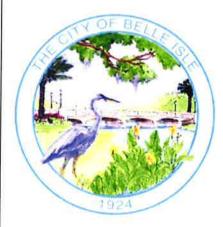

The Belle Isle City Council met in a Regular Session on September 1st, 2020, at 6:30 p.m. on a Virtual Webinar (zoom.us/j/84991977807.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Fouraker opened the meeting at 6:30 pm, and City Clerk confirmed quorum. Comm Shuck gave the invocation and led the Pledge to the Flag.

CONSENT ITEMS

a. Approval of the City Council Budget Workshop meeting minutes – August 25, 2020

Comm Partin moved to approve the consent items as presented.

Comm Sims seconded the motion, which passed unanimously upon roll call, 6:0. Comm Readey was not present for the vote.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Mayor Fouraker opened for citizen comments.

City Clerk reported that she did not receive any citizen comments for this meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

a. Mayor Fouraker read Ordinance 20-08 by title.

Mayor Fouraker opened for Council discussion and motion.

Comm Sims moved to approve Ordinance 20-08.

Comm Gold seconded the motion, which passed unanimously upon roll call, 6:0. Comm Readey was not present for the vote.

Ordinance 20-09 Second Reading and Adoption: Repeal Electric Utility Tax - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA; AMENDING SECTION 28-31 OF THE BELLE ISLE CITY CODE; PROVIDING FOR FRANCHISE FEE FOR ELECTRIC UTILITY SERVICES AS ALTERNATIVE TO PUBLIC SERVICE TAX; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor Fouraker read Ordinance 20-09 by title.

Mayor Fouraker opened for Council discussion and motion.

Comm Sims moved to approve Ordinance 20-09.

Comm Nielsen seconded the motion, which passed unanimously upon roll call, 6:0. Comm Readey was not present for the vote.

Comm Readey joined the Zoom meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

a. Ordinance 20-12 First Reading and Consideration: Home Occupancy Ordinance - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE BELLE ISLE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, CHAPTER 28, ARTICLE IV, SECTION 28-91 – OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE REQUIRED, AND SECTION 28-94 – ISSUANCE; TRANSFERABILITY AND CHAPTER 50, ARTICLE IV – ACCESSORY STRUCTURE; SECTION 28-99 - REVOCATION AND USES, SECTION 50-103 – ACCESSORY USES; PROVIDING FOR AN APPEAL PROCESS AND PROCEDURES; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Francis reported that the Council directed the staff to review and revise the Zoning Occupational Code. This change will modify Section 50-103 of the code. He said it is necessary to rewrite the section to better define the BIMC "Home Occupations" for the following reasons,

- provides for a new review and revocation process,
- provides for an appeal process; and
- provides for fines in the event a permit is revoked or not applied for

Comm Sims moved to advance Ordinance 20-12 to a second reading at the next Council meeting.

After Council discussion, Comm Nielsen seconded the motion, which passed unanimously upon roll call, 7:0.

ATTORNEY REPORT

Attorney Ardaman reported that the Board of County Commissioners has a meeting tomorrow with the County Attorney regarding the lake issues. He has open communications with the County Attorney concerning lake county navigation district.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Francis gave an overview of the upcoming budget meetings and said it is essential to have a quorum present on September 15th and September 23rd to be able to approve the budget.

- September 7, 2020 Mayor, City Manager, and City Clerk. At this meeting, the Mayor will open the meeting and continue it to a date certain of September 15, 2020.
- September 15, 2020 First Budget Hearing and City Council meeting
- September 23, 2020 Second Budget Hearing and Adoption

Issues Log

Mr. Francis gave a brief overview as follows

- Storm Drainage The City has reconditioned some of the swales on the 5200 block of Jade Circle. The process was adequate, and the City will follow the same approach to condition the swales to the north (Barby Lane, Sol, and Wind Willow). He spoke on some of the existing drainage challenges on Sol.
- He and the Mayor are meeting with Comm Uribe tomorrow to see if they can partner on some drainage projects.
- We are reviewing the site plan of Wallace Field before the Planning & Zoning meeting on September 22nd.
- Acquisition of Property The City is redoing the Phase 1 Environmental Report to ensure compliance.
- CCA Awaiting a new term sheet for the refinancing project.
- Municipal Code The Comp Plan update is due no later than April 2024. He is working with April Fisher on the updates.
- Annexation He reported that residents on Wilks, Randolph, and Waltham area that would like to be part of Belle Isle. He also said on the Lancaster House, the new location, funding, and coordination with Duke Energy; the project hinges on Orange County, allowing the move across the street and allowing annexation of that property.

Chief's Report

Chief Houston reported on the following,

- Chief reminded residents on the police department call-in numbers
 - o 911 Emergency Only
 - Non-Emergency Dispatch 407-826-4397
 - o Admin Office 407-240-2473
- The Agency has received a tremendous number of calls regarding the loud music on the lake; she has published a Facebook post on how to report the nuisance. Also, she spoke on the aggressive behavior of individuals on the lake and stated that the Agency would step up the Marine Patrol enforcement.
- Chief Houston provided a sample Uniform Crime Reporting Program report monitored by the FBI that access and monitor types of crimes in the City. The report provides reliable information to assist the Agency in making decisions on best practices.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Fouraker reported on the following.

- Mayor Fouraker addressed the continued load music complaints on the lake, dangerous behavior, and exorbitant
 amount of trash on all areas of the lake and at the sandbar. Residents have noted safety concerns and feel like they are
 being invaded. He shared a video taken over the weekend of where he observed unacceptable behavior and provided a
 copy for the record. He said he would continue to work with the residents and NAV Board on different options/solutions
 to encourage better behavior.
- Mayor Fouraker spoke on the lowering of the Weir. He said he continued to work with the NAV Board on this issue and
 conveyed the concerns by the residents on the canal. Mayor Fouraker said the current water level is not the issue, but
 the amount of debris that is accumulating in the canal. He has requested action on this to the NAV Board and Orange
 County and has not been successful; he will continue to push for a positive result.
- Mayor Fouraker said he joined the Police Advisory Board (PAB) meeting and gave a brief overview of the discussion on current issues. He said the PAB is looking to raise funds for a new PD boat. The staff is reviewing the Gift Policy to ensure there are no improprieties.
- Mayor Fouraker shared his concern with Comm Readey's lack of participation and apparent commitment to the City and duties as a commissioner. He regrettably and formally asked for his resignation and said his district deserves a commissioner that can actively serve. He further added instead of waiting for something that will eventually transpire; he would like to put a plan in place for succession. He tried to handle this situation in a private setting with Comm Readey with no positive result. Comm Readey stated that there will be no action on his part. The Mayor said the City deserves an active Council member and will ask for a formal resignation on the next meeting agenda.

COUNCIL REPORT

Comm Shuck thanked the Chief for the report and said there is still crime occurring from outside the City.

Comm Carugno reported on the following:

- Comm Carugno asked if the City was to change power companies in the future does the Council have to re-advertise for a new ordinance. Mr. Francis said no; however, the Council will need to renegotiate the terms.
- He said he had received several complaints from residents on the noise and safety concerns in the slow zones and Venetian boat ramp.
- He said a resident requested belle isle residents to place blue lights on their homes in support of the Police Officers and the Department around the Country.
- Comm Carugno asked for an update on the drowning on the lake. Chief Houston said once the investigation is complete, anyone can request a copy of the report through the public records process.
- Comm Carugno announced that he would be meeting with the FAA on Friday. Please email or call him with any questions or concerns.

