### **Tree Removal Permit Application – Developed Property**

Tree Removal permits are required to meet the conditions under the Ordinance that can be viewed on www.municode.com - CH 48, ART III, SEC 48-63 - Tree Protection

Please refer to the Code of Ordinances of Belle Isle, Florida, at <a href="https://www.municiode.com">www.municiode.com</a> to view a full copy of the City Ordinance Chapter 48, Art 111, Section 48-63(d). Tree Protection -No permit/fee is required if a report or documentation from an arborist certified by the International Society of Arboriculture or a Florida licensed landscape architect is provided that demonstrates the tree presents a danger to person or property. Documentation must be provided to the City within ten days of receipt. -A permit is required for removal of a healthy tree for the following circumstances:

- The location of the tree restricts the opening of a street or road right-of-way.
- The location of the tree restricts the construction of utility lines or drainage facilities.
- 3. The location of the tree restricts access to the property.
- 4. The location of the tree restricts access to the property
- 5. The area of the tree restricts a use of the property consistent with all other city regulations
- The selective removal of up to 25% of existing trees with a diameter at breast height (DBH) of less than six inches, to provide increase light and air circulation.
- Removal of the tree is required, in writing, by the homeowners' insurance company or proposed insurance company.

#### -Replacement Trees

Replacement trees should have a minimum D8H of fourinches

DBH of Removal Tree	Number of Replacement Trees
Less than 12-inches	1
12-inches to less than 18-inches	2
18-inches or greater	3
