development Code be amended to expressly allow for paver sidewalks and driveways in the public rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with section 163.3174, Florida Statutes, the City's planning and zoning board functioning as the local planning agency has reviewed and recommended approval of this Ordinance prior to its passage by the City Council.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida that:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> AMENDMENT OF LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE. Chapter 50, Article II, Section 50-36(4) of the City of Belle Isle Land Development Code is hereby amended to reflect the following changes (struckout text indicates deletions; underlined text indicates additions; and non-referenced provisions shall remain unchanged):

Sec. 50-36. Improvements

* * *

(4) Sidewalks and block crosswalks. All subdivisions areas of the City shall have four-foot concrete sidewalks on both sides of all streets except streets projected to carry in excess of an ADT equal to 3,500 vehicle per day (vpd) which shall have five-foot concrete sidewalks. Prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for a structure upon a parcel or lot, a public sidewalk shall be constructed at the expense of the property owner along all street right-of-way frontage of such parcel or lot in a manner required by code. All public sidewalks shall be located constructed within the street public right-of-way or a public sidewalk easement. Concrete sSidewalks shall be a minimum of four inches in thickness, except at driveways where the required thickness is six inches and will be a minimum of 3,500 psi reinforced concrete. Sidewalks shall be designed to include handicapped ramps at all intersections. On a case-by-case basis, upon approval from the city engineer and city manager or the city manager's designee, a developer may make a voluntary contribution to a sidewalk fund to pay for construction of sidewalks in lieu of actual construction of sidewalks. The amount of the contribution shall be on a per foot basis, as may be approved from time to time by the city engineer and the city manager or the city manager's designee. On a lot by lot (or parcel by parcel) basis, the city may approve the use of pavers for sidewalks, driveways, and driveway aprons within the right-of-way or sidewalk easement adjacent to residential parcels or lots pursuant to section 50-77.

<u>SECTION 32.</u> AMENDMENT OF LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE. Chapter 50, Article III of the City of Belle Isle Land Development Code is hereby amended to create a new Section 50-77 as set forth below (struckout text indicates deletions; underlined text indicates

additions; and non-referenced provisions shall remain unchanged):

Section 50-77. Pavers for sidewalks and driveways.

- a) Subject to compliance with the applicable requirements of this section, the city may permit a residential property owner to construct a paver sidewalk, driveway and driveway apron (or either one individually) within the public right-of-way or a public sidewalk easement adjacent to such residential property owner's parcel or lot in conjunction with such property owner's construction of a paver driveway upon the adjacent private property. Any such permit or permission granted by the city (included such granted prior to the adoption of this section) shall be a revocable license and does not create any vested rights, property rights, or privileges. All property owner(s) given permission to install a paver sidewalk, paver driveway and/or paver driveway apron shall assume the risk that the city's permission to construct and maintain the pavers within the public right-of-way or public sidewalk area may be revoked at any time at the city's discretion and that the pavers may be required to be removed. By granting permission to use pavers under this section, the city does not waive or restrict the city's power and authority over the operation, use, regulation and control of the public rights-of-way and public sidewalk easement areas.
- b) A residential property owner that desires to construct or reconstruct a sidewalk, driveway or driveway apron within the public right-of-way or public sidewalk easement area using pavers must, as a precondition of obtaining approval, execute a license and maintenance agreement with the city, in a form and with terms acceptable to the city manager, that provides, at a minimum, for such property owner and its successors and assigns in interest, to maintain and repair (at the property owner(s)' expense) the pavers and to indemnify and hold the city and its officers, employees and agents harmless from matters arising from or concerning the use, installation, maintenance and repair of the pavers, and address other matters set forth in this section. All license and maintenance agreements shall be promptly recorded in the public records of Orange County, Florida, at the property owner(s)' expense, and such shall run with the property owner(s)' land and shall inure to and be binding upon the property owner(s)' heirs, personal representatives, successors, and assigns. Further, such license and maintenance agreement shall give the city lien rights against the property owner(s)' property for the recovery of any monies owed to the city concerning the pavers. In the event the city license is revoked or terminated, then the property owner(s) shall promptly, at the property owners' cost, remove the paver sidewalk and driveway apron improvements and restore such area as directed by the city, which may require the reconstruction of sidewalks and/or a driveway apron with other code compliant materials at the property owner(s)' expense.
- c) Sidewalks made of pavers shall be constructed with pavers that are 2-1/4" thickness x 4" width x 8" length to meet ASTM C 902-11 pedestrian and light traffic paving brick specifications except at driveways where 2-3/4" thickness x 4" width x 8" length to meet ASTM C 1272-11 is required. Pavers are to be set on one inch of compacted sand on top of four-inches of compacted 3/4-inch crushed rock (six-inches of compacted ³/₄inch crushed rock for driveways). Pavers are to be laid with no or minimal joints and

