Update and Changes – 30 mins.

Background:

Flag lots are typically configured to feature a narrow accessway from the right-of-way and drastically expands in lot width to accommodate the building envelope for a primary structure. In 2019, the city's land development code was updated to enable lot split approvals exclusively under the city council's discretion (sec. 50-33), revise the definition of lot width (sec. 50-32), and prohibit variances for newly created lots that do not conform to all aspects of the city's code (sec. 50-33 and (sec. 50-37).

The P&Z board had originally approved the first language change. There are 3 options being presented for the workshop.

ORDINANCE NO. 25-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 50, ARTICLE II, SECTIONS 50.32 AND 50.33 OF THE CITY CODE GOVERNING SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS TO PROHIBIT THE CREATION OF FLAG-SHAPED LOTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has the authority under Section 2(b), Article VIII of the Florida Constitution, Section 166.021(1), Florida Statutes, and the City Charter to exercise any power for municipal purposes except where expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it necessary to amend the City Code to expressly provide that the City does not permit the creation of new flag-shaped lots by lot split or subdivision of parcels; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Belle Isle finds that this Ordinance is in the interests of the public health, safety, and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, that:

SECTION 1. <u>Recitals.</u> The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance.

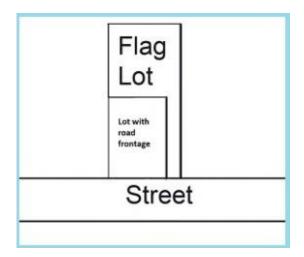
SECTION 2. <u>City Code Amendment</u>. Sections 50.32 and 50.33 of the City Code of Ordinances are hereby amended as follows (words that are <u>stricken out</u> are deletions; words that are <u>underlined</u> are additions; provisions not included are not being amended):

Sec. 50.32. Definitions

The following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meaning given in this section. Words used in the present tense include the future tense; words in the plural tense include the singular tense and vice versa. The word "shall" is considered mandatory, and the word "may" is considered permissive.

Director means a city employee designated by the city manager to process the preliminary application and plat reviews pursuant to the provision of this article.

Flag-shaped lot describes the shape of a certain type of lot, where the ingress and egress to and from the public right-of-way is provided along the long narrow "flag pole" portion of the lot with width less than the minimum lot width required in a zoning district and the remaining shape of the lot is generally rectangular in shape. A diagram showing an example of a flag-shaped lot is below:



Gross residential acre means an acre of land zoned and/or used for residential purposes, including, but not limited to, land which provides access or contributes to the amenities of residents of the subdivision such as streets, parks, and usable open spaces. Land devoted to nonresidential uses other than those listed above, including, but not limited to, environmentally sensitive lands, shall not be included as part of gross residential acreage.

Lot depth means the distance measured along a straight line drawn from the midpoint of the front property line of the lot to the midpoint of the rear property line, or to the most distant point on the lot located on any other lot line if there is no rear lot line. In the event that the rear property line, or if there is no rear lot line then the most distant point on the lot located on any other line, is located fully or partially below the normal high water line of an abutting body of water, then lot depth shall be measured along a straight line drawn from the front property line and parallel to the side lot line(s) to the point on the normal high water line located closest to the front property line.

Lot split means the division of a lot or parcel that is not located within the boundaries of a planned unit development into no more than two parcels or lots and shall include any change in boundary lines between two parcels or lots.

Lot width means the distance between the side lot lines, along a line drawn parallel to the front lot line <u>abutting the public right-of-way</u> measured at a distance from the front lot line <u>abutting the public right-of-way</u> equal to the greater of: (i) the minimum front yard setback required for the applicable zoning district, and (ii) a front yard setback established at a greater distance than required by the applicable zoning district pursuant to a deed restriction granted by the property owner in favor of the city.

Net residential acre means an acre of land zoned and/or used for residential purposes and which does not include areas such as streets, parks, environmentally sensitive lands, and usable open spaces. Land devoted to nonresidential uses shall not be included as part of net residential acreage.

Tract mean any land in a subdivision which is designated as, but not limited to, recreation areas, water detention facilities, landscape buffers or conservation areas, and not meant for use as a residential or commercial lot.

Sec. 50.33. Procedures

(6) Lot split.

