Difficult and sad information was shared by Mary Ann Spaun and Barbara Black with the members of the Historical Advisory Committee the passing of Mary Louise Rea Boren on Monday, November 24, 2023. Mrs. Boren's funeral was at Prairie Springs Cemetery, December 1, 2023. Following the funeral, the Historical Advisory Committee hosted a luncheon for family and guests. Mary Louise Boren and her husband Charlie Wade Boren gifted Russell Farm Art Center to the City of Burleson in 2012.

Members of the Historical Advisory Committee have been busy volunteering for events at Russell Farm during October, November, and December. They have served as greeters, docents, and assistants for Fall Fest at the Farm, Far Out Family Campout, Red Chair Event, Boren Family Reunion, Nights of Lights, and Christmas on the Farm and decorators of the historical Russell-Boren Home for Christmas.

Members distributed flyers following the November meeting throughout the community for Christmas on the Farm and Nights of Lights. Members agreed to cancel the December 12, 2023 meeting, as volunteer appreciation brunch was scheduled the same day by the Russell Farm staff. Fall and Winter Recap:

- Nov. 4, 2023: We hosted a craft class 12:00 -1:30 with instructor Karen Kaiser who presented a Fall Collage class.
- November 17, 2023: Our Red Chair Lecture on was a presentation by UNT Special Collection
 Director, Morgan Geringer who drew a crowd of 30 attendees in conjunction with a display of
 historic branding irons from the collection. This collection has not been publicly displayed for
 over 30 years. We are talking to the Special Collections of extending the loan for a year (there is
 still art display space on the walls above the branding irons). We also had a hands-on
 demonstration afterwards around the campfire where we heated some irons and branded the
 marks on wood.
- December 2023 and January 2024 first Saturday art classes: Did not make, but our upcoming February 3, 2024, Valentine's Workshop class already has participants signed up.
- We are continuing into the spring with the first Saturday art classes ages 15 to adult from 12:00 1:30 pm Fee \$25 to \$30 depending on the project.
- Our Saturday sketch group continues to meet each Saturday 9:00 12:00 pm. It is open to the public with a theme each week.
- Hill College instructor, Karen Kaiser, has put together a great system for kid's arts and crafts at
 our festival events. Karen puts out at least 5 different crafts, with all the prepared materials,
 examples and easy to follow instructions. Families can work alongside their little ones. The farm
 has provided volunteers to oversee traffic flow and clean up. Karen provided materials for Fall
 Fest and Christmas on the Farm and plans to continue to volunteer in the future.

Fall and Winter 2023 Recap:

- October 20, 2023: Date Night Experience Couples enjoyed a barbeque meal, making smores around a fire pit and kicking up their heels in the Hay Barn while taking country western dance lessons.
- October 21, 2023: Canning Class Students made Apple Pie Filling and left with a quart size jar of their own to make an apple pie for the holidays. These classes are designed to give students confidence in the canning process, teach safe canning practices, and make new friends.
- October 21, 2023: Scarecrow Making Class Families made a large scarecrow to display at home. Each one had its own unique style. This was held in the Chesapeake building with stations set up for families to rotate. All supplies were provided except the hat.
- October 27, 2023: Crowley Homeschool Field trip students had stations they could rotate divided into 4 groups. Due to the grounds being wet we were not able to offer a hayride to the back nature trails. Instead we offered a scavenger hunt that was educational on historical items on the farm and identification of trees and plants. The Russell Boren home was open for students to tour in the rotation along with the donkey station.
- October 28, 2023: Far Out Family Camp Out at the farm This event was so much fun for all who attend. Corn hole, archery, fishing, fire pit, games, movie inside, dinner, instructional line dancing and much more filled the evening.
- November 11, 2023: Red Chair Lecture with Morgan Gieringer, Director of Special Collections at UNT Library, spoke on the historical branding irons on display in the Baker Building art gallery. Those who attended were able to have a hands-on demonstration of branding on a piece of wood. These brandings from Texas Ranches are on loan to Russell Farm and are on display in the Baker building art gallery.
- November 17, 2023: Fall Fest and Kids Farmers Market Hayrides, arts and crafts, games, corn maze and lots of unique merchandise to purchase from the Children's

- November 18, 2023: Canning Class Students made Holiday Jam. This class had a
 waitlist and maxed out with 16 in the class. Everyone took their personal jar of holiday
 jam. These classes are to encourage students to be confident in the canning process,
 teach safe practice while canning and make friends.
- December 2, 2023: Breakfast with Santa was a great success with up to 960 attendees.
 The theme this year was the Grinch. Green pancakes, sausage, coffee and juice were
 served. Families enjoyed free cocoa and a picture with Santa and the Reindonkey. The
 Grinch had his house in the Baker Building where children could go in and visit.
- December 6,7,8, 9, 2023: Nights of Lights is an after our event offered for four evenings where families can stop by and see the entire farm decorated with Christmas lights. We also partnered with BISD Gaming Academy for a light show to music. Visitors enjoyed hot cocoa to spread holiday cheer.
- December 9, 2023: Christmas on the Farm had over 800 visitors that experienced an old fashion Christmas event. Activities included visits from Santa, free arts and crafts, Children's Entrepreneur market with 58 vendors, hayrides, and live music for guest to enjoy while visiting the farm.

- February 10, 2024: Sweets for your Sweetie This class will teach the methods of working with chocolate and dipping strawberries, pretzels and marshmallows. Students will take home a platter full of sweets wrapped and ready to give as a gift to your sweetheart!
- February 16, 2024: Date Night Experience Event will include a catered Italian meal from local restaurant Sammy's Italian Bistro, smore's by the fire pit, and instructional country western dancing for couples.
- March 16, 2024: Canning Class Pickled Three Bean Salad This class is designed to give confidence to our students in the canning process and practice safety as well as meet new friends.
- March 23, 2024: Donuts with the Easter Bunny and Easter Egg Hunt This event will include a donut breakfast for \$5.00. The Easter Egg hunt is free to all children ages 4 and under.