Comm Partin reported on the following,

• Comm Partin also spoke on the noise nuisance. If the behavior is not curtailed, it may cause someone to get hurt.

Comm Sims reported on the following

• Comm Sims shared his satisfaction with the hotel on McCoy. The fourth floor has been completed, and residents can barely see the roof because of the 150 Foot buffer negotiated by the City. He thanked the staff for their support.

Comm Nielsen reported on the following

- Comm Nielsen said it might be beneficial to let the residents of the Lakes and Landings know that they can request the City Manager to make their neighborhood a restricted parking district. It may be a solution to the current parking problem.
- Comm Nielsen spoke on the drainage leaf baskets on Cullen Lake Shore. She said they are not, apparently, in every location and have witnessed the discharge at a resident's home to be horrible. She asked if the City Manager can look into adding more baskets on the north lake area. City Manager Francis asked for the location of the inlet, and he will contact EPD.
 - o Comm Gold stated that the City negotiated the installation of 19 baskets.

Comm Readey reported on the following

- Comm Readey said proudly that his grandson has just enrolled in CCA.
- Comm Readey addressed some of the concerns addressed by the Mayor. He acknowledged that the Mayor had approached him on this issue before; however, he is feeling well and will continue to serve.

Comm Gold shared his concern with the process and was not in favor of the Mayor's approach and said the Charter speaks on how to remove someone from office. After further discussion, the Mayor asked Attorney Ardaman how he can have Comm Gold removed from the meeting.

Attorney Ardaman said it is a decision made and approved by the Council.

Mayor Fouraker warned Comm Gold if the interruption continued, he would ask Council for a motion to remove Comm Gold from the meeting.

Comm Carugno motioned to remove Comm Gold from the meeting.

The motion failed for lack of a second.

Mayor Fouraker asked Comm Gold from refraining from speaking out of term for the remainder of the meeting. He said they might not agree on everything but must be respectful in their disagreements.

Comm Gold apologized for the interruptions.

Mayor Fouraker announced that the proposed changes of the Transportation Plan for Hoffner and Daetwyler/Judge are open for residents to review at City Hall. If anyone is interested in looking at them, please schedule an appointment with the City Clerk at 407-851-7730. All feedback must be received by September 4th, 2020, to the City Manager.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, Mayor Fouraker called for a motion to adjourn. The motion was passed unanimously at 8:30 p.m.

Subject: Resolution 20-11 Authorizing Issuance of 2020 Note and Loan Agreement

Background: The Council approved the purchase of the BoA property and adopted Ordinance 20-10, authorizing the borrowing of money and issuance of debt in an amount not to exceed \$2,600,000 for purchasing one or more parcels of land and/or construction capital improvements including, but not limited to, storm water improvements.

The City staff has been working with the City Attorney and members of the Florida League of Cities to borrow the funds needed for the purchase. An RFP, reviewed by the City staff and City Attorney was issued in the amount of \$2.6 million. The bids came back and the lowest bid was from Center State Bank for 2.08% for 20 years.

The City will use the proceeds of the 2020 Loan to finance the acquisition of one or more parcels of land and the improvements thereon and/or capital projects including but not limited to stormwater improvements (collectively, the "Project") along with the costs of issuance related to the 2020 Loan.

Staff Recommendation: Adopt Ordinance 20-10

Suggested Motion: I move that we approve the Loan Agreement.

Alternatives: Do not adopt the ordinance.

Fiscal Impact: \$2.6 million (\$157.315 annually for 20 years)

CenterState Bank, N.A. ("the Bank") is pleased to have the opportunity to consider your loan request on behalf of the City of Belle Isle, Florida. This letter is a Non-Binding Proposal.

Borrower: City of Belle Isle, Florida ("the City" or "Borrower")

Purpose: The purpose of the loan is to fund (i) acquisition of the Property in the City.

ii) additional property acquisition and/or capital improvements including but not limited to stormwater improvements (ii) the costs of issuance related to

the 2020 loan.

Loan Amount and Type: Not to exceed \$2,600,000.00 (Two Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars).

The loan (or Note) is anticipated to close on or about September 25, 2020,

and is considered a Bank Qualified Tax Exempt term loan.

Collateral: The 2020 loan will be secured by a Covenant to Budget and Appropriate

from Non-Ad Valorem Revenues.

Maturity Date: Option A: October 1, 2035

Option B: October 1, 2040

Interest Rate: Option A: The interest rate shall be a bank qualified tax-exempt fixed rate

of 1.70% for the term of the loan, provided the loan is closed by September

25, 2020. Interest will be calculated on a 30/360 day count basis.

The City shall also retain the option to select a 15 year Assumable Rate Conversion (ARC) Index loan based on the Index on the day of closing plus 125 basis points (1.25%) X 0.79. The indicative rate as of August 20,

2020 is 1.60%. See attached proposal summary for this option.

Option B: The interest rate shall be a bank qualified tax exempt fixed rate of 2.08% for the term of the loan, provided the loan is closed by September

25, 2020. Interest will be calculated on a 30/360 day count basis.

The City shall also retain the option to select a 20 year Assumable Rate Conversion (ARC) Index loan based on the Index on the day of closing plus 150 basis points (1.50%) X 0.79. The indicative rate as of August 20,

2020 is 1.875%. See attached proposal summary for this option.

Repayment Terms: Options A & B: Interest payments on the outstanding principal balance

may be paid semi-annually or quarterly beginning April 1, 2021. The City shall determine prior to closing their preference of quarterly or semi-annually. Principal shall be payable annually beginning October 1, 2021

based on the preliminary amortization schedule attached (see Addendum

"A"), with any changes subject to the Bank's approval.

Prepayment Penalty:

Option A: The City will incur a 1.00% prepayment penalty of the outstanding principal balance if the Series 2020 loan is paid in full during the first 3 years of the loan. Principal reductions in excess of the determined amortization schedule will also be subject to the 1.00% prepayment penalty for the first 3 years of the loan.

Option B: The City will incur a 1.50% prepayment penalty of the outstanding principal balance if the Series 2020 loan is paid in full during the first three years of the term, followed by 1% for the second three years. Principal reductions in excess of the determined amortization schedule will also be subject to the 1.50% prepayment penalty for the first 3 years of the loan, and 1.00% for the second 3 years.

If the City selects one of the "ARC" Index options noted above, the Borrower may make additional principal reduction payments subject to yield maintenance provisions, which will be equal to the difference in the net present value using the initial fixed rate less the net present value using the current market fixed rate of the amount of interest that would have accrued on the prepaid amount had the prepaid amount remained outstanding until its nominal payment date at the time of prepayment. If the prepayment amount is greater than zero, it will be paid by the Borrower to the Bank; if the prepayment amount is zero or less than zero, the Bank will pay the Borrower (see attached examples).

Late Fees:

Bank may, at its option collect from the Borrower a late charge of five percent (5.00%) of any payment not received by Bank within ten (10) days after the payment is due.

