1. Call to Order and Confirmation of Quorum

Mayor Fouraker called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm, and the Clerk confirmed quorum. Also present were Attorney Langley, City Manager Francis, Chief Houston, and City Clerk Yolanda Quiceno.

2. Invocation and Pledge to Flag - Commissioner Holihan, District 4

Comm Carugno gave the invocation and led the Pledge to the Flag.

3. Consent Items

- a. Approval of City Council Meeting minutes October 5, 2021
- b. Monthly Reports: Red Light Camera, Marine Patrol, and Fire Unit Responses

Comm Gold moved to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Comm Holihan seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

4. Citizen's Comments

Mayor Fouraker called for Citizen Comments.

Comm Holihan requested item 6d be moved under citizen comments for discussion. Council agreed unanimously.

Comm Holihan introduced Larry Maddox. He said Mr. Maddox is an expert in the water sports industry and is here to provide some advice and possible solutions on some of our lake issues.

Mr. Larry Maddox, residing at 4860 Waterswitch Point Drive, Orlando – a 25 year resident on Lake Gaitlan. He is the Chairman of the Water Sports Association and represents towed water sports and all the equipment used in the sport. He just met with FWC and NASWA on all matters about code water sports. He has monitored activities on the lake for the past couple of years. He has recommended some restrictions to have everyone act responsibly and believes in Education over Regulation through a program called Wake Responsibly. He addressed some of the issues and concerns on lake users and suggested no-wake signs, 45-50mph regulation, and noise control of loud music and unmuffled engines. He recommended that Council only address those issues that they can win when meeting with FWC in Tallahassee. He further added that he will use all of his resources to partner with the City to resolve the ongoing issues.

Comm Holihan said one of the concerns he shared is going to Tallahassee with a wish list. He agrees that he would like Council to decide on specific items and what is the most important.

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a.

Mr. Francis shared his concerns and addressed the nuisance riders and the weekend lake users who rent watercraft vehicles. He said he would like to focus on a 50 mph speed limit, Coast Guard vest safety device, and adding a canoe information trail. Discussion ensued on reckless driving, safety issues on the narrows, and enforcement.

Comm Carugno shared his concerns and the push back on the no-wake zone regulation. He added that he would like to see the City partner with other municipalities and meet with FWC. Comm Carugno spoke on the email received by Mr. Tennar. Discussion ensued.

Comm Carugno requested an edit to Page 97-Section 34-36 of the packet.

Should read, The term "watercraft," for purposes of this section, shall include motorboats, seaplanes, and any and all other craft which are propelled or powered by any internal or external combustion engine or motor.

Council agreed to the edit of Section 34-36.

After further discussion, the Council agreed on the following talking topics with FWC: slow speed minimum wake at the narrows, wake regulations, use of safety vest, personal watercraft 300ft distance for towing and 100ft distance for anchored vessels. Mr. Francis said he would like to include discussion topics of Sections 39-43 and pond weeds in the lake. Mr. Maddox gave a brief history of the use of safety vests for watercraft professionals.

5. Unfinished Business

a. ORDINANCE NO. 21-12 - SECOND READING AND CONSIDERATION: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE LEASE OF CERTAIN PROPERTY TO THE CORNERSTONE CHARTER ACADEMY, INC. FOR THE CONTINUED OPERATION OF A CHARTER SCHOOL; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, NON-CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Francis read Ordinance 21-12 by title.

City Manager Francis said Ordinance 21-12 was read for the first time on October 5' and no changes were made to the Agreement at the time.

Comm Holihan moved to adopt Ordinance 21-12 as presented.

Comm Nielsen seconded the motion, which passed unanimously upon roll call 7:0.

b. ORDINANCE NO. 21-13 - SECOND READING AND CONSIDERATION: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA AMENDING SECTION 30-77 TO ARTICLE 30 OF CHAPTER 30 OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR WITHHOLDING THE ISSUANCE OF VEHICLE LICENSE PLATES AND REVALIDATION STICKERS FOR OUTSTANDING PARKING VIOLATIONS WITHIN THE CITY; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Francis read Ordinance 21-13 by title.

There being no discussion, Comm Nielsen moved to adopt Ordinance 21-13 as presented.