the joints are to be filled with a fine sand-portland cement grout mix. Additionally, sidewalk pavers must differentiate and delineate the property owner(s)' property lines in a manner that allows pedestrians and the city to easily determine the boundaries of

in a manner that allows pedestrians and the city to easily determine the boundaries of the public sidewalk area for ease of pedestrian access, to avoid inadvertent trespass and to identify vehicle blockages of public sidewalks. If pavers are used for driveways, driveway aprons or sidewalks, the first course will be perpendicular to the curb, or edge of pavement to protect the existing pavement.

- d) Paver sidewalks and driveway aprons shall be installed and at all times maintained in compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements, as may be subsequently modified and be designed to include handicapped ramps at all intersections.
- e) The owner(s) of the property served by or upon which a paver driveway (including with or without a paver sidewalk) is or was installed (including those installed prior to the adoption of this section) is/are solely responsible to cause and pay for all inspections, maintenance and repair of the paver driveway and paver sidewalks within the public rightof-way or public sidewalk area adjacent to said property owner(s)' property. The city shall not be liable for the costs of any inspection, maintenance, repair, or replacement of the paver driveway and sidewalk regardless of the reason(s) requiring the maintenance or repair.
- f) A property owner, property owner's agent or occupant shall regularly inspect a sidewalk and driveway apron composed of pavers to ensure its proper maintenance and repair, including in accordance with this section, other applicable code provisions and any applicable license and maintenance agreement or condition of approval. Whenever a sidewalk, driveway or driveway apron composed of pavers is in the public right-of-way or public sidewalk easement is in violation of any city code provision, the property owner or occupant must take prompt corrective action to ensure that the sidewalk and driveway apron complies with the requirements of this section, other applicable code provisions and the terms of any applicable license and maintenance agreement or condition of approval.
- g) In the event any property owner fails to properly maintain and repair the paver materials within the public right-of-way or public sidewalk easement area adjacent to such property owner's property, the city may give fifteen (15) days' written notice of such deficiencies and an opportunity to cure to the property owner(s) at the address on file with the Orange County Property Appraiser. Thereafter, if the property owner(s) fails to cure the deficiencies as determined by the city after notice of same, then the city may perform any corrective action it determines necessary, which may include without limitation, the removal of the pavers and restoration of such areas with code compliant concrete sidewalks and driveway aprons and charge the costs for the same against the property owner(s) and as a recorded lien against the property owner(s)' property. However, in the event of exigent circumstances, the city may proceed to take corrective action as stated above without notice to the property owner(s).
- h) It shall be a violation of this section for any owner, occupant, or agent of any property to allow sidewalks, driveways, or driveway aprons composed of pavers to be in violation of this section.

- i) A permit shall not be issued for the installation of a paver sidewalk, paver driveway or paver driveway apron if the city has not been fully compensated for prior expenses incurred in removing, repairing, or replacing a non-compliant paver sidewalk, paver driveway or paver driveway apron on the subject adjacent property.
- j) Driveway construction that requires removal of a vertical curb (raised curb) shall have pavement saw cut at curbline prior to removing existing curb and replaced with a header curb or valley in accordance with existing type. Driveway construction where Miami type curb (mountable) exists must tie to the back of the curb.
- k) On a case-by-case basis, upon approval from the city engineer and city manager or the city manager's designee, the property owner may request an alternative to subsection (c) above if it can be shown that the alternative requested will provide equal or greater protections or benefits to the city. Further, the city manager or his/her designee shall have the authority to deny permission for the use of pavers within the public rights-of-way or public sidewalk easement area in any circumstance where: (i) the city manager is not satisfied that the proposed pavers and installation, maintenance or repair methods involved will meet the intent of this section or otherwise be safe; or (ii) such may create issues with the city's operation, control, maintenance, regulation of public rights-of-way and sidewalk easements.
- 1) Those property owners who as of the date of the adoption of this section have pavers installed in the place of concrete sidewalks or driveway aprons pursuant to previous permit or permission of the city are not required to comply with subsections (b), (c) and (j) above unless such improvements are removed or reconstructed; however they are not relieved of the other obligations and responsibilities of this section.