Event of Default:

Upon an event of default as described in the Bond Resolution, the holder may recover from the Borrower all expenses incurred including without limitation reasonable attorney's fees, at all levels of the proceedings, whether incurred in connection with collection, bankruptcy, proceedings, trial, appeal or otherwise. Remedies shall include acceleration in the event of payment default greater than 30 days past due or in the event other covenant debt is accelerated for any reason. The Bank shall have the remedies upon default granted to the holders of any existing or future parity debt, including the Series 2016 Bond, during the period(s) such parity debt is outstanding.

Default Rate:

3% above the Note rate.

Bank Fees:

Bank fees including its bond counsel review shall not exceed \$5,000. It is understood that Bryant Miller Olive P.A. will prepare the documents on behalf of the Borrower with the Borrower bearing all closing costs. This shall include delivering to the Bank an opinion by Bond Counsel to ensure compliance by the County with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), and to qualify interest on the 2020 Notes for exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes as set forth in the opinion of Bond Counsel on the Series 2020 Note, which shall be satisfactorily reviewed by Bank's Bond Counsel.

Warranties:

- 2) Formal approval and authorization from the City of Belle Isle, Florida City Council for the Series 2020 Note.

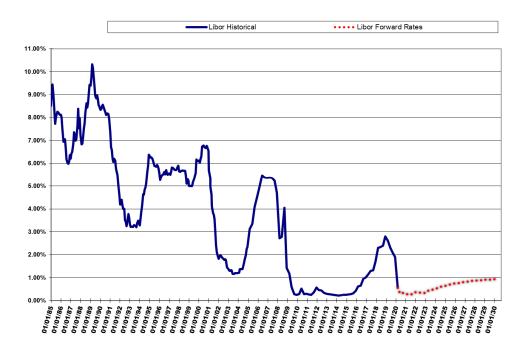

The breakeven or symmetrical yield maintenance prepayment provision associated with a hedge is a borrower-friendly or equitable prepayment calculation because it allows the borrower to collect a fee if rates rise and the loan/hedge combination is prepaid. 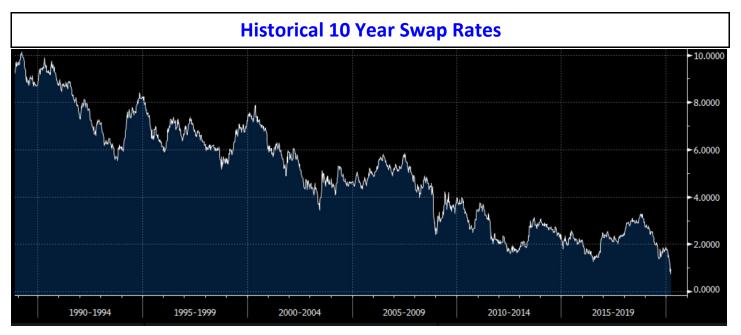

Considerations for a borrower when contemplating ARC:

- Does the borrower intend to hold the loan for a substantial portion of the contractual term?
- May the borrower need to transfer the hedge to another loan with the lender in the future?
- Can the borrower's cash flow support debt service on a variable basis in a rising rate environment?
- Are rates more likely to rise or fall in the future? Upon loan/hedge prepayment, if rates rise, the borrower is paid a prepayment fee, if rates fall, the borrower must pay a prepayment fee.



Note that this prepayment provision is in line with a borrower's motivation for fixed rate protection. If rates rise as expected, the borrower will collect a fee upon partial or full prepayment.

Considerations for a borrower when contemplating ARC:

RESOLUTION OF THE **CITY** OF **BELLE** ISLE, FLORIDA, SUPPLEMENTING ORDINANCE NO. 20-10, ENACTED ON AUGUST 18, **AUTHORIZED** THE **BORROWING OF** AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF ITS NOT TO EXCEED \$2,600,000 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT REVENUE NOTE, SERIES 2020, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING THE ACQUISITION OF ONE OR MORE PARCELS OF LAND AND THE IMPROVEMENTS LOCATED THEREON AND/OR THE CONSTRUCTION, ACQUISITION, AND EQUIPPING OF CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS OF THE ISSUER, EACH AS MORE FULLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; AUTHORIZING THE NEGOTIATED SALE OF SUCH NOTE TO CENTERSTATE BANK, N.A., PURSUANT TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF A LOAN AGREEMENT BY AND AMONG THE FLORIDA MUNICIPAL LOAN COUNCIL, THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AND CENTERSTATE BANK, N.A.; APPROVING THE FORM OF AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF THE LOAN AGREEMENT; DESIGNATING THE NOTE AS A "QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATION;" MAKING CERTAIN OTHER COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH NOTE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, participating governmental units have created the Florida Municipal Loan Council (the "Council") pursuant to a certain Interlocal Agreement and pursuant to Chapter 163, Part I, Florida Statutes, for the purpose of issuing its bonds to make loans to participating governmental units for qualified projects; and

WHEREAS, the City of Belle Isle, Florida (the "Issuer") is a municipal corporation duly created and existing pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Florida (the "State"); and

WHEREAS, on August 18, 2020, the Issuer duly enacted Ordinance No. 20-10 (the "Ordinance") authorizing the borrowing of money to finance (i) the acquisition of one or more parcels of land and the improvements located thereon to be used for a municipal purpose, including, but not limited to, use as a police station or a charter school, and/or (ii) the construction, acquisition, and equipping of certain capital improvements of the Issuer, including, but not limited to, stormwater improvements (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Issuer is authorized pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution of the State, Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, the Charter of the Issuer, the Ordinance, and other applicable provisions of law, each as amended, to borrow funds to finance the costs of the Project (the "Loan"); and

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WHEREAS, it is determined that it is necessary and desirable and in the best interest of the inhabitants of the Issuer to finance the Project, and that the Project serves a public purpose;

WHEREAS, it is determined that it is necessary and desirable and in the best interest of the Issuer to issue its not to exceed \$2,600,000 City of Belle Isle, Florida Capital Improvement Revenue Note, Series 2020 (the "Note") pursuant to a Loan Agreement, by and among the Issuer, the Council, and CenterState Bank, N.A. (the "Lender"), in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "Loan Agreement"), to finance the costs of the Project and pay the transaction costs associated with the issuance of the Note; and

WHEREAS, debt service on the Note and any other amounts due under the Loan Agreement will be secured by a covenant to budget and appropriate legally available non-ad valorem revenues of the Issuer (the "Non-Ad Valorem Revenues"), as further described in the Ordinance, this Resolution, and in the Loan Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Non-Ad Valorem Revenues are estimated to be sufficient to pay all principal of and interest on the Note, as the same becomes due, and to make all other deposits or payments required by the Ordinance, this Resolution, and the Loan Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer received proposals from a number of financial institutions in response to the Issuer's request for proposals, dated July 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is determined that it is necessary and desirable and in the best interest of the Issuer to authorize the Mayor, or his or her duly authorized designee, to accept the offer from the Lender to extend credit to the Issuer by obtaining a loan evidenced by the Note upon the terms and conditions set forth in the Ordinance, this Resolution, the Loan Agreement, and in the term sheet, dated August 21, 2020, submitted by the Lender with respect to the Note, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Loan Commitment"); and

WHEREAS, due to the present volatility of the market for tax-exempt obligations such as the Note and the complexity of the transactions relating to the Note, including the duration of the Note and the relatively small size of the principal amount of the Note, it is in the best interest of the Issuer that the Note be issued on a negotiated basis to the Lender; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer will be provided all applicable disclosure information by the Lender as required by Section 218.385, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Note shall not constitute a general obligation, or a pledge of the faith, credit, or taxing power of the Issuer, the State, or any political subdivision thereof, within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory provisions. Neither the State, nor any political subdivision thereof, nor the Issuer shall be obligated to (i) exercise its ad valorem taxing power in any form on any real or personal property of or in the Issuer to pay the principal of and interest on the Note, or any other amounts due under the Loan Agreement, or (ii) to pay the

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same from any other funds of the Issuer except from the Non-Ad Valorem Revenues budgeted and appropriated and deposited to the debt service fund established in the Loan Agreement, all in the manner provided in this Resolution and the Loan Agreement. The Note shall not constitute a lien on any property owned or situated within the limits of the Issuer.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, as follows:

SECTION 1. ADOPTION OF REPRESENTATIONS. The foregoing Whereas paragraphs are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true, and the same are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution.