Comm Holihan seconded the motion, which passed unanimously upon roll call 7:0.

6. New Business

a. Approval of Agreement with Cornerstone Charter Academy for the payment of City Services

City Manager Francis said as part of the negotiations between the City and CCA, both parties agreed to develop a separate services agreement for the cost of services. The total payment to the City from CCA will be \$450,000 annually to run concurrently with the Lease and increase accordingly.

Comm Nielsen moved to approve the Agreement with Cornerstone Charter Academy for the payment of City Services.

Comm Holihan seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

b. Approval to start the process to annex Sienna Condominiums

City Manager Francis provided the Staff Report and said that staff will need to file a report with the Board of County Commissioners 15-days before starting the annexation process. The City will start the involuntary process with a referendum and a vote from the people.

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a.

There being no discussion, Comm Gold moved to approve the Urban Service Report of Sienna Place Condominiums and have the City staff start the annexation process.

Comm Lowell seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

c. Approve Agreement for the use of Boat Slip

City Manager said before the start of discussion Comm Partin would like to recuse himself due to conflict of interest due to the Agreement being approved with a family member.

City Manager Francis said William Partin agreed to have the Belle Isle Police Department use his boat dock for a rental fee of \$1.00 a year.

Comm Nielsen moved to approve the Agreement with William Partin for the use of the boat dock.

Comm Carugno seconded the motion, which passed 6:0 with Comm Partin's recusal accepted for the record.

Mayor Fouraker called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm, and the Clerk confirmed quorum. Also present were Attorney Chumley, City Manager Francis, Chief Houston, and City Clerk Yolanda Quiceno.

Comm Shuck gave the invocation and led the Pledge to the Flag.

4. Citizen's Comments

Mayor Fouraker called for Citizen Comments.

Diana Santos, Sienna Place Condominiums, said she had received 80% of the consent forms for the proposed annexation. She asked for an update on the proposed annexation and additional steps to move it forward.

Mayor Fouraker welcomed the guests and provided for a brief discussion of Sienna Place Proposed Annexation.

City Manager Francis reposted that the City has finalized the Urban Services Report and sent it to Orange County. Orange County will forward the report to the Board of County Commissioners for review. However, the process cannot start before 15-days after submission. Since we were not able to obtain 100% homeowner participation, it will be an involuntary annexation. The staff is looking to present it on the March 2022 Election ballot for consideration by Sienna Condo residents. Discussion ensued on the challenges in obtaining signatures and the process moving forward.

Mayor Fouraker offered to have an open forum for the residents of Sienna Condos to clarify any concerns.

6. New Business

a. Ordinance 21-14 First Reading and Consideration: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Francis read Ordinance 21-14 by title.

City Manager Francis reported, per Section 6.06, the Council appointed a Redistricting Committee to reevaluate the district boundaries and provide a balance in the population under state and federal rules governing the process. The Committee provided an updated map with a word description of the district and Ordinance.

Mr. Francis recognized the Redistricting Commission for their outstanding work (David Evertsen, Emily DeLozier, Brandon Shaw, Jackie Hoevenaar, Carolyn Holihan, Meg Sharf, Alexa Dowlen, and Charlotte Brown.

Mr. Francis said some of the changes are as follows,

District 2 - will take over Oak Island

District 3 – would pick up roads to the South (Stafford)

District 5 – will lose the Lake and Landings and some land on Matchett and pick up Daetwyler and Mattamy Homes.

District 7 - will absorb Belle Vista

Mr. David Evertsen gave an overview of the property counts and district changes.

Comm Gold moved to approve the Ordinance and move to second reading and adoption.

Comm Holihan seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

b. Approval of Resolution 21-23: A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2020 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2021, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Francis read Resolution 21-23 by title.

Comm Nielsen moved to approve Resolution 21-23 as presented.

Comm Holihan seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

c. Discussion - RFP - Swann Beach Deck Project

City Manager Francis said the City removed the Swann beach deck in 2019 due its condition and safety hazards. Funds were budgeted to replace the deck; however, the City could not find a contractor. Since then, an Eagle Scout Project stepped forward and installed two benches and a picnic table. The ADA-accessible deck should still be re-built at the water's edge as it was before. The City budgeted 40,000 for this project.