- a. Submission requirements. The applicant shall submit a survey and legal description both certified by a registered state surveyor of the property as it is to be divided, payment as set forth in this Land Development Code or as otherwise prescribed by the city council or city manager, and proof of ownership acceptable to the city.
- b. Requirements. With the prior approval of the city council, any lot or parcel not located within a planned unit development may be divided by lot split so long as the two resulting lots or parcels meet in every respect the Land Development Code's requirements for newly created lots or parcels. No lot or parcel nor any portion of any lot or parcel which has been created by a lot split shall be further divided by lot split. The creation of new flag-shaped lots is prohibited. A lot split is not permitted if the parcel proposed to be subdivided has a non-conforming use or non-conforming structure(s) that will not brought into compliance with the Land Development Code. No variance will be given for any lot split that results in a lot or parcel or development that does not conform in every respect to the Land Development Code's requirement for newly created lots or parcels. For example, no variance will be given for any lot split that results in a substandard lot or in the creation of a flag-shapped lot.
- c. *Notice*. A notice of no further lot split shall be fully executed by the owner of the property submitted for lot split which notice must be approved by the city and such notice shall be recorded in the public records of the county prior to the issuance of any building permit for lots or parcels created by lot split. The form of the notice shall be in recordable form and in substance substantially in accordance be with the following: "The property described on the attached Exhibit 1 was the subject of a lot split within the City of Belle Isle, Florida, and no further division of all or any portion of the property described on the attached Exhibit 1 by the lot split procedure in the City of Belle Isle shall be allowed. Further subdivision by other methods may or may not be allowed."

SECTION 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether for substantive, procedural, or any other reason, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. <u>Conflicts</u>. In the event of a conflict or conflicts between this Ordinance and any other ordinance or provision of law, this Ordinance controls to the extent of the conflict, as allowable under the law.

SECTION 5. <u>Codification.</u> Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be incorporated into the Belle Isle City Code. Any section, paragraph number, subsection number, letter and/or any heading may be changed or modified as necessary to effectuate the foregoing. Grammatical,

typographical and similar or like errors may be corrected, and additions, alterations, and omissions not affecting the construction or meaning of this ordinance or City Code may be freely made.

SECTION 6. <u>Effective date</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 50, ARTICLE II, SECTIONS 50.32 AND 50.33 OF THE CITY CODE GOVERNING SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS TO PROHIBIT THE CREATION OF FLAGSHAPED LOTS ON LAKEFRONT AND CANAL FRONT LOTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has the authority under Section 2(b), Article VIII of the Florida Constitution, Section 166.021(1), Florida Statutes, and the City Charter to exercise any power for municipal purposes except where expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it necessary to amend the City Code to clarify that the City does not permit the creation of new flag-shaped lots by lot split or subdivision of parcels adjacent to a lake or canal connected to a lake and otherwise discourages the creation of flag-shaped lots for all other parcels; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Belle Isle finds that this Ordinance is in the interests of the public health, safety, and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, that:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. <u>City Code Amendment.</u> Sections 50.32 and 50.33 of the City Code of Ordinances are hereby amended as follows (words that are <u>stricken out</u> are deletions; words that are <u>underlined</u> are additions; provisions not included are not being amended):

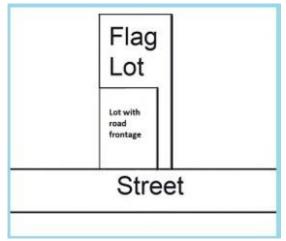

Words used in the present tense include the future tense; words in the plural tense include the singular tense and vice versa. The word "shall" is considered mandatory, and the word "may" is considered permissive.

Lot width means the distance between the side lot lines, along a line drawn parallel to the front lot line abutting the public right-of-way measured at a distance from the front lot line abutting the public right-of-way equal to the greater of: (i) the minimum front yard setback required for the applicable zoning district, and (ii) a front yard setback for a non-lakefront single-family residential lot established with city council approval at a greater distance than required by the applicable zoning district and that ensures a proper building setback from development on adjacent lots pursuant to a deed restriction granted by the property owner in favor of the city.

Net residential acre means an acre of land zoned and/or used for residential purposes and which does not include areas such as streets, parks, environmentally sensitive lands, and usable open spaces. Land devoted to nonresidential uses shall not be included as part of net residential acreage.

Tract mean any land in a subdivision which is designated as, but not limited to, recreation areas, water detention facilities, landscape buffers or conservation areas, and not meant for use as a residential or commercial lot.

Sec. 50.33. Procedures

(6) Lot split.

