### Background

We have seen an increase in criminal activity county wide which has also minimally impacted our community. The increase in criminal activity has led to community inquiries about our efforts to deter crime. Many cities throughout San Mateo County have installed new license plate reader technology to aid them in their investigations and criminal prosecution. This technology has rendered positive results in identifying and solving criminal activity.

### Discussion

Exploring our potential options for installing new technology within the city limits of Brisbane as an aid to the police department's investigative tools. Review and discuss the new technology options and available vendors for providing a license plate reader system to aid the police department in their investigative and prosecution efforts. We will present a basic overview of the customization and functionality of a license plate reader system and discuss the potential impacts of community and council concerns, fiscal impact and the possibility of implementing a pilot program within the city of Brisbane.