Mayor Fouraker called for a 5-minute comfort break.

The meeting resumed at 7:53 pm.

Comm Carugno said he would like to see the repair to the walkway as well. Mr. Francis said that it is not part of this project. Unfortunately, that may not be possible because that area is an active drainage basin.

Comm Holihan moved to approve the RFP as presented.

Comm Lowell seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

d. Donation request from Pioneer Days Committee

City Manager Francis said that the City has sponsored the acoustic stage for the Pioneer Days Event over the past years. The City has budgeted \$1,500 for this year's donations. The donation for the stage is \$600 from the general fund.

Mayor Fouraker said he had received some feedback from residents about the City contributing to the blue house's move and a donation for the event. He believes it is a big ask. Comm Gold asked if the Pioneer Days group might like to help with this project. He further noted that the City did not pay the last donation because the event was canceled.

Comm Nielsen moved to approve the donation of \$600 for the acoustic stage for Pioneer Days.

Comm Gold seconded the motion, which passed unanimously 7:0.

 Impact Fees Mr. Francis said the P&Z Board will reconvene in January and an ordinance will be presented at that time. If something should arise, he will ask the P&Z Board to have an emergency meeting to move it forward.
 - Mr. Francis asked Council for consideration on scheduling a workshop to discuss the acquisistions of property. Council agreed to schedule a workshop on Tuesday, November 23, 2021.
 - Traffic Calming Mr. Francis opened discussion on a request from a resident for a crosswalk on Judge Road. He asked Council for direction on preparing an RFP to start the process. Council discussed partnering with the City of Orlando to split the costs. Mr. Francis spoke on the MetroPlan Transportation report to install a right turn lane on Daetwyler. He will reach out to the City of Orlando and report back to Council at the following meeting.
 - Flashing Beacon Comm Carugno asked if the City would change the flashing yellow light to red. He believes it will be more effective in promoting safety.

- Chief Houston reported that the speed sign on Hoffner has been damaged that is a total of two in the last few months.

Synopsis of the November 8, 2021 Lake Conway Navigation Board Meeting

• Public Comment:

- a. Annie Fiola, 2493 Trentwood Blvd addressed the Board stating that the weeds are bad and that they are a hazard for boats and the safety of the residents because strangers are beaching their boats on their property to clean their props of the weeds. She asked what could be done to control the weeds. Discussion ensued on this issue of weeds. City Manager Francis stated that he and Commissioner Holihan had a meeting with FWC officials in Tallahassee and discussed the weed issue. FWC staff will get back to the CM with any recommendations.
- b. Mayor Fouraker addressed the Board thanking them for holding their meeting in Belle Isle. He introduced the Councilors and other officials in attendance.
- Comments from the Chairman: Chair Nelson stated that she is happy to be in Belle isle for the meeting. She also stated that Lake Apopka is also having trouble with weeds.

Marine Patrol Report:

- a. Reports of OCSO and BIPD are attached.
- b. CM Francis gave a report on the meeting that he and Commissioner Holihan had with FWC law enforcement officials in the Boating and Waterways Section. The meeting was to discuss a draft ordinance that the City wants to adopt and have the FWC allow for the enforcement. The ordinance would have a speed limit, safe distances for vessels, wake regulations during emergencies, and reckless operation of watercraft. CM Francis stated that the FWC staff was willing to assist the City in the process.
- c. CM Francis also stated that the FWC officials pointed out that if there is a problem with duck hunters shooting toward land that they can be cited under F.S. 810.09 for felony trespass with a projectile. Further discussion ensued with OCSO officers and BIPD on enforcement of

ordinances on the lake. OCSO officers stated that they would not enforce BI ordinances and BIPD would not enforce Orange County ordinances.