- a. Submission requirements. The applicant shall submit a survey and legal description both certified by a registered state surveyor of the property as it is to be divided, payment as set forth in this Land Development Code or as otherwise prescribed by the city council or city manager, and proof of ownership acceptable to the city.
- Requirements. With the prior approval of the city council, any lot or parcel not located within a planned unit development may be divided by lot split so long as the two resulting lots or parcels meet in every respect the Land Development Code's requirements for newly created lots or parcels. No lot or parcel nor any portion of any lot or parcel which has been created by a lot split shall be further divided by lot split. The creation of new flag-shaped lots is prohibited as a result of a lot split or subdivision of (i) any parcel adjacent to a lake or canal connected to a lake, or (ii) any parcel designated with a zoning category other than a singlefamily residential zoning category. The creation of new flag-shaped lot for nonlake front single-family residential lots and non-canal single-family residential front lots is discouraged but may be allowed in extraordinary circumstances with city council approval subject to (i) the creation of a deed restriction establishing a front yard setback along the public right-of-way at a greater distance than required by the applicable zoning district, and (ii) a determination that no traffic safety or vehicle access issues are being created. A lot split is not permitted if the parcel proposed to be subdivided has a non-conforming use or non-conforming structure(s) that will not be brought into compliance with the Land Development Code. No variance will be given for any lot split that results in a lot or parcel or <u>development</u> that does not conform in every respect to the Land Development Code's requirement for newly created lots or parcels. For example, no variance will be given for any lot split that results in a substandard lot or in the creation of a lakefront or canal front flag lot.
- c. *Notice*. A notice of no further lot split shall be fully executed by the owner of the property submitted for lot split which notice must be approved by the city and such notice shall be recorded in the public records of the county prior to the issuance of any building permit for lots or parcels created by lot split. The form of the notice shall be in recordable form and in substance substantially in accordance be with the following: "The property described on the attached Exhibit 1 was the subject of a lot split within the City of Belle Isle, Florida, and no further division of all or any portion of the property described on the attached Exhibit 1 by the lot split procedure in the City of Belle Isle shall be allowed. Further subdivision by other methods may or may not be allowed."

SECTION 3. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether for substantive, procedural, or any other reason, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 50, ARTICLE II, SECTIONS 50.32 AND 50.33 OF THE CITY CODE GOVERNING SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS TO PROHIBIT THE CREATION OF FLAG-SHAPED LOTS EXCEPT WITHIN A CERTAIN ESTABLISHED OVERLAY AREA AS DEFINED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has the authority under Section 2(b), Article VIII of the Florida Constitution, Section 166.021(1), Florida Statutes, and the City Charter to exercise any power for municipal purposes except where expressly prohibited by law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it necessary to amend the City Code to clarify that the City does not permit the creation of new flag-shaped lots by lot split or subdivision of parcels except within a certain overlay area as described herein and otherwise discourages the creation of flag-shaped lots for all other parcels; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Belle Isle finds that this Ordinance is in the interests of the public health, safety, and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, that:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance.

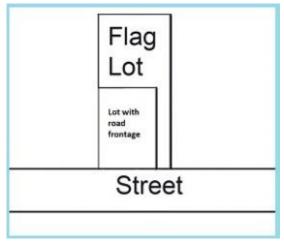

Net residential acre means an acre of land zoned and/or used for residential purposes and which does not include areas such as streets, parks, environmentally sensitive lands, and usable open spaces. Land devoted to nonresidential uses shall not be included as part of net residential acreage.

Tract mean any land in a subdivision which is designated as, but not limited to, recreation areas, water detention facilities, landscape buffers or conservation areas, and not meant for use as a residential or commercial lot.

Sec. 50.33. Procedures

(6) Lot split.

The applicant shall submit a survey and legal description both certified by a registered state surveyor of the property as it is to be divided, payment as set forth in this Land Development Code or as otherwise prescribed by the city council or city manager, and proof of ownership acceptable to the city.

The creation of new flag-shaped lot for single-family residential lots within the Area is discouraged but may be allowed in extraordinary circumstances with city council approval subject to (i) the creation of a deed restriction establishing a front yard setback along the public right-of-way at a greater distance than required by the applicable zoning district, and (ii) a determination that no traffic safety or vehicle access issues are being created. A lot split is not permitted if the parcel proposed to be subdivided has a non-conforming use or non-conforming structure(s) that will not brought into compliance with the Land Development Code. No variance will be given for any lot split that results in a lot or parcel or development that does not conform in every respect to the Land Development Code's requirement for newly created lots or parcels. For example, no variance will be given for any lot split that results in a substandard lot or in the creation of a flag-shaped lot outside of the Overlay Area.
- c. *Notice*. A notice of no further lot split shall be fully executed by the owner of the property submitted for lot split which notice must be approved by the city and such notice shall be recorded in the public records of the county prior to the issuance of any building permit for lots or parcels created by lot split. The form of the notice shall be in recordable form and in substance substantially in accordance be with the following: "The property described on the attached Exhibit 1 was the subject of a lot split within the City of Belle Isle, Florida, and no further division

of all or any portion of the property described on the attached Exhibit 1 by the lot split procedure in the City of Belle Isle shall be allowed. Further subdivision by other methods may or may not be allowed."

