ORDINANCE NO. 2025-1191

ORGANIZATIONAL ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF BOAZ, ALABAMA that the order of procedure in all instances for meetings of the Council shall be as follows:

SECTION 1: That the rules or order of procedure herein contained shall govern deliberations and meetings of the Council of Boaz, Alabama.

SECTION 2: Regular meetings of the Council shall be held on the following dates: the second and fourth Monday of each month, except for December and the dates shall be the first and third Monday.

SECTION 3: Special meetings may be held at the call of the presiding officer by serving notice on each member of the Council not less than 24 hours before the time set for such special meetings; or special meetings may be held as provided by Section 11-43-50, of the Alabama Code, 1975, whenever two Council members, or the Mayor request, in writing, that the presiding officer call such meeting. Upon the failure or refusal of the presiding officer to call such meeting when requested, the two Council members or the Mayor making the request shall have the right to call such meeting. Special meetings may be held without furnishing 24-hour advance written notice provided the Mayor and all members of the City Council shall first sign a waiver that waives any and all notice of the time and place of the special meeting, prior to commencing or transacting any business. Only those items of business for which the special meeting is convened shall be voted upon at said special meeting. All written notice and waivers shall state the specific purpose or purposes for such meetings.

SECTION 4: A quorum shall be determined as provided by Section 11-43-48, Code of Alabama.

SECTION 5: All regular meetings shall convene at 6:00 p.m. in the evening at the Boaz Senior Center on 112 Church Street, and all meetings, regular and special, shall be open to the public.

SECTION 6: The order of business shall be as follows:

2. Invocation
3. Pledge of allegiance to the Flag
4. Would anyone like to speak under Public Comments?
5. Adoption of Agenda
6. Reading and/or approval of minutes of previous meeting(s)
7. Committee Reports
8. Council Member Reports
9. Public Hearings
10. Proclamations
11. New Business

12. Old Business
13. Public Comments
14. Mayor's Comments
15. Adjourn

SECTION 7: No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject without permission of the presiding officer.

SECTION 8: No person, not a member of the Council, shall be allowed to address the same while in session without the permission of the presiding officer.

SECTION 9: Every officer, whose duty it is to report at the regular meetings of the Council, who shall be in default thereof, may be fined at the discretion of the council.

SECTION 10: Motions shall be reduced to writing when required by the presiding officer of the council or any member of the council. All resolutions and ordinances and any amendments thereto shall be in writing at the time of introduction.

SECTION 11: Motions to reconsider must be by a member who voted with a majority and at the same or next succeeding meeting of the council.

SECTION 12: Whenever it shall be required by one or more members, the "yeas" and "nays" shall be recorded and any member may call for a division on any question.

SECTION 13: All questions of order shall be decided by the presiding officer of the council with the right of appeal to the council by any member.

SECTION 14: The presiding officer of the council may, at his or her discretion, call any member to take the chair, to allow him or her to address the council, make a motion, or discuss any other matter at issue.

SECTION 15: Motions to lay any matter on the table shall be first in order; and on all questions, the last amendment, the most distant day, the largest sum shall be first out.

SECTION 16: All meetings of the council shall be open to the public, except when the council meets in executive session as authorized by state law.

SECTION 17: The council may meet in executive session only in accordance with and for those purposes authorized by Section 36-25A-7, Code of Alabama.

When a council member makes a motion to go into executive session for an enumerated purpose, the presiding officer shall put the motion to a vote. If the majority of the council shall vote in favor of the motion to go into executive session, the body shall then move into executive sessions to

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discuss the matter for which the executive session was called. No action may be taken in an

executive session. When the discussion has been completed, the council shall resume its deliberations in public.

SECTION 18: A motion for adjournment shall always be in order.

SECTION 19: The rules of the council may be amended in the same manner as any other ordinance of general and permanent operations.

SECTION 20: The rules of the council may be temporarily suspended by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

SECTION 21: The chair of each respective committee, or the council member acting for him or her, shall submit or make all reports to the council when so requested by the presiding officer or any member of the council.