- Water Elevation Report: The report is attached.
- EPD Report:
 - a. Ms. Urbanik stated that meetings will no longer be conducted via WEBEX and all meetings will now be in-person.
 - b. Canal Sediment Analysis Update: Ms. Urbanik stated that the question of who should pay for the canal work (residents on the canal or Nav Board) was answered by the County Attorney. The County Attorney stated that according to their research the Nav Board is not obligated to maintain the dead end canals; however they may maintain them for navigational purposes; therefore residents living on the canal may have to pay for any work done in the canals.
 - c. Lake Conway Stormwater Study Project Update: Ms. Urbanik stated that she did not receive anything from the City on the project the City was going to take the lead on. CM Francis stated that he did not think it was the City's responsibility, or that he had the authority to direct County staff to provide the necessary information to draft plans. He stated that the Nav Board should send a recommendation forward to the BCC, through Commissioner Uribe, to work with the City and provide the information needed to draft plans. After much discussion, the Board passed a motion to pay the City Engineer to conduct the required analysis of the Matchett Road drainage project and draft a plan for the area.



Subject: Ordinance 21-14 Amending Commissioner Districts

Background: Section 6.06 of the City Charter requires that by the first day of the month following official certification of the decennial census of the state, the city council shall appoint eight (8) city electors, determined from the registration for the last statewide general election, who shall comprise the districting commission. Also, the equal protection clause of the United States Constitution requires that where electoral districts are used, they must be substantially equal in population so that each person's vote counts about the same.

Section 6.06 also provides a timeframe for a decision on redistricting. Within one hundred twenty (120) days of appointment, the districting commission shall file with the official designated by the council, a report containing a recommended plan for adjustment of the council district boundaries. The council shall adopt a redistricting ordinance at least ninety (90) days before the next regular city election. If the council fails to do so by such date, the report of the districting commission shall go into effect and have the effect of an ordinance. The next City election is scheduled for March 8, 2022.

Belle Isle uses election districts and therefore we are legally required to consider redistricting every 10 years following the U.S. decennial census to maintain a population balance among electoral districts. The resulting council district boundaries must be balanced in population in accordance with state and federal rules governing the redistricting process.

Since the 2010 Census, areas such as Brighton Park and Royal Palm Condominiums, and some of Belle Vista have been added to the City of Belle Isle as well as some areas being removed; therefore, it was necessary to adjust the District boundaries.

It is important to note that the City Council does NOT get involved in this process and the City Manager and City Staff only provide the support necessary to the Redistricting Commission. The Commission alone has the responsibility to keep or redraw the Districts.

The Commission was made up of the following Belle Isle Residents: David Evertsen, Chair, Emily DeLozier, Vice-Chair, Brandon Shaw, Secretary, Jackie Hoevenour, Carolyn Holihan, Meg Sharf, Alexa Dowlin, and Charlotte Brown. This group of citizens worked tirelessly on this project and did an outstanding job in researching and coming up with District counts.

The results of the district counts of residences at the beginning of the process by each member of the Committee were as follows:

District 1 - 336

District 2 - 366

District 3 - 366

District 4 - 631

District 5 - 360

District 6 - 389

District 7 - 347

These counts were consistent with the counts that were done using the Orange County Property Appraiser website. Based on these counts, the Committee determined that the districts needed to be revised to get the numbers in each District as close to equal as possible.

The new residential counts for each appointed district were the following.

District 1 - 386

District 2 - 399

District 3 - 396

District 4 - 403

District 5 - 390

District 6 - 399

District 7 - 405

The district boundaries were drawn without regard for advantage or disadvantage to incumbents or challengers, and they were drawn without regard for advantage or disadvantage to any political party.

Once completed, the districting commission filed with the official designated by the council (City Manager), a report containing a recommended plan for adjustment of the council district boundaries to comply with these specifications:

- (1) Each district shall be formed of compact, contiguous territory, and its boundary lines shall follow the centerlines of streets whenever possible.
- (2) The districts shall be based upon the principle of equal and effective representation as required by the United States Constitution and as represented in the mathematical preciseness reached in the legislative apportionment of the state.

The report shall include a map and description of the districts recommended and shall be drafted as a proposed ordinance. Once filed with the designated official, the report shall be treated as an ordinance introduced by a commissioner.

Many thanks to the Redistricting Commission for their outstanding work.

