Richard Willsey said he was wrong in stating the Executive Assistant job was not advertised. It was only advertised in the local paper and on the City website. He said if City wasn't going to pay her \$19, they should pay her \$34 an hour. He mentioned that there are job recruiting services that you can use for free. Mr. Willsey said the City could not afford Florida Retirement System without the 3% millage rate. Mr. Willsey questioned the step raises on the Pay Scale, Code Enforcement, Annexations and Equipment for the Fire Department.

Ryan Martin said that when came on the Council the City had outstanding loans for grants that had been written, and had to wait on funds to come in to pay bills. He stated that money had to be transferred from the Enterprise Fund to the General Fund to compensate. Departments were told not to spend any money if they did not have to. Code Enforcement was a money pit. Mr. Martin said he is not in favor of a high tax, he is in favor of more people chipping in, and the Ad Valorem is the best way to do it.

City Clerk Callahan stated the time line given to the City back in late June showed the 60% plans on Etheridge Street complete, they would be finished on August 16th, and be ready to review on August 22nd. They show a 90% completion by September 20th, and the City has not heard anything from Dewberry.

City Clerk Callahan said Memorial Field 60% plan review was due August 29th, and we have not received those plans. The 90% plans were supposed to be finished by September 27th, and presented to the City October 6th.

City Clerk Callahan stated based on this and that we have already lost a FRDAP Grant because Dewberry thought they could file an extension and found out that they couldn't, I am asking permission to send a Termination of Agreements on the Memorial Field Improvement Project, and the Etheridge Street Drainage & Street improvements Project, and we ask for the work product that has been paid for be sent to us.

Note from City Attorney: Since Mr. Macon's statutory time to appeal his termination has passed, the Council can safely proceed with approving the permanent employment of Chief Whitaker following his emergency interim appointment by the Mayor. Based on my review of the applications, Whitaker was a well-qualified applicant from the last advertisement. Based on the short amount of time that passed since the advertisement, I see no legal concerns with proceeding with his permanent employment rather than re-advertising for the position. Now that we have fully complied with the new statute regarding termination of police chiefs (Sec. 166.0494, Fla. Stat.), we should revert to following our charter which calls for the Council to appoint the police chief. I would recommend doing so sooner rather than later, as the emergency situation following Mr. Macon's termination and appeal period has passed and the Mayor's emergency authority should not extend beyond the state of the emergency.