SECTION 3. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether for substantive, procedural, or any other reason, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Mayor Carson called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm, and the Clerk confirmed quorum. City Manager Rick Rudometkin, Attorney Pownall, Chief Grimm, DC Millis, Public Works Director Phil Price, and City Clerk Yolanda Quiceno were also present.

2. Invocation and Pledge to Flag

Comm Vertolli gave the Invocation and led the Pledge to the Flag.

Mayor Carson asked for a motion to excuse Comm Smith and Partin.

Comm Vertolli moved to excuse Comm Smith and Partin from tonight's meeting.

Comm Lowell seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 5:0.

 Comm Lance seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Ruthy Harrell, residing at 2800 Trentwood Blvd, presented the Council with a framed copy of the proposed 1925 brochure of a

Comm Lowell moved to approve the consent item as presented.

Comm Lance seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 5:0.

Unfinished Business

a. ORDINANCE NO. 25-04: SECOND READING AND ADOPTION - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING ARTICLE V OF CHAPTER 30 OF THE CITY CODE AUTHORIZING THE USE OF GOLF CARTS WITHIN CERTAIN COMMUNITIES AND ON STREETS DESIGNATED IN RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN APPLICATION PROCESS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Rudometkin read Ordinance 25-04 by Title.

Council spoke briefly about unlicensed drivers, the number of occupants allowed on a golf cart when in motion, and city-wide golf cart use. Chief Grimm said the staff will provide a resident guide to all permit holders upon yearly renewal of the Golf Cart Permit. Comm Shuck asked that more information be provided to the residents regarding bike riders, e-bikes, scooters, and golf carts' safety.

Comm Bobrowksi asked if staff would contact Orange County to see if the City can receive a dispensation to allow a clear path/road continuity for golf carts on out-of-city sidewalks, i.e., Conway, Judge. CM Rudometkin said the first step is to have the ordinance in place to start a discussion with Orange and Orlando for permission in those areas surrounding the city.

Comm Lowell expressed her concern about the safety of all residents and cautioned the staff before opening to allow the use of areas outside the city limits.

After the discussion, Comm Lowell moved to adopt Ordinance 25-04 as presented. Comm Vertolli seconded the motion, which passed unanimously upon roll call 5:0.

b. 3904 Arajo Court Condemnation Update

City Manager Rudometkin gave an update on the 3904-property condemnation. He stated that he had invited the homeowner and contractor to attend tonight's meeting. However, they did not show. He noted that the contractor is a family friend and has pulled a roofing permit. The contractor stated that after the roof repair, he would tackle the inside of the home. CM Rudometkin asked for an additional 30-day extension so that the homeowner could appear at the next meeting with a schedule for repairs. CM noted that he had told the homeowner that the condemnation process had been completed.

Comm Vertolli shared his concern and asked that the Council hold the homeowner to a firm finished date.

The Council agreed that the city must hold to a firm date. After further discussion, the Council granted the homeowner a 30-day extension to provide the construction dates and schedule at the next City Council meeting in June.

Comm Bobrowksi moved to grant the extension to the next City Council meeting in June. Comm Lance seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 5:0.

7. New Business

Approval of Second Amendment to Ground Werk's Sidewalk Contract

City Manager Rudometkin presented a second amendment to the Ground Werks' sidewalk contract not to exceed the amount of 1,580,281.22 ARPA Funds that included the already budgeted amounts. Council discussed staff providing a list of sidewalk repairs and approaches that are tripping hazards (cracked sidewalks may not be repaired).

After discussion, Comm Bobrowski moved to approve the second amendment with Ground Werks' Inc. and increase the not-to-exceed amount to \$1,580,281.22 to be paid for work performed by the contractor during the two-year extended contract term to reflect the additional allocated ARPA funds and city funds for sidewalk repairs previously authorized and approved by the City Council. Comm Lance seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 5:0.