So the question arises: What is the effect on Current Elected Officials? The Charter allows that no change in the boundary of any district shall exclude any Commissioner from office before the expiration of the term for which the incumbent was elected or appointed.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-14

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Belle Isle City Charter calls for the existence of seven City Council districts; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.06 of the Belle Isle City Charter requires redistricting following each decennial census of the state; and

WHEREAS, in accordance therewith a Districting Commission was appointed and has filed a recommended plan for adjustment of the council district boundaries in accordance with the requirements of the Belle Isle City Charter; and

WHEREAS, the council finds that the report complies with the requirements of the Charter.

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle that the new districts be and they are hereby described as follows:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted as the official legislative findings of the Belle Isle City Council and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. <u>Amended Council Districts</u>. The following amended council districts are adopted as set forth herein and more particularly described as set forth in the corresponding exhibits to this ordinance:

- A. District One: See attached Exhibit 1.
- B. District Two: See attached Exhibit 2.
- C. District Three: See Attached Exhibit 3
- D. District Four: See attached Exhibit 4.
- E. District Five: See attached Exhibit 5.
- F. District Six: See attached Exhibit 6.
- G. District Seven: See attached Exhibit 7.

H. District Map graphically depicting the districts described above: See attached Exhibit 8.

SECTION 3. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, whether for substantive, procedural, or any other reason, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. <u>Conflicts.</u> In the event of a conflict or conflicts between this Ordinance and any other Ordinance or provision of law, this Ordinance governs and controls to the extent of any such conflict.

SECTION 5. <u>Effective date</u>. This Ordinance will become effective immediately upon adoption by the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida.



RESOLUTION NO. 21-24

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ISSUE A PURCHASE ORDER TO VENDORS APPROVED BY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF PALM BEACH COUNTY AND ORANGE COUNTY FOR PAVING AND RELATED SERVICES, PIGGYBACKING PALM BEACH SCHOOL DISTRICT ITB NO. #20C-46V AND ORANGE COUNTY BID Y20-1031-RM; AND PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTING ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS, SCRIVENER'S ERRORS, CONFLICTS, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Belle Isle, a Florida municipal corporation (the "City") has the legal authority under F.S. §287.056 to "piggyback" onto a contract procured pursuant to by another governmental entity when seeking to utilize the same or similar services provided for in the said contract; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 5-12 of the City Code and Section 4-6 of the City Purchasing Policy, adopted by the City Council on July 7, 2020, the City Manager may purchase services from current contracts of other governmental agencies ("Piggyback"), with City Council approval on any such purchase which exceeds Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the requested Paving Service was competitively bid through District ITB#20C-46V and awarded to M&M Asphalt Maintenance (dba, All County Paving) under District Contract Number 20C-46V for a term effective June 22, 2020 through June 21, 2023 for use by all government entities; and

WHEREAS, the requested Paving Service was competitively bid through Orange County and awarded to Middlesex Paving, LLC under Orange County Contract Number Y20-1031-RM for a term effective June 30, 2019 through December 31, 2022 for use by all government entities; and

WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County School District and Orange County authorized the City of Belle Isle to Piggyback on their Paving contracts; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to piggyback on the existing Agreements with the Palm Beach County School District and Orange County to obtain competitive pricing for Paving Services; and

WHEREAS, M&M Asphalt Maintenance (dba, All County Paving) and Middlesex Paving, LLC have agreed to provide to the City, under the exact pricing, terms and conditions of Contract Number 20C-46V and Y20-1031-RM respectively, the requested paving services; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the City's best interests to approve the issuance of a purchase order to Contractors for provision of Services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Authority of City Manager. The City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, hereby authorize the City Manager to issue Purchase Orders to those vendors listed in Exhibit A, piggybacking agreements with the Palm Beach County School District and Orange County that have current contracts for Paving Services

- **Section 2.** Implementing Administrative Actions. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to take such actions as he may deem necessary and appropriate in order to implement the provisions of this Resolution. The City Manager may, as deemed appropriate, necessary and convenient, delegate the powers of implementation as herein set forth to such City employees as deemed effectual and prudent.
- **Section 3.** Scrivener's Errors. Typographical errors and other matters of a similar nature that do not affect the intent of this Resolution, as determined by the City Clerk and City Attorney may be corrected.

