**Subject:** Master Fee Schedule Review and Recommendations

#### **Purpose**

Act in an advisory capacity in preparation of the annual budget for Parks & Recreation.

#### Recommendation

Review the 2022-2023 Master Fee Schedule and supplemental information in order to make recommendations to City Council for the upcoming budget cycle including fiscal year 2023-2024.

## **Background**

As part of the Brisbane Municipal Code 2.20.050, the "Parks & Recreation Commission shall: act in advisory capacity in preparation of the annual budget for recreation and long-range recreation and park and playground capital improvement program as well as recommend to the City Council fees or charges to be paid by residents and nonresidents for use of city recreational facilities, or for participation in city recreational programs."

At the 4/12/2023 Commission meeting, staff presented the current Master Fee schedule (Attachment 1) as well as a detailed analysis of childcare fees, aquatics fees, and facility rental rates, comparing them against similar programs in our area (Attachments 2, 3, 4). Commissioners expressed a desire to further digest the information and the opportunity to ask follow up questions of staff.

## Discussion

In order to inform further conversation amongst the Commission regarding the department's expenditures, a summary of divisions and programs for the P&R budget has been provided as Attachment 5. In addition, we are providing responses to questions that were directed to staff:

- How many families is the city providing financial assistance to (e.g., waiving/reducing fees) for the following programs (and how does a family qualify for that)?
  - o Preschool: 2
  - o Afterschool: 2
  - Seasonal camps: 5

\*Our fee waiver program is based on the honor system. If a resident requests financial assistance, they complete a form that waives up to 50% of program fees. For Summer camps, we are able to offer full scholarships utilizing funds from the San Mateo County Summer Enrichment grant.

• Do other cities offer financial aid for the programs listed above; if so, how does it work?

\*Yes, most agencies we examined offer some degree of financial assistance or scholarships for childcare programs including Burlingame, South San Francisco, San Bruno, Daly City, Campbell, and Cupertino. Fee assistance applies to residents only and ranges anywhere from 50-100%. In

some cases, scholarship availability is restricted based on available funds and in others, eligibility is based on household income.

## • For facilities, to what extent do fees cover the costs of providing rentals (staff time needed to set up, clean up, etc.)?

\*Across the various rental categories (facilities, picnic areas), this is challenging to quantify as it would need to account for the following: staff time (before, during, after), custodial services, facility maintenance, administrative fees & overhead for processing, depreciation of equipment, utilities, trash collection services, etc. In addition, if we don't have a rental, the City is still absorbing the expense of ownership and operation of the facility. Those expenses are only offset by private rentals. In examining annual expenditures of Mission Blue, Community Center, and picnic rentals against revenue actualized, cost recovery hovers around 40%.

At this time, the Commission should identify any fees for modification along with proposed adjustments for Council consideration.
