Subject: Posting of Vacant Commission Seats – Districts 1, 2 and 3

Background: In December 2023, the City received resignations, leaving three open seats, effective December 31, 2023. The staff have posted for the District 3 opening and received no submittals in the 60-day period.

The procedure for filling vacancies is outlined in the Charter as follows,

- The Council shall direct the city manager to post the vacancy a 30-day notice
- The Council may interview all or a portion of the applicants if it so desires
- The filling of the office shall be completed within one month (30 days) of the date that the council seat was vacated
- If the 30-day time period for filling the vacant office expires before the office is filled, or by majority vote, the time period for filling the vacancy shall be extended by 30 days

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends posting the open seats on Facebook, e-alert, and the City's webpage. If possible, we may also post in the Conway News. The appointed candidate will fill the seat until the next qualifying date. Qualifying for each district is as follows:

- District 1 Qualifying Date November 2025 (filing of the office through April 7, 2026)
- District 2 Qualifying Date November 2024 (filing of the office through April 1, 2025)
- District 3 Qualifying Date November 2024 (filing of the office through April 1, 2025)

Suggested Motion: I move to direct the City Manager to post the open seats as stated in the Belle Isle Municipal Code and bring forward any applications for Council review and consideration.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BELLE ISLE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING COUNCIL MEMBERS AND THE MAYOR AS SIGNATORIES ON THE CITY CHECKING ACCOUNTS, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Manager is the Chief Administrative Officer of the City responsible for the financial administration of all city funds, and is the purchasing agent of the City with the responsibility of authorizing all expenditures of city monies; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager is hired by and works under the direction of the City Council and WHEREAS, the City Council determined it is in the best interest of the citizens of Belle Isle to require at least two signatures by authorized individuals on each check prepared and issued by the City at the direction of the City Manager or Finance Director.

WHEREAS, the authorized signatories on the City checking accounts require periodic updating; and WHEREAS, the City desires to **add** Jason Carson as a signatory for all bank accounts;

WHEREAS, the City desires to **remove** V. Edward Gold Jr., Anthony Carugno, Karl Shuck, and Randy Holihan as a signatory for all bank accounts;

THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Belle Isle, Florida, hereby resolves:

<u>Section 1.</u> Recitals. That the findings and premises contained in the above preamble are hereby deemed to be true and correct.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Authorized Signatories</u>. The City Council hereby authorizes the following individuals as authorized signatories on the City checking accounts while such persons hold their respective term of office on the City Council:

Commissioner Beth Lowell

Commissioner Jason Carson

Commissioner Stanley Smith

Commissioner James Partin

Mayor Nicholas Fouraker

If and when an individual member of the City Council listed above is no longer on the City Council, such 1 member shall no longer be an authorized signatory for City checks. The City Manager and Finance 2 Director shall not accept such former member's signature on any City check. 3 4 Section 3. Check Preparation. The City Manager, Finance Director, or their respective City 5 employee designee is responsible for preparing or directing the preparation of all checks to be issued by 6 the City for signature by at least two of the authorized signatories set forth in Section 2 of this 7 Resolution. Without requirement upon the City's bank(s) to verify both signatures, each check issued by the City must bear the signature of at least two authorized signatories as confirmed by the City Manager, 9 Finance Director, or their respective City employee designee. No individual listed in Section 2 of this 10 Resolution (i) shall draft or direct the drafting or issuance of any City check, or (ii) has the authority to draft or issue a counter check from any City bank account. 11 <u>Section 4.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption. 12 Section 5. Conflicts. Subject: Declaration of Surplus Property

Background: Per Section 2-221 of the BIMC, the city council shall have the discretion to classify any of the city's obsolete property as surplus or the continued use of which is uneconomical or inefficient, or which serves no useful function. Any such determination of the council that such property is surplus shall also estimate the value of such property.

In accordance with Section 2-223 of the BIMC, if the council has estimated property which it has determined to be surplus to be of some commercial value, but such value does not exceed \$100.00, the city manager shall dispose of such property in any reasonable manner which the city manager, in the city manager's sole discretion, determines will bring the greatest price.

