Mayor Hrubby said he has worked with three Charter Review Commissions. The appointment of commission members is the responsibility of the Mayor. Mayor Hrubby said he has requested Council members recommend one person to serve on the Charter Review Commission and Mayor Hrubby will appoint the remaining members. Mayor Hrubby said he found that to be a good way of dealing with the appointments. Mayor Hrubby said this group began on September 27, 2023. The commission meet 13 times throughout the year and concluded on September 13, 2024. Mayor Hrubby said the group was very thorough and interviewed every department director, Board and Commission And held meetings for public input. The group proposed six (6) Charter Amendments to the electorate of the City of Brecksville and prepared a booklet to be mailed to all registered voters in the City.

Mayor Hrubby thanked all of the Commission members for their dedication. Council member Savage served as the Council Representative to the Commission. Council member Savage said she attended the meetings and this was her first Charter Review and was impressed by the members work. Council member Savage presented a plaque to each of the Commission members.

Mayor Hrubby said Rob Holub served as the alternate member of the Commission. Rob he went to all of these meetings and he spoke out just like a regular member would do but in the end he really couldn't vote it's like an alternate juror that has to sit through the trial but unless a member is unable to vote, cannot participate in the final votes.

Jessica Vid-Clough and Jill Mansfield, Teresa Lesh, Denise Gawlik, and Mike Berlin were also valuable members providing input during the discussions did an outstanding job on the commission.

Stephanie Bartos and Dan Bender, who served as Vice Chairperson, enjoyed working on this commission, they are both running in the election for City Council this year.

Eric Church he was the Commission Secretary and provided much input throughout the process.

Mayor Hrubby said he knew Greg Skaljac would probably turn down his request to serve on the Commission. Mr. Skaljac served several years on Boards & Commissions and on City Council. Mayor Hrubby said Mr. Skaljac agreed to be the Chairman of the Charter Review Commission and was very involved and did a remarkable job leading the Commission.

Adam Diem, 8653 Hollis Lane. Mr. Diem said he is excited and believes the project is good for the city. Mr. Diem said he is aware of close calls and near misses in being hit (by cars). Mr. Diem said the plans do not show the access road from the school past the maintenance buildings. The dismissal process of students has changed. Mr. Diem said he has seen many vehicles ignore stop signs. Mr. Diem asked Council to delay the bid award.

Mayor Hruby said he was unaware of Mr. Diem's concern. Mayor Hruby asked Engineer Wise if there is anything that could address Mr. Diem's concerns. Engineer Wise said there is a chance people do not stop at the intersection. There will be a crosswalk painted on the ground. The intersections of the trail at Valley Parkway and Highland do not have a stop light. Engineer Wise said the plans show the driveway and the crossing are shown on the plans. It does not show the extension to the school property. Engineer Wise said the difference from the original plan was in the area of the concession stand due to the transformer equipment.

Mayor Hruby said Councilmember Stucky recommended flashing light on the curve. Mayor Hruby asked if a traffic bump at the intersection would be helpful.

Engineer Wise said additional signage and a speedbump on the driveway could be possible. Mayor Hruby said the trail was originally to go on the school property. The school refused that proposal due to school safety. The original discussion was the access road from the school to the Blossom property would be used if an evacuation was necessary from the school onto Blossom property. Mayor Hruby said there are some changes that could be made, but the project should not be stopped while that is being considered.

Council Vice President Caruso said he has a high level of confidence in the review that the plan is safe and some changes may be made to ensure it is safer for pedestrians.

Council member Stucky said he feels this is a good plan and Engineer Wise has done a good job and if there are concern Council will look into them.

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Council member Ganim asked if changes, as suggested, could be made after the project award. Engineer Wise said signage and other features, as discussed can be added. The sidewalk project along the front of Blossom Hill will cross the driveway at Oakes Road. Flashing lights are not possible at each location. Council Vice President Caruso said the area has not (previously) had a lot of pedestrian traffic and the crosswalk has not been painted yet. Drivers are not aware of the pedestrian traffic. Mayor Hruby said during the non-school sessions the access could be closed. Mayor Hruby said there will be issues at other locations, too.

Law Director Matty said he would like the record to reflect the City of Cleveland's efforts on behalf of the city of Brecksville. The City had this put aside this legislation until the city of Cleveland did its necessary legislation for the easement which Engineer Wise and Law Director Matty have been working to try to get for over a year and a half. City Council and the Mayor should know we actually faced a summer recess by City Council of the City of Cleveland. Utilities Committee approval is needed and then final approval by the entire Council. On September 21st Law Director Matty attended the committee meeting of the Utilities Committee in Cleveland, Brian Kazy is Chairperson.

At that meeting the Director of Public Safety and Cleveland Water Commissioner presented on behalf of the city our project and our request for the easement. The Chair understood Brecksville's project and understood the importance of the project and also understood that the city was waving its compensation for the easement. The committee passed the issue unanimously and then on the September 25th at the council meeting, the City of Cleveland has 17 council members. One council member was excused and the Brecksville request for easement passed 16 to 0. The City of Cleveland certainly showed they were a good community member.

Engineer Wise worked with the gentleman by the name of Dan Donley in the Real Estate Division of Cleveland and Law Director Matty worked with an Assistant Law Director by the name of Kevin Roberts. The officials were most accommodating, they understood the project and Law Director Matty said that doesn't always happen.

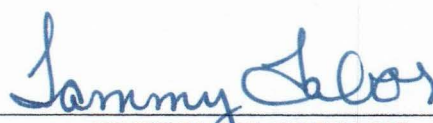