SECTION 2. AUTHORITY. This Resolution is adopted pursuant to the Constitution of the State, Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, the Charter of the Issuer, the Ordinance, and other applicable provisions of law, each as amended (collectively, the "Act").

SECTION 3. AUTHORIZATION OF THE PROJECT. The Issuer does hereby authorize the Project.

SECTION 4. AUTHORIZATION OF THE LOAN AGREEMENT. To provide for the security of the Note and to express the contract between the parties to the Loan Agreement, the Issuer does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor or Vice Mayor of the Issuer, or their duly authorized designee (the "Mayor"), as attested by the City Clerk of the Issuer, or his or her duly authorized designee (the "City Clerk"), and approved as to form by the City Attorney, or his or her duly authorized designee (the "City Attorney"), if required, to execute and deliver the Loan Agreement and to undertake all actions in respect to the Loan Agreement, which is in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, with such changes, amendments, modifications, deletions, and additions as may be approved by the Mayor, after consultation with the City Attorney, the execution thereof being conclusive evidence of such approval.

SECTION 5. AUTHORIZATION OF THE NOTE. Subject and pursuant to the provisions of this Resolution, the Ordinance, and the terms and provisions of the Loan Agreement, an obligation of the Issuer to be designated as "City of Belle Isle, Florida Capital Improvement Revenue Note, Series 2020" is hereby authorized to be issued, which Note shall evidence amounts outstanding under the Loan Agreement and will be repaid in accordance with the terms of the Loan Agreement. The proceeds of the Note shall be used for the principal purpose of financing all or a portion of the costs of the Project and paying certain costs of issuance incurred with respect to the Loan, which such costs shall include costs of issuance incurred by the Issuer, the Lender, and the Council.

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SECTION 6. DESCRIPTION OF THE NOTE.

- (A) The Note is to be issued as a single, fully registered note in a principal amount of not to exceed \$2,600,000, shall be dated its date of delivery, and shall mature on October 1, 2040 (the "Maturity Date"). The Note shall bear a fixed interest rate of 2.08% per annum (subject to adjustment as described in the Note), and interest shall be payable on each April 1 and October 1, commencing April 1, 2021, and thereafter until the principal amount of the Note has been paid. Interest shall be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of 12 months of 30 days each. Principal shall be payable on October 1, commencing on October 1, 2021, and thereafter, through and including, the Maturity Date.
- (B) The Note shall be subject to optional prepayment as set forth in the Loan Agreement.

SECTION 7. EXECUTION OF THE NOTE. The Note shall be executed in the name of the Issuer with the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor, and the official seal of the Issuer shall be imprinted thereon, attested, countersigned, and authenticated with the manual or facsimile signature of the City Clerk, and approved as to form and legal sufficiency by the City Attorney, if necessary. In case any one or more of the officers who shall have signed or sealed the Note, or whose facsimile signature shall appear thereon, shall cease to be such officer of the Issuer before the Note so signed and sealed has been actually sold and delivered, such Note may nevertheless be sold and delivered as herein provided and may be issued as if the person who signed or sealed such Note had not ceased to hold such office. The Note may be signed and sealed on behalf of the Issuer by such person who at the actual time of the execution of such Note shall hold the proper office of the Issuer, although, at the date of such Note, such person may not have held such office or may not have been so authorized. The Issuer may adopt and use for such purposes the facsimile signatures of any such persons who shall have held such offices at any time after the date of the adoption of this Resolution, notwithstanding that either or both shall have ceased to hold such office at the time the Note shall be actually sold and delivered.

SECTION 8. FORM OF THE NOTE. The text of the Note shall be in substantially the form set forth on Exhibit C of the Loan Agreement with such changes, amendments, modifications, deletions, and additions as may be approved by the Mayor, upon consultation with the City Attorney, the execution thereof being conclusive evidence of such approval.

SECTION 9. NEGOTIATED SALE OF THE NOTE.

(A) Due to the present volatility of the market for tax-exempt obligations such as the Note and the complexity of the transactions relating to the Note, including the duration of the Note and the relatively small size of the principal amount of the Note, it is in the best interest of the Issuer that the Note be issued on a negotiated basis to the Lender.

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(B) Prior to the issuance of the Note, the Issuer shall receive from the Lender a Lender Certificate, substantially in the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u> and a Disclosure Letter containing the information required by section 218.385, Florida Statutes, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit D.

SECTION 10. PAYMENT OF THE NOTE; LIMITED OBLIGATION.

- (A) The principal of and interest on the Note shall be secured by a covenant to budget and appropriate legally available Non-Ad Valorem Revenues in accordance with the Ordinance, this Resolution, and the Loan Agreement.
- (B) THE FULL FAITH AND CREDIT OF THE ISSUER, THE STATE, OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THEREOF, ARE NOT PLEDGED TO THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE NOTE, AND ALL OTHER AMOUNTS DUE UNDER THE LOAN AGREEMENT, AND HOLDERS SHALL NEVER HAVE THE RIGHT TO REQUIRE OR COMPEL THE EXERCISE OF ANY TAXING POWER OF THE ISSUER, THE STATE, OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THEREOF, TO THE PAYMENT OF SUCH PRINCIPAL OR INTEREST, OR ALL OTHER AMOUNTS DUE UNDER THE LOAN AGREEMENT. THE NOTE AND THE OBLIGATION EVIDENCED THEREBY SHALL NOT CONSTITUTE A LIEN UPON ANY PROPERTY OF THE ISSUER, AND SHALL BE PAYABLE FROM AND SECURED SOLELY BY THE NON-AD VALOREM REVENUES ACTUALLY BUDGETED, APPROPRIATED, AND DEPOSITED INTO A DEBT SERVICE FUND ESTABLISHED FOR SUCH PURPOSE, ALL IN THE MANNER AND TO THE EXTENT DESCRIBED IN THIS RESOLUTION AND THE LOAN AGREEMENT. THE NOTE SHALL NOT BE OR CONSTITUTE A GENERAL OBLIGATION OR INDEBTEDNESS OF THE ISSUER AS "BONDS" WITHIN THE MEANING OF ANY CONSTITUTIONAL OR STATUTORY PROVISION.

