B&G 1. Buildings & Grounds Approval of Minutes 6-7-2022

Motion made by Koepke, Seconded by Stucky. Voting Yea: Ganim, Koepke, Stucky.

B&G 2. Aquatic Center Project - Consideration of a motion recommending to Council approval of Change Order #58 and Change Order #59 for the Brecksville Aquatics Center in the aggregate amount of \$82,290.57.

Purchasing Director Riser said there are (2) change orders presented for the Aquatic Center Project. Change Order # 58 in the amount of \$69,336.42 is for the roof remediation. The contractor, Then Design Architects has contributed to the cost of the roof remediation. Change Order # 59 in the amount of \$50,118.26 for the increase to the General Conditions due to COVID totaling \$119,454.68 with the contingency balance of \$37,164.11 applied leaving a balance of \$82,290.57. Then Design Architecture is crediting the City \$20,000 as their contribution to the roof remediation, making the City's actual spend on the (2) contract change orders in the amount of \$62,290.57.

The closing out of the Aquatics Center project has been prolonged by the unavailability of the PPG paint needed to finish the last punch list item of painting the fasteners on the indoor pool ceiling. Purchasing Director Riser said there are subcontractors that require payment and the City should only be holding the amount needed to cover that last painting task. Purchasing Director Riser said the City still has \$58,904.16 retained on the Seitz Builders contract. Seitz Builders will submit Pay Application #21 requesting these change order amounts, as well as release of retainage with the exception of their cost for the final painting task. When painting is completed, the final payment will be released and the project will be officially closed.

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Mayor Hruby said that amount is based on a \$9 million project. Purchasing Director Riser said the total expenditures that have been approved are \$9,081,144.51, with the exception of the change orders presented today. Mayor Hruby said Mr. Matty is aware that the \$50,000 amount is a negotiated amount. The contractor's original request, due to COVID-19 was three times that amount. The contractor provided information on the additional charges for materials and products. Mayor Hruby said this was a well-run project. Mayor Hruby said the current roof is much better than the original design.

Service Director Weidig said the original roof that was installed was a vented roof and when the weather became colder, there was a problem with moisture inside the building. Upon inspection, it was determined the underlayment on the roof was retaining water. Service Director Weidig said after discussions with engineers and architects, roofing contractors it was determined to remove and replace the roof with a non-vented roof. Service Director Weidig said a third party was hired to inspect the roof to make sure it was functioning properly. It was determined that the roof was functioning as it should and the humidity levels were properly maintained. Infrared scanning was performed to make sure the building had no heat loss.

Councilmember Stucky said the amount was negotiated for the roof was with the City, architect, contractor and subcontractor.

Councilmember Koepke said the changes were made before the building was accepted.

Service Director Weidig said the roof of the Post Office is 33 years old and in need of repair. The project was included in the capital budget. Service Director Weidig said Apple Creek Roofing was the lowest bidder for this project. The shingles installed will match City Hall and the Fire Station.