Staff Recommendation: With the computer surpluses at the November and December 2023 meetings, Admin and BIPD purchased new desktops with ARPA funds. The staff has old desktops and other misc. items that are outdated/non-working. Staff requests a surplus of computers for a minimal price to staff or dispose of the items after 30 days.

Suggested Motion: I move we declare the items surplus and direct the City

Manager to sell the items to the staff at a minimal price or dispose of the surplus according to the BIMC.

Subject: City Boat Dock – Wallace Beach Easement

Background: In July 2023, the Belle Isle Police Department requested a dock for stationing their watercraft vehicles on Lake Conway for patrolling and security purposes. After further discussion at a November 2023 session, the Council discussed potential locations and agreed to move forward with the Wallace Beach (Easement) location.

A conceptual Site Plan has been provided for discussion. The City needs an official property survey to verify the linear shoreline measurement, the normal high-water elevation of Lake Conway, and easement information for the final zoning review and building permit.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends obtaining a site survey and submitting a Request for Proposal.

Suggested Motion:

I move to direct the City Manager to obtain an official property survey and submit a Request for Proposal for the Belle Isle Police Dock at the Wallace Beach Easement location.

Alternatives: Do not move forward.

Fiscal Impact: \$179,000 ARPA Funds Allocated (additional cost to be determined: cost of supplies,

fuel, and labor).

City Project: Belle Isle Police Department Boat Dock Locations – Zoning Analysis

Background: In July 2023, the Belle Isle Police Department requested a dock site to station their watercraft vehicles for patrolling and security purposes on Lake Conway. The Council and Mayor reviewed potential locations for the dock and submitted input on the preferred sites. At a recent Council meeting, Wallace Beach was determined the project site for the police dock.

Belle Isle code section 48-32 outlines the design criteria for a boat dock. General zoning requirements for dock designs include height, length, terminal platform size, access walkway width, dock width, proposed structure location, roof pitch, and additional restrictions.

The City Council may exempt the city from the requirements of the land development code with a supermajority vote, except as otherwise prohibited by the City Charter or Code of Ordinances following section 41-3. Exceptions to the code must be determined to be in the citizens' best interest and not detrimental to public health, safety, and welfare. The project proposal may undergo a variance request process, if necessary, by the City's Planning and Zoning Board.

The City needs an official property survey to verify the linear shoreline measurement, the normal highwater elevation of Lake Conway, and easement information for final zoning review and approval with a building permit. The zoning analysis of each dock does not include legal review or input.

Zoning Requirements for Dock Designs Wallace Beach

- 1. Setbacks. Under section 48-32 (a) (1), private boat docks must have a minimum 5-foot side setback. The property and dock design provides accommodations for the 5-foot side setback requirement.
- 2. Total Area. Under section 48-32 (a) (3), the allowable terminal platform size is based on the linear shoreline frontage. The linear shoreline frontage of the property is 73 feet, which allows the maximum terminal platform size of 730 square feet. The proposed terminal platform size is 986 square feet.
- 3. Location of Docks.
 - a. Dock Extension. Under section 48-32 (a) (6) (a), no dock can extend greater than 15 feet lakeward of an existing dock within 300 feet of the proposed location. There are four existing docks neighboring the property. Among the four docks, only one dock at 1311 E Wallace Street is affected by the code criteria. The police department has contacted the property owner of 1311 E Wallace Street and the owner expressed no concerns for the proposed dock design.
 - b. Dock and Land Ownership. Under section 48-32 (a) (6) (e), a dock owned by the government must be adjacent and attached upland to a government-owned property.
 - c. Dock Width. Under section 48-32 (a) (6) (i), a dock cannot extend across more than 50 percent of the linear shoreline footage. Per code, the dock cannot extend more than 36.5 feet in width as the linear shoreline footage is 73 feet. The proposed dock width is 33 feet.
- 4. Additional restrictions for dock designs.
 - a. No dock or work for or on a dock can be within easements for ingress, egress and drainage held by individuals or the general public. Orange County government maintains a 15-foot drainage easement within the Wallace Street Right-of-Way. The proposed dock does not impact the County's drainage easement and would not interfere with the normal operation or maintenance of the drainage ditch, pipe, or facility.
 - b. No flat roofs.
 - c. No enclosed sidewalls are permitted on any dock.
 - d. Storage lockers cannot exceed 30 inches in height above the deck and 67 cubic feet of volume. Storage lockers on a dock shall not be used to store boat maintenance and/or repair equipment and materials, fuel, fueling equipment, and hazardous materials or hazardous wastes.
 - e. Dock design must meet state and federal laws and regulations, and it cannot create unreasonable interference with the riparian or littoral rights of one or more nearby property owners or the general public, as determined by the City.