* * *

<u>SECTION 4.</u> <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not be construed to render the remaining provisions of this Ordinance invalid or unconstitutional.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>CODIFICATION.</u> It is the intention of the City Council that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Belle Isle Land Development Code and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to section, article, or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida.

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 20-02

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY WITHIN THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY BY THE GOVERNOR; ADOPTING **EMERGENCY** REGULATIONS TO ADDRESS **PREPARATION FOR AND MITIGATION OF COVID-19;** PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, NON-**CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS a respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID-19), was first identified in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China, and has spread outside of China, impacting many countries, including the United States; and

WHEREAS the State of Florida has been working in close collaboration with the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), with the United States Health and Human Services Agency, and with local health departments since December 2019 to monitor and plan for the potential spread of COVID-19 to the United States; and

WHEREAS on January 23, 2020, the CDC activated its Emergency Response System to provide ongoing support for the response to COVID- 19 across the country; and

WHEREAS on March 1, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis of the State of Florida issued Executive Order No. 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS on March 1, 2020, the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis of the State of Florida directed the Director of the Division of Emergency Management to activate the State Emergency Operations Center to Level 2 to provide coordination and response to the COVID-19 emergency; and

WHEREAS on March 9, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis of the State of Florida issued Executive Order No. 20-52 declaring a state of emergency within the State of Florida in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency; and

WHEREAS in accordance with § 252.38, Florida Statutes, Executive Order No. 20-52 authorizes the City to waive the procedures and formalities otherwise required of the City by law pertaining to (1) Performance of public work and taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; (2) Entering into contracts (however,

the City is cautioned against entering into time and materials contracts without ceiling as defined in 2 CFR 200.318(j) or cost plus percentage contracts as defined by 2 CFR 200.323(d)); (3) Incurring obligations; (4) Employment of permanent and temporary workers; (5) Utilization of volunteer workers; (6) Rental of equipment; (7) Acquisition and distribution, with or without compensation, of supplies, materials, and facilities; and (8) Appropriation and expenditure of public funds;

WHEREAS the Florida Department of Public Health has been in regular communication with hospitals, clinics and other health providers and has provided guidance to health facilities and providers regarding COVID-19; and

WHEREAS experts anticipate that while a high percentage of individuals affected by COVID-19 will experience mild flu-like symptoms, some will have more serious symptoms and require hospitalization, particularly individuals who are elderly or already have underlying chronic health conditions; and

WHEREAS it is imperative to prepare for and respond to suspected or confirmed COVID-19 cases in the City of Belle Isle, to implement measures to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, and to prepare to respond to an increasing number of individuals requiring medical care and hospitalization; and

WHEREAS the City must use all available preventative measures to combat the spread of COVID-19, which will require access to services, personnel, equipment, facilities, and other resources, potentially including resources beyond those currently available, to prepare for and respond to any potential cases and the spread of the virus; and

WHEREAS the conditions caused by COVID-19 are likely to require the combined forces of a mutual aid; and