SECTION 11. OTHER INSTRUMENTS. The Mayor, the City Clerk, the City Manager, the City Finance Director, the City Attorney, and other officers, attorneys, and other agents and employees of the Issuer are hereby authorized to perform all acts and things required of them by the Ordinance, this Resolution and the Loan Agreement or desirable or consistent with the requirements thereof and hereof, for the full, punctual, and complete performance of all of the terms, covenants, and agreements contained in the Note, the Ordinance, this Resolution, and the Loan Agreement, and they are hereby authorized to execute and deliver all documents which shall be required by note counsel, the Financial Advisor, or the Council to effectuate the issuance of the Note. All action taken to date by the officers, attorneys, and any other agents and employees of the Issuer in furtherance of the issuance of the Note is hereby approved, confirmed, and ratified.

SECTION 12. BANK QUALIFIED. The Issuer hereby designates the Note in the amount which is issued hereunder, which shall be an amount not to exceed \$2,600,000 (which together with any previous tax-exempt debt of the Issuer issued in the calendar year 2020 totals less than

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\$10,000,000) as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. There are no entities which are subordinate to or which issue obligations on behalf of the Issuer. The Issuer hereby covenants and agrees not to take any action or to fail to take any action if such action or failure would cause the Note to no longer be a "qualified tax-exempt obligation."

SECTION 13. SEVERABILITY AND INVALID PROVISIONS. If any one or more of the covenants, agreements, or provisions herein contained shall be held contrary to any express provision of law or contrary to the policy of express law, though not expressly prohibited, or against public policy, or shall for any reason whatsoever be held invalid, then such covenants, agreements, or provisions shall be null and void and shall be deemed separable from the remaining covenants, agreements, or provisions and shall in no way affect the validity of any of the other provisions hereof.

SECTION 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

Background: The Council directed the City Staff to draft an ordinance to allow the use of golf carts on City streets. The proposed ordinance was discussed at the August 4, 2020 meeting, changes were made by the Council and incorporated in the new draft which was read for the first time at the August 4th Council Meeting.

The staff is preparing a registration packet with will include an information brochure. We expect this to be done by October 1, 2020. At that time cart owners will be able to have their carts inspected for safety requirements and registered that they have passed the safety requirements. The staff will also contact HOAs with the information. If carts have not been inspected or display the safety inspection sticker, the BIPD will give them a warning and direct them on how to register their carts.

However since the Council is allowing carts on certain streets, the ordinance has to be reviewed by FDOT prior to the use of carts on the sidewalks at Conway.

Staff Recommendation: Discuss the proposed ordinance and make any necessary changes or move to read the ordinance for a second time and adopt it at the next Council Meeting.

Suggested Motion: <u>I move that we read Ordinance 20-11 for the second time and</u> adopt it.

Alternatives: Do not move forward with the ordinance.

Fiscal Impact: TBD based on the number of carts to register.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-11

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, ADOPTING A NEW ARTICLE V OF CHAPTER 30 OF THE CITY CODE AUTHORIZING THE USE OF GOLF CARTS WITHIN **COMMUNITIES AND** ON **STREETS CERTAIN** RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE **DESIGNATED IN CITY** COMMISSION; AUTHORIZING USE OF GOLF CARTS ON **CERTAIN** SIDEWALKS; **PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS**; PROVIDING FOR **REGULATION OF** THE GOLF CARTS, INCLUDING THE HOURS OF OPERATION; PROVIDING FOR THE **ESTABLISHMENT** OF AN APPLICATION PROCESS, **AGE** REGULATIONS, **REOUIRED** SIGNAGE, VIOLATIONS **AND** PENALTIES, AND APPEALS TO THE HEARING **BOARD: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY**; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission has the authority to authorize the operation of golf carts and regulate such operation within its jurisdictional boundaries pursuant to Article VIII, § 2(b) of the Florida Constitution and Section 166.221 and Section 316.212, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, citizens of the City have expressed an interest in allowing golf carts to be driven upon certain streets subject to City jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the operation of golf carts upon streets subject to City jurisdiction is ordinarily prohibited unless otherwise authorized by the City pursuant to Section 316.212 and Section 316.008, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to add a new Article V of Chapter 30 of the City's Code of Ordinances to allow for the City Commission to consider and approve resolutions authorizing the operation of golf carts within specified residential communities and roadways meeting safety requirements under state and municipal law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 316.212(7), Florida Statutes the City has undertaken to pass additional regulations pertaining to unlicensed drivers who desire to operate golf carts upon City roadways and sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 316.212(8)(b)(1) the City Commission has determined that, after considering the condition and current use of the sidewalks and the character of the area, that golf carts, bicycles, and pedestrians may safely share the sidewalk in areas where the sidewalks are at least 8 feet in width; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that Section 316.212(8)(b)(2), Florida Statutes requires the City to consult with the Florida Department of Transportation before adopting any ordinance permitting operation of golf carts on sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, the City has consulted with and received approval from the Florida Department of Transportation before adopting this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens, the City desires to prohibit the operation of golf carts along roads and thoroughfares incompatible with such operation and regulate the manner and times of the operation of golf carts upon streets subject to City jurisdiction where such operation is authorized; and

WHEREAS, the City is cognizant of the provisions of Article III, Section 3.12, of the City Charter, which requires that all grants, renewals, or extensions of franchises requires passage of an ordinance relating to same; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Belle Isle, Florida as follows:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct, shall constitute the legislative findings of the City, and are hereby made a part of this ordinance.

SECTION 2. <u>City Code Amendment.</u> Sections 30-163, 30-170, 30-171, 30-172, 30-173, 30-174, 30-175, 30-176, 30-177, 30-178 and 30-179 are hereby created as follows (words that are <u>stricken out</u> are deletions; words that are <u>underlined</u> are additions; and all other provisions shall remain unchanged):

ARTICLE IV. – IV. TOWING AND IMMOBILIZATION OF VEHICLES

<u>Section 30-163 – 169. Reserved.</u>

ARTICLE V. – GOLF CARTS ON PUBLIC STREETS

Section 30-170. – Title; Authority.

(a) This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Belle Isle Golf Cart Ordinance."

(b) The City has the authority to adopt this article pursuant to Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of Florida, Chapter 166, Florida Statutes and Section 316.212, Florida Statutes.

Section 30-171. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Golf Cart means a motor vehicle that is designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course for sporting or recreational purposes and that is not capable of exceeding speeds of twenty (20) miles per hour.

Golf Cart Community means a subdivision or community within the corporate limits of the city within which the Belle Isle City Commission has by resolution authorized the operation of golf carts on designated municipal streets within such subdivision or community.

Golf Cart Permitted Street means a municipal street within the corporate limits of the city which has been designated by resolution of the Belle Isle City Commission for use by golf carts.

Applicant means a person or entity, including a homeowner's or community association, that is requesting that the Belle Isle City Commission adopt a resolution designating one or more Golf Cart Communities and/or one or more Golf Cart Permitted Streets.

Section 30-172. Golf Cart Operation.

- (a) It shall be unlawful to operate a golf cart on any street or sidewalk within the corporate limits of the City unless expressly authorized by this article or Florida law.
- (b) Golf carts may be operated on city roadways within the defined boundaries of residential communities when such communities are approved by resolution as "golf cart communities. Golf carts may also be operated between golf cart communities that are adjacent, if such provision is specifically included by the city commission in the approving resolution. Golf carts may also be operated on streets meeting the requirements of this section once such street has been approved by resolution as a "golf cart permitted street."