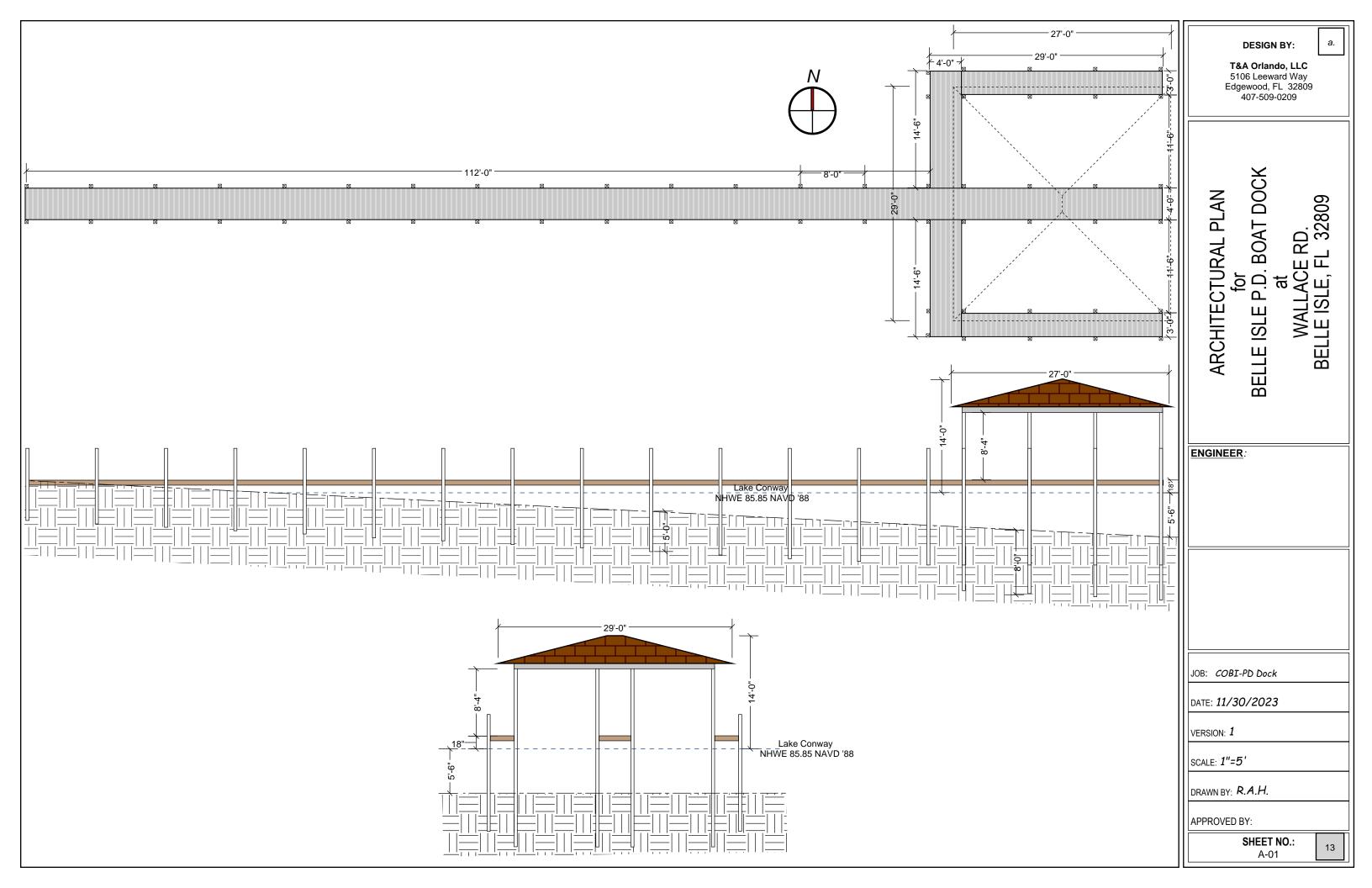

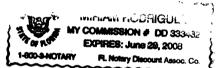

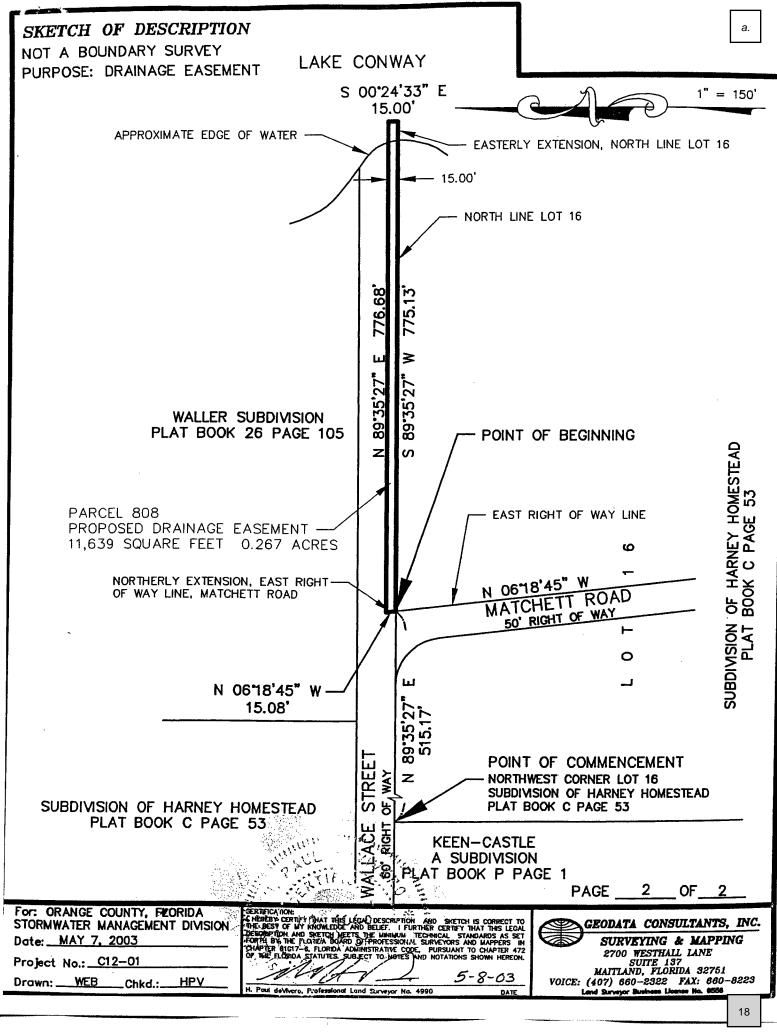

Background: MetroPlan Orlando and its government partners have been awarded a \$3.79 million federal grant under the 2022 Safe Streets and Roads for All Action Plan program. The money will be used to develop Vision Zero Safety Action Plans throughout Orange, Osceola, and Seminole counties – working toward the ultimate goal of zero deaths and serious injuries on the roadways.

With the grant, MetroPlan Orlando hired planning and transportation consultants to work with the City of Belle Isle to create a comprehensive Vision Zero Safety Action Plan, tailored to our local jurisdiction. The Action Plan is a detailed and collaborative assessment of transportation safety issues in the City and identifies feasible safety improvement tactics to target risk areas on the roadway network.

In February, the City and its partners will promote a survey and organize a community workshop to engage the public in transportation issues within the City. Staff would like a citizen and a commissioner to serve on the Stakeholder Working Group with Staff to help develop the City's Vision Zero Action Plan. The stakeholder working group will meet monthly with MetroPlan Orlando representatives and the consultants to review the proposed Vizion Zero Action Plan initiatives for the Council's consideration.

Staff Recommendation: Recruit a citizen and a commissioner to serve on the Stakeholder Working Group for the City's Vision Zero Action Plan.

Alternative Action: Recruit two citizens or two commissioners to join the Stakeholder

Working Group.

Fiscal Impact: SS4A Grant covers the cost to develop a Vision Zero Action Plan.