WHEREAS City is granted the authority under § 2(b), Art. VIII of the Florida Constitution, to exercise any power for municipal purposes, except when expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS this Emergency Ordinance is authorized by § 3.13 of the City of Belle Isle's Charter, Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, Section 252.38, Florida Statutes, and other applicable provisions of law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to § 3.13 of the City Charter, this emergency ordinance must be enacted by a 2/3 vote of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City finds that this Ordinance is in the interests of the public health, safety, and welfare.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, pursuant to § 3.13 of the Belle Isle City Charter, §§ 870.043 and 870.047, Florida Statutes, and the Florida Governor's Executive Order No. 20-52, that:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> DECLARATION OF GENERAL STATE OF EMERGENCY. A state of General Emergency is declared to exist by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, effective upon adoption of this Ordinance and until 60 days thereafter as provided under § 3.13 of the City Charter.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> DESIGNATION OF LOCAL AUTHORITY. For the purposes of § 870.042, Florida Statutes, the City hereby designates the City Manager as the Designated City Official authorized to exercise the powers conferred in §§ 870.041-870.047, Florida Statutes. In the case of the unavailability, incapacity, or absence of the City Manager or as may be delegated by the City Manager, the Chief of Police or his/her designee will serve as the designated city official. In the case of the unavailability, incapacity, or absence of both the City Manager and Chief of Police, the Mayor, followed by each successive council member in order of seat numbers 1 through 7 in the event of a prior official's unavailability, incapacity, or absence, will serve as the designated city official. For the purposes of this ordinance, the term "City Manager" refers to the Designated City Official if the City Manager is unavailable, incapacitated, or absent.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. EMERGENCY POWERS & WAIVER. As authorized by the Florida Governor's Executive Order No. 20-52, the City hereby opts to waive all procedures and formalities otherwise required of the City by law, which procedures and formalities pertain to the following:

- a. Performance of public work and taking whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community;
- b. Entering into contracts;
- c. Incurring obligations;
- d. Employment of permanent and temporary workers;
- e. Utilization of volunteer workers;
- f. Rental of equipment;
- g. Acquisition and distribution, with or without compensation, of supplies, materials, and facilities; and
- h. Appropriation and expenditure of public funds.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> AUTHORITY TO MITIGATE SPREAD OF COVID-19. The City Manager or his/her designee is hereby empowered, authorized, and directed to exercise on behalf of the City Council, such emergency powers necessary to carry out the applicable provisions of Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, §§ 870.041 – 870.047, Florida Statutes, and any current or further

Executive Orders of the Office of the Governor pertaining to COVID-19, including, but not limited to, the powers to direct and compel evacuation, sequester, or quarantine of all or part of the population if such action is deemed necessary to reduce the vulnerability of people in communities of the City of Belle Isle to damage, injury, illness, and loss of life or property resulting from the imminent threat, as well as any other powers expressly or implicitly conferred pursuant to Chapters 166 and 252, Florida Statutes, §§ 870.041 - 870.047, Florida Statutes, and any other provision of applicable state or federal law or City ordinance. The City Manager or his/her designee are further provided, to the extent permitted by law or any applicable executive or emergency order, the authority to close public spaces or otherwise cancel, rescind, close, or postpone any special events, assemblies, or gatherings, scheduled or unscheduled, within the City where COVID-19 may be spread or otherwise transmitted to others. The City Manager may further close any public offices, facilities, parks, or buildings of the City or otherwise limit access thereto to further assist in any quarantine or isolation efforts. To assist in maintaining safe and sanitary living and functioning conditions and protect property from immediate threat, the City Manager shall have the power, but not the obligation, to authorize and issue sanitary processes and supplies to reduce or otherwise mitigate potential sources of contagion. The City Manager is further authorized to enter into temporary lease or license agreements for real property which is necessary for creating and operating temporary medical staging areas to process, quarantine, and/or otherwise treat any persons diagnosed with or suspected of being infected by COVID-19.