SECTION 22: All ordinances, resolutions or propositions submitted to the council which require the expenditure of money shall lie over until the next meeting; provided, that such ordinance, resolutions or propositions may be considered earlier by unanimous consent of the council; and provided further, that this rule shall not apply to the current expenses of, or contracts previously made with, or regular salaries of officers, or wages of employees of the city.

SECTION 23: The clerk, attorney and chief of police, and such other officers or employees of the City of Boaz, Alabama, shall, when requested, attend all meeting of the council and shall remain in the council room for such length of time as the council may direct.

SECTION 24: No ordinance or resolution of a permanent nature shall be adopted at the meeting at which it is introduced unless unanimous consent be obtained for the immediate consideration of such ordinance or resolution, such consent shall be by roll call and the vote thereon spread on the minutes.

SECTION 25: Robert's Rules of Order is hereby adopted as the rules of procedure for the council in those situations which cannot be resolved by the rules set in this ordinance.

SECTION 26: This ordinance shall go into effect upon the passage and publication as required by law.

RESOLUTION 2025-1912

A Resolution Establishing an Advisory Council Liaison for Business, Engineering, and Planning for the City of Boaz

WHEREAS, the City of Boaz recognizes the importance of coordinated planning and communication among the business community, engineering professionals, developers, and City departments to ensure orderly growth and sound infrastructure development; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to connect between the City Council, the business community, and the technical aspects of growth. This role combines economic promotion, technical oversight, and regulatory planning; and

WHEREAS, Boaz’s continued development requires a unified approach to balancing business expansion, infrastructure improvements, and long-range planning goals; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it beneficial to establish an Advisory Council Liaison to provide the City Council with informed, real-time insights on business climate, project engineering feasibility, and planning/zoning activities. This council member will serve on the Boaz Chamber of Commerce Board for business purposes and the Boaz Planning Commission for planning;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOAZ, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Establishment of Position:

There is hereby established the position of **Advisory Council Liaison for Business, Engineering, and Planning** for the City of Boaz, Alabama. This position shall serve as a key point of contact and coordination between the City Council, the Planning Commission, engineering staff, developers, and the business community.

2. Appointment and Term:

The City Council hereby appoints **Rodney Frix** to serve as **Advisory Council Liaison for Business, Engineering, and Planning**, effective **November 3, 2025**, to serve for a term concurrent with the appointing Mayor’s term, unless otherwise determined by the Council.

3. Duties and Responsibilities:

The Advisory Council Liaison for Business, Engineering, and Planning shall have advisory responsibilities across three domains:

A. Business and Industry Growth (Chamber Board Seat)

- **Chamber of Commerce Representation:** Serve as the City's official voting representative on the **Boaz Area Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors**. This is a critical function to ensure direct communication between municipal government and the local business community.
- **Industry Liaison:** Work with the Chamber and the Economic Development plans to **identify and remove regulatory or logistical barriers** that hinder local business growth and industry investment.

- **Business Climate Advisor:** This advisory representative will work with the **Council Liaison Commercial and Community Development** and will present periodic reports to the Council on the **health of the local business climate**, including trends in retail vacancies, new business licensing, and industrial job creation.

B. Engineering and Project Oversight Advisor (Technical Feasibility)

- **Project Feasibility Review:** Serve as a Council resource to work with the City Engineer, Mayor and Council, and others on the **initial feasibility and engineering review** for large commercial and industrial projects before they reach the full Council for final approval.
- **Infrastructure Coordination:** Collaborate with the proposed **Sustainable Infrastructure Liaison** to assess the technical readiness of city utilities (water, sewer, electric) to support major new industrial parks or business expansions.
- **Process Streamlining:** Recommend ways to **streamline the permitting and inspection process** for new construction to make Boaz a more attractive and efficient place to do business.

C. Regulatory Planning and Zoning (Planning Commission Seat)

- **Planning Commission Seat: Represent the City Council** on the **Boaz Planning Commission**. This is crucial for bridging the gap between the Council's long-term vision and the Commission's zoning and subdivision decisions.
- **Zoning Policy Alignment:** Advocate for **amendments to zoning ordinances** that support the Council's growth policies, such as mixed-use zoning in targeted areas or incentives for high-quality residential development.
- **Future Development Zones:** Identify and champion the creation of **specific development zones** or overlay districts that are necessary to attract targeted industries or address specific commercial needs.