- (c) "Golf cart permitted streets" and "golf cart communities" are subject to the following requirements:
 - (1) <u>Unless otherwise expressly authorized pursuant to Florida law or by enabling resolution upon a showing of good cause, golf carts shall not be permitted operate upon a street with a posted speed limit in excess of thirty-five (35) miles per hour.</u>
 - (2) <u>Unless otherwise expressly authorized pursuant to Florida law or by enabling resolution upon a showing of good cause, golf carts may not be operated across street with a posted speed limit of thirty-five (35) miles per hour or greater.</u>
 - (3) Notwithstanding subsection (c)(2), golf carts traveling along a designated golf cart permitted street may be permitted cross an intersecting street with a speed limit of thirty-five (35) miles per hour or less at an intersection that governed by a traffic control device or at a designated crosswalk if such use complies with the requirements of this article and Florida law.
- (d) Golf carts may be operated upon the sidewalks within the jurisdictional territory of the City subject to the following restrictions and requirements:
 - (1) The maximum speed for golf carts on sidewalks is fifteen (15) miles per hour.
 - (2) Golf carts operated upon sidewalks must meet the equipment requirements of Section 172(e)(2) and (3).
 - (3) Golf carts may only be operated on the sidewalks which are at least eight (8) feet wide.
- (e) It shall be unlawful to operate a golf cart upon any City street or City sidewalk unless said golf cart is equipped with efficient brakes, reliable steering apparatus, horn, safe tires, a rearview mirror, and reflective warning devices in both the front and rear as required by Section 316.212(6), Florida Statutes.
- (f) Except as provided in Section 30-172 (f)(1), it shall be unlawful to operate a golf cart upon any City street or sidewalk after sunset and before sunrise.

- (1) Golf carts equipped with headlights, brake lights, turn signals and a windshield may be operated upon City streets and upon City sidewalks at any time.
- (g) This article is in addition to and not in lieu of the Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law, Chapter 316 of the Florida Statutes. Golf carts shall comply with all applicable state traffic laws and provisions of this Code and may be ticketed for traffic violations in the same manner as motor vehicles.

Section 30-173. Application for Approval of a Golf Cart Community and/or Golf Cart Permitted Streets.

- (a) The City Commission may, upon its own initiative or upon petition of an Applicant, direct City staff to create a map or other diagram delineating the boundaries of a Golf Cart Community and/or Golf Cart Permitted Streets and to prepare the appropriate resolution to be presented to the City Commission. Any such resolution shall be acted upon only following an advertised public hearing preceded by at least seven (7) days' notice thereof.
- (b) To receive approval, any resolution proposed under this Article must be include the requisite legislative findings as required by Section 316.212, Florida Statutes, and a plan for the placement of the requisite signage within the Golf Cart Community and the Golf Cart Permitted Streets.
- (c) The City Commission may approve or disapprove any resolution presented under this article based upon its legislative determination as to whether golf carts may safely travel on or cross the public road or street, considering factors including the speed, volume and character of motor vehicles using the road or street and such other factors as the City Commission may deem appropriate, including input received at any public hearing.
- (d) The City Commission may by resolution rescind a previously adopted resolution if the City Commission determines that the operation of golf carts within any such Golf Cart Community and/or Golf Cart Permitted Streets would constitute or has become a danger or detriment to the health, safety, welfare, or character of the community or the surrounding area. Any such resolution shall be acted upon only following an advertised public hearing preceded by at least seven (7) days' notice thereof.

Section 30-174. Age Regulations.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for an unlicensed driver under eighteen (18) years of age to operate a golf cart within the City.
- (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), an unlicensed driver under eighteen (18) years of age who possesses a valid state-issued learner's permit may operate a golf cart shall be permitted to operate a golf cart within the City subject to the following requirements:
 - (1) The unlicensed driver under eighteen (18) years of age must be accompanied by another person who is at least 21 years of age and who holds a valid state-issued driver's license.
 - (2) The person accompanying the unlicensed driver under eighteen (18) years of age must occupy seat immediately to the right of the unlicensed driver.
 - (3) Except for the licensed occupant described in section 30-174(b)(1), an unlicensed driver shall not operate a golf cart occupied by passengers.
 - (4) An unlicensed driver shall not operate a golf cart between sunset and sunrise.

Section 30-175. Signage.

(a) The City shall provide proper signage pursuant to Section 316.212(1), Florida Statutes, within thirty (30) days of approval of a resolution to allow golf carts to be operated within a Golf Cart Community or on a Golf Cart Permitted Street.

Section 30-176. Parking of Golf Carts.

- (a) It shall be unlawful to park or leave unattended a golf cart in or upon a city street, right-of-way, sidewalk, or public park. Golf carts may not be parked upon private property that is not owned or leased by the owner of such golf cart without the permission of such private property owner.
- (b) Golf carts shall comply with all parking regulations set forth in this Chapter 30.

Sec. 30-177. Indemnification

(a) Each person operating or riding on a golf cart on city streets and all person who are passengers in such golf carts does so at his own risk and must operate such vehicle with due regard for the safety and convenience of other motor vehicles, bicyclists and pedestrians.

(b) The City in so designating certain City streets for the operation of the golf carts extends such operating privileges on the express condition that the operator of such golf carts undertakes such operation at his own risk and assumes sole liability for operating the vehicle on City streets and by such operation shall be deemed to agree to defend, release, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Belle Isle, its officials and employees for and regarding any and all claims, demands or damages of any nature whatsoever arising from such operation by any person against the City of Belle Isle.

Section 30-178. Compliance; Enforcement.

- (a) The City of Belle Isle Police Department shall have power and authority to enforce the provisions of this article. Any person found in violation of this article shall be issued a City of Belle Isle Civil Citation (or notice of violation).
- (b) In addition to any fine levied under this article, the city may bring civil suit to restrain, enjoin or otherwise prevent the violation of this article in a court of competent jurisdiction. If the city brings suit to restrain or enjoin or to otherwise prevent the violation of this article, the city is entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs from the named defendant in the action.

Section 30-179. Violations; Penalties.

(a) With the exception of Section 30-176, violations of this article shall constitute a non-criminal infraction punishable pursuant to the provisions of §316.212(9), Florida Statutes. The use of a golf cart resulting in violations of the Florida "Uniform Traffic Control" statute and the Florida "Uniform Disposition of Traffic Infractions Act" are punishable pursuant to chapters 316, 318, and 319, Florida Statutes, as applicable.

(b) Violations.

- (1) Violations of Section 172(a), (d), and (f) shall be a noncriminal traffic violation, punishable pursuant to Chapter 318, Florida Statutes, as a moving violation.
- (2) <u>Violations of Section 172(e) shall be a noncriminal traffic violation punishable pursuant to Chapter 318, Florida Statutes, as a nonmoving violation.</u>
- (3) Violations of Section 30-174 shall be punishable by a \$100 fine.

- (4) <u>Violations of Section 30-176 shall be punishable in accordance with the provisions Article III of Chapter 30 of the Belle Isle Code in the same manner as motor vehicle parking violations.</u>
- (c) <u>Unless specifically provided otherwise by Florida law or this code, a violation of this article shall be punishable by a fine in the amount of \$100.</u>
- (d) Any person receiving civil citation pursuant to this article shall, within 21 days of the date of the notice of violation, pay the assessed civil penalty pursuant to instructions on the notice of violation contest (or appeal) the notice of violation pursuant to the procedures set forth in the notice of violation.

Section 30-180. Appeals.