SECTION 6. MEETING PROCEDURES. During this declared state of emergency and in the interest of minimizing exposure to COVID-19, the City Council, pursuant to the authority provided by Executive Order No. 20-52 and its emergency authority under § 252.38, Florida Statutes, is hereby permitted to meet via videoconferencing or telephonic means, provided that such meetings are noticed, to the extent feasible under the circumstances, pursuant to the appropriate notice requirements, whether such meeting is a regular, special, or emergency meeting. A quorum for any such meetings will be three (3) or more Commission members, whether physically or virtually present. The Commission is authorized to vote at such meetings on any measures the Commission deems necessary for the continued orderly operation and administration of the City and the management and mitigation of conditions arising from the declared emergency. For such meetings, the City will, to the extent possible or otherwise feasible, ensure that Commission members attending the meeting remotely can both hear any Commission or public comment and speak to the Commission and the public. The City must also, to the extent possible or otherwise feasible or advisable (given the nature of the contagion), further provide interactive internet access to the public and make computers or other similar systems available for citizens without internet access at designated places within the City. Upon the conclusion of the state of emergency, any and all Commission actions taken at meetings held via videoconferencing or telephonic means must be reviewed and, subject to the Commission's discretion and receipt of public comment, ratified at a regular meeting of the City Commission noticed and conducted according to the City's ordinary rules and procedures. Notwithstanding the above, in the event the Governor or the Florida Attorney General gives an order or guidance to local governments that allows more flexibility than the foregoing, the City shall have such additional flexibility consistent with such guidance.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> DURATION. The authority granted pursuant to this emergency ordinance extends only for the period established in § 3.13 of the City's Charter or until otherwise terminated by the City Council or the City's Designated City Official pursuant to Section 3 of this Ordinance *supra*. For the purposes of §§ 870.041 – 870.047, Florida Statutes, this Ordinance serves as the Designated City Official's request for an extension of the 72 hour time limit imposed pursuant to § 870.047, Florida Statutes, and, upon approval by the City Council, the council's concurrence as to the extension of such 72 hour period through the sixty (60) day duration of this Ordinance as set forth in § 3.13 of the City's Charter.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not be construed to render the remaining provisions of this Ordinance invalid or unconstitutional.

<u>SECTION 9.</u> <u>NON-CODIFICATION.</u> Given the temporary nature and effect of this Ordinance, it is the intent of the City Commission that this Ordinance will not be codified.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, and remain in effect for sixty days thereafter as further specified in Section 7 of this Ordinance *supra* and authorized by § 3.13 of the City's Charter.

Subject: Proposal to Demolish the Structure at 1604 Swann Avenue.

Background: The residence at 1604 Swann is a public nuisance and has been cited several times for trash, tires, broken windows, grass and more recently, Officers caught two transients coming out of the back of 1604 Swann. The owners have been cited on numerous occasions for code violations and have not responded. The City then made the necessary corrections (cut grass, removed tires, etc.) and we have placed liens on the property for the costs. After several other notices, the property owners are no longer responding. The property went into foreclosure and the Code Enforcement Officer has been in contact with representatives from the bank. Still nothing has been done to correct the violations on this property. With the condition of the house and property, it is now considered a public health and safety issue and the City has a quote to demolish, remove the waste, cap the utilities and fill in the excavations.

We have consulted with the City Attorney's Office and they concur that the house could be demolished and the cost be placed on the property as a lien. We would work with the parties that have invested interest in the property if it is foreclosed and see what can be done for the City to recoup its costs, to include having the property turned over to the City.

The City Manager followed the process outlined in section 10-33 relating to notice to remove nuisances and hearings on nuisances. This required that the city manager find and determine that a public nuisance as defined above exists, which is then provided to the owner of the offending property in writing with a demand that such owner cause the condition to be remedied. The process must be followed strictly in accordance with Section 10-33, City Code (posting, written notice, hearings, timelines, etc.) which was done. The property owner must make a written request to the City Council for a hearing before the Council for the purpose of showing that the condition(s) listed in the written notice and demand do not constitute a public nuisance. This was not done and the time has lapsed. Without the necessity of finding a serious threat as outlined above in the code enforcement route, Section 10-34 allows for removal of the nuisance by the city where: "If within the time provided by the notice after the mailing, servicing or posting of the notice no hearing has been requested and the

condition described in the notice has not been remedied, the city manager shall cause the condition to be remedied at the expense of the property owner.

We reached out to everyone connected with the property to tell them the City will be demolishing the residence but received no response. Since February, there has been at least there parties interested in purchasing this property, but the City is not aware of any offers being made.

Staff Recommendation: Review the information provided and allow the City to move forward to remove the public nuisance by demolishing the residence.

Suggested Motion: I move we declare the property located at 1604 Swann Avenue to be a public nuisance and public health and safety hazard and further direct the City Manager to remedy the condition. I further move that we accept the proposal of Cathcart Construction Company to demolish the residence located at 1604 Swann Avenue in the amount of \$33,845.00 and direct that this amount be placed as a lien on the property.

Alternatives: Do not demolish the residence and hope that someone will buy it.

Fiscal Impact: \$33,845 plus approximately \$2,500 in previous liens.