4. Implementation:

The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary actions to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution.

A RESOLUTION TO APPOINT AN ADVISORY COUNCIL LIAISON FOR SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURE

WHEREAS, the City of Boaz is committed to promoting responsible growth, environmental stewardship, and the efficient use of public resources; and

WHEREAS, sustainable infrastructure planning—encompassing transportation systems, utilities, public facilities, and green infrastructure—plays a vital role in ensuring long-term economic vitality, environmental quality, and community resilience; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council desire to strengthen the City’s capacity to plan, implement, and maintain infrastructure projects that are efficient, durable, and environmentally responsible; and

WHEREAS, the appointment of an **Advisory Council Liaison for Sustainable Infrastructure** will provide professional guidance, technical expertise, and policy recommendations for Water Management, Stormwater and Resilience, Material Selection, Work with ADEM and ALDOT, and access grant opportunities to assist the City in achieving these goals;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOAZ, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. **Appointment.** The City Council hereby appoints **Steven Bates** to serve as **Advisory Council Liaison for Sustainable Infrastructure** for the City of Boaz, effective **November 3, 2025**, to serve for a term concurrent with the appointing Mayor’s term, unless otherwise determined by the Council.
2. **Purpose and Duties.** The Advisor's guidance should prioritize infrastructure that offers long-term resilience and fiscal responsibility:
 - **Water Management:** Advising on strategies to reduce system leaks, promote water conservation, and update older sewer/water lines with efficient, durable materials.
 - **Stormwater and Resilience:** Manage runoff, mitigate flood risk, and reduce pollution, thereby protecting local waterways.
 - **Material Selection:** Guiding the Council on selecting long-lasting, locally sourced, and **low-carbon impact materials** for public construction projects.
 - Assisting the Mayor and others working with **Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM)** and the **Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT)** on projects and innovations concerning infrastructure.
 - Assist Mayor and others in accessing grant opportunities.
3. **Implementation.** The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents and take any actions necessary to effectuate the intent and purpose of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION 2025-1914

A Resolution Establishing an Advisory Council Liaison for Commercial and Community Development for the City of Boaz

WHEREAS, the City of Boaz recognizes the importance of coordinated efforts in promoting commercial growth, revitalizing community spaces, and supporting local businesses; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Boaz desires to help Boaz capitalize on its economic growth and manage both business and residential expansion effectively; and

WHEREAS, effective commercial and community development enhances quality of life, broadens the City’s tax base, and promotes sustainable economic vitality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it beneficial to designate a dedicated liaison to serve as the strategic bridge between the City Council's legislative intent and the city's economic development and planning goals, focusing on attracting new businesses and managing responsible residential expansion;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOAZ, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Establishment of Position:

A position of **Advisory Council Liaison for Commercial and Community Development** is hereby established to serve as the official liaison to coordinate city efforts related to economic, commercial, and residential growth.

2. Appointment and Term:

The City Council hereby appoints **Alan Hales** to serve as **Advisory Council Liaison for Commercial and Community Development**, effective **November 3, 2025**, to serve for a term concurrent with the appointing Mayor’s term, unless otherwise determined by the Council.

3. Duties and Responsibilities:

A. Commercial and Economic Development

- **Site Opportunities:** Proactively identify and monitor **potential site development opportunities** for commercial and industrial use, including available land, vacant buildings, and properties needing redevelopment.
- **Business Attraction:** Work with the City's Economic Development staff to include the Mayor and City Council, Boaz Industrial Board, Marshall County Economic Development Council and other entities to help **recruit new commercial and industrial businesses** to Boaz.
- **Existing Business Support:** Establish a structured mechanism (e.g., quarterly check-ins) to **support the expansion of existing Boaz businesses** to help increase job density and retain local talent.
- **Commercial Corridor Strategy:** Focus on improving the appearance, accessibility, and retail diversity of key commercial areas from **Highway 431 to the historic downtown district, and other business areas in between.**

B. Community and Residential Development

- **Residential Planning:** Work with the Council Liaison for Business, Engineering and Planning to connect with The Planning and Zoning Commissions to ensure **new residential development** aligns with the city's comprehensive plan, particularly regarding quality, density, and impact on city services (schools, water, sewer).
- **Downtown Infill:** Champion programs for **compatible development and infill** in the dense, historic downtown area, especially near Snead State Community College and Marshall Medical center (Hospital) South.
- **Infrastructure Alignment:** Work with the proposed Sustainable Infrastructure Liaison to ensure that **water, sewer, and road capacity** is ready *before* major commercial or residential projects begin.
- **Quality of Life Assets:** Promote strategic investment in **quality of life assets** (parks, trails, public spaces) that attract young families and talent, directly feeding into economic growth.

