






4 - Generally speaking, how do you rate the recreational facilities in the City of Hillside and Hillside Township?




5 - What recreational facilities do you use within the two communities?




6 - Our communities offer a number of parks. Which park(s) have you visited?









Community Survey Word Cloud

Throughout the public input process, many parks and recreation needs were expressed. The graphic below is a summary of feedback gained from the community survey. Many of the open-ended comments fit into similar themes. When a topic was mentioned multiple times, the comment was grouped into a general theme and expressed in the word cloud, where the size of the word corresponds to the number of times it was mentioned in comments. This graphic helps to distill a great deal of input into a quick summary of responses.



Public Review and Final Adoption

A draft Plan was prepared by Edgewater Resources and reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Plan Committee. This Plan was then presented to the Parks Advisory Board for comment. This draft Plan was then made available for public review for one month beginning on December 4, 2020. Copies were placed at City Hall and the St. Joseph Public Library. The Plan's availability for public review was posted in the local newspaper and the City's Website. Following the month long public review, the St. Joseph Parks Advisory Board held a public hearing on the Plan at its January 7, 2021 meeting. Following the public hearing and Board recommendation for Commission adoption, the Plan was adopted by City Commission on January 25, 2021.