- (a) The Chief of Police may void or dismiss the notice of violation being appealed if the Chief of Police or his designee determines based on a review of the appeal that there does not exist probable cause to believe that the appellant committed a violation of this Article.
- (b) If the Chief of Police voids or dismisses the notice of violation as aforesaid, then written notice of such action shall be provided to the person filing the appeal.
- (c) If the decision of the Chief is appealed, the appeal will follow the procedures pursuant to Sec. 30-76.
- **SECTION 3.** <u>Codification</u>. This Ordinance shall be codified into the Belle Isle City Code. Any section, paragraph number, letter and/or any heading may be changed or modified as necessary to effectuate the foregoing. Grammatical, typographical and similar or like errors may be corrected, and additions, alterations, and omissions not affecting the construction or meaning of this ordinance or the Belle Isle City Code may be freely made.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether for substantive, procedural, or any other reason, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 5.** <u>Conflicts</u>. In the event of a conflict or conflicts between this Ordinance and any other ordinance or provision of law, this Ordinance controls to the extent of the conflict to the maximum extent allowable under the law.

Subject: Changes to Home Occupation Ordinance

Background: The City Council directed that the City staff review and revise the BIMC that deals with Home Occupations. In the current Zoning Ordinance home occupations are regulated through Section 50-103, Accessory Uses. It is necessary to rewrite this portion of the BIMC and Sections in Chapter 28, Taxation for three major reasons: the current regulations are too open to interpretation which leads to confusion for the issuer, the applicant, and those neighboring the applicant; the current regulations prohibit many activities related to home occupations which would be good for the economic development of the community, but would not negatively impact nearby residents; and the current regulations allow for certain activities related to home occupations that have proven to be irritating to nearby residents, generating numerous complaints to the City.

Home occupations can be very beneficial to the community when governed by zoning regulation that permit as broad of an array of home occupations as possible without negatively impacting the surrounding neighborhood. Home occupations are an important part of any local economy. They are a critical component of the local economy to grow through entrepreneurial activities of its residents. They foster the establishment of new business by eliminating the need for some small businesses to rent commercial space, a factor which could make all the difference to a new business.

Allowing to work from home can save commuting and child care costs, and can give those who might be unable to work outside the home, including single parents, the elderly and the disabled, an opportunity to earn a living. However, any benefits of home occupations must be balanced that neighbors are not disturbed by excessive noise, odors, light, traffic, and other nuisances that are not characteristic of a residential area. Current regulations prohibit a number of activities that are associated with home occupations that are no more disruptive to the surrounding neighborhood than activities already permitted as part of the allowed residential land use by special exception.

While there are many benefits to home occupations, they also do have the potential to disrupt the residential character of the surrounding area. Current regulations have not adequately addressed all activities related to home occupations that can be disruptive to the neighbors, particularly in regards to vehicles, parking, and number of visitors (customers/clients) related to home occupations. Current regulations do not address this issue at all. As a result, there have been a number of instances where parking, vehicles, and number of client/customer visits have generated numerous complaints from neighbors.

The current regulations also do not provide a way for neighbors to know that someone has applied for a home occupation permit and there is no recourse for them if they object to the home occupation.

Staff Recommendation: Move forward with the proposed changes to the BIMC

Suggested Motion: <u>I move that we read (for the 2nd time) and adopt Ordinance 20-12.</u>

Alternatives: Do not accept the changes and suggest other changes to the code.

ORDINANCE 20-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE BELLE ISLE LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE, CHAPTER 28, ARTICLE IV, SECTION 28-91 – OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE REQUIRED, AND SECTION 28-94 – ISSUANCE; TRANSFERABILITY AND CHAPTER 50, ARTICLE IV – ACCESSORY STRUCTURE; SECTION 28-99 - REVOCATION AND USES, SECTION 50-103 – ACCESSORY USES; PROVIDING FOR AN APPEAL PROCESS AND PROCEDURES; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council has found and determined that the adoption of this Ordinance is in the interests of the public health, safety and welfare, will aid in the harmonious, orderly and progressive development of the City, and serves a valid public purpose.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida as follows:

Sec. 28-91. – Occupational License Required.

An occupational license tax for the privilege of engaging in or managing any business, profession or occupation within the corporate limits of the city is required and shall be levied on:

- (1) Any person who maintains a permanent business location or branch office within the city, for the privilege of engaging in or managing any business within its jurisdiction.
- (2) Any person who maintains a permanent business location or branch office within the city, for the privilege of engaging in or managing any profession or occupation within its jurisdiction.
- (3) Any person who does not qualify under subsection (1) or subsection (2) of this section and who transacts any business or engages in any occupation or profession in interstate commerce, if the license tax is not prohibited by US Const. art. I, § 8.

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(4) Any person engaged in home occupation within the jurisdiction, Home Occupation shall be licenses under Section 50-103(a).

Sec. 50-103. - Accessory uses.

(a) Home occupation.

(1)	It is the purpose of his section to provide for the orderly conduct of a limited commercial
	activity on property otherwise zoned for residential purposes. Such activity shall not be of a
	nature that would impose any disruption to the quality of life, safety, character health
	welfare or appearance of a residential neighborhood.

- (2) Any use conducted entirely within a dwelling unit including the garage area, and carried on by an occupant thereof, which use is clearly incidental and secondary accessory to the use of the dwelling residence for dwelling purposes and does not change the character thereof. ; and provided that all of the following requirements are met. This also includes the garage area and only if the garage door remains closed.
 - Letter from the city manager or the city manager's designee approving a business as a home occupation.
 - b. County occupational license.
- (3) All business occupations, trades or professions qualifying as home occupations under this chapter shall exist and operate subject to the following provisions, conditions and <u>restrictions:</u> The city manager or the city manager's designee may issue a letter approving a business as a home occupations provided that the applicant agrees to the following conditions:
 - a. Only such commodities made on the premises may be sold on the premises. All such sales of home occupation work or products shall be conducted within a building. Home

- occupations that market commodities via the internet, telephone or other off-site advertising may sell commodities produced off premises so long as said commodities are drop shipped to the client/customer. Shipment and delivery of products, merchandise, or supplies shall be limited to the hours of 7:00am and 7:00pm in single rear axle vehicles.
- b. There shall be no outdoor display, or storage of merchandise or products, nor shall there be any display visible from the outside of the building.
- c. No person shall be engaged in any such home occupation other than members of the immediate family residing on the premises. Written consent by the owner of the property is required to engage in any form of home occupation by a tenant at the time of application.
- d. No mechanical equipment or machinery shall be used or stored on the premises in connection with the home occupation, except such that is normally used for purely domestic or household purposes. Examples include, but not limited to, cement mixers, tractors, welding or create excessive noise, smoke, fumes, odor, or vibration.
- e. No more than 25 percent of the floor area of the first floor shall be used for home occupation purposes. <u>Interior alterations are allowed as long as alterations do not result in the eliminations of the kitchen, dining area, bathrooms, living room or the bedrooms in the residence.</u>
- f. No sign shall be used other than one nonilluminated nameplate attached to the building entrance, and such plate shall not exceed one square foot in area.
- g. Fabrication of articles, by way of example and not by way of limitation such articles commonly classified under the term "arts and handicrafts," may be deemed a home occupation.