4. Implementation:

The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to implement and support the intent of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOAZ, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. **Appointment.** The City Council hereby appoints **Matt Brannon** to serve as **Advisory Council Liaison for Public Safety** for the City of Boaz, effective **November 3, 2025**, to serve for a term concurrent with the appointing Mayor’s term, unless otherwise determined by the Council.
 2. **Duties.** The Advisory Council Liaison for Public Safety shall provide Policy Guidance, Interagency Coordination (Liaison), Program Assessment, and Regulatory Compliance with Special Focus Areas in Drug Enforcement/Trafficking, Elder Abuse, and Emergency Management to the Mayor, City Council, and department heads on matters relating to public safety, emergency preparedness, interagency coordination, and community risk reduction.
 3. **Implementation.** The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute any documents and take any actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this resolution.

RESOLUTION 2025-1916

A Resolution Establishing an Advisory Council Liaison for Education and Workforce Development for the City of Boaz

WHEREAS, the City of Boaz recognizes that a strong, coordinated partnership between education and industry is essential to sustaining long-term economic growth and community prosperity; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Boaz desires to strengthen communication between the City, Boaz City School System, Snead State Community College, Workforce Development, Library and Early Education, and Community Engagement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Boaz wishes to establish a dedicated Advisory Council Liaison for Education and Workforce Development to streamline communication and align the city's economic goals with its **entire educational pipeline**; and

WHEREAS, this is an **advisory and communication role** created by the City Council. The liaison would not have direct authority over the independent school boards or colleges but would serve as the **primary conduit** between them and the City Council; and

WHEREAS, aligning educational programs with current and emerging workforce needs supports the City's goals for job creation, talent retention, and economic competitiveness; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it necessary to designate a dedicated liaison to ensure Boaz's educational infrastructure is strategically aligned with the city's economic development goals and to advocate for the City Council's interests in all educational policy matters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOAZ, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Establishment of Position:

A position of **Advisory Council Liaison for Education and Workforce Development** is hereby established to serve as the primary point of contact and coordination between the City of Boaz, Boaz City School System, Snead State Community College, Workforce Development, Library and Early Education, and Community Engagement.

2. Appointment and Term:

The City Council hereby appoints **Caleb Williams** to serve as **Advisory Council Liaison for Education and Workforce Development**, effective **November 3, 2025**, to serve for a term concurrent with the appointing Mayor's term, unless otherwise determined by the Council.

3. Duties and Responsibilities:

The Advisory Council Liaison shall:

a. **Attend meetings** with the BCSS Board to discuss city-provided resources, share ways BCSS can help the city and ways the city can be a good partner in education. Explore ways the city can promote joint facility use, and coordinated planning for future development (e.g., student enrollment projections vs. housing growth).

b. Advocate for customized workforce training programs based on the City's economic development needs. Work with the college and local industry (Automotive, Rail, Manufacturing) to promote and support specific certifications and technical programs that fill high-demand, high-wage local jobs. Explore new and improved ways to make SSCC and The City of Boaz work together to promote more partnerships.

c. Serve to advise City Council Members on changes and innovations to the new **Alabama Department of Workforce (ADOW)** and Marshall County Economic Development agency. Track state and federal grant opportunities that can bring funding for local job training initiatives.

d. Coordinate with the Boaz Public Library and local preschools/daycares to ensure alignment with early literacy and school readiness goals. This directly supports the foundation of the future workforce pipeline.

e. Present an Annual Report to the City Council on the status of local educational institutions, detailing partnerships, challenges, and providing data-driven recommendations for city financial and legislative support.

4. Implementation:

The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary actions to implement the intent of this Resolution.
