**REPORT OF THE MAYOR:** Mayor Hruby said the City collected 30,000 pounds **MAYOR** of material and 2 truckloads of food for the food pantry at the shredding event. # Scott Campbell, 8315 Sunnydale

Mr. Campbell said there are three people here from the pickle ball group. The group is trying to get Council to approve the construction of 12 permanent lit pickle ball only courts somewhere in the city. Some locations have been talked about and we're fine with any place the city decides to put these things.

Mr. Campbell said the need is great. Mr. Campbell provided a booklet with information on pickle ball. The group has obtained an estimate for 12 lit permanent courts at approximately \$350,000 and \$400, 000. Mr. Campbell said the city would not have to purchase land. That estimate is based on information gathered from the other localities around here Independence, Seven Hills, Hudson, Strongsville, communities that have already built courts.

Mr. Campbell said the fastest growing sport in America is pickle ball, all the courts around the area are crowded when residents go to play, at the times he goes to play. Independence has six permanent lit courts were participants can play there until after dark. Mr. Campbell said there'll probably be 20 people waiting to play on six courts, which means 24 people are playing. Seven Hills just built two courts behind the Meijer store, Richfield has plans to build a couple of courts. Strongsville is working on 12 courts, Hudson built 12 courts. Based on Brecksville's population compared to the other cities, Mr. Campbell believes 12 courts are needed. Mr. Campbell said there are many projects within the recreation program and would appreciate consideration of the installation of pickle ball courts.

Council President Redinger thanked Mr. Campbell for providing information on the sport. The City is constantly looking for money for projects within Recreation Department and other projects within the city. The needs of the entire City are looked at, not only in recreation, when the budgets are determined.

Mayor Hruby said the fieldhouse has striped the fieldhouse for pickle ball and asked if Mr. Campbell knew how many people use those fields. **2:10:41**

Mr. Campbell said tonight there were four courts available. When there are four courts on Thursday nights or Saturday mornings and the schedule changes depending on what other programs are going on. There are typically six to ten people waiting on each court to play the next game.

Mr. Campbell said when Brecksville residents go to play at other locations our residents will consume all six Courts at Independence and still have people waiting to play. In Seven Hills, two courts, there was a 45 minute wait between games. Mr. Campbell said they need more indoor courts and lots of outdoor courts.

Mr. Campbell said Independence will usually set aside four courts on Wednesday evenings in the winter, fees are charged and you need to be a guest of a resident. Independence is actively discouraging outsiders from playing on their courts because it's so crowded their residents get mad that they don't have first pick on the court times. Mr. Campbell said in North Royalton you can play at the "Y" early in the morning, it is going to get worse in the wintertime there's going to be a lot of people that don't have some place to play.