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- h. By way of example and not by way of limitation, barbershops, beauty parlors, plant nurseries, tearooms, food processing, restaurants, sale of antiques, commercial kennels, real estate offices, day care, pain management clinics, or insurance offices shall not be allowed as home occupations.
- i. No home occupation shall be permitted wherein group instruction or group assembly or activity is involved. To that end, no dance instruction, exercise class or similar activities.
- j. No alteration of the residential character of the premises be made, and the home occupations shall not be allowed to create a nuisance or to create any undue disturbance.
- k. No business, trade, profession ro occupation shall qualify as a home occupation if it will generate noise which is audible beyond the property lines of the property upon which the promise if located.
- No business, trade, profession, or occupation which generates vehicular trips or visitors
 to the premises exceeding 10 (ten) per day shall qualify as a home occupation.
 Instruction based home occupations may receive one (1) student/customer at a time, by appointment only.
- m. No vehicles which display advertising relating to the business on the premises may be utilized so as to avoid the restriction or signs contained above.
- No more than three (3) passenger vehicles may be parked on or about the premises at any one time. Off street parking must be provided on a hard surface as provided in Section 30-73 and 30-133. The home occupation shall not generate excessive vehicular traffic or parking.
- o. As a condition for granting of the home occupation license. The licensee agrees the City is authorized to conduct an inspection during normal business hours, with sufficient

notice to the licensee, for the purpo	se of determining	whether or not th	e provisions of
this Code section are being complied	d with.		

- p. <u>Use of the garage or any activity associated with the home occupation shall not displace</u> and required parting in currently useable garage.
- (4) Approval of Application; Administrative Procedures. All applications for home occupation permits shall be reviewed y the City Manager or City Manager's designee for compliance with the provisions set forth herein.
 - a. All applicants must provide two proofs of residence; a Florida Driver's License and a utility bill, and a copy of the applicant's lease, if renting the premises.
 - Submitted applications which fail to comply with the provisions of the Code shall be denied, and the applicant notified, in writing, of the denial and the reasons for the denial.
 - c. Applications compliant with all the provisions of this Coe shall be approved upon the posting requirement in Section 50-103(5) below and issued a permit, provided that all written objectives to the application, if any, have been reviewed and found to be without merit and unsupported by fact.
- (5) Posting Required For Posting Application. All applicants for a home occupation permit shall be required o place a notice on the premises, to inform the public that a home occupation permit has been applied for. This notice shall be posted on the premises for ten(1) days prior to the disposition of the permit applications. When the applicant is submitted to the City, a placard will be given to the applicant for posting. It is the applicant's responsibility to post the placard on the premises so it can be seen by the public.
- (6) Appeals and Hearing on Application. Applications which are denied by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee shall b=have the right to appeal to the Planning & Zoning

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Board. Such appeal shall be in writing and delivered to the City Clerk no less than ten (10) days after the denial of the application. The appeal will be placed on the next available

Planning & Zoning Board agenda for action. The Planning & Zoning Board shall be the right to overturn, modify or affirm the decision made by the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee. The Board's decision shall be final.

- (7) Revocation of Home Occupation Permit; Procedure; Conditions.
 - a. Any person may seek revocation of a home occupation permit by making written

 application to the City Manager ot City Manager's designee and an investigation will be

 made to determine whether the permit holder is conducting a home occupation in a

 lawful manner prescribed in this section.
 - b. <u>If the City Manager determines that the permit holder in in violation of the provisions of</u> this section, the City Manager may revoke, suspend, or revise the permit.
 - c. The decision of the City Manager shall be subject to appeal to the Planning & Zoning

 Board as in Section 50-103(b). The decision of the Board is final.
 - d. The following shall be considered as grounds for revoking a home occupational permit.
 - i. Any change in the use or any change in extent or nature of the use or area of the dwelling unit being used, that is different from that specified in the approved home occupation application, this not first approved by the City Manager.
 - ii. The operator of the home occupation must apply for a new home occupation permit prior to any such changes.
 - iii. Any change in use, extent of use, area of the swelling being used. Or mechanical or electrical equipment being use that results in conditions not in

accordance wit the provisions of the require conditions hall result in immediate revocation of the permit.

- (8) The following conditions shall apply for home occupation permits which have been revoked;
 - a. Initial revocation. Reapplication may only occur when the condition(s) causing the revocation has been corrected.
 - b. Second Revocation. Reapplications may only occur after one (1) year and when the condition(s) has been corrected.
 - c. Third Revocation. No permit shall be reissued.

Sec. 28-94. - Issuance; transferability.

- (a) An occupational license is not valid for more than one year and all licenses expire on September 30 of each year, except as otherwise provided by law. No license shall be issued for any fractional portion of any year, however, the rate charged for the initial license issued to a business new to the city after December 31 shall be prorated on a quarterly basis, i.e., a fee of three-quarters the annual rate will be assessed from January 1 through March 31, onehalf the annual rate from April 1 through June 30 and one-fourth the annual rate thereafter for the remainder of the license term.
- (b) Any occupational license may be transferred to a new owner, when there is a bona fide sale of the business, upon payment of a transfer fee of \$3.00 or ten percent of the annual license tax, whichever is greater, up to \$25.00, and presentation of the original license and evidence of the sale.
- (c) Upon written request and presentation of the original license, any license may be transferred from one location to another location within the city upon payment of a transfer fee of \$3.00 or ten percent of the annual license tax, whichever is greater, up to \$25.00.

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(d) Home occupation license are non-transferable and cannot be used by the applicant for any premises other than that premise for which it was originally granted. If a home occupation license is to be transferred to a new owner and/or new location, a new location I a new license needs to be applied for according to Chapter 50, Section 50-103 of the BIMC.

(b) Nonresidential facilities.

- (1) General. Nonresidential businesses may provide amenities for the exclusive use of the employees, clients and/or guest of the primary business on the site.
- (2) Businesses in conjunction with a hotel/motel.
 - a. Restaurants. Restaurants shall be permitted in conjunction with a hotel/motel provided that they are located within the primary building; or if they are in another building, then that building must meet the setback requirements for a primary building. The facility shall be treated as a primary use and subject to the requirements of the zoning district in which it is located.
 - b. Car rental agencies. Car rental agencies shall be permitted in conjunction with a hotel/motel provided that the car rental agency is located within the primary building and that it meets the parking requirements set forth in this Land Development Code.
 - c. Tourist information centers. Tourist information centers may be permitted in a hotel/motel provided that they are located entirely within the primary building. No signs outside of the building are permitted.

Sec. 28-99. - Revocation.

The city council shall have the right and authority to revoke, after legal notice and public hearing, any occupational license granted under this article whenever it is shown that the business is being conducted in such a manner as to be detrimental to the public health, safety or welfare or to the customers and patrons of the licensee. Home occupation licenses shall be revoked according to Chapter 50, Section 50-103 of the BIMC.

SECTION 2. Codification. This Ordinance shall be incorporated into and codified within the Land Development Code of the City of Belle Isle, Florida. Any section, paragraph number, letter and/or any heading may be changed or modified as necessary to effectuate the foregoing. Grammatical, typographical and similar or like errors may be corrected, and additions, alterations, and omissions not affecting the construction or meaning of this ordinance or the Land Development Code may be freely made.

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SECTION 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether for substantive, procedural, or any other reason, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

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SECTION 4. Conflicts. In the event of a conflict or conflicts between this Ordinance and any other ordinance or provision of law, this Ordinance controls to the extent of the conflict, as allowable under the law.