8. Attorney's Report - No report.

9. City Manager's Report

a. City Manager's Report

The City Manager presented the Task List.

b. Chief's Report

- Chief Grimm announced that the canine broke her toes and is recovering and will be ready to meet and greet at the next meeting.
- Chief Grimm thanked the residents for the water donated to the agency.
- Chief Grimm reminded residents that the lake and the ramps are busy with traffic, and he asked for patience. PD and OC staff are working on increasing their presence to improve the traffic flow. In the summer, there will always be a Belle Isle Marine and a NAV Board patrol boat on the lake.

c. Public Works Report

Phil Price reported that the PD boat dock is almost complete, and we await the finalization of the power.

10. Mayor's Report - na

Mayor Carson said he attended the CCA Board meeting, where they announced additional starting times to help with the traffic. He also welcomed the newly appointed board members.

11. Commissioners' Report

 The council asked if staff could invite the CCA board representative to the next council meeting to give an update on the school.

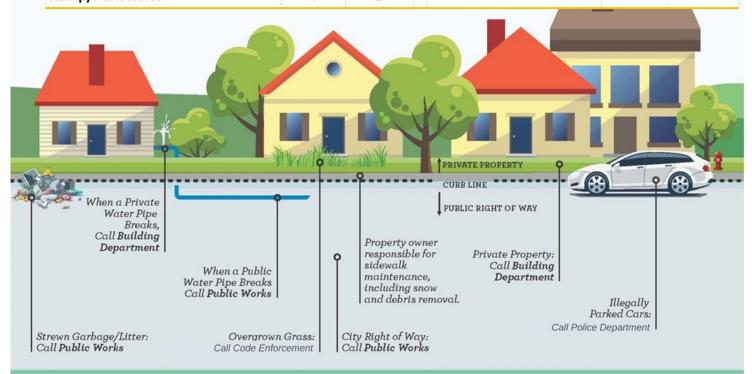

SECOND AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT

This SECOND AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT (this "Second Amendment") is made and entered into as of the _____ day, 2025 ("Effective Date") by and between CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, a Florida municipal corporation ("Landlord, or City") whose mailing address is 1600 Nela Avenue, Belle Isle, Florida 32809 and CORNERSTONE CHARTER ACADEMY, INC., A Florida not-for-profit corporation ("Tenant") whose mailing address is 906 Waltham Avenue, Belle Isle, Florida 32809.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, The Parties entered into that certain Lease Agreement dated October 19, 2021 (the "Lease Agreement") that was amended by the Amended Lease Agreement dated May 17, 2022, (together the "Lease Agreement, as Amended"); and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Lease Agreement, as Amended, to modify the area defined therein as the Leased Property for purposes of carving out certain property enclosed by a fence that includes the Lancaster House located at the corner of Randolph Avenue and Waltham Avenue;

WHEREAS, the Tenant has executed and delivered a Leasehold Mortgage in connection with the closing of the Tenant's bonding financing transaction contemplated by the Lease Agreement, as Amended;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the terms, covenants, and conditions hereof, and other good and valuable consideration the adequacy, receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree to amend the Lease Agreement, as Amended, as follows:

- 1. The definition "Leased Property" is amended as follows:
- "Leased Property" means the Premises, the Equipment, and the Buildings, and (d) any additions or alterations thereto which are permitted herein, excluding that portion of land identified in Exhibit A-1 attached hereto ("Lancaster House Parcel") and by this reference made a part hereof, including the tenements, hereditaments, improvements, fixtures, furniture, equipment, appurtenances, rights, easement and rights-of-way incident thereto.
- 2. The Landlord and their respective officers, employees, contractors, invitees and agents shall have a limited right of vehicular ingress and egress, including parking, to and from the Lancaster House Parcel only over and through a driveway from the Waltham Avenue public right of way, and pedestrian access from the existing sidewalk through a pedestrian gate from Randolph Avenue. No vehicular or pedestrian access shall be provided across, through or over the Premises to the Lancaster House Parcel.
- 3. Prior to any renovation work commencing within the Lancaster House Parcel, the Landlord, directly or through its future Lancaster House Parcel tenant, shall construct a new 6 ft. steel fence / gate around the Lancaster House Parcel including all areas contiguous to the Leased Property to maintain the perimeter and separation of school from Lancaster house property. The

fence shall match the current Cornerstone Charter Academy standard perimeter fence style and standard, and shall be subject to advanced approval by Tenant.