Subject: Discussion on the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program

Background: The City has had a few calls from residents who are interested in the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program to fund renovations in their homes. The City currently does not have a PACE program but the City should consider it. Over 200 cities and towns in Florida have a PACE Program. In Orange County, Orlando, Apopka, Winter Garden and Winter Park have PACE Programs. PACE is NOT a City Program and PACE programs are not subsidized with City funds.

What is PACE

PACE is a long term, fixed rate source of financing that allows homeowners to do energy conservation and hurricane hardening improvements to their property. Property owners can use PACE financing to cover 100% of the costs involved in installing eligible projects, including all related equipment, materials and labor. Eligible improvements include energy efficiency, water conservation, renewable energy generation, and resiliency upgrades. A few examples include: air conditioners, roofs, windows/doors, water heaters, solar panels, pool heaters, hurricane shutters, and generators.

There are two types of PACE programs, "Residential PACE" (sometimes referred to as "R-PACE"), which covers residential properties (1 to 4 family homes), and "Commercial PACE" (sometimes referred to "C-PACE"), which covers multifamily (5+ family homes), retail, hotels, industrial, and other types of commercial properties. For now, the focus will be on R-PACE.

Property owners pay back the financing for PACE improvements through a special (non-ad valorem) assessment that is added to their property tax bill each year. Property owners repay the special assessment for an agreed upon term (usually the useful life of the improvements) and the interest rates are fixed. There are no adjustments to interest rates and no balloon payments.

PACE assessments can be prepaid at any time and R-PACE does not have any prepayment fees. Because the assessment is attached to the property, rather than the owner of the property, if the property owner sells the property before the assessment is paid off, the balance

of the assessment remains with the property. The assessment can transfer to the new owner without any need to approve the purchaser of the property.

PACE, therefore, makes it easy for property owners to make improvements to their home by eliminating upfront cash payments, providing competitive interest rates spread out over time, and allowing property owners to transfer repayment obligations to a new owner upon sale.

However, with respect to R-PACE, on December 22, 2014, the Federal Housing Finance Agency ("FHFA") which oversees the eleven Federal Home Loan Banks ("FHLBanks") and Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac issued a statement (which has been confirmed by subsequent statements and remarks) in which it made clear that Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac's policies prohibit them from purchasing a residential mortgage where the property is subject to a first lien PACE assessment. FHFA has made it clear that Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac should neither purchase nor refinance mortgages which are encumbered by PACE assessments.

As a consequence of the FHFA position on PACE assessments, a homeowner may have difficulty selling its home or refinancing its mortgage if the home is subject to a PACE assessment. Specifically, some mortgage lenders or secondary mortgage market purchasers may either (1) refuse to refinance an existing mortgage, (2) refuse to finance the purchase of any property or (3) refuse to purchase mortgages in the secondary mortgage market with respect to a home subject to a PACE assessment. This may mean that if a homeowner desires to sell its home or refinance its mortgage after the homeowner obtains PACE financing, the homeowner may be required to prepay the PACE assessment before the homeowner can close such a transaction.

What are some improvements that can be made with PACE financing?

PACE can be used to fund energy efficiency improvements, wind resistance measures and renewable electricity generation including, but not limited to, solar water heating systems; air sealing and ventilation systems; efficient doors and windows; insulation; "cool" roofs; water heaters; pool pumps; lighting fixtures and controls; storm shutters; wind resistant shingles; high impact windows and doors; photovoltaic systems; EV charging stations; and small wind turbines.

Are PACE Programs Risky?

They could be. For example, Many lenders will not provide loans to subsequent buyers of homes that have a PACE property tax liability. They will be harder to sell unless the current owner pays off the entire PACE loan before listing their home for sale. If the homeowner loses income, they cannot use bankruptcy laws to avoid PACE liabilities. PACE tax liabilities increase the annual property tax bills and STAY with the property. Owners could lose significant home equity in this process just to pay overdue property taxes and PACE payments. But as for all loan programs and home projects, the homeowner has to do their homework and research.

Staff Recommendation: Council should do additional research prior to the meeting to determine whether or not to consider implementing a PACE Program.

Suggested Motion: I move we start the process to establish a PACE Program.

Alternatives: Do not establish a PACE Program.


