A. Receive a report and discuss Animal Services' monthly reports on November 2023, December 2023, and January 2024 shelter operations. (*Staff Presenter: Kim Peckler, Animal Services Manager*)

Staff gave an update on the shelter operations for November 2023, December 2023, and January 2024.

- Q: What does RTO mean? A: Return to owner.
- Q: What is required for the animal to be returned to the owner? Are there fees involved? A: No fees at this time for a first offense, but a rabies vaccination must be given within 10 days. For a return in the field by the officer, the owner is given a Notice of Violation, with the same 10 days to get a rabies vaccination.
- Q: How often is the shelter full? A: 100% of the time now.

B. Summary of the improvements to Shelter. (Staff Presenter: Kim Peckler, Animal Services Manager)

Staff gave an update on the improvements to Shelter approved in the FY2023-2024 budget, which included an outside cover for the kennels and a solar panel electric gate.

• The committee was happy the gates were installed




All Calls for Service are handled within 24 hours

Actions Taken by Officers


Attempts to educate and mediate are most often the first method of resolution. When these techniques fail or are ignored, a written warning or citation could be issued. These methods help to reduce the number of repeat offenders, and animals impounded, and more effectively manage long-term problems. 


Burleson Animal Shelter intakes about 2,000 animals per year and averages about 165 animals per month. Below you will see the intake data per month broken down by species and by intake type.






Phone calls and visitors are depicted in the graph above. Phone calls typically increase with season changes and visitors tend to fluctuate on an unforeseen basis.






Animal Quarantine