4. If during the Term, the Landlord leases the Lancaster House Parcel to any third party ("Lancaster House Lessee"), and if the Lancaster House Lessee defaults on its lease with the Landlord, or if the Landlord otherwise takes back the Lancaster House Parcel, then Tenant (ie Cornerstone) has a right of first refusal to amend the definition of "Leased Property" in the Lease Agreement, and any amendments, to include the Lancaster House Parcel again, for no additional cost to the Tenant including no additional rent, together with the express right for Tenant to demolish any and all improvements that may exist on the Lancaster House Parcel at that time and to use of the Lancaster House Parcel for any authorized use under the Lease Agreement, as Amended. Landlord agrees to provide Tenant in writing with a notice of a default by the Lancaster House Tenant, termination of any lease between the Landlord and a third party for the Lancaster House Parcel or of the Landlord's action to take back the Lancaster House Parcel, after which time the Tenant shall have ninety (90) days to notify the Landlord of its decision to add the Lancaster House Parcel to the Leased Property. The parties agree to execute an amendment to the Lease effecting the addition of the Lancaster House to the Leased Property.

- 5. Exhibit A-1 attached to this Second Amendment shall constitute Exhibit A-1 referenced in the definition of the Leased Property being amended by Paragraph 1 of this Second Amendment.
- 6. The Parties hereto acknowledge that this Second Amendment constitutes a written agreement pursuant to Section 16.28(b) of the Lease Agreement, and all references to the "Lease" in the Original Amendment are to be as read incorporating the amendments to the Original Lease Amendment by this Amendment. The Tenant represents that a Leasehold Mortgage exists with respect to the Leased Property, and that prior written consent of the Leasehold Mortgagee, or bond holders as required, shall be obtained for this Second Amendment to become effective and enforceable.

Except as modified by this Second Amendment, the Lease Agreement, as Amended is the entire agreement of the Parties, and no representations, inducements, promises, or agreements, oral or otherwise, not embodied herein will be of any force or effect. Any change, amendment, or modification to this Lease will not be binding upon the Parties unless it is in writing and executed by the Parties hereto. Capitalized terms used herein but not otherwise defined herein will have the same meanings as set forth in the Amended Lease Agreement.

