I. CALL TO ORDER

V. SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

A. Fire Chief Travis F. Cook - Bonifay Fire Rescue

Fire Chief Travis Cook presented the Council Members with the history of the City of Bonifay Fire Department, the improvements in the ISO ratings, growth, and community outreach. Chief Cook wants to take a historical step forward by having a firefighter at the station during the week, which will reduce response times to incidents.

Chief Cook requested the Council's approval of having an on duty firefighter at the station Monday thru Friday from 8 am until 4 pm, with a pay rate of \$15.00 per hour. The \$10 per call stipend will still apply, and having a paid firefighter on duty will not effect the grants.

Motion made to approve having a paid firefighter at the station beginning October 1, 2024 by Council Member Crews, Seconded by Council Member Carroll.

NON- AGENDA AUDIENCE

Richard Willsey addressed the violations of public notice of meetings, agendas not being on the website, and his civil rights being violated when he was removed from the meeting and wanted an apology from Mayor Cook.

Attorney Holloway advised Mr. Willsey to wrap up his comments as his time had expired, and Mr. Willsey continued. Mayor Cook also asked Mr. Willsey to please sit down. Mr. Willsey continued and refused to sit down. After several requests to sit down, Chief Whitaker was asked to remove Mr. Willsey from the meeting due to disrupting the meeting.

A. Project Graduation Facility Usage Request

Leslie Perry, with Holmes County High Class of 2025 Project Graduation, came before the City Council stating they do several fund raisers for the HCHS seniors and their biggest fund raiser was the haunted house. Ms. Perry stated they have insurance for liability and requested using the Rec Center for their haunted house.

Motion made to approve letting them use the Rec Center by Council Member Crews, Seconded by Council Member Dixon.

A. Melvin Engineering - Downtown Stormwater Park Revision

Brett Melvin, with Melvin Engineering, presented and updated agreement for the Downtown Stormwater Park Revision. Melvin stated that DEP shifted the deliverables around, but the dollar amount was still the same. The project is on schedule.

A. Code Enforcement Discussion

City Attorney Jon Holloway gave an overview of proposed new Code Enforcement Ordinance.

Attorney Holloway stated that Code Enforcement encourages voluntary performance without having to use the teeth that the law gives you. Having clean and safe properties for property value, and it gives time for home owners to get into compliance.

B. Request for Reimbursement of Legal Expenses

Attorney Holloway stated that this reimbursement request was to reimburse Mayor Larry Cook for his legal expenses for ethic complaints to which the ethics board found no probable cause.

Motion made to approve reimbursing Mayor Cook for legal fees by Council Member Sellers, Seconded by Council Member Crews.

B. Department Updates

Chief Wastewater Plant Operator Matt Perry told the Council Members that we had a five year inspection at the Wastewater Treatment Plant by DEP, and received a "glowing" inspection report.

Mayor Cook stated the fire department and the police department held a "Teen Night" and it was a great success. Waukesha Way's "Back to School Bash" was held the next morning and turnout was very good.

Chief Whitaker requested approval for two new hires, Mikayla Steverson and Aiden Tate.

EMS Director Steve Connell told the Council Members that there is 94 square miles in Holmes County that the Bonifay Fire Department can respond to, and having a firefighter at the station during peak hours is a good move. Bonifay Fire Department's Paramedics and EMTs assist when EMS vehicles are on other calls.

Chief Cook stated that the UTV is back at the station and will be able to assist with medical calls.
