Community Building - Brisbane will honor the rich diversity of our city (residents, organizations, businesses) through community engagement and participation

## **Purpose**

Provide direction on community activities and outreach with an equity and inclusion focus

#### Recommendation

Staff is recommending to provide direction on a Community Equity and Inclusion Calendar as well as a brief community survey to receive more information about the diversity of our community

## **Background**

Summer of 2020, an employee-led group came together to learn more about equity and inclusion issues impacting the City of Brisbane as an organization. The group of 12 staff members from various City Departments and created EPIC--the Equity Plus Inclusion Committee.

EPIC's Mission Statement is to affirm every person has rights, value, and a voice and deserves the opportunity to achieve their potential, which is why we work so hard to listen to and learn from everyone in order to provide opportunities, uphold a safe environment, and speak up against injustice.

EPIC combats oppression, implicit biases, stereotypes, hate, barriers, injustice and divisions and promotes equity, compassion, acceptance, the celebration of our differences, and the amplification of oppressed voices in order to create opportunity and unity in our workplace and community.

The Committee is comprised of the following focus areas: Messaging and Guide Posts, Recruitment and Advancement, Workplace Community/Family, Community and Partnerships.

We are looking for the City Council Liaison to EPIC Subcommittee to provide direction in EPIC's Community and Partnership work.

EPIC's Community and Partnership Focus Group's work is comprised of doing what we can to ensure:

- 1. Everyone in the community feels included or addressed
- 2. People feel their voices are being heard
- 3. All community partnership opportunities are identified and the community assets we have are inventoried
- 4. That the partnerships and activities reach and engage all types of people

EPIC's Community and Partnership Focus Group's work is trying to achieve the following:

- 1. Utilize all the skill sets to help businesses thrive and to help the organization/staff thrive
- 2. Businesses/community have more ways to engage with the City and each other as a community
- 3. The community has a better understanding of the diversity within the community
- 4. Residents are aware of the opportunities available to them

#### Discussion

EPIC is submitting a draft Community Calendar and calendar criteria for review. EPIC is also requesting more direction on how to best recognize the events or holidays in the Community Calendar. Some proposed activities include the following: write a STAR article on the subject, add to the Citywebsite's Community Calendar, host a community event, draft a Mayoral Proclamation, etc.