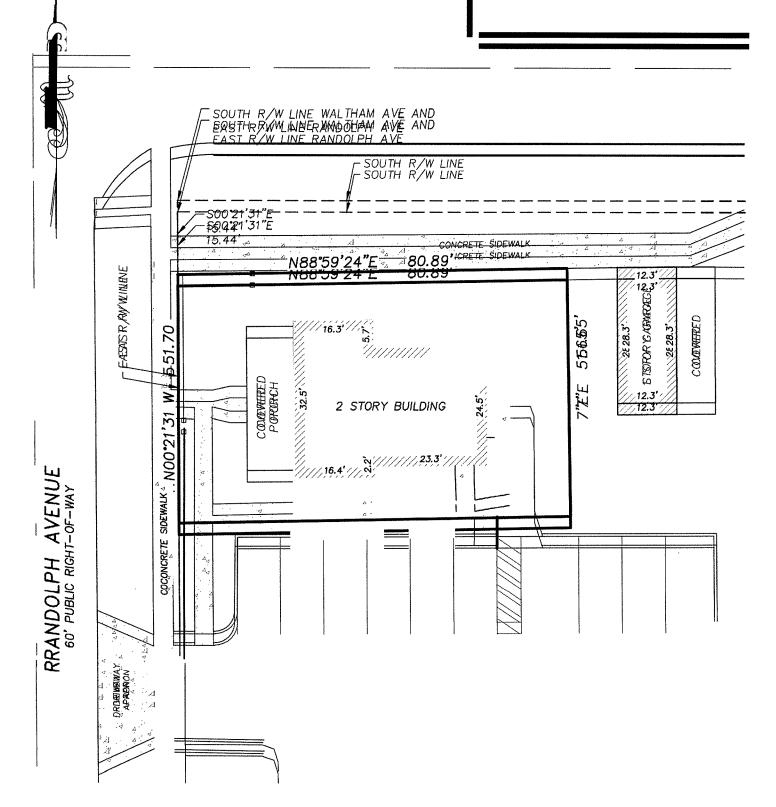

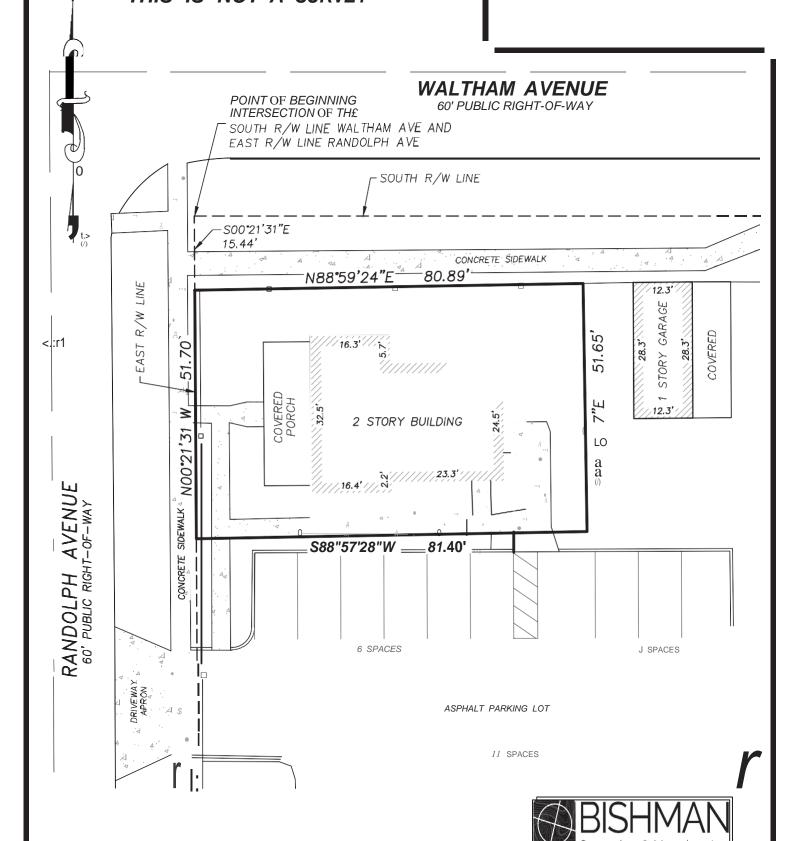

FIRST AMENDMENT TO SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES AGREEMENT (hereinafter "First Amendment") is made and entered into effective as of the 1st day of October, 2025, by and a Florida municipal corporation whose address is 1600 Nela Avenue, Belle Isle, Florida 32809 ("City"), and JJ's Waste and Recycling, LLC ("Contractor"), a limited liability corporation, whose address is 3905 El Rey Road, Orlando, Florida 32808. Sometimes, herein, the City and Contractor shall be collectively referred to as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, City and Contractor, entered into that certain Solid Waste and Recycle Services Agreement dated September 30, 2019 (hereinafter collectively the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the City and Contractor desire to extend the term of the Agreement and to make amendments to the Agreement as set forth herein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Grantor and Grantee agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. <u>Defined Terms</u>. Any defined term used in this First Amendment that is not specifically defined herein shall have the meaning given to such term in the Agreement.
- 3. <u>Definitions</u>. Section 1 of the Agreement is hereby amended to add the definition of "Annexation" as set forth below, with all subsequent definitions renumbered accordingly:
 - 1.4 <u>Annexation:</u> the legal process of adding land to the jurisdictional limits of the city.
- 4. <u>Grant of Exclusive Franchise</u>. Section 2 of the Agreement is hereby amended to add the following new sentence to the end of the Section:

In the event of annexation, the City reserves the right to and may allow non-franchise pickup of trash, waste, and recyclables for newly annexed property in an exclusive agreement.

- 5. <u>Amended Term</u>. Paragraph 3 of the Agreement is hereby amended to be replaced with the following language:
- **3.** <u>TERM.</u> The Initial Term of Agreement as previously extended expires on September 30, 2025. Unless sooner terminated in accordance with the Agreement, the Second Term of this Agreement shall commence October 1, 2025, and shall continue in effect until September 30, 2030, at

11:59 PM, Eastern Time. The parties may renew this Agreement for up to three (3) additional one (1) year optional Renewal Terms beyond the Second Term by mutual agreement in writing at the end of the Second Term. The City must advise the Contractor at least nine (9) months prior to expiration of the Second Term or a Renewal Term. If Contractor does not agree to renewal within one (1) month of notification, Contractor will be deemed to have rejected the renewal. This provision in no way limits City's right to terminate this Agreement at any time during the Second Term or any optional Renewal Term pursuant to the provisions of the Agreement as hereby amended.

A financial hold shall be placed on the increase in rates for all Residential Service Units for a period of three (3) City fiscal years (October 1, 2025, to September 30, 2028). There shall be a single increase annually in the final two (2) fiscal years of the Second Term for Residential Service Units. Such annual increase will be calculated by the increase of CPI as noted by the Bureau of Statistics or five percent (5%), whichever is greater, plus any disposal increases via landfills.

There shall be a single increase annually each year of the Second Term for Commercial Service Units. Such increase will be calculated by the increase of CPI as noted by the Bureau of Statistics or five percent (5%), whichever is greater, plus any disposal increases via landfills.

6. Modification to Rates.

A) The intro paragraph of Paragraph 26 of the Agreement is hereby amended as follows:

The Contractor may submit a written request for modification to fees to the city on or before July 1st, 201925 and every July 1st thereafter. If Contractor fails to submit a written request for modification to rates on or before July 1st, Contractor waives the right for a modification to rates for that year. This will follow the term contract language and Exhibit 2 of the Agreement.

B) Paragraph 26.2 of the Agreement is hereby amended as follows:

26.2 Pass-through of Increased Governmental Costs or increased Landfill Disposal Costs. The Contractor may request and City will approve an increase in the monthly rate hereunder if, during the term of this Agreement, the Contractor's costs increase solely as a result of an increased or new fee, charge, or assessment imposed by any relevant governmental authority including, a city, county, municipality or the Federal or State government on the Contractor's business capital or operations or due to increased disposal costs (including landfill and alternative disposal or recycling facility costs) after the date of this Agreement, provided that: (i) the fee, charge, or assessment was not imposed due to the Contractor's violation of any applicable legal requirement, and (ii) the Contractor notifies the City in writing within five (5) business days of the date when Contractor first becomes aware of such increase or new fee, charge or assessment along with the details of and documentation supporting the same. Such adjustment will not be limited by the 3% maximum adjustment related to any CPI based adjustment. To obtain an increase in the monthly rate under this subparagraph, the Contractor must submit documentation confirming the amount of or increase in

the fee, charge, or assessment and the effective date of the increase, and must provide the City proportionate share of the increased cost. No pass-through will be effective until the City has approved the increase and made an appropriate adjustment to its rate order; however, City will not unreasonably condition or delay any such pass-through increase.

- C) The Agreement is hereby amended to add a new Paragraph 26.4 to read as follows:
- 26.4 <u>City's Option to Terminate</u>. The City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement without penalty by giving at least, one hundred twenty (120) days advance written notice to the Contractor. Within the 120 days between the City's election to terminate this Agreement and the effective date of termination, the parties agree to meet and discuss in good faith potential modifications in services to reduce the City's cost, and if the parties reach a mutually agreeable solution the parties will execute an amendment and rescind the City's election to terminate this Agreement early.
- D. The remaining portions of Paragraph 26 remain unchanged.
- 7. <u>Performance Bond</u>. The Performance Bond required by Paragraph 36 of the Agreement shall be extended or a new one provided by the Contractor to the City covering the period of time during the Second Term of this Agreement.
- 8. <u>Eligible Disaster Debris</u>. Paragraph 60 of the Agreement is hereby amended to be replaced to read:
- 60. <u>Eligible Disaster Debris.</u> For the purposes of this Paragraph, "Eligible Disaster Debris" means debris that is eligible for FEMA reimbursement related to a Presidential declared emergency. If and when requested by the City, Contractor hereby agrees to collect any Eligible Disaster Debris in the event of a hurricane, tornado, major storm, or other natural disaster. City will pay an additional cost for such removal of Eligible Disaster Debris, such cost to be negotiated prior to the precipitating natural disaster, if possible, or else prior to Contractor's collection of Eligible Disaster Debris. Contractor must abide by the proper process for documenting Eligible Disaster Debris removal and disposal and invoicing in compliance with FEMA guidelines and requirements, including but not limited to, providing photographs, load tickets and location of temporary debris staging and reduction sites (TDSRs) and permanent or final disposal sites. Removal and disposal of Eligible Disaster Debris by the Contractor without City prior approval and without Contractor providing the City with proper documentation in accordance with FEMA requirements is not compensable under this Agreement.
- 9. <u>No Further Changes</u>. The foregoing terms and conditions and this First Amendment are hereby incorporated into the Agreement. Except as set forth in this First Amendment, the Agreement as modified by the First Amendment shall have full force and effect. In the event of any conflict or ambiguity between the Agreement and this First Amendment, this First Amendment

controls. This First Amendment may be executed in one or more counterparts. Signed counterparts delivered by facsimile or electronic mail shall constitute originals and shall be binding.
